In case of injuries to players requiring medical treatment, please advise your coach and team manager by email giving details of the injury.

Injuries often are not noticed until after the match or training so it is important we know about the injuries so we can support the player.

RCL has a paid physio to answer questions and provide immediate support to players and guidance for rehabilitation and return to play.

In addition you can claim back any costs not reimbursed by the CNS. You need to fill in a form within 60 days of the incident.

Do not criticise referees.

Do not enter the playing area unless invited to do so by an official.

As pitch manager at Cessange these are the rules which will be enforced.

Any supporter who is abusive towards players, coaches or officials will be given a verbal warning. If the supporter continues to be abusive they will be asked to leave the Stade Boy Konen Complex.

Let the children play and develop in a safe and supportive environment.

10 June 2023 at the Parc Hotel Alvisse. Please mark the day in your calendar




Many parents (and some coaches and team managers) are having problems navigating the RCL website when they have to update or provide their input to matches and events.

Club life goes on despite some disruption due to Covid, which caused the Bundesliga match last saturday to be cancelled by the german team, and an U16 home game as well


The board met last week in order to prepare for the AGM of FLR, which will be held at end of june, and will see a new board to be elected


If you instead chose to use the website, you have to login with the account you got when you signed up. This is what you'll see




The tailwinds of Storm Eunice gave an advantage to the home side, with Walferdange leading 3-0 at half-time.

Thinking that rugby is only for boys? Think again!

When it comes to looking for a sport for our kids we tend to follow common patterns, boys fall in to sports like football or rugby while girls start dance or gymnastics.

After all, who would like see her daughter getting stuck into a ruck?? The truth is that rugby is actually a great sport for girls, and girls rock it!

Apart from being a very good sport to stay active, and teaching very important values like team playing, respect and discipline, there is one very important aspect of girls playing rugby: it helps building confidence.

Research shows that women tend to have less self-esteem later in life and confidence when it comes to career progression, and all this starts in the formative years.

On the other hand, girls who play rugby in a mixed team (until U14) learn to see that they are indeed good and as good as the boys. They are treated in the same way and they are not afraid of it!

They run, tackle, and score like anyone else on the pitch. They are respected like anyone else in the pitch, they follow the same rules and have the same opportunities. By experiencing equality in the field first hand, they grow into confident young women.

Speaking with parents of the girls who play rugby we also discovered that these girls enjoy a great level of camaraderie with the other girls in the team. A camaraderie that will help them through the teenage years and beyond.

The junior section has been going from strength to strength and regularily has around 20 kids between 9 and 15 years training within the ecole. The great news is that over half the players are now girls. And next month we hope to travel to Brussels to play our first competitive match against another club.

We were delighted to host Erik Williams from Galaxy London at two training sessions. Erik who is also a coach with Touch England was able to give the guys an insight into what it takes to play elite amateur sport. We also had a very succesful womens night with 9 ladies learning the sport of Touch.

This runs the first thursday of every month and is open to girls and women over 13 of any standard. It's a great introduction into game of Rugby for anyone wanting to try the sport. Also this month, RCL touch took a mixed team to the 2nd leg of the Belgian League Mixed Open Touch rugby series on the 13th March. We had a core of experienced players and several new women and juniors who took the plunge for their first taste of competitive touch.

There was a real sense of solidarity throughout the day and the cohesion

built progressively as the day went on. The co captains Hamish Cullen and Amaury Billay, did a great job organising the playing structures and subbing systems, allowing the newcomers to experience the challenge and intensity of competitive Touch as well as opportunities to succeed in their specific roles in the team.

The experienced players built a platform for us to put 6 tries past the best team in the league in our opening loss to Kituro, who have consistently been the best team in the Belgian league.

The team kicked on to record an impressive win against Liege Touch Rugby 9-6, only tired legs and fatigue let in the opposition to a few more tries towards the end of that game.


As we develop as a club and a team, our aim in this league was always to provide a framework for new players to both have a great time, and to experience a relative level of challenge.

There was great

team spirit throughout the day and we all contributed to a successful event.

Big thanks to all the players, especially the newcomers and the women/ Junior girls who joined us and played out of their skins. Without these players we frankly would not be able to compete at all in these tournaments.

Noa, The most valuable players awards went to Alessia Hancock who at 13 showed an intuitive understanding of the game and more than kept up with her older peers, and Antonine Pfaltzgraff whose heads up play, scything lines and big engine provided a backbone to our game in attack and defence.



To further enhance our teams for competitions, RCL has gotten A.I. cameras and video analysis software.

Thanks to our new sponsor, **Vistra** we were able to acquire two portable sports cameras from Spiideo with the associated analysis software. **Inbau** kindly donated an iPad to help setting up the games.

Further down the line, a third camera is expected to be installed permanently on a post next to the pitch in Cessange, so every match we play, can be livestreamed over the internet to fans and friends of RCL

"I am delighted that we received the Spiideo Portable SmartCam cameras – it provides the coaches with essential footage from training and competitions, enabling us to elevate the development of rugby for

all our teams, " said James Kent, director of rugby.

"The coaching team and I will use the software for individual and group analysis, expanding the players' knowledge of the game in many aspects. The cameras and video analysis software are essential to best prepare teams for our competitions.

It enhances technical meetings with the coaching team, allowing us to review the necessary moments of training and matches to prepare quality training sessions and identify areas for improvement.

Video analysis is also a useful tool in our coach development within the club and for seniors and junior coaches to review and reflect on their sessions"."
