FWC2026 MOBILE TICKETS APP

All ticket buyers receive their purchased tickets through the **FWC 2026 Mobile Tickets App**.

To receive your tickets, you'll need to download the FWC 2026 Mobile Tickets App. Log in using the **email address** you used to buy the tickets.

Please note! Your tickets will not be sent by email and cannot be downloaded. Screenshots or photos of your tickets are invalid and will not be accepted. If you run into any problems, a help desk is available at every stadium (on match day only).

On match day, a QR code will appear on your mobile ticket in the app one hour before the gates open. Make sure your phone is charged when you arrive at the stadium (a power bank comes in handy). You won't need Wi-Fi or Bluetooth.

MOBILITY

Vancouver has an extensive public transport network, allowing supporters to move easily around the city and to and from the House of the Devils and the stadium.

On the official [host city](#) website, you will find all practical mobility information, including arrival in Vancouver, local transport options, the stadium, and city attractions.



By car

We strongly discourage travelling to the stadium by car. Parking in the area is limited and prices are very high on matchdays. Significant traffic congestion around the stadium should also be expected.



Taxi & rideshare drop-off

Arriving at the House of the Devils by taxi, Uber, or Lyft? Get dropped off at **1510 Quebec** (corner of Quebec St & Terminal Ave), right next to Science World. This is the closest drop-off point. An alternative drop-off location is at **525 W 2nd Avenue**, near Olympic Village Station on the Canada SkyTrain Line.



By public transport

The House of the Devils and the stadium are easily accessible by public transport. The closest station is Main Street–Science World.

Plan your journey [via](#):

- If you travel via the **Millennium Line**, transfer to the Expo Line at Commercial–Broadway Station
- If you travel via the **Canada Line**, transfer to the Expo Line at Vancouver City Centre or Waterfront Station to reach Main Street–Science World



STADIUM RULES

All FIFA stadiums enforce a clear bag policy to ensure a safe and smooth entry process. Only transparent bags made of plastic, vinyl or PVC are allowed, with maximum dimensions of 30 x 15 x 30 cm. Small wallets, clutches or handbags up to 11.5 x 16.5 cm are an exception and do not need to be transparent.

All bags are checked at the entrance.

See the full list of prohibited items [here](#). Below is a summary of the prohibited items:

- Weapons and sharp or dangerous objects
- Explosives and flammable materials
- Glass, bottles and hard packaging that could cause injury
- Illegal substances and drugs
- Flares, fireworks and smoke bombs
- Large or hard objects that could compromise safety or block the view
- Professional camera or recording equipment without authorisation
- Political, discriminatory or offensive materials or banners
- Objects that could obstruct passage, sightlines or evacuation

FIFA FAN MATERIALS

There are clear guidelines and rules for using fan materials inside the stadium. Below is an overview of what's allowed without prior approval, what requires permission, and which rules of use apply inside the stadium. Each request must be submitted individually.

ALLOWED WITHOUT PRIOR APPROVAL

Supporters may bring the following materials without a prior request:

- Flags and banners smaller than 2 m x 1.5 m.
 - Flexible plastic flagpoles up to 1 m long and 1 cm in diameter.
- Note:** metal poles are strictly prohibited.
- Replica trophies, provided they pose no safety risk.

MATERIALS THAT REQUIRE PRIOR APPROVAL

For certain larger or specific fan materials, prior permission must be requested through the FIFA Fan Materials Entry Portal.

- Flags and banners larger than 2 m x 1.5 m but smaller than 4 m x 2 m.
- Tifos (maximum 10 m x 10 m)
- Musical instruments

RULES OF USE INSIDE THE STADIUM

When using fan materials inside the stadium, the following rules must always be observed:

- Blocking other supporters' sightlines is prohibited.
- Safety signs, sponsor boards, LED screens and television cameras must not be obstructed.
- Hanging or installing materials in the stadium in advance is not permitted. Supporters bringing materials must arrive at least 2 hours before kick-off for inspection.
- The approval certificate must be presented at the entrance whenever prior permission was required.



