As August approaches, there is always excitement in the air at our schools and Central Office as we prepare to welcome back our students and staff for the new school year. This summer, Lakota's finance team has been very busy closing the books on Fiscal Year 2024 (FY24), opening the new one and implementing a few changes for the upcoming school year.

Despite some challenges on the horizon, such as increasing enrollment and no increases to state funding, Lakota's finances continue to be strong. We ended FY24 with our 12<sup>th</sup> consecutive balanced budget while also receiving our tenth consecutive Auditor of State Award with Distinction.

### FROM THE TREASURER

At Lakota, WE are fiscally responsible. This statement is at the center of every financial decision we make to uphold our district mission: "Everything WE do is designed to provide a futureready, student-centered learning experience for every single child."

To that end, please be aware of a few changes that have been implemented for the new school year:

• PaySchools Central has launched as the district's new online payment portal, replacing EZpay. Parents can access PaySchools through OneLogin.

• As we have communicated, the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) funds from the COVID-19 pandemic are no longer available. As a result, student fees will return for the 2024-2025 school year. Specific information about fees can be found on our website.

• For the first time since 2017, student lunches will see a slight increase in cost.

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Thank you to all of our new families who have completed the enrollment process. Early registration helps the district be better prepared with staffing and planning for the new school year.

I hope that you have had a chance to read our annual Financial Prospectus, which was mailed to our residents and businesses in the spring. If you missed it, please use the QR code to access the electronic edition.

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## **Master Facilities Plan Update**

The Board's work on the Master Facilities Plan continues to move forward. The Ohio Facilities Construction Commission (OFCC) has approved the Lakota Board of Education's application to enroll in the Expedited Local Partnership Program (ELPP). As a result, the State will now pay for an updated enrollment study and building assessment that the district will use to build out its facilities plan. Partnering with the State through ELPP also makes Lakota eligible to receive partial reimbursement for facilities projects that the OFCC approves through the final plan. Currently, Lakota is eligible for a 31% reimbursement rate through ELPP.

# Curriculum Corner

Lakota students will benefit from new curriculum textbooks and materials in English language arts and mathematics this year. Approved in May by the Lakota Board of Education, the new curriculum supports the Ohio Learning Standards, which Lakota follows for teaching and instruction.

#### K-6 English Language Arts

Imagine Learning EL Education focuses on the comprehension side of reading, using social studies and science topics to teach students. This not only teaches students to read, but also builds their content knowledge at the same time.

Students in kindergarten through third grade will use "Heggerty Bridge to Reading" to build their foundational

skills. The curriculum for grades four and five will be released from the company and introduced at Lakota for the 2025-2026 school year. The curriculum includes decodable books and workbooks to support student learning.

### K-6 Math and Sixth Grade Advanced Mathematics

Imagine Learning's Illustrative Mathematics 360 curriculum has been adopted by the Board of Education for early childhood and elementary students. Students will have access to online accounts to practice their math skills as well as manipulative kits in their classrooms for hands-on learning.

#### 7-12 Mathematics

Students will now have consistency with the foundational resources for their math courses when transitioning from primary to secondary grades. The District has adopted Amplify Desmos

Illustrative Based Math for seventh grade through Algebra II, sharing the same Illustrative-based foundation as the adopted K-6 math curriculum.

Additionally, the Board has approved the adoption of the Miller Precalculus textbook and Bedford, Freeman and Worth textbook for advanced placement (AP) statistics, AP calculus AB and BC.

### 7-12 English Language Arts (ELA)

Lakota has adopted the SAVVAS MyPerspectives ELA curriculum for both regular and advanced language arts classes in grades 7-8. This curriculum has also been adopted for college preparatory (CP) English 9-12, British and world literature and honors English 9-11. One of the deciding factors for choosing this curriculum is the robust teacher and student resources available to enrich instruction and learning.

- Buy school supplies.

Attend open house or orientation.

- Complete new school year forms in FinalForms via OneLogin. Aug. 1 was the deadline for alternative bus pick-up/drop-off locations to be honored on the first day.
- Submit any updated immunization records to your school nurse.
- Add funds to your child's meal balance via PaySchools.
- Complete your annual free/reduced meals application if you think you qualify.
- Check teacher assignments and student schedules on Home Access Center (HAC) in early August.

Look up your bus route in HAC in early August.

- **Bookmark your school's website** and subscribe to the calendars of your choice.
- **Download Lakota's mobile app** (search "Lakota Schools" from your app store) and select your schools to customize your calendar, news feed and push notifications.
