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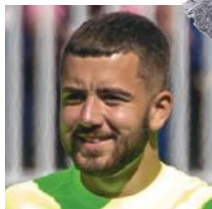

The Fleet's record against Welsh clubs

PRINCI-PARITY

— WHILE WE'VE NEVER played a team from Cardiff before, we do have a history with Welsh sides from our time in the Southern League and Conference/National League down the years.

Our very first – and most played – Welsh opponents were **Merthyr Tydfil**, closely followed by **Barry Town**, both exactly 80 years ago in our first-ever season of 1946/47. The Fleet's very first trip to Wales came during a severe winter spell in January 1947, when we enjoyed a 2-0 win at Penryn Park. That result, in the club's first season, was an excellent one given Merthyr finished third that season and would go on to win the Southern League five times over the next seven years. Merthyr



were also the first Welsh side to visit Stonebridge Road, making the return trip in March. Barry Town soon followed and we exchanged 13 goals with them that season, in a 5-0 win and a 4-4 draw.

We added **Lovell's Athletic** the following season – they were a club formed out of the famous toffee-makers of Lovell's, a Newport-based sweet factory, who eventually left the Southern League in 1959 and dissolved in 1969. In our first visit to their Rexville ground (now a housing estate called

'The Turnstiles'), they beat us 4-0 and even applied to join the Football League at the end of that season! Quite ambitious for a factory team!

That Welsh contingent became four-strong with the addition of **Llanelli** to our list of opponents in 1950, although their stay was relatively short as they

left the Southern League in 1957. They reformed in 2013 (as Llanelli Town, using the correct Welsh spelling) after being wound up over unpaid tax debt. They are our only former Welsh opponents who have regularly played Cardiff Met and who are currently playing in the Cymru League (having been relegated from the Premier to the South last season).

It was then more than 20 years before we met our fifth Welsh side in the Southern League, **Bridgend Town**, for what proved to be the only time in 1978/79. Bridgend returned to the Welsh pyramid in 1983 and merged with local rivals Bryntirion Athletic in 2013 to form Pen-y-bont FC. That club also takes on Cardiff Met in the Cymru Premier.

The following season of 1979/80 we became founder members of the Alliance Premier League and added Welsh club #6 in the form of **Bangor City** for two seasons. We had the pleasure of an undefeated four matches against them, winning two and drawing two. After more than 150 years of history behind them, Bangor withdrew from the Cymru League in 2022 and the club was officially dissolved in 2025.

The Nineties gave us **Newport County** after they had fallen out of the Football League in 1988 and were wound

up. They reformed as Newport AFC and we met in the Southern League before crossing swords again in the Conference, by which time the club had added the suffix 'County' once again.

And before Ryan Reynolds made them super-famous, we were also on an equal footing with **Wrexham** through various seasons from 2008–19, beating the Red Dragons five times out of 16 attempts. We never quite managed a victory at the Racecourse but enjoyed convincing wins of 3-0 and 4-2 over them here at home in successive years in 2018 and 2019.

Our final game against a Welsh side also came that year, as we enjoyed a third triumph over Wrexham, Myles Weston providing the winner in a 2-1 victory.

We have also played a couple of clubs who have taken part in the Welsh Cup but who are geographically English – Hereford United, Chester, Crewe Alexandra, Northwich Victoria, Kidderminster Harriers, Stourbridge, Hednesford Town, Tranmere Rovers

and Shrewsbury Town – but these clubs have been prohibited from entering since 1995.

A DANCE WITH DRAGONS

What links the Fleet to Cardiff and to Wales down the years?

— WHEN CARDIFF MET POPPED UP in the list of pre-season opponents, Fleet fans could have been forgiven for a quick detour via Google to find out just who the Archers were and what league they played in.