SAFETY

Vigilance & emergencies

While traveling and on match days, it's important to stay alert at all times, especially in busy tourist areas where pickpockets may be active. Keep a close eye on your personal belongings and carry valuables securely and close to your body.

Climate

Climate Vancouver enjoys mild summer weather, with daytime temperatures typically around 20°C, cooler evenings and a chance of rain. Pack layers and a light waterproof jacket or poncho, and bring sunscreen for the brighter days. Stay hydrated and dress for changeable conditions.

Teamspirit

Being a supporter is something you do together. Look out for one another on the way and in and around the stadium, and make sure everyone can enjoy the experience safely and comfortably.

Agree on a clear meeting point outside the stadium with your group in advance. That way you can easily find each other again, even when it's crowded or your phone signal is poor.

ASSISTANCE AND SUPPORT

Consular assistance

In the event of a critical situation (loss of identity documents, a serious accident or an arrest), you should contact the Belgian consular services. For Vancouver, this falls under the jurisdiction of the Consulate General in Montreal (+1 514 849 73 94 | montreal@diplobel.fed.be) / consular emergencies +1 514 236 54 02). A consular hub will be set up in Vancouver (+1 438 303 87 96). This number will be reachable from 25/06 at 11:00 until 28/06 at 09:00 (local time).

What the embassy/consulate can do:

- Issue a temporary travel document
- Provide contact details for a local lawyer or doctor
- Quickly inform family and/or friends in an emergency
- Liaise with local authorities to locate missing persons
- If you are arrested, it is essential to ask to use consular assistance

Emergencies outside opening hours

If a life-threatening emergency arises at night or over the weekend, call the main number of the relevant consulate and listen to the recorded message in full; it provides the on-call number for extreme cases.

Precautions

It is strongly recommended that you register your stay on the Travellers Online platform so that the authorities can locate you in the event of a major crisis. You are also advised to keep a digital copy of your passport and your visa (ESTA or eTA) in a secure place (for example, a secure mailbox) to make any replacement procedures easier.







TIPS & TRICKS

LOCAL LIFE



'TIPPING CULTURE'

Tipping is the norm, because service staff often earn a low base wage; in restaurants and bars you usually add 15–20% on top of the bill. Tips are also expected for taxis, hairdressers and deliveries, whereas in Belgium this is fairly exceptional and voluntary. Watch out: sometimes a tip is already added to the bill automatically as a 'gratuity.' In that case, you're not obliged to leave anything extra on top.

Alcohol



- In Canada (British Columbia), the legal drinking age is 19.
- Drinking alcohol in public is prohibited in Canada.
- A photo ID is required as proof, and your passport will also be requested at the stadiums

Police

Police in Canada have a low tolerance for 'jokes,' so don't play the comedian during checks at airports or on the street...

Visa-free travel (for Belgians): what do you need to arrange?

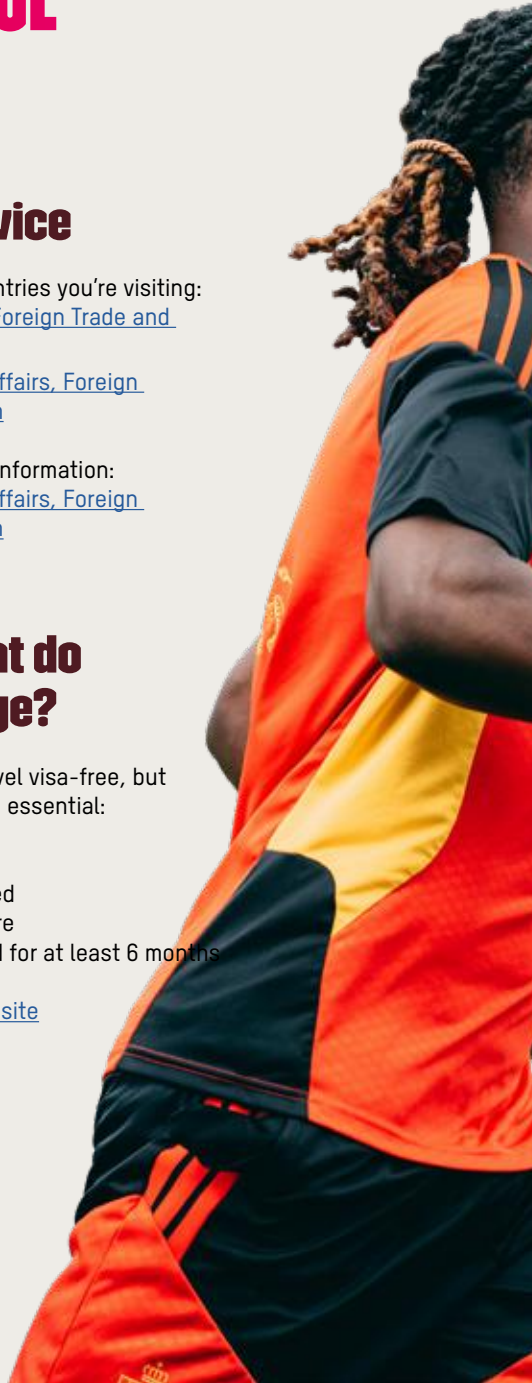
For the 2026 World Cup you can travel visa-free, but a few mandatory documents remain essential:

UNITED STATES

- International passport required
- ESTA required before departure
- Recommended: passport valid for at least 6 months after your return
- Apply only via the [official website](#)

=> If your ESTA is denied:

CANADA

- International passport required"
- eTA required before departure"
- Recommended: passport valid for at **least 6 months** after your return
- Apply only via the [official website](#):
- Apply for all documents **well in advance**

Border control

Entry to the United States and Canada is always assessed **individually** and remains a decision of the border authorities. Even with an approved **ESTA** or **eTA**, entry can still be refused.

Be ready to answer questions about:

- The purpose of your trip (World Cup / tourism)
- The length of your stay + **return flight (required)**
- Your accommodation address(es)

Make sure you have the following documents **on hand (digital or printed)**:

- ESTA / eTA
- Return ticket (required)
- Hotel or accommodation bookings

Insurance & emergencies: travel and assistance insurance

Medical costs in the United States and Canada are **extremely high**. Comprehensive insurance is therefore **strongly recommended.**"

We recommend arranging at least the following coverage:

- Medical expenses (with high coverage)
- Hospitalization and repatriation
- Cancellation and trip interruption
- Personal liability

Stanley Park & de Seawall

One of the largest urban parks in North America, wrapped by a flat seaside path — the Seawall — that loops around the entire peninsula. Rent a bike and ride the full circuit in an hour or two, past totem poles, beaches and the downtown skyline, with the North Shore mountains rising across the water. Cooler and greener than the city behind it, and at its best in the long light of a summer evening. .





Granville Island

A former industrial spit tucked under the Granville Bridge, now home to a covered public market packed with food stalls, plus artist studios, breweries and a small marina. Come hungry and graze your way through the market, then hop one of the tiny rainbow Aquabus ferries across False Creek instead of walking back.

Grouse Mountain

The Skyride gondola lifts you from the suburbs to the top of the North Shore mountains in minutes, where you'll find trails, wildlife, lumberjack shows and a sweeping view back over the city and the sea. The fit can hike up the punishing Grouse Grind instead; everyone else takes the cable car both ways.

Capilano Suspension Bridge Park

A 140-metre footbridge swaying high above the Capilano River canyon, with treetop walkways and a glass-floored cliff walk bolted into the rock. Touristy and not cheap, but genuinely thrilling, and the surrounding rainforest earns the trip on its own. A free seasonal shuttle runs from downtown.

