OUR VISITORS



Wallingford's football history dates back to at least 1889. A report in the Oxford Journal of 27th April 1889 shows "a match was played in the Croft on Easter Monday between the Wallingford Football Club and the Queen's Park Rangers, London, resulting in a draw, two goals each". A Wallingford side competed in the inaugural season of the North Berks Football League in 1909-10 but Wallingford Town Football Club was not formed until 1922.

The newly formed Wallingford Town won the North Berks War Memorial Cup in 1922 and 1923 and the Charity Shield in 1929. Having finished as North Berks Division 1 runners-up in 1923-24, the club switched to the Reading & District League and were crowned Premier Division winners in 1935-36. We were founder members of the Hellenic League in 1953 became Hellenic League Premier Division champions in 1968- 69 League Cup runners-up in 1982-83. After 36 consecutive seasons, our Hellenic premier division status was lost in 1989. A short spell in Hellenic League Division One followed before a switch to the Chiltonian League.

In 1995, AFC Wallingford was formed by the merger of Town and Wallingford United, then members of the Chiltonian League and themselves seven-time winners of the North Berks War Memorial Cup. AFC Wallingford spent 3 seasons in the Chiltonian League, winning the 1995-96 League Cup final against Denham & the League title in 1997-98. Carl Henry was the goal-scoring sensation that season, setting a club record with 62 goals. With the championship came promotion to the Combined Counties League.

Progress continued under manager Dave Crowdy and in 2000-01 he led 'Wally' to runners-up positions in the Combined Counties League and Berks and Bucks Senior Trophy.

Our Visitors continued

Season 2001-02 saw the club go one better, winning the Combined Counties Championship and the Berks and Bucks Senior Trophy, beating Milton Keynes City 3-2 in a thrilling final. Striker Andy Shildrick won the Combined Counties Golden Boot award for the top goal scorer in 2002-03, as we were pipped to the league title firstly by Withdean and then by AFC Wimbledon.

The summer of 2004 saw major upheavals and 2004-05 turned into an unsuccessful struggle against relegation. We bounced back at the first time of asking but it was a brief upturn in fortunes. Having been transferred back to the Hellenic Premier in 2006, relegation to Division 1 followed. The financial strain of remaining at step 6 of the national pyramid began to take its toll. A rapid decline in fortunes followed. In 2008 the club decided to step back to local football returning to the North Berks League after an 84-year absence.

In 2013 we reverted back to Wallingford Town FC, and switched back to the original 1922 colours of red and white stripes. The club applied to return to the nonleague pyramid in the 2017/18 season with then Chairman Simon Cowlard and 1st Team manager Duncan Mitchell attending a meeting at Wembley Stadium with The FA to put a case forward for resubmission. The move-up was granted and after 4 seasons in the Hellenic League East, the club moved back to the Combined Counties League after The FA performed a re-structure of Step 5 & 6 leagues.

In the summer of 2021/22 season and with the club's committee weakened by the resignations of several key members, former manager Glenn Goudie, who managed the 1st team for three seasons, stepped into the Chairman's role and his first task was to appoint former Ardley United manager Lee Matthews as 1st team manager. Matthews and his squad gelled quickly and were unbeaten after 17 league games. A club record of games without defeat. After a nervy January, the side began to hit form at the key stages of the season, and promotion was gained via the playoffs, beating Hilltop 2-1 AET.

At the beginning of the 2022/23 season, the club became Wallingford & Crowmarsh FC after an amalgamation between Wallingford Town and Crowmarsh Youth in an effort to boost community involvement and improve player pathways. The club now boasts 35 teams from U6 to adults male and female teams. Lee Matthews enters his fourth season with the club and is looking to push the team to make positive progress each season.

The club is very grateful to all our sponsorship partners and the club is determined to become stronger over the next few seasons.

Jonathan ‘JJ’ Lacey enjoyed a day to remember at Wembley Stadium back in May.

The Biggleswade Town midfielder and his family were handed the VIP treatment at the Home of Football as a special guest of The FA at the FA Cup Final. This once-in-a-lifetime opportunity was JJ’s reward for ranking as the highest scorer in the competition, from the Extra Preliminary Round to the Final, after his 10 goals helped the Southern League Premier Central Waders won through six rounds before being knocked out by Solihull Moors in the fourth qualifying round.

Only Manchester City goal machine Erling Haaland could have possibly toppled Lacey’s goal haul ahead of his team’s 2-1 loss to Manchester United - but would have needed to have scored six goals.

Lacey’s day included carrying out the match ball prior to kick-off and being presented with the Golden Ball Award by former Manchester United striker Dion Dublin.

"It's once-in-a-lifetime stuff, to be able to walk the match ball out before kick-off, and to be presented this award, it's amazing for me and my family," he said. "It’s surreal to be the top scorer in the Emirates FA Cup, and invite my family to enjoy the Final at Wembley Stadium and see me receive the trophy.

"We wondered if it all might be too good to be true, so when it became official after the final whistle we were relieved, and now I’m really proud to take home the Golden Ball Award."

