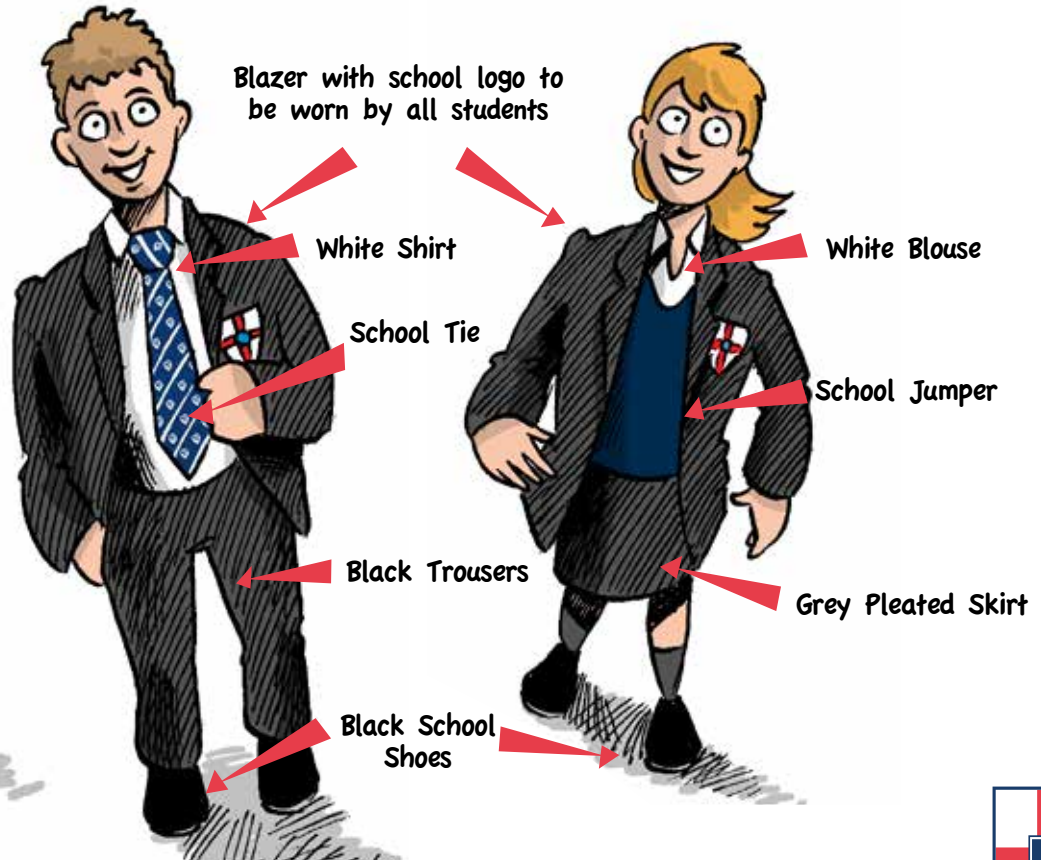


Top Tip from students: The number of students in a school like Charters can be overwhelming at times. It is good to remember that everyone has felt like this at some point.

Top Tip from students: Try not to leave everything to the last minute.

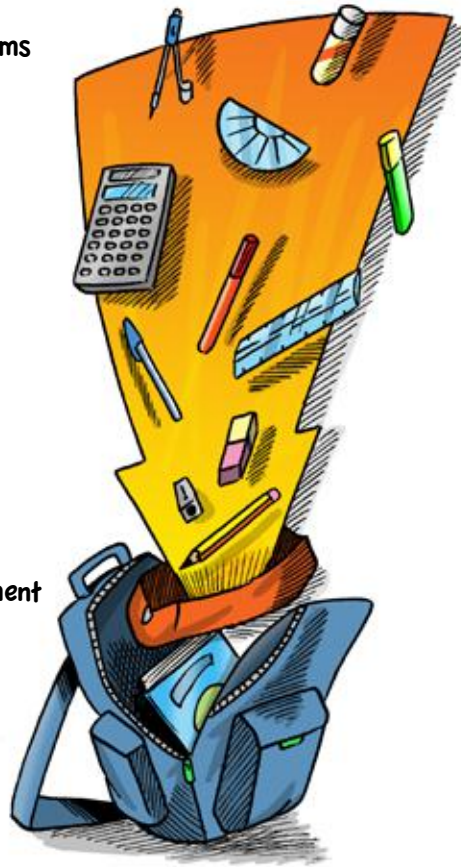


What else do I need to bring with me?

