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

The DJs who will thrive this year are the ones who adapt, refine their identity, and treat DJing as both an art and a craft.

Here's what DJs can expect in 2026 — and what they should aim to master to truly step up.


The DJ Is Becoming a Storyteller Again

In 2026, playlists alone won't cut it. Audiences are craving **journeys**, not just transitions. DJs who can build emotional arcs, control energy, and take people somewhere meaningful will stand out.

What to work on:

- Reading the room instead of relying on pre-planned sets
- Building tension and release
- Understanding musical storytelling, not just beatmatching

The best DJs don't just play tracks — they *guide* experiences.



Hybrid Skills Will Separate the Good from the Great

DJing is no longer isolated. The strongest performers are blending skills:

- DJing + music production
- DJing + live performance elements
- DJing + visuals or content creation

In 2026, even basic production knowledge gives you an edge — whether it's editing tracks, creating intro edits, or releasing original music.

Goal: Learn just enough production to make your sets yours.



Technology Will Get Smarter – DJs Must Get Sharper

Gear is becoming more powerful and more accessible. Controllers, standalone systems, stems, and performance features are no longer optional — they're expected. But tech won't replace skill.

DJs should aim to:

- Master stems and live remixing
- Use effects intentionally, not excessively
- Be comfortable on multiple setups
- Understand sound systems, not just decks

In 2026, the DJ who truly understands their gear will always outperform the one who just owns it.



Your Brand Matters as Much as Your Mix


Being a great DJ isn't enough if no one remembers you. DJs who grow in 2026 will treat themselves like brands.

This means:

- A clear musical identity

- Improve crowd-reading and storytelling
- Learn at least basic music production
- Release original music or edits
- Upgrade performance confidence
- Build a professional image
- Play fewer but better-quality gigs

Progress isn't about doing everything — it's about doing the right things well.

A LaTique

From Estcourt in KwaZulu-Natal to the heart of Johannesburg's music scene, **LaTique — also known as Mr Rare Dub** — represents a new generation of South African house music with depth, soul, and unmistakable identity. Blending deep grooves with rich musicality, his sound has resonated far beyond local dance floors, earning millions of streams and industry-wide recognition.

With the breakout success of the *Nyuku EP*, which surpassed 3 million streams, and the chart-dominating anthem **“Hayibaba”**, LaTique's rise reached a defining moment when the track claimed **Best Dance Song at the Metro FM Awards 2025**.

Now officially signed to **Universal Music South Africa** and collaborating with some of the country's most influential artists, LaTique isn't simply emerging — he's actively shaping the future of the sound.



In this interview, he reflects on his journey, his creative evolution, and the mindset driving his next chapter.



LaTique, 2025 was an incredible year for you. For those who may be discovering you for the first time, how would you describe who LaTique is - both as an artist and as a person behind the music?



LaTique is a very talented individual, not just musically, but in a lot of different dynamics, with talent in football, gaming and design. A very respectful human being who was grown in a stable family background. Apart from music, LaTique is very ambitious, with different other objectives he is currently chasing.



You started in Estcourt, KZN and found your way to Johannesburg's music scene. What were some of the key moments early in your journey that shaped your sound and identity?



With no hesitation, id give all the flowers to my big brother "Cilongo", who inspired me at a very young age, from teaching me how to play keys, to teaching me music production. Yes house music has always been playing in my head, as you can imagine, the older brother pumping the sounds all day everyday.



Your style is known for blending soulful rhythms with deep, unmistakable grooves. How did your signature sound develop over time, and who or what influenced it the most?



Initially, my music had less melodies and more percussions, until i grew into understanding that there's more to music than just dark songs, until I attempted to use the very same keyboard skills to enhance my sound.

Of course over the years, I have been exposed to multiple artists to influence my sound, but one artist that has forever inspired my sound has to be " Da Capo", what an honour to have him on my next project.





You're now officially part of the Universal Music South Africa roster and collaborating with major industry leaders like Lamiez Holworthy, Kabza De Small, Mdu a.k.a. TRP, and Thakzin. How has joining Universal and working with such big names influenced your growth as an artist and shaped your sound today?



First and foremost, it is a true honor to be part of the Universal Music Group, this is something I did not expect to be part of so sudden, more especially since I feel like my sound needs lots of improvement ways been great though!

