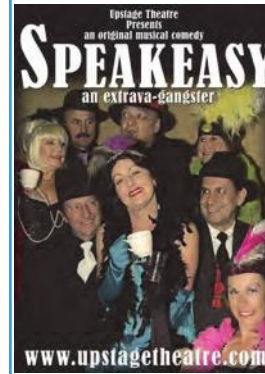

The Fleurieu Bluesbreakers: The Devil Lives Down My Street

The Fleurieu Bluesbreakers debut album has eleven tunes of diverse rhythm all written and contrived by the band members. The band hails from the Fleurieu Peninsula and the members are Brian Cain (lead vocal and blues harp), Ross Brennan (guitar and backing vocal), Peter Nixon (bass guitar and backing vocal) and Jim Judd (drums). The band has been together for just over a year and was contrived when Brian Cain returned to South Australia settling in his past stamping ground of The Fleurieu Peninsula.

"The album has been put up on the internet through Spotify and is beginning to appear on many sites such as iTunes and Amazon," said Brian. "This process can take two to three months to prepare, gradually leaching out onto just about every promotional music site available. Spotify is about the only internet music provider that accommodates this in one process. This is in preparation for an album release showcase during the months of Feb and March 2018. The timeline is to make sure all due preparation is complete for punters to access the album. The hard CD will be available at the bands gigs, certain venues such as the Railway

Hotel in Port Adelaide will stock the album. This venue was where the album was recorded and we greatly appreciate the efforts made by the staff at the Railway in assisting our efforts. The first ever manufactured copy of the album hangs on the wall of the Railway hotel on display, the framed CD is signed by all band members. We have entered into a residency at this venue and a second album is being recorded over the next 8 months for release in Feb 2019, the Railway is closed of a Monday and can be used as a recording studio."

"A mail out of every radio station affiliated with the IBC blues network in Australia has been completed, a total of over seventy albums specially embossed with the presenters name and radio station, other stations in the community radio network are being canvassed. The international mail out has begun and covers over six hundred stations and is estimated to take six months. The biggest request for albums came from Coast FM Adelaide not affiliated with the IBC network, over 17 albums are in the hands of the presenters there and the interview process at this station began Tuesday 12th of December 2017 with Doug Frost of Coast FM, as awareness of the album grows other band members will attend interviews to cover demand throughout South Australia" said Brian. 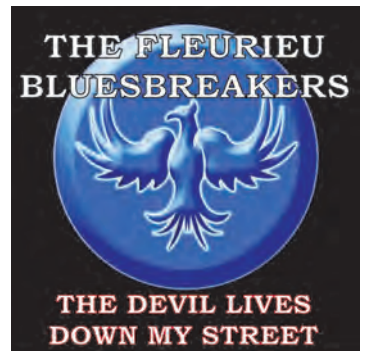

\$500,000+ On Heritage Building Repairs

Over \$500,000 is being spent on repairs and restoration of two historic buildings in Victor Harbor.

The roof of the Adare Conference Centre "castle" is being replaced, while the Grosvenor Hotel's new balcony is almost completed.

Both properties are on the State Heritage Register and are having their restorations carried out by Victor Harbor builder South Coast Constructions who have worked closely with heritage architects Flightpath, plus State Heritage and City of Victor Harbor staff to get the projects approved and underway.

Mark Lee, general manager of Uniting Venues SA, said the work being undertaken at Adare would see the iron roof and gutters replaced, which would allow the church to carry out other maintenance and restoration work inside.

"It has stopped us from doing some preventative maintenance inside. The roof has been leaking and birds have been nesting in it too," Mark explained. The iconic shingle turrets are not part of the roof work.

"We chose South Coast Constructions because they were local and had recently done the roof restoration and repair at Newland Uniting Church."

The church has been considering undertaking the work for more than seven years, but funding has been one of the reasons it has been delayed so long. Maintaining heritage buildings such as Adare and the Grosvenor comes at a heavy cost for property owners with no government funding being available to carry out restoration or maintenance projects.

However, there are significant restrictions placed on owners about the style of work that can be carried out, right down to the colours that can be used.

Owners and builders must work closely with heritage advisors at both the state and local level.

For John Hodge, owner of the Grosvenor Hotel, it has been a frustrating and expensive process after the City of Victor Harbor advised him that the veranda at the hotel had to be replaced for safety reasons.

"We had wanted to undertake the work during the main street redevelopment, but we were unable to get the approvals in time to be able to engage builders to do the work then," he explained.