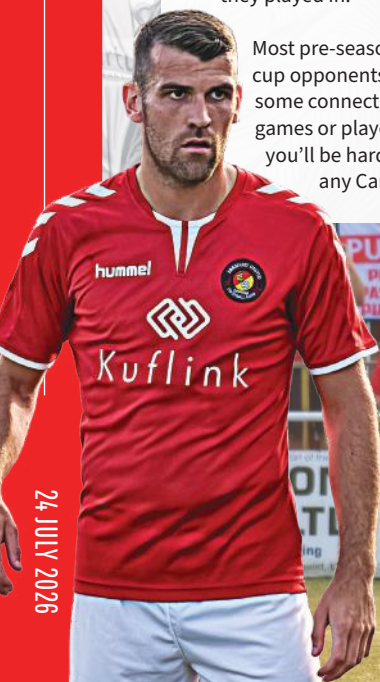
Most pre-season, league and cup opponents will have at least some connection via previous games or players to the Fleet but you'll be hard-pressed finding any Cardiff Met links.

There is, however, one link... tenuous though it may be. Striker Adam Roscrow (*below*), who this summer departed his third spell at Cardiff Met, was a pre-season trialist for the Fleet in a game at Punjab United in 2022 and he later had a brief spell with Welling United before returning home to Wales.

Links between the Fleet and the city of Cardiff itself are slightly easier to find, and perhaps most recognisably via our number two David Kerslake. Kers spent

2011–2014 at Cardiff City as assistant manager, and for a spell at the end of that time as caretaker manager, winning promotion to the Premier League during that period.

Welsh team under Chris Coleman. Old Gravesend keepers Norman Coe and Tommy James were also born in Wales.

Amongst our current squad, Lennon Peake is another who has spent time at Cardiff City while the same was true of our former wide man Luke Coulson.

Other former Cardiff City youth players who went on to play for the Fleet include Aaron Bolger (*right, in Cardiff colours*), Alex Lawless, Anthony Acheampong, Anthony Cook and Michael Corcoran. Goalkeeper Lee Smelt, meanwhile, is the only former Fleet man to spend any significant playing time in Cardiff, turning out 37 times for the Bluebirds in the mid-1980s.

In fact, we've had a few goalkeepers with links to Wales, with Micky Cadmore born in Swansea and having played football there before moving to Kent in the 1980s, while Darren Smith spent time as a goalkeeper coach for the



Wider links to Wales include three men with Welsh caps. Pre-war Northfleet United players Taffy O'Callaghan and Ron Burgess won 11 and 32 caps respectively for their country, while our former player-manager Steve Lovell played six times for Wales during the Eighties.

We also boast a few ex-Welsh U21 internationals with Danny Slatter (born in Cardiff), Alex Lawless, Grant Basey and Gareth Williams all having represented the country.

As far as the Cymru League, of which Cardiff Met are a current member, is concerned, our new signing Aramide Oteh played for The New Saints as recently as last season. Others to have played for the Fleet and in that league include goalkeeper Josh Gould (Barry Town), plus striker Nick Harry (Llanelli,

Monmouth Town, Carmarthen). Former Newport County and Fleet winger Robbie Willmott (*above*) is also the current manager of Cymru South club Newport City.

One of our players from the 1950s, Ken Jones, who went on to become a well-known sports journalist, was born in Wales to a famous Welsh footballing family. His father Emlyn played with Dixie Dean at Everton, his uncle Ivor was capped by Wales and his cousin Cliff Jones played for Spurs and scored three goals for Wales in the 1958 World Cup while winning 59 caps in total.

Finally, his uncle Bryn (no, this isn't a Gavin & Stacey gag), was once the most expensive Welsh footballer when he held the British record transfer fee of £14,000 after a move to Arsenal in 1938. He, too, was capped by Wales, 17 times.

And if you want one more spurious Wales fact from Fleet history to end on, we give you right-back Tony Wales. His only link to the country was his surname but he did make his debut in 1963 against Barry Town and played his last game the following year, also against Barry Town! Wales by name, Wales by nature!

The Fleet could count themselves unfortunate not to find at least a second goal in a game where Josh Wright handed one half of his squad a full 90 minutes ahead of the same again this evening.