This is a huge opportunity for me as my perspective in music has shifted drastically and I no have a different view and approach to the scene and when even in studio, I am fully motivated to put out my best, especially since I now has access to getting my wish collaborations/artist, but most importantly, it is being around people that motivate me to unleash the best version of myself, I am excited.



SP MAGAZINE Your Nyuku EP made a huge impact, crossing millions of streams. What inspired the project, and what message did you want listeners to take away from it?



The song 'Nyuku' was produced at Piano Hub, which gave me so much motivation to produce other songs due to the excitement and the experience i had received with Kabza. Just like that, the whole EP was complete within a single month.

This project was simply to show my audience my full potential and capabilities, and to make them aware that there is more to what they know, and trust, there is still a whole lot more!



'Hayi baba' became a major anthem across Africa and won Best Dance Song at the Metro FM Awards 2025. What was the creative process behind the track, and did you expect it to blow up the way it did?



Honestly, the collaboration was not planned at all, it was Chronical Deep And I in studio at Piano Hub, and with other artists around the house, well, Leeheleza was gaming in the other room, I called him over to listen and just like that, we has the best dance song of 2025, God is greater by day haha!, and no, non of us expected the song to blow up as much.





Winning a Metro FM Award and landing a feature on The Circle was a massive moment. How did that recognition influence you personally and professionally?



Well that was a very huge turn in my career, as that is when it sank in my head that I was big artist, I honestly wasn't even thinking of awards at that time, it was God walking overtime. Professionally it influenced me into getting more recognition, especially from people who looked down on me in the game.

Personally it just gave me all the confidence you can possibly think off, I now believe in myself so much, and thank God because this is something I have been struggling with for the longest time.

Speak about 'The Circle' wow man, till this day, that is one of the greatest stages I have been on, and the best set thus far.



With 2026 on the horizon, what can fans expect next from LaTique - new music, collaborations, or any big moves you're excited to share?



There is so much to expect in 2026, A lot of music and collaborations of course, but for now, id like to keep in deep in my chest haha!

Bringing Beat-Making Back to Its Roots




When AlphaTheta and Serato join forces,

the result is never ordinary — and SLAB is proof. As the first-ever MIDI pad controller designed specifically for Serato Studio, SLAB restores beat-making to what it always should be: instinctive, expressive, and deeply hands-on.



It's a return to the raw feel of creating music with your fingers, not your mouse. SLAB isn't about adding more complexity to your setup — it's about giving producers, DJs, and creators a tool that brings them closer to the music.

Every feature is built to sharpen your workflow, speed up ideas, and make creativity feel natural again.



Pads That Feel Alive

At the center of SLAB are its 16 velocity-sensitive RGB pads. They respond to every touch — soft ghost notes, heavy kicks, fast rolls — giving beat-makers the expressive range they've been missing in a laptop-only workflow.

The pad grid doubles as an intuitive step-sequencer, letting you “paint” in beats, adjust swing, tweak velocity, and shape rhythm entirely from the hardware.

There's no setup. No mapping. Just instant connection to your samples and kits.

A Workflow Designed for Flow

SLAB is built around one idea: keep you in the creative zone.

- **The big multi-function Dial** makes sample browsing, scrubbing, chopping, and editing feel effortless. Hover a parameter in Serato Studio — the Dial takes control of it instantly.
- **Touch-sensitive encoders** give you direct access to EQ, FX, stems, filters, and sound-shaping tools, with clean visual feedback on the built-in display.
- **A long touch strip** lets you sweep filters, bend pitch, modulate FX, or perform transitions with a single finger.

The hardware feels modern, but the workflow brings back everything producers loved about early samplers and grooveboxes: immediacy, simplicity, and instinct.

Built for Serato Creators

Because SLAB is deeply integrated with Serato Studio, it behaves more like an extension of the software than a separate controller. It instantly controls sampling, sequencing, stems, effects, automation, and performance functions — with almost no learning curve.

For DJs growing into production, this is the bridge they've been waiting for.

For producers wanting to tighten their workflow, SLAB removes friction.

For finger-drummers and pad-players, it feels like home.

It also works seamlessly with Serato Sample and Serato DJ Pro, making SLAB equally comfortable in a studio, DJ booth, or live performance setup.



Why SLAB Matters

In a world full of controllers trying to be everything at once, SLAB does one thing exceptionally well: it brings you closer to your creativity. It strips away the barriers between your ideas and your music. The pads are expressive, the controls are intuitive, and the workflow encourages experimentation.