There was much toing and froing as the council and state authorities wanted it

to be replaced "like for like". "However, if we had pursued that it would have resulted in a patchwork effect using all different materials," John explained.

"It has cost a lot more because of the rules that the heritage people put in place.

"But, in the end, it will contribute to the general improvement of Victor Harbor. It will make a difference and hopefully it will be there for another hundred years."



South Coast Constructions' director Jamie Knott said he was pleased his firm could help retain the heritage of Victor Harbor.

"We feel honoured to be asked to be a part of preserving the local heritage," he said.

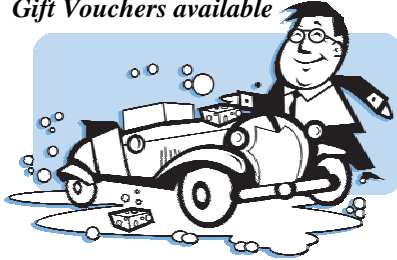

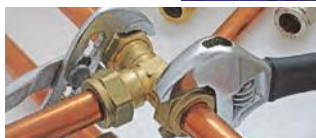

Aussie Backyard Bird Count - 2017 Results

Rainbow Lorikeet tops the count... again



The Aussie Backyard Bird Count is fast becoming one of Australia's largest citizen science events - with more than 72,000 participants and 60,000 checklists submitted, together we counted almost two million birds! The Rainbow Lorikeet topped the Aussie Backyard Bird Count for the fourth consecutive year, reported in approximately 40% and of all surveys submitted. The Top 10 most counted bird species remained unchanged, but there were variations within the order of the group.

Why we need you

Collecting a huge dataset like the one we get from the Aussie Backyard Bird Count is only possible thanks to you. The vast amount of data collected from citizen science programs like the Aussie Backyard Bird Count fills a knowledge gap, particularly on urban bird species, and gives us access to areas we usually wouldn't be able to survey, like your backyard!

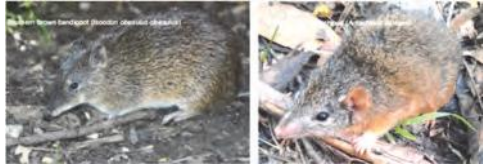
One of the most surprising trends from the data is a decline in the frequency of occurrence of the Laughing Kookaburra across southeast Australia. If counting birds for one week each October isn't enough, and you're keen to submit bird surveys year-round, you should check out our bird monitoring programs - Birds in Backyards and Birdata.

Can you identify the native animal that visited downtown Normanville in early December?

It was an extremely hot day but it did not stop this cute Koala climbing to the top of the tree opposite the Post Office. Concerned shoppers put water in an ice cream container at the bottom of the tree and presumably he quenched his thirst before he went on his way!

Weed of the Month

Rat's Tail Weed

(*Sporobolus africanus*)

(Photos : C. Schultz, growth habit and flower spikes, at Cape Jervis)

A perennial grass of the tussock variety, this weed originated in sub-Saharan Africa. It is quite invasive in our climate, spreading via small brown seeds. Unlike the *Sporobolus virginicus* (saltwater couch), this plant is erect and up to 60cm tall, with fairly thin but stiff stems. Leaves are also slender, stiff and not hairy. These leaves tend to grow about 18cm long from the base of the plant, and the sides roll in a bit. It is the flower heads that give the plant its common name though. These are spikes, grey-green against the dark green of the leaves. 35mm long and 7mm wide, densely packed with lots of teeny individual branches around the stem... you can understand why they are called rat's tails!

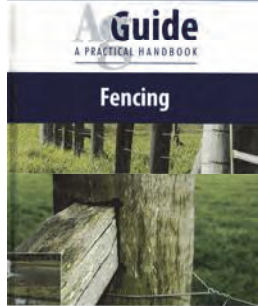

Fencing, A Practical Handbook,

Why build a fence?

Well-constructed, well positioned fencing is one of the most effective management tools you can have. But you need to identify your reason for building a fence.



The first questions to consider are: Why are you building it? Where are you building it?

There are many reasons for building a fence. Stock management, land and pasture management, crop and stock protection, human safety, legal requirements etc.

Why reasons matter.

It is important to identify the reason. The type of stock and the intensity of land use both influence the pressure on a fence. Behaviours of the animals you want to keep in, or out, determines the type of fence that suits you best. A fence is really just a bluff for animals and they need to be educated to it when they are young.