Both sides exchanged opportunities before the Hammers went ahead on 19 minutes. A ball was flicked on to find the strong-running Josh Landers who was able to fight off Charlie Seaman before placing a well-crafted, delicate chip over Will Buse.

And with 33 minutes gone, West Ham found a second. Fleet were the architects of their own undoing after failing to clear their lines and Jett Murphy was able to thread a pass into the box for former Celtic striker Dan Cummings. He squared it across goal for Jephthah Medine, arriving in the six-yard box, to finish off.

Fleet were back in the game a minute before half-time. This time it was West Ham's turn for some sloppy defending as Finn Hooper's clearance went only as far as Finlay Barnes, whose quick-thinking intercepted Callum Leacock. Although Hooper prevented Barnes' shot from finding the target, Maxx Manktelow got the ball down and drilled a low shot home.

Fleet were able to keep the impressive and physical front two of Landers and Cummings quiet as the second-half began and enjoyed most of the possession after the break. An excellent Fleet move saw Barnes find Harvey Walker out wide and he advanced, dropping a shot in towards the six-yard box that Hooper had to come out and collect in mid-air.

More chances came as Manktelow headed just over from a Josh Passley delivery while the energetic Lennon Peake – against his old club – threaded his way through in another move that ended with Walker lifting the ball over the crossbar. The Fleet's back line didn't give West Ham any room to manoeuvre in the closing stages but the Hammers held firm too as their 2-1 lead was maintained.



FROM CARDIFF TO THE COLOSSEUM

The Cardiff kid who played for Italy...



— **GIORGIO CHINAGLIA WAS BORN** into the 1947 post-war defeatism of an occupied Italy, and raised in the care of his grandparents until, aged just eight years old, he set off across Europe alone to join his parents in Wales. A child of exceptional talent, and exceptional arrogance, his career struggled to take off in England as he rejected Cardiff City and struggled with discipline in several seasons at Swansea Town. After 11 years living in Wales, he got a letter from the Italian government calling him up to national service, and his career turned around.

His time in the army was spent in a special footballers' battalion, meaning his only duties were to train every day, and to get a special pass when the club he joined – Massese, in Tuscany – had a match. By his own admission, without that letter, he probably would

have spent his life getting drunk in Wales. Not that it all went swimmingly for him, at the start.

Having played abroad, he was banned from joining a Serie A club for three years. Massese were in the third tier, as were his second club, Internapoli. He was seen as a very British player, big and physical, but technically lacking. It was in his two seasons at Internapoli that he earned the nickname Long John, after Welsh international John Charles, and also a reputation as a busy forward with a good strike rate. When his three-year exile was up, he got his wish to play in the top flight. Along with Darlington-born Joseph Wilson, he was signed by Lazio.

His first seasons in the Italian capital were a struggle. Chinaglia managed 21 goals across his first two campaigns, and Lazio were relegated, before he found his form in Serie B and fired them back to the top table. But the Lazio dressing room was split, although it was claimed that it was on personality rather than politics. It didn't stop Chinaglia showing his support for the heirs to Mussolini's fascists. Such was the dislike in the squad that the factions changed separately, and all bought guns. According to goalkeeper Felice Pulci, the cabin whenever they flew was like an armoury.

On their return to Serie A, the rivalry seemed to inspire them. They missed out on the Scudetto by two points. The only place Chinaglia was more popular than at Lazio was in Rome's bustling nightclubs. He enjoyed time away from football so much, he even released a single.

The following season saw Chinaglia called up to the national side to play at Wembley, where he set up the winner for Fabio Capello. That same season, after scoring the winner against Roma, he celebrated in front of their supporters. He received so many death threats, he started carrying his magnum pistol everywhere, not just to training. But he revelled in the intensity, and in the return fixture, he did the same again, just to rub it in. He scored the winner in the final game of the season, as Lazio secured the title.

