Residential Services

Safe, welcoming homes are the foundation for dignity and belonging. Through Supported Living, Shared Living, and Congregate Living, people find stability, independence, and connection in environments where they can thrive.



MEET JASMINE

Jasmine has found stability, care, and belonging through AbleLight's Shared Living program. Moving into her Shared Living provider Catherine's home meant more than just a place to stay. It gave Jasmine the security of knowing she is valued and supported, and the opportunity to flourish as part of a family and community.

Employment Services

Too often, people with developmental disabilities face employment insecurity. At AbleLight, we believe everyone who wants to work should have the opportunity to do so. Employment Supports help people discover their gifts, prepare for success, and build confidence in meaningful jobs that strengthen both independence and community. We help each individual find work they are proud of in roles that reflect their passions and allow them to thrive.

Through AbleLight Employment Supports, Georgie found more than a job — she found confidence, pride, and a place where she belongs. With guidance and encouragement from her AbleLight Employment Specialist, Jerrica, Georgie began working as a concierge at Strata Spa at Garden of the Gods Resort, where she helps with daily operations and brightens everyone's day. Her role has helped her become more independent and discover the joy that comes from meaningful work.

Faith In Action

Fostering Spiritual Growth and Belonging

At AbleLight, our Christian foundation has guided us for over 120 years. Today, faith continues to be a central part of how we care for people with developmental disabilities.

Through our Faith Integration program, we live out our Value of Christian Love by helping individuals grow spiritually, experience belonging, and find joy in their communities. Each opportunity is offered in a way that honors personal choice, so faith can be expressed in the most meaningful ways to each individual.

Faith integration takes many forms. Some individuals find connection through JAM (Jesus and Me), a lively, interactive virtual worship time with music, prayer, and devotionals.



Others participate in Bible studies, prayer group, or are integrated into local congregations attending services and activities. Every expression reflects a simple truth: each person matters, is loved, and has gifts worth sharing.

AbleLight Thrift Shops are more than retail stores: they are our Mission in action, creating spaces of inclusion, community, and opportunity. Every shop creates meaningful jobs for people with developmental disabilities, generates revenue to support life-changing services, and provides affordable goods for local families.

CELEBRATING ALL ABILITIES AND OUR VOLUNTEERS

Every day in our thrift shops, inclusion comes to life as team members of all abilities work together, support one another, and serve their community with pride. Across our 12 stores, more than 250 dedicated volunteers, along with 130 individuals from school and community groups, share their time and talents to help our Mission thrive. AbleLight Thrift Shops demonstrate what can happen when purpose drives work: every store becomes a place where abilities are celebrated, neighbors rally together, and lives are transformed.





Today, more than 40% of AbleLight Thrift Shop team members are people with developmental disabilities, working as valued and paid employees.

These roles provide dignity, purpose, and belonging while showing what's possible when communities embrace inclusion. What began with a goal of 25% has grown well beyond expectations, and we continue to exceed it year after year.

MEET NICOLE

Nicole has been part of AbleLight Thrift Shops for nearly two decades, first as a volunteer and now as a paid team member. Her days are filled with responsibilities like caring for the sales floor and tagging jewelry, but what she values most are her coworkers and the joy of being part of the team.