SLAB is a reminder of why beat-making took over the world in the first place — because music creation feels best when it's physical, immediate, and emotional.





JACK EMERY


Few artists rise through the melodic house and techno landscape with as much clarity of purpose and emotional depth as Jack Emery.

A multi-instrumentalist turned producer, Emery brings a rare musicality to the dance floor — blending cinematic atmospheres, expressive vocals, and deep, rolling basslines into a sound that feels both intimate and expansive.

As a key figure within Nora En Pure's Purified Records, he has carved out a space that is unmistakably his own, with performances stretching from Ultra Europe to Miami Music Week and releases championed by some of the biggest names in modern melodic dance music.

Fresh off the success of *Halo* reaching #1 on SiriusXM Chill and following a series of standout US performances, Emery returns with his newest Purified release, *Walked Too Far*, a track that reflects the emotional storytelling and production finesse that define his artistic identity.

In this exclusive interview, he opens up about his journey, his creative process, and what fans can expect next.





For those who are discovering you for the first time, can you introduce yourself and share a bit about what defines your sound and artistic identity?



I'm currently based in San Diego, California and come from a diverse background of music from playing cello in a symphony to playing guitar in a rock band.

This musical background and knowledge of music theory has shaped my dj and producer career as I've dove fully into melodic house and techno.

Over the past few years I've had several releases on Purified, Nora En Pure's label and performed events including Purified San Diego, direct support for Nora En Pure, Le Youth, and Jerro. I love creating tracks with big emotional vocals, cinematic atmospheres, and deep basses.

You've become a strong presence in Purified Records. How did your relationship with the label begin, and what has it meant for your development as an artist?



My first house music set I ever attended was a Nora En Pure set at Coachella in the Yuma tent. I was so inspired by her and eventually started producing electronic music.

Once I had enough solid demos, I sent my best demo at the time to her label and that track became my first release “Believe”. I was ecstatic to see her playing it live around the world and knew this was a great home for my music.

Since then I've really appreciated the mentorship and freedom the label gives me in my artistic direction and am excited for continued partnership!




Nora En Pure has been a consistent supporter of your music. How has working closely with her and the Purified community shaped your journey in the melodic house and techno scene?



Her support has meant the world to me. I feel very grateful to have such a legendary pioneer of deep house help guide me and support my growth as an artist and dj.

Our connection continues to grow stronger and I always love performing at her shows and Purified events and testing new demos with the amazing Purified crowd.



Your new single 'Walked Too Far' is releasing on November 28th 2025 via Purified Records. What inspired this track, and how did the initial idea come to life?



This track started as an idea between myself and the co-producer and vocalist Rob Tirea a few months back. We wanted to blend my deep and melodic style with his signature melodic/indie dance vibe and everything came so naturally between us.

His beautiful, emotional vocal came first and then the bass, atmospheres and synths came to support that amazing vocal. We really wanted a deep and complex track filled with emotion while still keeping some driving dance rhythm.



The single blends deep basslines, shimmering synth work, and emotive, indie-style vocals. What was your approach to creating this balance of energy and emotional depth?



The most important thing was letting that vocal shine through and then layering the synths and basses around that. So I think letting the vocal have its space and then having a contrast to the deep bass was key in this track.




Your work is said to have an immersive, storytelling nature. What feelings or experiences are you hoping fans take away from 'Walked Too Far'?



I hope listeners can lean into the themes of light vs dark and loneliness that are central to the lyrics.

Feelings of introspection and deep emotion were key to creating the overall depth of this track.





The artwork shot by Rachel Moore depicts Aakapa Bay in the Marquesas Islands and ties into themes of Marine life, nature and conservation. How does this visual concept connect to the creative vision behind the single?



Rachel's work is amazing and I love tying in the ocean in my music. I myself am a scuba diver and also live not far from the ocean in San Diego so this directly translates in my life and music.

The sunset and contrast of the lush palm trees with the power of the ocean waves gives a reminder of the light vs dark theme in the track and the “golden hour” feeling in “Walked Too Far”.

Jack Emery’s momentum shows no signs of slowing. With new releases on the horizon, collaborations across the melodic spectrum, and a growing presence on international stages, 2026 is shaping up to be a defining year for the rising producer.

His ability to merge musical depth with crowd-moving energy continues to set him apart, and *Walked Too Far* stands as another milestone in a career built on intention, emotion, and sonic storytelling.