If you know how your animals think, react and behave you can build a good fence to control them. Some livestock need stronger fences than others. Fences for cattle need higher fences than sheep; deer require expensive fencing; wool growing sheep are timid in their approach to a fence whereas cross-bred ewes are frequently aggressive in attempting to crawl through or under a fence. Cattle are more inclined to rub on fences. Bulls and stallions put tremendous pressure on a fence.

Close Shave For Bearded Orchid

An intense effort involving weeding and fencing has resulted in the beginnings of the recovery of one of Australia's rarest orchids.

The extremely threatened Copper Beard Orchid (*Calochilus cupreus*) had declined to just three plants last year, but has now bounced back to 19.

A conservation reserve on the northern Fleurieu is the only known site in the world where the orchid is found.

For the past few years, the plants have been carefully monitored by staff from Natural Resources Adelaide and Mt Lofty Ranges (AMLR) and dedicated volunteers from the Native Orchid Society of South Australia (NOSSA).

Natural Resources AMLR threatened flora ecologist and orchid expert Dr Rick Davies said orchid numbers had plummeted from 55 to just 3 plants between 2010-2016, due to kangaroo grazing, weed infestation and off-road vehicles. Alarmed at the decline, staff from Natural Resources AMLR last year built a protective fence around the orchids, and also implemented a program of targeted weeding by volunteers and contractors.

"Some of the plants this year have produced more than 30 flowers, which is very impressive and great news, as it means more seeds will be produced," said Dr Davies.

The name of the critically endangered Copper Beard Orchid was inspired by the distinct green and red striped flower, which has a coppery tint and purple hairs resembling a beard. The flowers appear from October to early November and are pollinated by just one species of native wasp.

"It's really important not to disturb wild orchids in any way," said Dr Davies.

"Anyone can help protect our own local beautiful

and rare orchids by joining a volunteer group involved in the restoration of their bushland habitat."

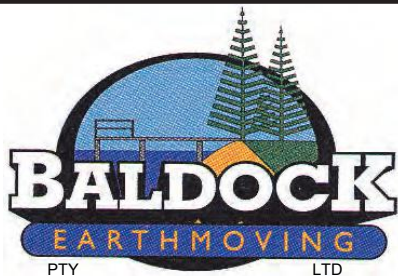

Dogs Unleashed For Normanville

The contemptuous Yankalilla Council has again shown that it is not interested in the views of the rate payers and refuses to respond reasonably to requests from its constituents. At the Council meeting in December, 2016, the Council voted to change the regulations requiring dogs to be on a lead on beaches and parks. Dogs had previously been allowed to exercise without a lead while under effective control on Normanville beach, while at least 100 metres away from the Jetty. This action was taken following a "Have your say" on the council website, despite the majority of respondents asking for the regulation to remain the same. I wrote to the Councillors of the Yankalilla Council, arguing the need to review that decision based on the results

of "Have your say". An exchange of view between the CEO and me were published in the January 2016 edition of the Yankalilla News.

The poor and unworthy attempt at consultation by the Council showed that by far the majority of respondents urged that the regulations remain unchanged. The Council simply ignored their wishes and somehow decided that the Normanville Beach should have the same by law as any metropolitan beach.

Once again in December 2017, the council has refused to alter the decision, despite a petition of more than 1000 signatures presented to the meeting. A group of local people met, sought local opinion, and presented the petition to the Council, only to be treated with contempt. This group deserved better, we as ratepayers deserve better.

Many Councillors were either not present or abstained from the vote, with the formal request lost by four votes to three. It appears that only three councillors of twelve actually took the position urged by the constituents. The remaining non attendees, abstainers and those who voted against the proposal should be ashamed not to have represented the will of residents.

It is time that the ratepayers of Yankalilla demanded better from the Council, which obviously regards consultation as unimportant and ignores legitimately expressed views.

The beach on Yankalilla Bay from Lady Bay to Carrickalinga is about eight kilometres long. From many years of observation, more than 95% of Normanville Beach users position themselves within one or two hundred metres of the jetty. Similarly the major users of Lady Bay, Carrickalinga and other popular beaches use little of the beach. Why not allow dogs to be exercised between 10am and 6.00pm without a lead while under effective control, away, from any nesting hooded plover sites?

This matter of lack of consultation by the Council extends far wider than dog control. It appears that the Council also treats the views and concerns of ratepayers with contempt on other agendas, such as the Caravan Park, Petrol Station on the Bungala River, expenditure on consultants and expenditure on caravan waste points costing in excess of \$50,000. It is also obvious the Council prefers to heavily abridge the minutes of Council meetings by not listing the names of Councillors voting either way in decisions, or by providing insufficient detail to make the minutes easily understandable. At the same time the minutes don't reflect enough detail to allow anyone accessing them any real understanding of what was discussed.