Lacey, 25, was pushed all the way by Ramsgate striker Joe Taylor, who notched nine goals for the Rams in a remarkable season tally of 53 for the Isthmian South East side.

And he said he was only unaware of the award in September, when he scored a hat-trick in an away tie with then Step 2 side Bishop’s Stortford

The FA’s Director of Pro Game Relations, Andy Ambler, added: “JJ Lacey is an excellent example of this competition giving players and clubs across the English pyramid the chance to test themselves against the very elite.

“His goal-scoring exploits from attacking midfield were outstanding, and we are delighted that his family could attend today’s Final and see him collect the Golden Ball Award.”

This year, a record high 221 fixtures took place in the FA Cup extra preliminary round – and the competition kicked off in celebratory fashion after a new record was set for the earliest date and time that a goal has been scored in FA Cup history.

It came on Friday August 2nd, at 7.54pm, when Jack Hobson-McVeigh netted for hosts Royal Wootton Bassett Town in their 2-1 extra preliminary round tie against Mangotsfield United.

CLUB HISTORY

Buckingham Football Club is a football club based in Buckingham, Buckinghamshire, England. Formed by a merger of Buckingham Athletic and Buckingham United in 2023, they are currently members of the Spartan South Midlands League Division One and play at Stratford Fields.

The club was first formed in 1933 as **Buckingham Juniors**, but it was three years before a ground was found, allowing the club to enter the Brackley and District League. When they got their ground, it was originally called Timm's Meadow, before later becoming Stratford Fields. In 1939 the club adopted **Buckingham Athletic FC** as its name. It then took the club 27 years to win its first trophy when in 1960–61 they won their first trophy, the North Bucks League Shield.

In 1965 they applied and was accepted to the Hellenic League where they played in Division 1 finishing a creditable mid-table position in their first season but also won the Berks & Bucks FA Junior Cup. Their success continued and in 68/69 was promoted to the Premier Division after finishing Division runners-up.

The late 60's brought about some good success for the whole club with the Youth, Reserve and First teams all picking up trophies with the First winning the Buckinghamshire Senior Cup for the first time.

After a steady decline in fortunes in 78/79 the club returned to the North Bucks League and it wasn't until the mid-80's that further success was achieved.

This was the start of a successful period for the club and after winning the North Bucks Premier League title they moved to the South Midlands Division 1 in 1985 winning the league at their first attempt, losing only 3 games throughout the season.

However, success came too quickly, and the ground facilities were not ready for promotion to the Premier Division so they had to remain in Division 1.

The following season they were once again knocking on the door of the Premier League as they finished runners-up but a last minute hold up on planning permission once again stalled promotion. However, promotion was achieved the following year when they did the league and cup double and with correct ground grading in place the club was promoted to the Premier League for the first time.

Throughout the 90's all the teams in the club consistently won trophies

although the highest the first team achieved in the Premier League was in 97 when they finished 5th.

The late 90's the club struggled financially, and they made a very difficult decision to drop out of the top flight and they were placed back in Division 2. A level of stability was brought about the club and in 2003 they were promoted back to Division 1.

Once again ground grading held the club back as in 2004 they finished runners-up in Division 1 and promotion back to the Premier league was denied.

Since 05/06 a huge amount of work has taken place to upgrade the clubhouse and football facilities but unfortunately success on the field has been sparse.

In 2023 Buckingham Athletic started talks with Buckingham United to bring the two clubs together with the sole purpose of having one senior football team in the town.

Buckingham United FC were formed in 2011 with the sole aim of providing local grassroots football. This began as a single Sunday side playing in Deanshanger due to a lack of local facilities. After the first season the club moved to Tingewick but it was not until 2016 when the club finally moved into Buckingham to the new Lace Hill Sports and Community Centre. The club joined the North Bucks and District League before joining the South Midlands League Division Two in 2019. Here the club grew quickly providing grassroots football across various levels and abilities which peaked with eight teams by 2021, this included Saturday First and Reserves, Sunday League A & B sides, Veterans, Ladies along with an Under 21s and Under 18s.

The club reached many cup finals across the teams including winning the North Bucks and District League Division One shield in 2018. In the final season under Buckingham United the ladies side really gave the club a wonderful finally winning the Northants Premier Division Title and League Cup double.

As a result of many meetings between the clubs, both Buckingham Athletic & Buckingham United formally agreed to pass the motion to combine both clubs, creating Buckingham Football Club, which now has one of the largest offerings of adult football in the region with a structured youth pathway with our strategic partners Moretonville Junior FC.

This is not an end to Buckingham Athletic or Buckingham United, this is very much a continuation in the story of these clubs and football within the town. The history of which won't be forgotten.

The ultimate aim of combining the clubs is to provide the town with a sustainable non-league football club by sharing resources, passionate volunteers, and great sporting facilities. A club with the aim of pushing up the pyramid while also providing structured football for the community, maintaining the fun and enjoyment of the game that everyone loves.
