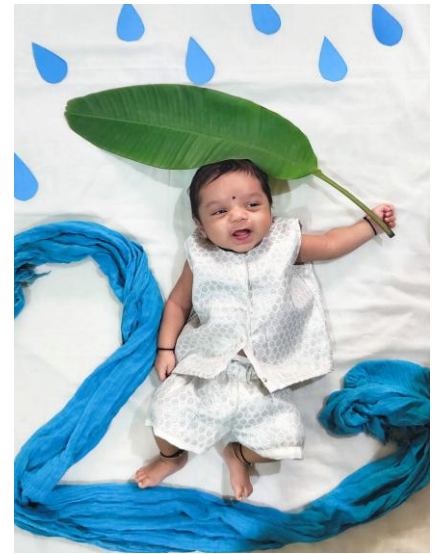

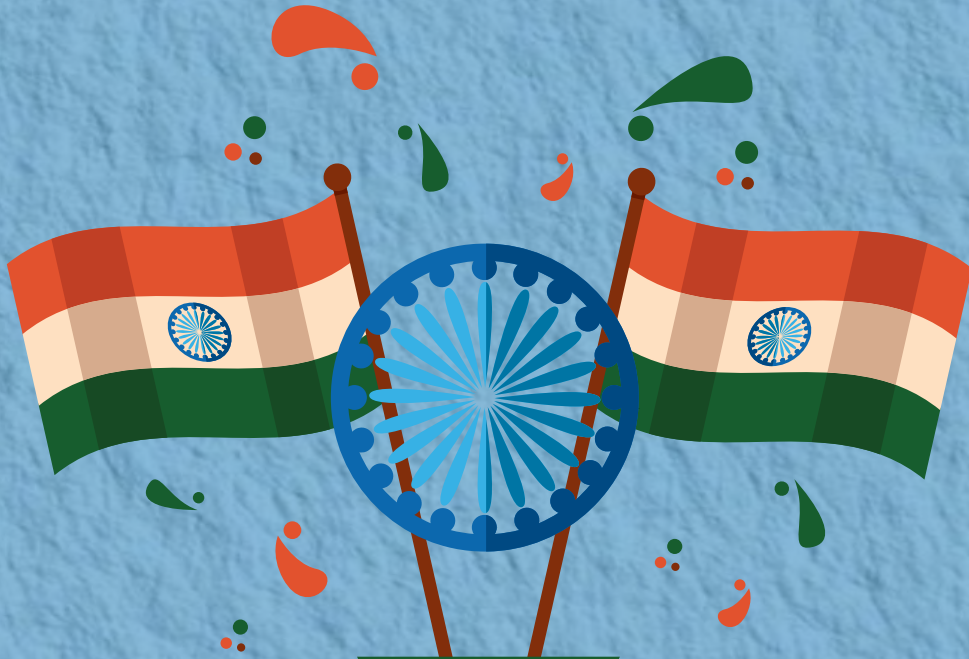

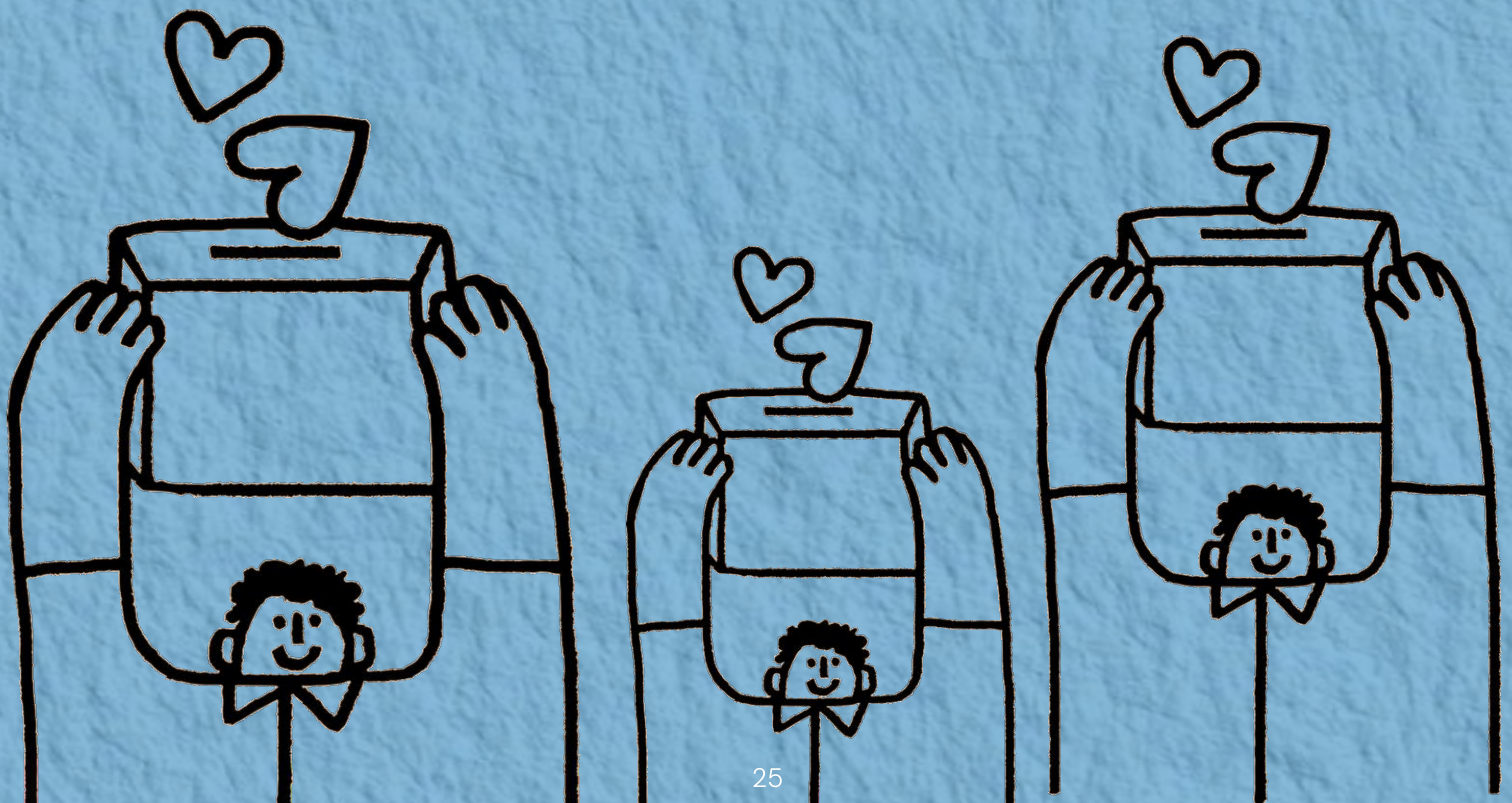

A reminder of the fragile turns of fate... and the urgent need for peace.

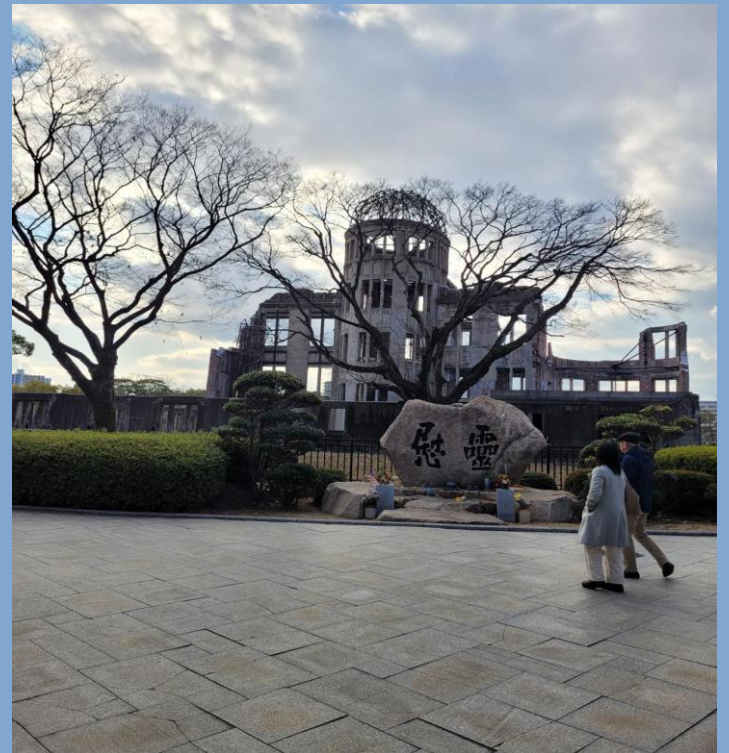
On 07th August 2025, during my morning jog — a ritual I’ve followed almost every time I’ve visited this city — I found myself once again at Kokura Castle (the castle has a modern significance as the city of Kokura was the original primary target for the atomic bomb dropped on Nagasaki, and the castle stands as a symbol of resilience and history in the area). But this time the feeling was different. By coincidence, this visit fell in the very week marking the 80th anniversary of Hiroshima and Nagasaki atomic bombing. That made the moment feel especially profound, because Kokura itself holds a unique place in that history which many may not know.

