NO ID & ENROLLMENT FORM, NO ENTRY

- If your **ID and enrollment form are not yet available**, the only allowed point of entry is the Main Gate.
- If you have an ID and enrollment form, you may enter through the various gates available starting at 6:00 a.m. For convenient access to specific locations or buildings at the Main Campus, it is suggested that you take the following gates:
 - **Main Gate** (*SLU Main Campus, A. Bonifacio St.*): Diego Silang Building, Waldo Perfecto Building, Fr. Joseph De Haes-P.E. Building, Dr. Konrad Adenauer-Science Building, Dr. Jose P. Rizal Building, Prince Bernhard Gym

 - **Gate 6 - Checkpoint** (*SLU SHMC, Upper Assumption Rd*): Msgr. Charles Vath Library Building, Fr. Joseph Van den Daelen- Center for Culture and the Arts (CCA), Prince Bernhard Gym, Dr. Jose P. Rizal Building, Otto Hahn- Engineering Building, Dr. Konrad Adenauer-Science Building
- Guests may only enter through the main gate starting at 8:00 a.m.
- For **first year students/transferees whose IDs are not yet available**, your enrollment form is sufficient. Note, however, that starting **02 September 2025**, our Campus Planning, Maintenance, and Security Department (CPMSD) will enforce strict checking of the wearing of IDs.

HEALTH & SAFETY PROTOCOLS

- SLU's "Water is Life" refilling stations are located at the Quadrangle, adjacent to the Diego Silang Building at the SLU Main Campus, and at the left wing lobby of the Fr. Serafin Devesse Building at the SLU Maryheights Campus, Bakakeng — ensuring you have easy access to clean and safe drinking water.
- Water is absolutely FREE. Whenever you need a drink, bring your own tumbler and just refill at the "Water is Life" station—no single-use plastics needed!
- Drinking water throughout the day helps you stay focused, keeps your energy up, and supports your overall well-being.
- Bringing your own bottle helps the environment, too.

FREE WATER REFILL!

Water is absolutely FREE every time you refill a maximum of 1 liter tumbler.

REMEMBER, EVERY DROP COUNTS!

For larger thirsts exceeding 1 liter, a corresponding fee will apply, contributing to eco-friendly initiatives. You may settle this fee at the Finance Office.