A rate of 24 goals in just 30 games ensured he was called up to the World Cup squad in 1974, but his temperament got in the way. He was substituted in the first game against Haiti, and made it clear to staff that he would play the full game or no game at all. They obliged, and refused to play him for the next game, which provoked his temper even more. He

ended up storming out of the squad, as Italy failed to deliver an expected World Cup.

Lazio's fortunes also faltered, finishing fourth in 1975 and fighting relegation in 1976. Chinaglia had run out of road in Italy, and when his American wife moved home to the States, he followed. Landing in New York, he marched into the offices of the Cosmos and declared that they would sign him, or he would start his own team and play for them. The Cosmos signed him.

Anyone who thought he might be humbled playing alongside such luminaries as Pele and Franz Beckenbauer hadn't been paying attention. In his own mind, Chinaglia was the star. He reportedly made Pele cry at one point, after forcefully making that point. But Cosmos fans loved him as Lazio fans had, and he repaid their idolisation with 231 goals in 234 appearances. They won the championship four times with him at the head of their attack, before he eventually retired.

Chinaglia tried his hand at management, but his personality was not well suited to that field. But at Lazio, he is a legend. In the famous Ristorante di Sabatino there is a picture of Saint Padre Pio, who claimed to have physically fought Satan and his demons. And just above him is a picture of a man, arms outstretched, in the blue of Lazio. Although that one was never a saint!

WELCOMING THE ARCHERS

There's something of a novelty to this one as Cardiff Met are the first team outside of the English football pyramid to visit us since (as far as memory allows us!) Bray Wanderers from the League of Ireland came to Stonebridge Road for a pre-season friendly back in 1995.

A little bit like Team Bath who made it into the Conference South back in 2008, Cardiff Met was founded from the halls of academia as the Cardiff College of Education FC, performing well in the Welsh Amateur Cup before joining the lower ranks of the Welsh League in 1972. The club has gone through several iterations. In 1990, it rebranded as Cardiff Institute of Higher Education FC and in 2000 merged with Inter Cardiff to form UWIC Inter Cardiff. It became known as just UWIC in 2009 and then switched to its current name of Cardiff Met in 2012, earning back-to-back promotions into the Welsh Division 1 and then to its current Premier Division status in 2016.

The side features a number of younger players studying at or recently graduated from the university as well as a number of well-established non-league and ex-EFL players, most notably defender James Clarke who has more than 600 games at levels from League One to Conference South (indeed he played against the Fleet for Oxford United almost 20 years ago).

There have been 10 departures but only one new signing has been announced as yet – and no goalkeeper – so expect a few trialists tonight, while former Shrewsbury Town and Morecambe midfielder Aaron Wildig has been heavily linked with the Archers this summer. The visitors have enjoyed an unbeaten pre-season so far, most recently earning a 0-0 draw against Brackley Town of the National North, recently relegated from the National League.

