Emerging infectious diseases in recent decades, driven in large part by such environmental developments, are mostly zoonotic in origin. Zoonotic disease outbreaks and pandemic including COVID-19, Ebola, chikungunya, Zika virus, Middle East Respiratory Syndrome, cholera, plague, and yellow fever, have highlighted our vulnerability to emerging infectious diseases among other crises.

One Health is an emerging concept that stresses the linkages between human, animal, and environment health, as well as the need for interdisciplinary communication and collaboration to address health issues including emerging zoonotic diseases, climate changes impacts, and the human-animal bond. Lessons learned from infectious disease outbreaks in recent years have illustrated that training professionals in the One Health arena has the potential to improve epidemic and pandemic preparedness. Without One Health approach, experts in environmental, animal, and human health will continue to address these challenges independently and in an uncoordinated fashion, missing the opportunity to maximise the benefits of shared knowledge, shared professional expertise, and available resources

In response to One Health issues, training of researchers must transcend individual's disciplines to develop a new process of collaboration. This involves physicians, veterinarians, nurses, ecologist, zoologist, entomologists, sociologist, economist, anthropologists, pathologists, microbiologists, epidemiologists, and politicians need to ensure they have the skills to work collaboratively with each other and with governments, the private sector and communities.

This course is intended for medical doctors, veterinarians, nurses, epidemiologists, zoologists, ecologists, entomologists, economists, biologists, microbiologists, anthropologists and students of relevant areas.

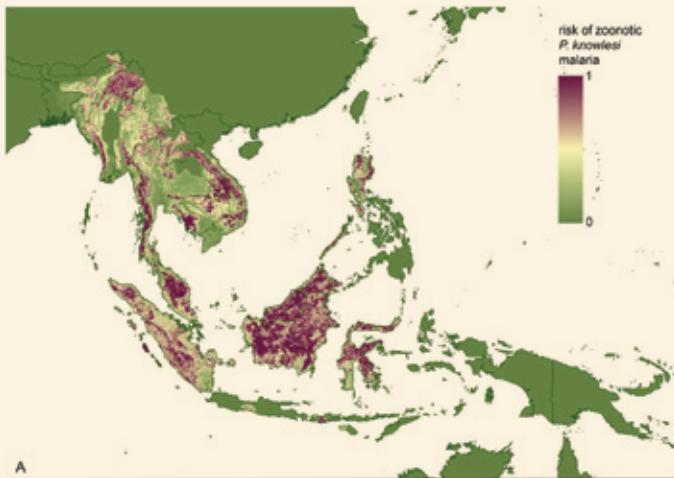

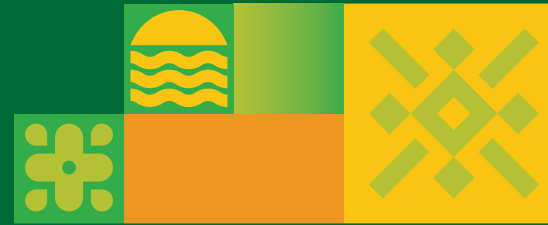

Herbal Medicine: Technology and Innovations

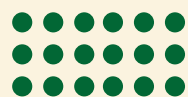

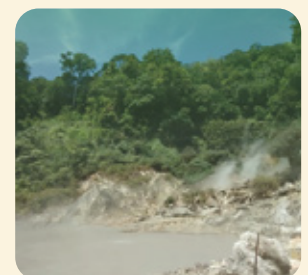
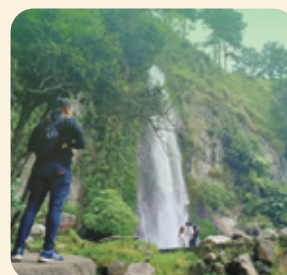

In accordance with the summer course topic "Herbal Medicine: Technology and Innovations", this course will review the potential of natural resources (plants) as herbal medicine using technology to produce the innovative products. This course is carried in line with the excellence study program, namely Manufacturing Technology of Natural Medicinal Dosage Forms that will explore the Indonesia natural resources, especially medicinal plants. This program will be able to be recognized with subject related herbal medicine in student's institution.