As Emery steps into the next chapter, one thing is clear: **his journey is only just beginning, and the melodic house world is listening.**





From the heart of Tshwane emerges a DJ whose mission is more than entertainment — it's emotional transformation. **Justine Winterboer**, professionally known as **DJ Justine**, has become one of South Africa's most compelling sonic storytellers, crafting euphoric journeys that move effortlessly between melodic trance, techno, EDM, and house.

Mentored by the iconic **Lady Lea** and shaped by the influence of DJ Surge, DJ Dizzy, DJ Morgan, and Dirkie Coetze, Justine channels mentorship, passion, and raw musical instinct into a sound that is both powerful and deeply personal.

Her performances at **We Are Trance**, **Trancemission**, **NYE Decades of Dance 2024**, **Re-En-Trance**, and other major events have earned her a reputation for turning dance floors into spaces of connection, release, and healing.

Diverse, emotive, and unapologetically expressive, DJ Justine represents a new wave of artists who treat DJing as an art form — one rooted in storytelling, transformation, and shared human experience.





Justine, for those discovering you for the first time, how would you describe the essence of your sound and the energy you bring to every set?




My sound is rooted in emotion—melodic trance at its core, but always infused with the pulse of techno, EDM, and house. I want every set to feel like a journey, where the crowd is lifted, challenged, and ultimately healed through rhythm. The energy I bring is high-voltage yet deeply human: it's about connection, about creating a space where people can lose themselves and find themselves at the same time.




You've carved out a unique space in the realms of melodic trance, techno, EDM, and house. How did your journey into DJing begin, and what drew you to these genres specifically?



My journey began with pure fascination—watching how music could transform a room, shift moods, and unite strangers. Trance drew me in first with its emotional depth, then techno and house added grit and groove, while EDM gave me accessibility and reach. I didn't choose genres so much as they chose me. Each one offered a different emotional language, and together they became the palette I use to paint my sets.





Being mentored by icons like Lady Lea and influenced by DJ Surge, DJ Dizzy, DJ Morgan, and Dirkie Coetzee is an incredible foundation. How have these mentors shaped your sound and artistic identity?



Lady Lea was my saving light—she made me realize that dreams do come true. Her guidance gave me discipline and professionalism, teaching me to respect both the craft and the audience. DJ Surge and DJ Dizzy showed me how to play with energy, to read and shape a crowd.

DJ Morgan and Dirkie Coetzee encouraged me to lean into melody and storytelling. Together, they gave me both technical grounding and artistic courage, shaping me into someone who doesn't just play tracks, but creates experiences that linger long after the music stops.



You've performed at landmark events like We Are Trance, Trancemission, and NYE Decades of Dance 2024. Looking back, which moment in your career felt truly defining - where you realised, "This is exactly where I'm meant to be"?



Performing at NYE Decades of Dance 2024 was a turning point, but playing at H2O was truly a dream come true. That stage had always been on my horizon, and stepping onto it felt like a milestone I'd been chasing for years.

Another defining moment was playing alongside DJ Dirkie Coetzee at We Are Trance—that collaboration made me realize how deeply I love curating music, not just mixing tracks but shaping emotional journeys for the crowd.




Your sets are described as emotional journeys and even therapeutic experiences. How do you approach crafting a set that resonates so deeply with your audience?



I approach every set like writing a story. There's a beginning that invites, a build that excites, a climax that liberates, and a resolution that soothes. I think about how people might feel when they arrive, and where I want them emotionally by the end.

It's less about technical perfection and more about creating a safe, immersive space where people can let go, heal, and celebrate themselves through music.





You're known for being incredibly diverse across genres. How do you balance experimenting with new sounds while staying true to the core of who you are as an artist?



Experimentation is essential—I'm always exploring new sounds, textures, and rhythms. But my anchor is melody and emotion. That's the compass that keeps me true to myself.

No matter how far I push into techno's intensity or house's groove, the thread of storytelling through sound remains constant. It allows me to evolve without losing the essence of who I am as an artist.




From intimate crowds to massive festival stages, your energy always connects. What do you find most rewarding about performing live?



The most rewarding part is connection. Watching a crowd move as one, seeing someone close their eyes and surrender to the music—that's magic. Whether it's fifty people in an intimate club or thousands at a festival, the shared energy is unforgettable.