Finally, why is the Council ignoring the 2030 Development Plan? Why does the council ignore its own policies?

The Council's: *Code of Practice Proceedings of Council and Committee Meetings*

Require Council to;

(a) be fair and contribute to open, transparent and informed decision-making

(b) should encourage appropriate community participation in the affairs of the Council
 (c) reflect levels of formality appropriate to the nature and scope of responsibilities exercised at the meeting

(d) be sufficiently detailed to give the community and decision makers confidence in the deliberations undertaken at the meeting.

Re: Dog Control

I read with interest the recent letters in the Dec 2017 edition of the YRN regarding the current dog control measures on local beaches but the letter writers seem to be missing the point. When I moved to the area several years ago and started running on the local beaches I noticed signs either side of the Normanville jetty requiring all dogs within 100metres of the jetty to be physically restrained at all times. This restriction was almost universally ignored by dog owners. Also, the beach car park, to my knowledge, has never been an off-lead area and yet, on many occasions, I saw dogs running loose in the car park. It's also been the case for many years that dogs on the beach must be under effective control at all times when off-lead to prevent them from annoying other beach users. This restriction was also completely ignored by some dog owners, and it was rare for me to complete a run without being harassed by one or more dogs. I have never seen anyone from the Council enforcing dog control measures on the beach.

The Council has had in place for a number of years the necessary tools to deter anti-social dog owners who use local beaches, but have failed to use them sufficiently to prevent dogs annoying, harassing and even attacking other beach users.

Some people obviously regard the current restrictions as draconian, while others regard them as justified. My point is this: It matters very little what restrictions are placed on taking dogs onto the beach (or any other public space for that matter) because there will always be a minority of irresponsible, cerebrally challenged dog owners who will completely ignore any restriction unless those restrictions are actively enforced by the Council which, in my opinion, doesn't happen. The current restrictions will only affect responsible dog owners, the irresponsible ones will ignore them anyway, just as they always have, because it is human nature for some people to ignore the law if they think they won't get caught.

As John Bowling points out in his letter, we pay high rates compared to metropolitan Adelaide - in my opinion, enough for ratepayers to expect adequate enforcement of Council imposed restrictions.

To conclude, it is not restrictions which will make recalcitrant dog owners tow the line (or the lead), but the knowledge that they will get caught and fined if they don't, and it is naive of anyone to think otherwise.

Mining Adds To Region's Economy

From the time of first settlement along the Fleurieu Peninsula, the earliest industries apart from whaling were grain growing, primarily wheat, and dairying. Mills were established at Yankalilla, Normanville and Second Valley, and wheat, and/or flour, was shipped to Adelaide, and also to Melbourne, destined for the Victorian goldfields. In addition, other agricultural produce was grown including barley, maize and oats. Sheep were also kept for wool and meat. Soon there was another industry – mining.

The first local mining venture was the Yattagolonga Mine at Rapid Bay, after HW Phillips found surface indications of lead and copper on land he purchased in 1844. He also found numerous lodes and 12 men were subsequently employed in the first year and raised 50 tons of hand-picked ore averaging 75 per cent lead and 22-25 ounces of silver to the ton. The small cutters *William*, 6 tons, and *Jane Flaxman*, 11 tons, were used as carriers. This mine closed in 1850 having produced 190 tons of hand-picked silver-lead-copper ore.

However, the majority of mines on the Fleurieu Peninsula were discovered in the 1860s after miners returned from the Victorian goldfields. As the pastoral industry was experiencing a downturn at this time, mining was a source of alternate income. Silver-lead-copper indications were found over a wide area, mainly along the coast from Rapid Bay to Sellicks Hill but the life span of them all was short. The *Wheat Mary*, or Barrett's mine near Carrickalinga produced 130 tons of galena (a common lead ore) worth about £10 a ton before it closed in 1873.

Patrick 'Paddy' Coglin had established a sheep station in the Rapid Bay area and when silver-lead was discovered on his run in the mid-1860s, the *Wheat Coglin* mine was floated. This discovery led to the steamer *Eleanor* being chartered to take a group of speculative investors from Glenelg to Rapid Bay, accompanied by a German band from Melbourne. The visitors were

brought ashore in a boat, six at a time. Paddy was able to sell his run to the *Wheat Coglin Mining and Smelting Co Ltd* for £25,000. Sixteen shafts were sunk, the deepest to 258 feet, and the mine produced 70 tons of hand-picked silver-lead-zinc ore, which was shipped to England for treatment, before the mine closed in 1869.