The Program Features

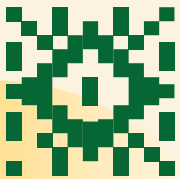


During this course, you will attend class for about six hours a day. A class consists of lectures plus discussion, workshop, sharing plants local wisdom for health treatment in traditional medicines, and the most interesting is the trip to explore North Sumatera. You also get a group of buddies from domestic (Indonesia students) and overseas, will be assigned to assist you throughout your whole study, giving you the perfect chance to explore North Sumatera. As a participant, you will enjoy the culture exploration in North Sumatera as well as visit to tropical forest.

In Sibual Buali Nature Preserve you will enjoy the forest observation. Along the agenda, you will enjoy the Dolok Sibual-buali Forest district which is inhabited by protected flora and fauna. The flora of the Dolok Sibual-buali Forest is dominated by Euphorbiaceae, Myrtaceae, Anarcadiaceae, Moraceae, Dipterocarpaceae, Rafflesia Sp., Pinus Merkusii strain Tapanuli and others. In this district, you will find many spring water-clear and cold streams.

The fauna of this forest is dominated by mammals (Tragulus napu, Muntiacus muntjak, Pangolin, Sun bear, Hystrix branhyura, Felis marmorata, Symphalangus syndactylus, Hylobates agilis) and birds (Garrulax leucophus, Rhyticeros undulatus, Otus Sp., Heterophasia). Dolok Sibual-buali Forest is convenient for studying about mountain natural forests, source of germplasm, and the flora/fauna can be used as an object of research.

You will also enjoy the nature and cultural tour in Tipang and Marbuntoruan Village such as Waterfall, tracking in the green expanse of Marbuntoruan rice fields, the local residents' agritourism featuring a variety of local arts dan cultures such as music, local traditional woven known as Ulos, traditional food etc. The sunset views can be enjoyed from all sides in the village and explore other exotic spots around the Lake Toba. You will get a broad experience to balance your knowledge from lectures and biological natural resources as well as North Sumatera cultures, this will be an unforgettable experience for you.



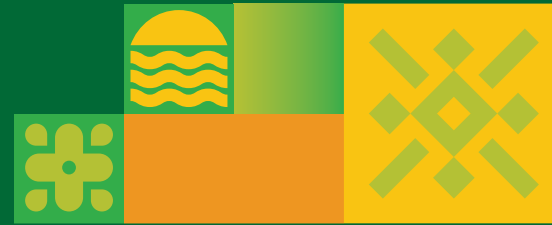

About the Program

The theme of Glocalizing Development in North Sumatra was obtained from the results of brainstorming conducted by several study programs at USU's FISIP, namely Public Administration Science, Social Welfare Science, Communication Science, and Sociology. After participating in this summer course, participants are expected to get a real picture of how local values in North Sumatra, which are the hallmarks of human resource development in North Sumatra, survive in the midst of the unstoppable influence of globalization. This program is also expected to be able to emphasize to the global community how people in North Sumatra maintain local wisdom not only at the level of the family environment, but also can still be felt within the government environment as a policy maker.

The Summer Course program is implemented with the concept of collaboration between several study programs in order to foster a culture of cross-disciplinary collaboration, and strengthen USU's position in cross-disciplinary fields. In accordance with the guidelines for implementing the summer course issued by USU, this activity has a duration of between 2 weeks to 2 months, and in general the aim is to provide additional professional training to students so that they can deepen their abilities and improve their own qualifications. The accumulated credits that will be obtained by foreign students in the implementation of this summer course are equivalent to 3 credits. The theme of the Summer Course program proposed by USU's FISIP takes a cross-disciplinary topic, but still refers to one of the leading fields of the University of North Sumatra (TALENTA) which is in accordance with the peculiarities of the social science field, namely "Local Wisdom".

This area of excellence explains that North Sumatra can be an example for outsiders of excellent forms of interaction and tolerance with the existing ethnic diversity. With the value of local wisdom possessed by each tribe, it can be used to maintain national unity and solve problems that exist in society. The study of local wisdom will be interesting when social science and political science take part in it.