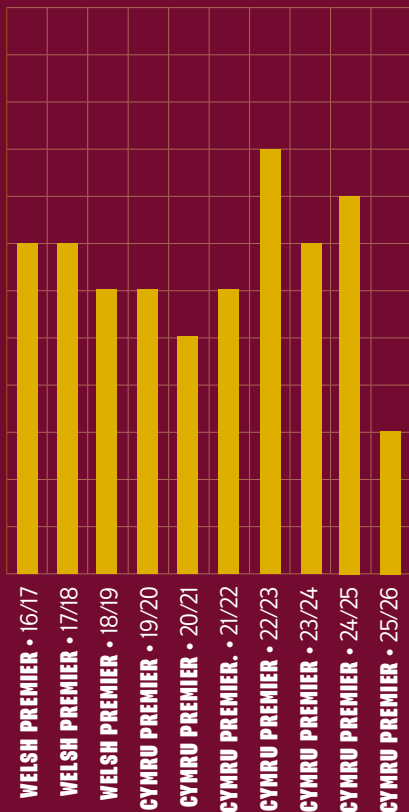

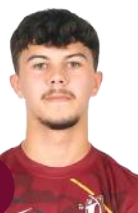

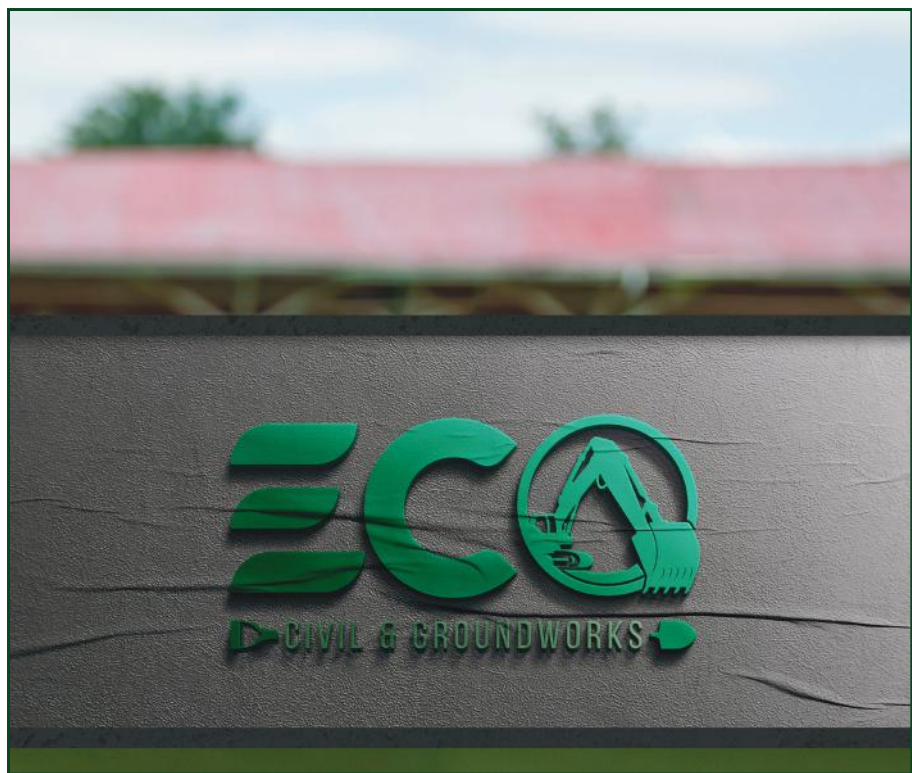

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— **NEVER PRE-JUDGE A SEASON'S** outcome by pre-season form... but that said, it's interesting to see what kind of form our soon-to-be-opponents are in heading into the new campaign.

Slough Town, of course, are first up for the Fleet at Arbour Park. With one win, two draws (one at Chatham Town) and two defeats to lower-division sides so far, it's been a mixed bag but new striker signing Godlove Oppong has three goals as he gets into his stride.

Our first visitors here are newly promoted **Folkestone Invicta** who have brought Jamie Fielding, Aaron Cosgrave and John Akinde in. They shared two of our pre-season opponents, losing at Aveley but drawing 0-0 at home to Dartford. Elsewhere they have beaten a Charlton XI and AFC Croydon Athletic, while drawing with Sutton Common Rovers and losing at Cray Wanderers.

Chelmsford City are once again much-fancied and we go there on a Monday

night in August. Mark Cooper's men haven't had a heavy pre-season but remain with a 100% record in three games, with wins over Ipswich Town U21s, Canvey Island and Bishop's Stortford.

Our second home game of the season sees **AFC Totton** visit us – the Stags are another whose pre-season schedule has been light and they have drawn 0-0 with an AFC Bournemouth XI and 2-2 with both Sutton United and Sholing. Their sole win was a 3-0 victory at Moneyfields.

Completing our August fixtures, we face **Farnborough** and **Horsham** over the Bank Holiday Weekend. Horsham, meanwhile, are firing on all cylinders, having beaten Eastbourne Town, AFC Wimbledon U18s and Eastleigh, with a draw against Dulwich Hamlet in midweek.

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THE FLEET ARCHERS