Master mariners seemed to take an interest in this new industry, possibly anticipating more work for coastal traders. The McLeod brothers of Cape Jervis, including Capt J McLeod, early in 1862 discovered a deposit of galena while searching for gold. Surface samples were taken to estimate the richness of the lode and the first returned 200 ounces of silver to the ton. They named the deposit *Talisker* after a town in their homeland Isle of Skye. The *Talisker Mining Company* was established and by the end of July, about 20 Cornish miners were working on the lode under supervision of the mine manager Captain Jenkins. At first the ore was hand-picked into small pieces and bagged. The first shipment was despatched to England from Fishery Bay, an early whaling station near Cape Jervis.

In early 1863, a crushing and dressing works was erected at Fishery Bay. Ore was then hauled by bullock drays down to the bay where the bagged concentrate was hand-loaded onto barges for transfer to coastal schooners which took the ore to Port Adelaide. About 32,000 bags were handled in this way until Captain William Price took over management in 1864 and began erecting a treatment works and smelting plant at the mine site. By the following year works completed included a flue, calcining furnace, blast furnace capable of producing one ton of silver-lead ingots a day, engine and crusher houses and reservoir.

When John Dodd sold his Normanville flour mill to Eli Butterworth, it was dismantled and the boiler sold to *Talisker Mine*. George and Septimane Herbert won the contract to transport the boiler the 20 miles by bullock drays, fastened together for the length of the boiler, one behind

the other. After digging themselves out often, they averaged two and a half miles a day but eventually reached the mine site.

The early crusher was a small capacity ball mill type proved inadequate and a 10-stamp battery added in 1867. A large brick kiln was built in 1869 to make fire bricks from the local high quality clay; a total of 4000 fire bricks were made in the first six months.

Two mining townships grew – *Silverton* and *Silverton Extended* – to house the miners. They boasted an eating house, hotel, post office, general store, day school, and a night school for youths employed at the mine during the day. In 1866, a Wesleyan Chapel was built. The mining operations, kiln and accommodation for miners also created a demand for timber for heating and building – wood to fire the boilers and kiln was cut from local bush and the adjacent area was soon stripped of trees.

Talisker was one of the largest producers of silver and lead in the colony. From 1862 to 1866, 1600 tons of dressed ore yielded 400 tons of lead and 40,000 ounces of silver which realised £16,000. From 1866 to 1872, 670 tons of lead was produced and 70,000 ounces of silver, which realised £29,885.

- the Pap test will be replaced with the more accurate Cervical Screening Test
- the time between tests will change from two to five years
- the age at which screening starts will increase from 18 years to 25 years

Drama at the Second Valley Petanque Championships

Last year's inaugural winners, The Senicview Galahs, (Councillor David Olsson and wife, Dr Jane Olsson), were unceremoniously trounced by qualifying round winners, The Randelsea Rebels. In a peacock to feather duster performance, The Galahs, resplendent in a striking new designer created uniform, were visibly shocked by their inexplicably dismal display. Feather duster, David Olsson, in an interview after the match was unusually lost for words, '... overtrained and peaked too early...' was all he could muster as a possible explanation.

A number of great contests between the 20 teams, kept the crowd enthralled, well lubricated and increasingly rowdy.

New entrants and surprise packets,



The Valley Virgins, (couturier to the stars, Glenda Eichner and Lady Cathy Smith), feigned ignorance of the rules and limited ability, to frustrate their opposition and sneak into the semi-finals. The other semi-finalists included The Randelsea Rebels, The Grundy Court Chuckers and The Reg Grundies.

After hard fought semis, the finalists emerged as the Randelsea Rebels, (Alec Wheatley and Greg Whittlesea) and The Reg Grundies, (Karen Buckley and Tim Pearce). The Reg Grundies, unlike the Galahs, were almost a feather duster to Peacock story, as last year they were obliged to drop their Regies after losing in the first round, to love.

The final proved to be an epic contest with The Rebels taking a commanding early lead. The Reg Grundies, with the memory of last year's ignominy etched in their collective psyche,

rallied and made a great contest of the final, eventually going down 13-8.

After receiving the gleaming, giant, gold (plated) trophy from a mercifully brief, but otherwise magnanimous, pair of Galahs, (last year's winners), Wheatley and Whittlesea were humble in their acceptance address, citing good luck and good alcohol as key factors in their winning formula.

