#### **MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT**



It has been a busy year at the Foundation with many changes, new initiatives and a lot of growth. We've been celebrating the Foundation's 30th Anniversary all year long with \$30 for 30 years. Your \$30 birthday gift goes straight to work helping us build sustainable library programs for the entire community.

With the closing of the Central Library, this summer has been dedicated to looking for a new home. We will announce our new location and official move date once we have a lease. We expect this to happen soon and foresee moving into our new office space early January.

Additionally, the Library is in the process of leadership transition as the search for

a new library director begins. I am pleased to represent the Foundation on the search committee. This is a first for the Foundation, and further demonstrates our deepened partnership with the Library and the City of Fort Worth.

Despite the changes, the Foundation is growing and expanding:

- Our development team is on track to surpass its revenue goals for the second year.
- We relaunched DeamBuilders, our monthly giving program.
- We're growing our community connections through speaking engagements, participating in city-wide events like Oktoberfest's Nonprofit Olympics and Lockwood's Cocktails for a Cause, and fostering new partnerships.
- The LaunchPad College App program has expanded with the addition of program specialist Dr. Teri Blaisdell. We're also awarding our first LaunchPad scholarship in Spring 2024.
- Board engagement and support are at an all-time high with the addition of three new members at the close of 2022 and two new members in 2023.

In just a few short months, we will begin 2024. The Foundation will continue striving for another 30 years of community engagement as we start a new chapter in a new location and with new library leadership. We'll also be coming up on the final year of the Foundation's three-year strategic plan and, of course, the 27th year of our famous signature event, the Cigar Smoker (May 1).

Change is never easy, and you can count on challenges along the way, but seeing the blessings within those challenges makes it worthwhile. On behalf of our board, staff and ALL those we serve through our mission, thank you for your dedication and support.

#### LAUNCHPAD: NURTURING STUDENT SUCCESS



In the realm of education, dedicated teachers play an essential role in shaping the future and success of students. Dr. Teri Blaisdell, the latest LaunchPad College App team addition, epitomizes this unwavering commitment to student achievement.

Teri crossed paths with Dr. Paula Tyler, the co-founder of

LaunchPad, in the Paschal High School Library in 2008. "We immediately realized we had so much in common," said Teri. Both are English PhDs, both taught at Paschal and both have had a common network of friends. Teri immediately invited Paula to speak to her senior class. This invitation would begin a transformative partnership.

Paula's visits to Teri's classes set the stage for a shared commitment to empower students and enhance their college application journey. Several years later, their vision led to the creation of a week-long summer college essay-writing camp. "It was our desire to reach as many students as possible, and summer seemed like the next obvious step," Teri said.

Fifteen summer camps later, Teri joined the LaunchPad team part-time, beginning a new chapter in her illustrious career that includes many years as a full-time English lecturer at UTA, a decade teaching AP English Literature, three years nurturing students in AP Capstone Seminar and several years teaching evening courses at TCU, UTA and TCC.

"The biggest benefit of working with LaunchPad students versus students in the classroom is the amount of time and flexibility. I get to work with students in person, via Zoom and by email. This flexibility ensures students receive personalized guidance tailored to their individual needs. I also appreciate the ability to work with students from all sorts of backgrounds and experiences," explained Teri.

Her dedication to guiding students is evident through stories of growth and transformation. Many hardworking and deserving students sign up for LaunchPad after they have poured their hearts into their first essays. In some cases, the essays don't answer the prompt and/ or need significant content revisions. "I'm extremely careful in these cases to make sure they see revising not as a criticism but as an opportunity to really shine," explains Teri. "I encouraged one student to write one paragraph and share it with me. Writing the new essay was so much fun using my strategy that the student was extremely excited about writing, and after a few revisions and drafting, she produced a remarkable college application essay."

The Foundation is thrilled to have Dr. Blaisdell on the team.

Her wealth of teaching experience and unwavering commitment to helping students achieve their aspirations will continue the excellence of LaunchPad services.

#### **ABC'S OF BABYSITTING**



Families asked, and the Fort Worth Public Library listened. This past summer, after many requests from the community, the Library launched a new teen-focused program to empower teens to successfully care for younger children by learning essential skills.

Focus groups helped the

Library understand that teens and preteens are often left with the huge responsibility of caring for their younger siblings when parents and adults are at work. The new program aims to help working families by providing teens with the skills necessary to look after younger children. Additionally, teens were eager to find ways to earn income during school breaks by babysitting.

After a successful debut, the program rapidly gained popularity and was included in the Library's fall lineup of free classes. The four-hour class covered safety, behavior management, and entertainment tips to better prepare teens to navigate the world of babysitting. The safety portion of the class included CPR training from the Fort Worth Fire Department. The Library and the Fire Department have collaborated on programming in the past, including firefighter story times.

Each participant received a babysitting kit packed with fun activities, games, books and bilingual materials.

The program successfully wrapped up fall courses on Saturday, Oct. 21, at the Vivian J. Lincoln Library, but teens can still check out a babysitting kit with their library card.

Community donations made through the Foundation help prepare teens to be successful through free programs like the ABC's of Babysitting.
