Throughout 2022, Haiti faced significant political and social unrest, which had a profound impact on the communities we are dedicated to serving, as well as our partners, team members, and their families. In this year's annual report, we proudly acknowledge and celebrate the concrete impact we have made together. With your support, Hope for Haiti has provided monetary and technical assistance to 6,700 students and more than 400 teachers, ensuring access to quality education. In 2022, Hope for Haiti procured and imported \$31M worth of medication, medical supplies, and equipment, benefiting more than 50 partners who collectively serve over 1 million children, parents, and grandparents in southern Haiti. Our healthcare team accomplished the extraordinary feat of providing 118,000 healthcare consultations, both at our Infirmary St. Etienne and through the tireless efforts of our mobile clinic team. These tangible achievements exemplify our commitment to making a lasting difference in the lives of those we serve, and they reflect who we are: Hope for Haiti.

Today, we are thrilled to share that Hope for Haiti was recognized with a perfect 100% score on Charity Navigator, a distinction held by less than 2% of U.S. nonprofits. This remarkable recognition serves as a testament to our unwavering dedication to transparency, accountability, and the highest standards of ethical practice. We were also proud recipients of the highest ratings on GuideStar and a clean financial audit, illuminating our steadfast commitment to financial stewardship and outcomes-driven impact. It is through this recognition that we assure you of our commitment to maximizing your contributions to create lasting positive change in Haiti.

As we look to the future, we acknowledge that our journey is far from complete. The road ahead in Haiti will present challenges, requiring unwavering support, big ideas, and collective action. From Adversity to Achievement: Jeunise's Story

Jeunice Guillaume is one of 50 Hope for Haiti scholars who receive a \$1,000 annual scholarship to attend college in Haiti. Like many young Haitians, Jeunise has seen much hardship, but she stands out among her peers for her keen sense of community, her courage, and her determination to succeed. First seen on the cover of our 2016 Annual Gratitude Report, Jeunise is now 28 years old. Her parents, Lila and Jeune, are farmers and have seven children.

From her early school days, Jeunise's resilience has shone through. After a setback in her studies, she found her place as a 10-year old second grader at Ecole Frère Unis de Ravine Sable, which (at the time) was only a makeshift structure made of wood and tarp. In 2007, when she was 12 years old, Hope for Haiti began the construction of a formal three-classroom school block. Although she was just a small child, Jeunise actively participated in the construction by carrying heavy rocks and water, symbolizing her commitment to her community and the next generation. "I did that for myself, for my little brothers and sisters and for my country," said Jeunise. Over the years, she and the community have witnessed the remarkable growth of her childhood school into a compound of 19 spacious and child-friendly classrooms, administrative space, a computer lab, a depot and a sanitation block with handwashing stations.



Jeunise’s academic journey faced further obstacles when the 2010 earthquake struck Port-au-Prince, where she had moved to further her education after the sixth grade. Despite the setback, she continued her studies in the community of Cavaillon before returning to Ravine Sable in 2012, where she remained until she completed her high school studies in 2017.

In addition to her academic pursuits, Jeunise has a fierce entrepreneurial spirit. While studying, she crafted and sold straw bags in the local markets, and even opened a small cosmetics business after securing a loan. Through her efforts, she not only met her own needs but also supported her siblings’ education, lightening the financial burden on her parents.

Jeunise’s dreams soared when she was awarded a Hope for Haiti college scholarship upon her graduation from high school. With unwavering determination, she left her village and moved to Les Cayes to pursue her studies at SITA (Seed International Institute of Tropical Agriculture), where she is set to graduate in 2024 as a certified agronomist. This scholarship, in Jeunise’s own words, meant the world to her: “Frankly I did know how I would go to college; I did not have the means to afford that. So, my heart jumped in my chest when I was offered that scholarship. It meant the world to me. Amid my despair, suddenly I saw my dream to become an agronomist being a reality.”

As Jeunise progresses through her college journey, she exudes confidence in her ability to create a better future not only for herself but also for her community. “All that I want is to succeed in life and be able to help my community,” said Jeunise. “This is the only way I can thank everyone who has supported me all along my life. I won’t cross my arms and wait for a job in an office after getting my degree. I will create my own agricultural farm even if I’ll have to start with my family plot.”

Three years ago, Jeunise had a child of her own - a daughter named Lourdes-Mhia. “Thanks to Hope for Haiti, I’m on track to graduate next year,” said Jeunise. “As a young mother, I must be able to take care of my child and give her the best education.”

Jeunise’s unwavering dedication and tenacity is a testament to the transformative power of education and opportunities made possible through your support. Her story reminds us of the profound impact that donors like you help make in empowering young people like Jeunise to overcome adversity, break the cycle of poverty, and build a brighter future for themselves and their communities.

Empowering Rural Communities with Access to Healthcare Through Mobile Clinics

In rural southern Haiti, access to quality healthcare remains a significant challenge, especially in the aftermath of the 2021 earthquake. Through Hope for Haiti's mobile clinics, our Public Health team has worked tirelessly to provide healthcare services to underserved populations for over five years. For Vila Pradet (pictured right), mobile clinics have been truly life-changing.