On 6th August 1945, Hiroshima was struck by the world’s first atomic bomb. Three days later, Kokura was actually the intended target for the second. On 9 August, however, poor visibility over Kokura forced the bomber to divert to Nagasaki. The castle, the city, and its people were spared but over 70,000 residents of Nagasaki lost their lives. This city’s history is a reminder of how chance can shape destiny and why peace must never be left to chance. Looking at these pictures now, I can only hope the world will one day truly embrace peace.

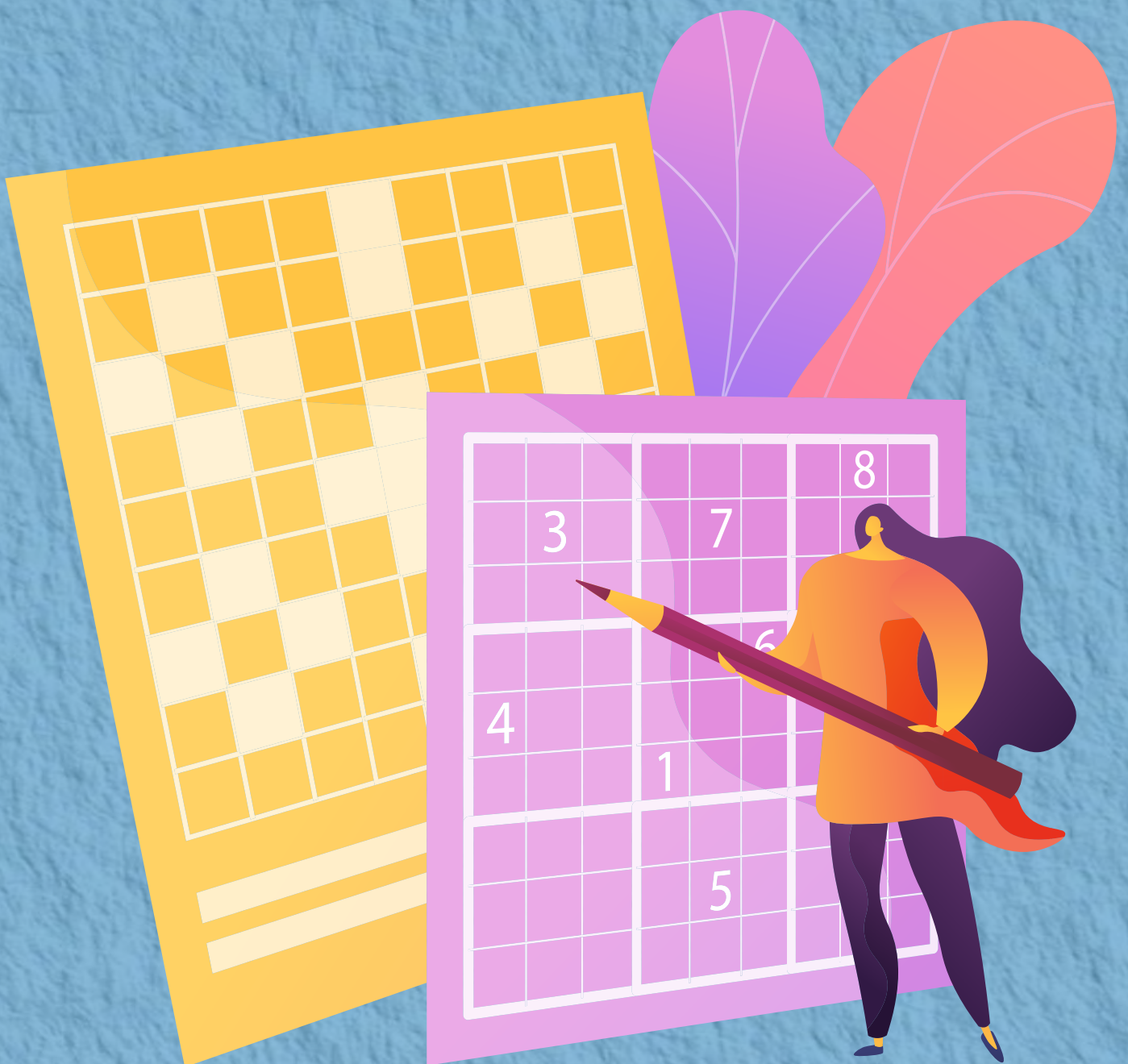

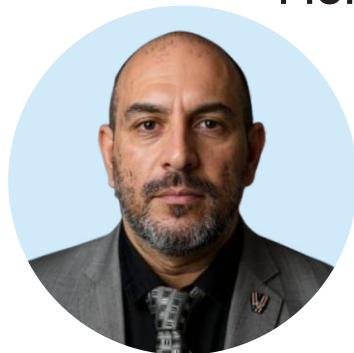

WELFARE SCHEMES FOR INDIAN SEAFARERS UNDER SWFS – AS PER DGS CIRCULAR 39 OF 2025

The welfare of Indian seafarers has been an area of growing focus within the maritime sector. The Directorate General of Shipping (DGS), under the Ministry of Ports, Shipping, and Waterways, has released Circular No. 39 of 2025 dated 18 September 2025, outlining a series of welfare schemes managed by the Seafarers' Welfare Fund Society (SWFS).

The SWFS is a statutory body with mixed representation (government, industry and seafarers) and is charged with administering welfare funds and schemes for Indian seafarers and their dependants.

The purpose of this circular is to inform Indian seafarers and their families about the various financial assistance programs available to them, ensuring their wellbeing both during and after their careers at sea. These schemes provide financial assistance across a range of situations from death, disability, maternity and old age to educational incentives for children of seafarers.

OVERVIEW OF THE WELFARE SCHEMES:

The circular lists several named schemes. The following are some programs and what they cover:

Survivor Benefit Scheme – (SBS)

The circular explains that this scheme provides “financial assistance to the family of a deceased Indian seafarer”.

Invalidity Benefit Scheme – (IBS)

This offers support to seafarers who are declared permanently unfit for sea service due to injury or disability.

Family Benefit Welfare Scheme – (FBWS)

According to the circular, this scheme provides support to dependent families of seafarers, covering “up to max 2 children” for either pre-sea training or full-time post-graduate degree/diploma (non-maritime stream) from a recognised university.

Maternity Benefit Scheme – (MBS)

This provides financial assistance for Indian women seafarers during maternity.

Old Age Benefit Welfare Scheme – (OABS)

For seafarers who attain age 65 years and fulfil minimum sea-service requirements.

Death on Board Benefit Scheme – (DBBS)

Support in cases where a seafarer dies or is presumed dead while on board a vessel or missing at sea.

Ex-Gratia Support Benefit Scheme – (ESBS)

Additional financial aid for specific cases of hardship, such as stranded or abandoned seafarers; support is available for a defined maximum period.

Award to Meritorious Child of Seafarers – (AMCS)

Recognises children of Indian seafarers who obtain first rank in full university or post-graduate degree courses (non-maritime stream) from recognised Indian universities.

The circular provides financial assistance details, eligibility criteria and time limits for each scheme. For comprehensive information regarding eligibility, required documentation, and claim procedures, please refer to the DGS Circular No. 39 of 2025 – “Welfare Schemes Administered by the SWFS for Indian Seafarers as given below –