FISIP Summer Course 2022 is a two-week program held by the Faculty of Social and Political Science of Universitas Sumatera Utara, Indonesia. The event provides students with medium to learn more about Indonesia's local wisdom especially in Sumatera Utara, through a series of lecture on multi-disciplined perspective such as public policies, social welfare issues, tourism communication, and plantation in sociological aspect. The course is free of charge with limited participants. We would like to invite students from all around the world for having this experience with us in blended class session.



The Program Objectives

Through this online class meeting, students will gain knowledge about traditional village (tourism based on local wisdom); slum area (identifying communities and their contributions); tourism communication (intercultural communication and local wisdom); and plantation (sociological aspect). Students will have a first-hand experience in exploring Sumatera Utara culture, economy, religion, and life style when attend the fieldwork (offline class meeting).



Learning Outcomes

- 1 Participants can recognize and be interested in the socio-political realities of the people of North Sumatra;

- 2 Participants know and are interested in exploring the natural beauty and cultural richness of North Sumatra;

- 3 Participants understand the local wisdom of the people of North Sumatra in preserving the environment and can adapt these values in their place of origin;

- 4 Participants can understand that the people of North Sumatra consist of various ethnicities and cultures, then generate academic interest in conducting joint research; and

- 5 Participants increasingly understand the historical background of the North Sumatra region in the global historical trajectory.

Highlight Course Material

Traditional Village (Tourism based on Local Wisdom)

Traditional village is an institution on a small scale in the area, which has customary values as community wealth at the village level. Traditional village is a regional advantage, which is research by the public administration in the subject of institutional development. In the 10th meeting, the institutional development course explored the main elements in institutions (institutions) consisting of institutions, actors and local wisdom (public values). Local wisdom (public value) as tourism, requirement in the context of traditional villages, as an institution, that requires public management.

Slum Area (Identifying Communities and Their Contributions)

One of the main problems that often experienced by big cities in developing countries is slum areas. Participants in this session will gain knowledge about the main characteristics of slum area, a reason for the emergence of slum area, and the impacts for urban area of the presence of slum area. The participants will have the first-hand experience visiting several slum areas in Medan.

Tourism Communication (Intercultural Communication and Local Wisdom)

This session invites summer course participants to see the cultural diversity found in the city of Medan. How as a Metropolitan city, Medan was previously inhabited by people from various races (Malay, Indian, Chinese, etc.) is also now inhabited by people from various countries. They stay to do work, business, etc. Of course, this condition has an impact on inter-ethnic mixed marriages in the people of Medan City. It is interesting to study from the aspect of intercultural communication. Likewise the influence of Malay culture in terms of rhyming, there are so many communities activity start by throwing rhymes to each other. For participants of this summer course, it can provide a new experience for them to learn to compose interesting rhymes. In addition, for visual enrichment, participants will invite to visit Istana Maimun as a representation of Malay Culture, as well as make friendly with intermarried couples or family members.

Plantation (Sociological Aspect)

In the period of colonialism, Indonesia integrated by European countries into a plantation-based capitalist economic system. Since then the plantation economy has become an integral part of the economic and social life of the Indonesian people. The plantation economy is also the main and important activity that drives economic life and social life in North Sumatra. Therefore, social issues related to the lives of workers and the surrounding communities become interesting to study and analyze. Issues of social stratification and social inequality are important in studying the social life of the plantation community. This material will be delivered classically and field studies. Through this material, it is hope that summer course participants will be able to see the reality of the life of plantation communities in North Sumatra.

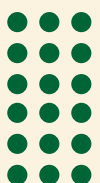


About the Program

The Summer Course: Agrarian Politics, Food Sovereignty, and Peasants' Rights is carried out in several stages. Participants are not charged. This program targets a minimum of 20 international students from three different countries. The lecture will involve six international lecturers, five lecturers from the Faculty of Social and Political Sciences-USU, and one lecturer at UIN Syarif Hidayatullah who focuses on studies on agrarian issues, food and peasants' rights. By utilizing technology, the lecture method is carried out using Blended Online (synchronous and asynchronous).
