





Tsitsikamma National Park

Situated along South Africa's beautiful coast, the Tsitsikamma National Park is a haven for adventure and nature lovers. Known for its thick ancient forest, dramatic coastline, and magnificent rivers, the park offers a plethora of activities. The Tsitsikamma National Park falls within the exquisite and famous Garden Route National Park and encompasses a gorgeous marine conservation belt stretching five kilometres out into the ocean, as well as the renowned Otter Trail. The park is home to diverse fauna and flora, including over 9000 species of indigenous fynbos, the stunning Knysna Loerie, dolphins and porpoises, Cape Clawless Otter, Blue Duiker, and many other animal and bird species. Visitors can look forward to hiking to The Big Tree - The Big Tree is a massive Outeniqua yellowwood tree estimated to be over 800 years old. The tree is located near the entrance of the forest and is a popular spot for tourists to take photos. Exhilarating activities include kayaking at Storms River Mouth, cycling, swimming, zip-lining, camping, snorkelling, diving, mountain biking, and sailing.




Nature's Valley

Situated along the Groot River Estuary within the Tsitsikamma National Park, Nature's Valley is a truly unique destination. It's the only residential area within a South African national park, offering a one-of-a-kind experience. Set in the heart of the pristine Tsitsikamma coastal forest, this charming village is alive with rich flora and fauna. The encircling forested slopes are home to a diverse mix of birds whose colourful feathers contrast against lush green surroundings. The estuary opens up onto a secluded beach that stretches the length of the village and is bordered by the warm Indian Ocean, where bottlenose dolphins and southern right whales can be seen. Visitors can enjoy dolphin watching, fishing, kayaking, bird watching, hiking, cycling, and swimming.




Knysna

Plettenberg Bay

The seaside town of Plettenberg Bay is a popular holiday destination situated just 2.5 hours' drive west of Gqeberha, on the spectacular coastal Garden Route; the Portuguese explorers called it the 'Beautiful Bay', and it's easy to see why. Plettenberg Bay is a picturesque, charming town with endless pristine beaches, tranquil lagoons, clean rivers, indigenous forests, and a dramatic rocky peninsula. Playground to the wealthy, beach mansions overlook the Indian Ocean, often dotted with luxury yachts, while leisure time is given over to polo and golf, among other things. However, all kinds of visitors will feel at peace here as simply swimming in the warm water on a safe beach is a great way to experience the beauty of Plettenberg Bay. Adrenaline seekers can visit Bloukrans Bridge, a 30-minute drive away, to do the highest bungee jump on earth.

Wilderness

The Wilderness National Park is a Ramsar site (wetlands of international importance), home to numerous exquisite birds and animals, including the legendary, brightly coloured Knysna Loerie, as well as some fascinating archaeological sites. Visitors can enjoy whale and dolphin spotting at Dolphin Point and can look forward to plenty of opportunities for hiking, water sports, abseiling, kloofing, paragliding, hang-gliding, quad biking, canoeing, horse riding, and cycling. A collection of charming shops, restaurants, and art galleries complete the experience.

Oudtshoorn

Located along the well-known Route 62 in South Africa's beautiful Klein Karoo, the charming town of Oudtshoorn is known as the world's ostrich capital. It is surrounded by numerous ostrich farms and the golden arid landscape of the Karoo. Visitors can enjoy the locally produced wine and port, sample ostrich meat and biltong, learn about the ostrich feather boom at the C.P. Nel Museum, and visit the world-renowned Cango Caves, the most extensive cave system in Africa featuring ancient rock formations and sparkling stalactites and stalagmites. Other popular activities include mountain biking, paragliding, horse riding, and taking a day trip to the quaint town of Prince Albert over the scenic Swartberg Pass.




De Hoop Nature Reserve

Set along the famously beautiful Garden Route, De Hoop Nature Reserve is known for its spectacular natural scenery, excellent hiking trails and abundant wildlife. This magnificent reserve stretches over 34,000 hectares and is decorated by awe-inspiring brightly coloured indigenous fynbos. The area is home to a variety of mammals, including bontebok, eland, Cape Mountain Zebra, and baboon, and also encompasses a marine section that extends for five kilometres into the ocean, allowing for excellent snorkelling opportunities among pristine turquoise pools and shallows. The birdlife in this area is also prolific. Enjoy a fantastic selection of activities, including the popular 5-day Whale Trail (one of the best hikes in South Africa), exploring the environment-sensitive Elim Wine Route, and taking adrenaline-pumping eco-quad bike tours.

The Garden Route in South Africa offers a variety of activities for travellers seeking adventure, relaxation, and exploration.






Scenic Drives

Explore the fascinating Cango Caves near Oudtshoorn, where guided tours take you through intricate limestone formations in an underground world






Wine Tasting



Morukuru Family De Hoop

Morukuru Beach Lodge is a luxury 5-suite boutique-style eco-lodge in the De Hoop Nature Reserve, approximately 1 km from the exclusive-use Morukuru Ocean House, along the same pristine coastline. Part of Relais & Chateaux, the lodge offers one Honeymoon Suite, two Ocean View Suites and two Ocean View Family Suites, making this a great stopover location for couples or smaller families travelling along the Garden Route. Morukuru Ocean House is ideal for (multi-generational) families and groups of friends travelling together. From the lodge, it is just a short walk down to the beach, and during whale season (July-October), this is arguably the best location for land-based whale watching in Africa. Other activities include mountain biking, fynbos walks, marine walks, snorkelling and swimming at low tide in protected rock pools, sandboarding, and nature drives. Morukuru Beach Lodge is completely off the grid, with solar panels generating electricity. For the odd longer cloudy periods, a backup generator may be used.