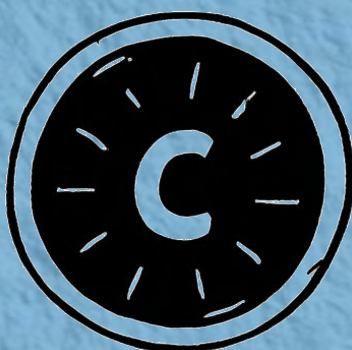

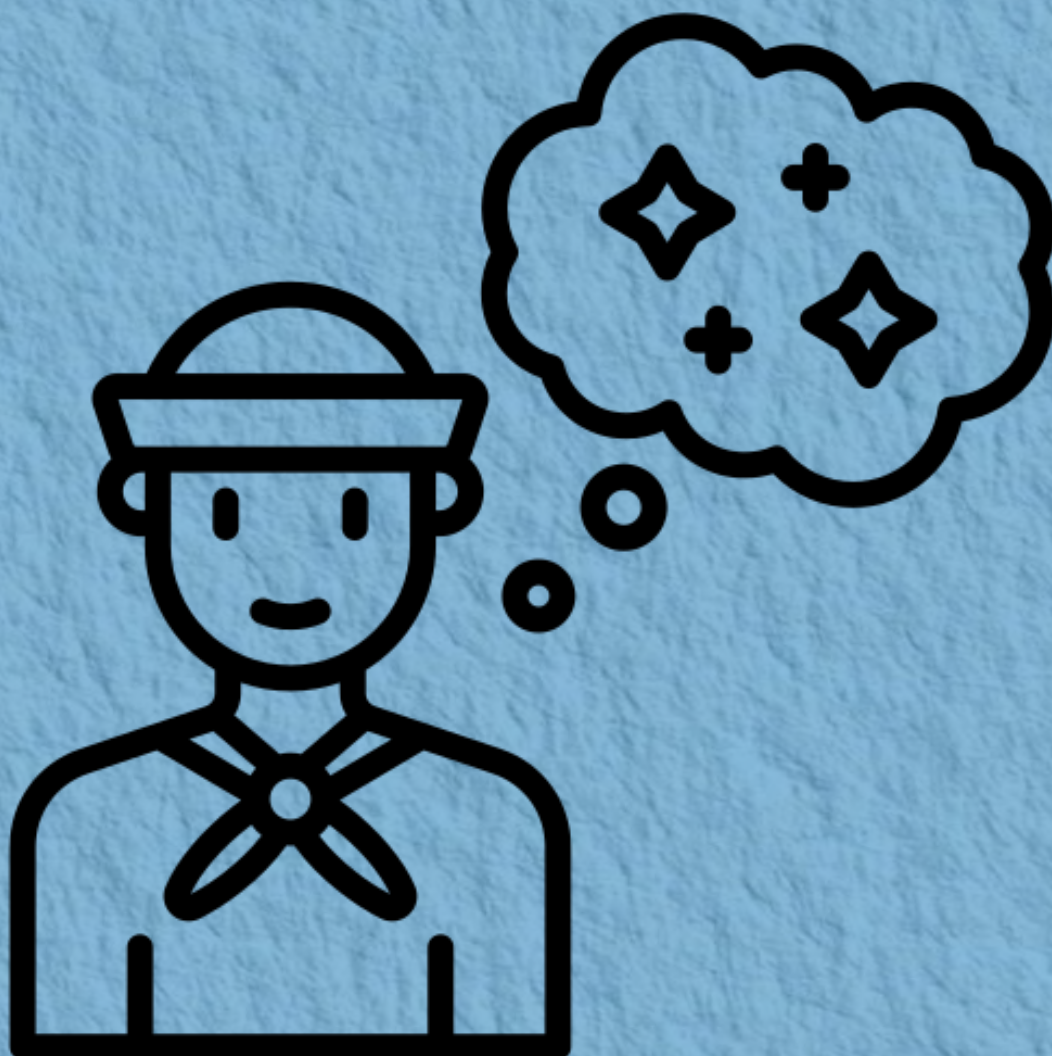

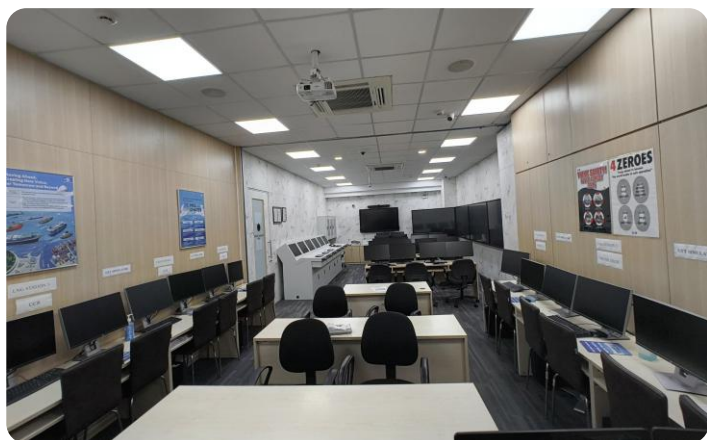