It's not just performance; it's communion. That exchange of energy between artist and audience is what keeps me chasing the next stage.






As you continue pushing creative boundaries, what exciting projects, goals, or evolutions can fans look forward to from DJ Justine in 2026?



In 2026, my focus is firmly on trance—my niche, my heartbeat. I'm working on producing my own track to bring fresh life back into the genre while staying authentic and true to my roots. Fans can expect to see me at more events and clubs, and yes, I'm pursuing the dream of playing at H2O again—hint hint!

Another big dream is to share the stage with my female DJ idol, Nifra, who's set to play at We Are Trance on January 31st, 2026. For me, it's about authenticity, passion, and keeping trance alive in every set.



More than two decades behind the decks have shaped Vimo into more than just a DJ. He is an artist, a tastemaker, and a brand — known for bouncy, uplifting energy that connects instantly with the crowd while staying true to the essence of authentic house music.

In this interview, Vimo reflects on his journey, the evolution of the scene, and the mindset that keeps him relevant in an ever-changing industry.





Your journey started in Port Elizabeth and eventually took you to global stages. Looking at where you are now, how do you feel your sound and identity as an artist have evolved over the years?



My sound has always carried a certain energy, bouncy, uplifting and made for people who are up for it on the dance floor. Over the years, my identity has grown beyond just being a DJ.


I've evolved into both an artist and a brand, while still staying true to the sound and feeling that people know me for.



From "Sugar Sundays" at Truth Nightclub to the current South African nightlife scene – how do you think the culture and energy of local dance floors have changed, and what role do you feel you play in shaping that energy today?



The culture, sound and vibe are always changing, especially with trends and what's popular at the time. The key is adapting your sound without losing your identity. Music will always evolve, but I truly believe house music will never die. My role is to read the room, bring the right energy, and keep that authentic house music spirit alive on the dance floor.





You've played in countries like Dubai, Hong Kong, Vietnam and more. Are there any new international destinations or recent tours that have influenced your approach to DJing in 2025?



South Africa has a very strong and influential music culture, and honestly, I haven't felt the need to change my approach based on international trends. We're quite forward-thinking here, and our sound often leads rather than follows. That confidence in our local music continues to shape how I play, wherever I am in the world.



After such a long and varied career, what currently inspires you the most behind the decks, and how do you keep your sets feeling fresh and relevant for today's audiences?



It's always been the music. That hasn't changed. Keeping my sets fresh comes down to constant research and digging for the newest, freshest beats. I've always believed that as DJs, part of our job is to educate the crowd musically while still making sure everyone is having a good time.





You've always been a strong supporter of South African music. How do you see the local electronic music scene right now, and what excites you most about where it's heading?




South African electronic music is globally recognised, and the level of talent here is incredible. There are so many producers and DJs pushing boundaries, and I'm excited to see what the next generation comes up with. The future of our scene looks very strong.



Electronic music has shifted a lot with the rise of streaming, AI tools, and evolving sub-genres. How have you adapted your creative process to stay fresh while keeping your signature sound?



Streaming has become a big part of how I discover and access music. That said, I'm still very old school in many ways. I haven't really used AI in my music, and I still rely on methods that have worked for me over the years. It's about adapting to new technology where it makes sense but ultimately doing what works for you as an artist.





With decades of experience behind you, how has your creative mindset changed when preparing for sets or new music compared to earlier in your career?



To be honest, my set preparation hasn't changed much over the years. I've developed a simple method that works for me, and I stick to it. Experience has taught me to trust my instincts more and let the music guide the journey.



You've built a loyal fanbase over two decades. What message do you have for your supporters, and what exciting projects, releases, or events should we look forward to from Vimo in the near future?



I just want to say thank you to everyone who supports me. Without you, there's no DJ, no vibe and no parties. Your support means everything. I've got some really exciting projects in the works for next year, so keep an ear out, there's a lot more coming.

With decades of experience guiding his instincts, Vimo remains deeply rooted in what matters most: the music, the crowd, and the shared energy of the dance floor.

His respect for South African sound, combined with an openness to evolution without compromise, continues to define his presence both locally and internationally.

As he looks ahead to new projects and performances, one thing is certain — Vimo's journey is far from over.

Grounded, grateful, and still driven by the same passion that started it all, he continues to prove that longevity in electronic music is built on authenticity, trust in your craft, and never losing touch with the people who dance to your sound.

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