Gastown

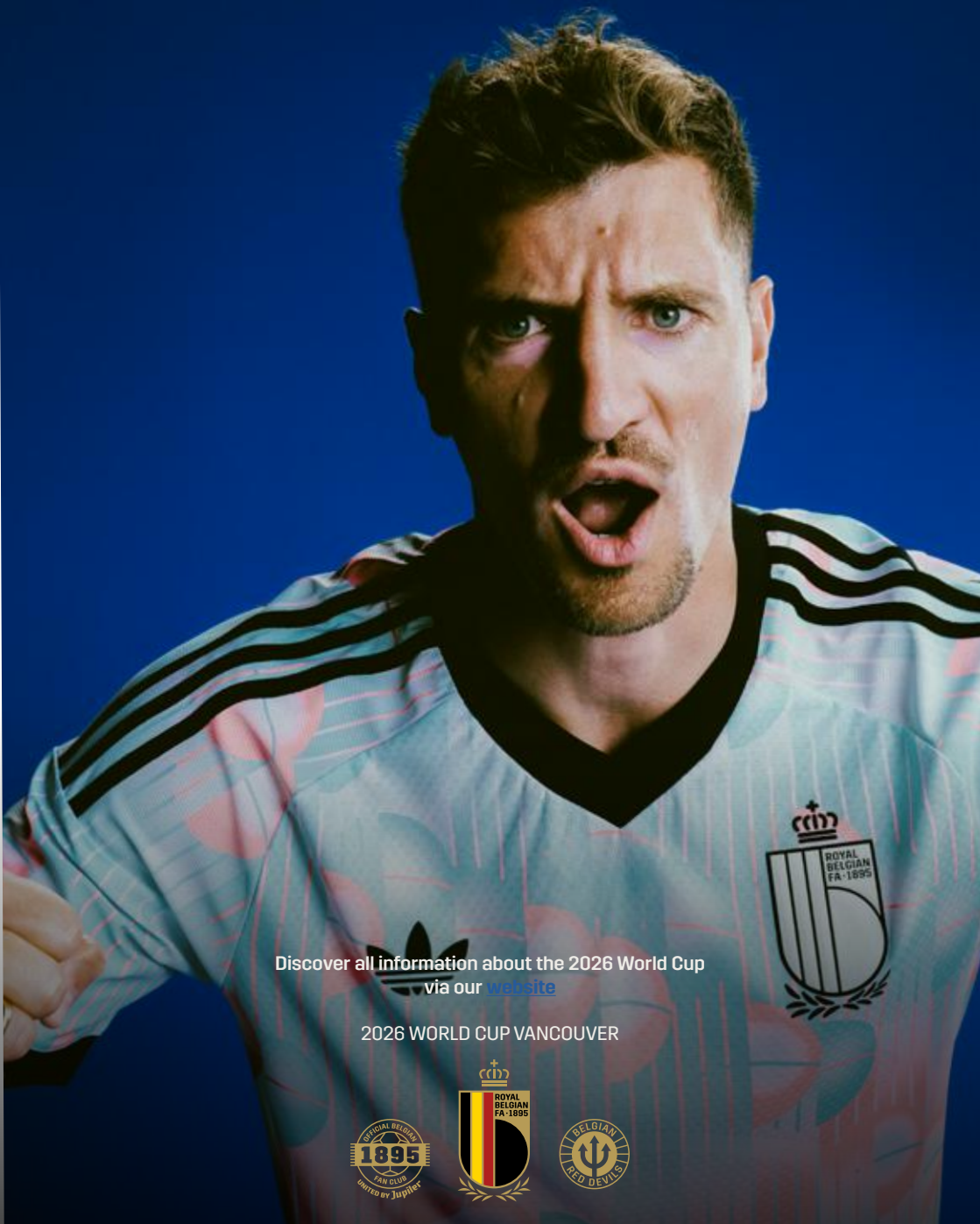
Vancouver's oldest quarter: cobblestone streets and red-brick warehouses now filled with restaurants, design shops and bars. The steam-powered clock on the corner draws a crowd on the hour — more curiosity than spectacle, but a pleasant place to wander, and easy to combine with neighbouring Chinatown.



∨ Kitsilano Beach & English Bay



Across False Creek from downtown, laid-back 'Kits' is the city's beach side: a wide sandy stretch, a huge outdoor saltwater pool and grassy lawns looking back at the skyline and the mountains. Sunset over English Bay is the local ritual — grab something to eat along West 4th and stay for it.