At 54 years old, Vila resides in Baradères. Her life took a devastating turn when her home was destroyed during the 2021 earthquake, forcing her family to live in a tent. In November of the same year, Vila's health began to deteriorate. Weight loss and persistent itching became daily struggles, likely exacerbated by the stress of her situation and the financial difficulties her family faced. Determined to seek medical help, Vila embarked on a challenging journey to a hospital in a distant town. She managed to gather the funds for transportation and consultation fees despite her limited means, and received the life-altering news that she has diabetes and high blood pressure.

Sadly, the financial burden of ongoing care and medication proved overwhelming for Vila. She was only able to purchase metformin in small quantities, so she resorted to makeshift remedies, such as tea infusions, and self-medicating with aloe vera. Unsurprisingly, her condition failed to improve, leaving her desperate for a long-term solution.

At the insistence of a neighbor, Vila decided to attend a Hope for Haiti mobile clinic in her community, where she received free treatment and a month's supply of medication for her high blood pressure and diabetes. She also underwent a free cervical cancer screening, a test she had previously had to pay for at two other healthcare facilities. Vila was delighted to learn that the screen was negative. She was also invited to attend weekly Diabetes Club meetings at Hope for Haiti's Infirmary St. Etienne.

"Your help and support mean a lot to the community of Baradères," said Vila. "I am extremely grateful, as I could not have afforded this life-saving care. Thanks to the mobile clinic team, I have all the medication and information I need to manage my health."

Soeur Manite Delva (pictured here) is a 75 year-old mother of 10 who received a water filtration system and emergency relief supplies in the aftermath of the 2021 earthquake. She lives alone, but through the help of her neighbor Papouch (also pictured) she was able to attend a training on how to maintain and use her water filtration system. When asked recently if she is still using the system, she said "yes, and I am grateful to still have access to safe and clean drinking water. Thank you, thank you, Hope for Haiti."



Preventing Cholera: the Importance of Handwashing and Clean Water

More than a decade after the UN peacekeepers contaminated Haiti's water with cholera, and for the first time in over three years, cholera was unfortunately detected once again in Haiti in 2022. This latest challenge to public health and the livelihood of Haitian families came during a period of acute and unsustainable unrest and insecurity in Haiti, coupled with the continued long-term recovery efforts from the 2021 earthquake, as well as the COVID-19 pandemic.

The re-emergence of cholera in Haiti serves as a stark reminder of the ongoing challenges faced by communities in accessing clean water. With limited access to safe drinking water and proper sanitation, the risk of cholera transmission remains a significant concern. Hope for Haiti recognizes the critical importance of providing sustainable solutions for clean water access, empowering communities to prevent the spread of diseases and fostering a healthier future for all Haitians.

In honor of Global Handwashing Day, our team held a series of detailed handwashing demonstrations, water filtration system trainings, and discussions at our Infirmary St. Etienne and throughout our impact area. Pictured below are photos from the events. Said one young man who attended: "I'm glad to have learned the proper way to wash hands, which takes longer than you think. Now I can stay healthy and in school."



Innovative Solutions for Immediate Aid: the Power of Digital Cash Assistance

Through Hope for Haiti's Economic Development Program, 100 small ti machann (small merchants) in southern Haiti received \$100 in USD via Digicel's MonCash mobile cash transfer platform to support their livelihoods and businesses after the 2021 earthquake. Read below to meet Rachelle and Dominique, two mothers who were both selected as part of the program:



Dominique (pictured left) has two children, ages six and 10 years old – but they are not her only responsibility. Dominique is currently head of an eight person household. She lives in the middle of town and sells street food from her stall. With \$100, Dominique was able to double her income and can now afford to start a second small business. She sells more during the school year at her street food stall, and adding a second business with additional food products enables her to have enough income to take care of her family and save for emergencies.

Rachelle (pictured right) has six children, and she continues to work every day so she can provide for them, even when grown. She previously took care of livestock before opening her stall at the market, but unfortunately, all of her animals died from flooding during Hurricane Matthew in 2016. Rachelle has been trying to get back on her feet ever since. Though \$100 may not be enough to purchase a cow, the first thing Rachelle intends to do with her funds is purchase some type of livestock. Her daughter, Sofia, comes to the market a couple hours every day to help her mom and has dreams of becoming a nurse.

The Power of Your Monthly Gift:



Medication & Supplies \$5

\$5 procures, ships, and distributes \$63.75 worth of critical gift-in-kind (medications, medical supplies, etc.) to support cholera prevention/treatment, and other communicable illnesses.



Basic Patient Consultation \$16

\$16 provides one health consultation, medication & supplies, referrals, and health education for children, parents, and grandparents at Hope for Haiti's infirmary and through mobile clinics conducted by our doctors and nurses.



Consultation & Bloodwork \$30

\$30 supports our Healthcare Program, including providing one medical consultation for one patient at our infirmary or mobile clinic, which includes any necessary bloodwork and medications.



Educator Support \$50

\$50 supplies one teacher with a direct cash transfer to supplement their salary for one month.



In-Home Water Filter \$65

\$65 dispatches one home water filtration system to a family in rural or urban area who lacks access to clean drinking water, and who is at risk of contracting waterborne illnesses such as cholera, giardia, E.coli, and other parasites.



Scholarship Support \$84

\$84 a month helps provide one student with a college scholarship for one year


