This impressive exhibition of intricate knitted wartime scenes has been visited and loved by thousands and we're delighted to be hosting it at Blackburn Cathedral.

Hundreds of volunteer knitters from across the UK have created a stunning set of 80 individual knitted panels, each depicting a scene of Britain during wartime. It builds on the international success of The Longest Yarn, an exhibition of scenes from D-Day, which following a tour of the UK, is now in the USA.

The work that has gone into the storytelling panels is informed by guidance from expert historians, although the knitter often has a personal connection with the story they portray - sometimes a relative, sometimes a place or moment in time, making this a truly unique, heartfelt and historically important exhibition.

Attracting thousands of visitors as it tours the UK, this exhibition appeals to people of all ages from schoolchildren upwards. Entry is by donation in support of both the Cathedral and veterans' charities.



You are warmly invited to join us at this service of Holy Communion where we will affirm our joy at living, learning and growing together as a diverse community in Blackburn and beyond.


We will recommit ourselves to standing up to racism and discrimination in all its forms.

We shall reflect on the importance of racial justice, give thanks for the gifts and beauty of human diversity and commit to end the racism and acts of discrimination that continue to mar our world.







Turin Shroud Exhibition

Few people have had the privilege of standing before the actual Shroud of Turin during its limited public display in Turin, Italy and so we are delighted that a life-size replica and supporting exhibition will be on display during the Lent and Easter period.

Believed to have been used to wrap the body of Jesus after the Crucifixion, the Shroud is a length of linen cloth that bears a faint image of the front and back of a crucified man, believed by many to be the actual burial Shroud used to wrap the body of the Lord Jesus after his crucifixion, and upon which his bodily image is miraculously imprinted.

This installation offers a fascinating opportunity to examine it in detail, and for some this has proved to be a moving and profound experience which has deeply strengthened their faith.

The accompanying exhibition provides evidence revealed by historical and scientific research, explaining how the Shroud's image and bloodstains align with Gospel accounts of Jesus' death and resurrection.

Uncover the rich history and significance of the garments worn by clergy during worship, over the last century. This special exhibition will explore how faith is woven into the fabric of everyday life.

As we look to the future, an exciting project to design and produce a set of vestments to mark the Centenary will come to fruition, with the new items unveiled as part of this exhibition. Designed and woven by Margo Selby, the acclaimed British textile artist and designer, they will combine contemporary artistry with the traditional craft of hand weaving. These new pieces will be both beautiful and symbolic and a wonderful way to mark this milestone.

A striking new large-scale artwork piece will accompany and enhance this significant collaboration.

Ash Wednesday

The start of Lent is a time of reflection and of asking for forgiveness, as Christians prepare to celebrate Jesus's resurrection at the feast of Easter, which comes at the end of Lent. The evening Cathedral Eucharist service on Ash Wednesday includes the imposition of ashes, at which the priest puts ash in the form of a cross on people's foreheads if they so wish.



Palm Sunday

Beginning outside the Cathedral, all are very welcome to join us as we process into the Church, or to take your seats inside if that is more convenient for you. This service remembers Jesus's triumphant entry into Jerusalem, and then tells the story of his journey to the cross.



Maundy Thursday Eucharist

Thu 2nd Apr 2026 | 8pm | 👰 | All welcome

We remember how Jesus washed the feet of his disciples and then shared the last supper with him, before being betrayed. The service, with guest preacher **Dr Rowan Williams**, includes the ritual of foot washing, and ends in silence with the opportunity to remain until 10pm in silent prayer for those who wish.



Pilgrimage of Prayer

Fri 3rd Apr 2026 | 10am | 💩 | All welcome

An hour long service sung by the Youth Choir with music and interactive reflections on the cross. All are welcome to join us at this friendly and informal service which is particularly suitable for children.



Good Friday Liturgy

Fri 3rd Apr 2026 | 12pm | 💩 | All welcome

This service, which will be led by **Dr Rowan Williams**, lasts three hours. The first two hours consist of reflections, music and silence with a focus on the cross of Jesus. The final hour is sung by the Cathedral Choir, and focuses on the crucifixion of Jesus. Everybody is very welcome to come for all or part of this service and are encouraged to enter and leave quietly as they wish.



Easter Vigil

Sat 4th Apr 2026 | 8pm | 4 | All welcome

This service begins outside as the Easter Fire is lit. With guest preacher Dr Rowan Williams, it includes the opportunity for baptism and confirmation - please contact your parish priest if you are interested in being baptised or confirmed. If you are a member of the Cathedral congregation please speak to a member of the clergy. Note that this service lasts around two hours.



Easter Parish Eucharist

The Parish Eucharist is a friendly, relaxed Eucharistic service which will feature a celebration of Easter. There will be hymns and a sermon and the service, which lasts around 45 minutes, will be sung by the Youth Choir.




Easter Cathedral Eucharist




The Sixteen - one of the world's most renowned choral ensembles - led by Harry Christophers, return to Blackburn Cathedral for what promises to be an another memorable concert.