In later interviews, Greg Whittlesea, (a man not unaccustomed to sporting greatness), likened the tension in the final to captaining Sturt during their dismal finals campaign in 1988, the year in which he won the Margery Medal.

Ever since I came second in the 1959 25 metre U7 egg & spoon Primary School Championships in the UK, I have trained hard in an effort to achieve sporting success...'. Wheatley said. '... 2017 has been a break-out year for me. Obviously I am just starting to peak, 48 years since my last podium finish...'

This year's Championships saw a 66% increase in entries over 2016. Many other potential entrants missed out due to missing the Registration deadline. Players came from as far afield as Woolgoolga in NSW, in the north and Delamere in the south.

Piste Curator, Grant Pember, said that the prospect of a 30+ team competition in 2018 '...will create a logistical nightmare and a need to make a lot more pizza dough...We will seriously have to consider building a second Piste, and hiring a pizza chef in 2018', he said.

SVPA Secretary Amanda Wallis is continuing in her efforts to have these Championships registered as a qualifying event for the World Titles. The Men's Titles for 2018 will be held in Desbiens City, Canada. Ms Wallis said '...that as the International Federation of Petanque currently does not have a World Championship category for mixed teams we might just have to go it alone and create our own World Titles In Second Valley, a place already on the world map for its beach and its Table tennis team...'

After a hectic sporting, cultural and social calendar in 2017, the Second Valley Progress Association is now looking forward to its regular Sausage Sizzle at Second Valley Beach during the Australia Day long weekend, which follows the (almost world famous) New Years Day sandcastle competition.

Re: Dawn Tonkin's Community Support

I have only been living in the local area for just over 12 months - renting until my new home is built. That is pretty much the big sore point, as it has taken over 14 & a half months for my block of land to come through, for me to be able to have my new home built (which is now being held up by the building company). I have discussed the situation with a few people, hoping that the laws will be changed, to protect others in the same situation as me, having to rent for all of this time, while so many people have a hand in the process of passing the land - because the law allows for land to be contracted, before it has gone through all the processes to even get to the Lands Titles Office. I was told originally in very early September of 2016, on at least 3 separate occasions, that the land would only take 6 months to go through. As a pensioner, I do not have any large amount of savings, just what I got from the sale of my home in Woodcroft & that money has been dwindling fast over the past more than 12 months, the biggest part has gone to rent, of course, at this stage to mid January, is over \$15,000 - money which I desperately did NOT need to lose, on anything other than MY new home. Two different people, on 2 separate occasions at Centrelink, told me in November LAST [2016] year, that as a pensioner I cannot afford to rent - nobody knows that better than I do, since I am a pensioner, which is why all of this rent has had to come out of my new house money. Nobody throughout this process has bothered to listen to me & to take my situation seriously & I have made sure that everybody from day one, has known how tight my budget was. I am now at the stage, where I've had to mentally cross off so many things on the very long list that all new home owners would have to find money for. It has got to the stage that it is quite iffy about whether I will be able to afford to even put flooring into my new

home, let alone stormwater - then there are driveways & paths; fences; etc, etc, etc - because I will now have to keep on renting until about April next year [2018], before my new home might be finished. I have an account that has been building up slowly, that was going to be for a shed & the very necessary rain water tank & also clothesline & letterbox - the very basics. However, the list goes on & on & I was originally going to be able to afford to set myself up for the rest of my life, now that is definitely not possible & I will have to continue to struggle to get the smallest things done at my new home. The health problems I have, mean that I should have decent heating & cooling in my home (which is why I've been sick since moving in here), but the cheapest quote for that was just over \$7,000 & I will have no money for that. The footings for my new home are atrociously high & my constant worry is that it will go higher when the footings are being done & that it may well be the end of me having my home built at all.

There were also going to be alterations inside my new home, that would have to be done either just before, or after I move in - because my new home is supposed to be a 'quickbuild' & therefore alterations not allowed during the build. However, trying to get a quote from the local contractors, has proved pointless, as they will just not get back to me with a quote. So it seems that I will have to find contractors further afield, who do want my business - if I have the money of course. I was trying to be loyal to the people in the local area. I hope I am just being a tad paranoid, in thinking that I am not exactly welcomed here, because although I've had a good attitude from the shops when I spend money there, anybody else who I am trying to get help from, doesn't seem to want to know me, or my situation. Life is difficult enough these days anyway, without the lack of help & support, especially for a newcomer in a small community, where I always thought people in my situation are looked after.