You will need the following items every day:

- Pencil Case
- Pencil and Sharpener
- Pencil Eraser
- Writing Pen - Black or Blue
- Marking Pen - Red or Green
- Ruler
- Scientific Calculator
- Protractor and Compass
- Highlighter
- Glue

Make sure you have a strong backpack to carry your equipment and books for the lessons you have that day.



In order to develop your key skills including independence, perseverance, practice, preparation and enrichment, teachers will set you home learning activities. This gives you the experience of working by yourself and helps to strengthen your knowledge of, and even extend, work begun in lessons.

How will I manage to carry everything I need when I am at school?

Use a locker. Most students only carry the books that they need for a couple of lessons at a time and keep the rest in their locker. You can book one from 1st June via www.ilsschools.co.uk for a small annual fee. They are very popular so book yours as soon as you can!



Top Tip from students: If you do not understand something in a lesson, just ask. Teachers are there to help you, so if you don't understand or need them to explain something again all you have to do is ask.

What will my school day look like?

You will have five lessons, eating break during period 3 and then one other break known as second break at 1:30 pm:

Period 1	9.00 am to 10.00 am
Period 2	10.00 am to 11.00 am
Period 3a	11.00 am to 11.28 am
Period 3b	11.30 am to 11.58 am
Period 3c	12.00 pm to 12.28 pm
Period 4	12.30 pm to 1.30 pm
Second Break	1.30 pm to 2.00 pm
Period 5	2.00 pm to 3.00 pm

You will move between classrooms for your lessons. This will be something new for you but don't worry - you will soon get to know your way around.



What subjects will I study?

You will study a fantastic range of subjects. Some you will be familiar with from primary and some will be new to you:

English, Maths, History, Biology, RE, Chemistry, Physics, French, Spanish, Personal Development, Drama, Music, Computing, Design Technology, Food and Textiles.

What about food?

We have a brilliant restaurant at Charters School! You can have snacks, full meals and street food.

You just use biometrics by using your finger to pay when you collect your food to charge your online account.

Top Tip from students: Before and after school, in between lessons and during break, staff members will be around, so if you ever need any help they will be more than happy to support.



What clubs can I take part in?

There are lots of Extra Curricular Activities on offer at lunchtime and after school, which include:

Poetry, Creative Writing, Book Club, Pride Soc, Junior Dance, Chess Club, Textiles Club, Science Club, STEM Club, Girls' Robotic Club, Cooking Club, Boys' and Girls' Hockey, Rugby and Football, Tennis, Netball, Table Tennis, Basketball, Badminton, Vocal Group, Chamber Choir, Junior Orchestra and Duke of Edinburgh's Award.

We also have regular school productions, sporting competitions, trips and events.

You can find out everything you need to know at our 'freshers fair' when you join us in September.

These activities are a great way to meet new people and make friends. Perhaps you will find something that you will love for the rest of your life. You may even discover your career direction. There are such brilliant opportunities that we recommend that you join at least a couple.

We talk about good mental health regularly in your Personal Development Lessons and Tutor Time and promote 'World Mental Health Day'.

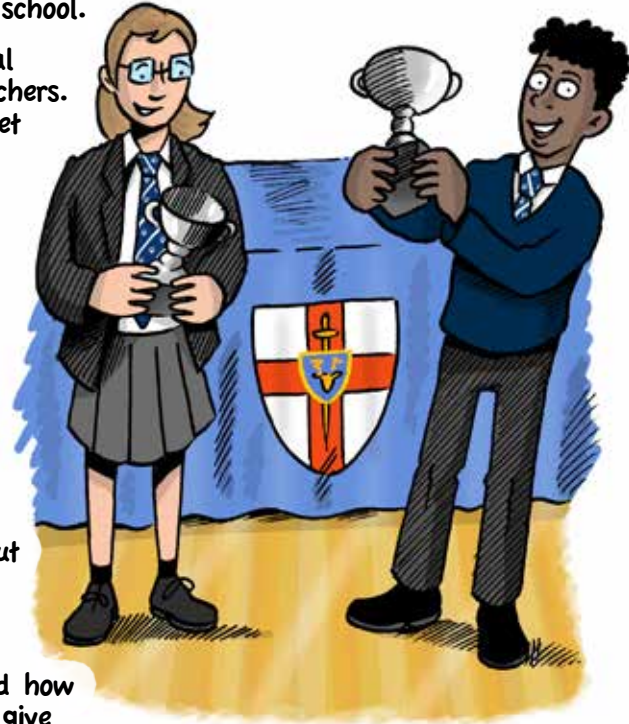
We also have a full time school ELSA to support the emotional needs of our students and our worried@ email address lets you share any worries or concerns you may have as you get used to secondary school life.
