WHAT THEY LOOK LIKE



A first for pre-season as we welcome visitors from Norfolk to the last home friendly of the summer.

King's Lynn Town were arranged as opposition following the withdrawal of Boreham Wood from the originally planned match – with the Linnets having featured in last season's National League North play-offs, losing in the eliminator to Chorley.

They have had a somewhat reduced pre-season in comparison to ours and indeed haven't played since drawing with a Peterborough United XI eight days ago. That match may have produced just the two goals but in King's Lynn's previous three friendlies, they have scored a total of 15 goals...

albeit against lower league opposition. With the departure of previous manager Adam Lakeland

to FC Halifax Town this summer, it's been all change at The Walks. In has come former Gloucester City and Chesterfield boss James Rowe alongside new owners to replace outgoing chairman Stephen Cleeve. A significant number of new players have been brought in, with two popular returning players – skipper Michael Clunan who lifted the National North playoff trophy with Scunthorpe and former Bromley striker Adam Marriott – hoping to rekindle their previous form for King's Lynn.

The Fleet have performed very well against higher-league opposition – now begins a period against fellow non-leaguers before the real thing!

The new Head Coach was appointed in May following an extensive search for the ideal candidate. Rowe had highly successful managerial spells at Gloucester City, Chesterfield, and AFC Fylde, where he consistently delivered strong performances and ambitious football. He also served as assistant manager at Aldershot Town, helping the club to consecutive National League play-offs in 2015/16 and 2016/17. He had a prolific playing career as a striker with Histon, AFC Sudbury, Leiston and Canvey.

Fleet 1-0 King's Lynn January 11, 2020

King's Lynn arrived with a formidable scoring record and superb form, having not lost a game in 14 matches and they certainly looked confident in the opening exchanges of this FA Trophy tie, even with former Fleet man Michael Gash on the bench. A misunderstanding over a drop ball preceded growing animosity and tempers boiled over on 20 minutes, resulting in Fleet's Andre Blackman being sent off for the merest of shoves. With seven players eventually booked, Fleet's defence was the most disciplined thing on the pitch and they kept the visitors quiet despite the numerical disadvantage. New loan signing Jermaine McGlashan was a useful outlet down the right for the home side and he had two solid penalty appeals turned down.

Finally, on 67 minutes, after a succession of infuriating refereeing decisions as far as Fleet fans were concerned, the match official gave a rather soft penalty when Josh Umerah was challenged in the box and substitute Ayo Obileye sent the goalkeeper the wrong way to put 10-man Fleet through to the next round of the Trophy.

GOALKEEPER

MARC SMELT

Yes, he was a striker when he played just the two games for us in 1980/81 but given his brother Lee was one of the Fleet's best-ever No.1s and the fact we don't have a goalkeeper in this combined eleven, he's going between the posts. He later played for Margate and spent 1985-87 with King's Lynn.

DEFENDERS

SHANE HUKU

The defender, signed from Dover in 2013, had a spell at King's Lynn a decade earlier in 2003 on loan from Peterborough United. He played 42 times for us, including a play-off final against former club Dover.

MICHAEL GASH

Hugely out of position for the striker, but he did retreat into the back four later in his career and we need another defender in this lineup, so...! Gash signed for us for £20,000 from Cambridge City in 2008 before a move a year later to York. The current Peterborough Sports boss was at Lynn from 2017-21, playing almost 150 times.

MIDFIELDERS

JOHN THURGOOD

Hard-working and consistent player with 295 Fleet games from 1970-76, as well as two promotions. He played for the Linnets before his time with us.

CEORIC ANSELIN

A one-game wonder for the Fleet against Canvey Island in March 2005. The former Norwich player had a spell at King's Lynn after leaving us.

LUDOVIC QUISTIN

Guadeloupe international winger who played two cup games for us at the beginning of his career in 2003/04. He played 16 times for King's Lynn in 2005 in a nomadic career. He was killed in a car accident on Guadeloupe in 2012.

NORMAN GOLDING

Winger who played for QPR from 1959-61. In a game for King's Lynn against the Fleet in 1961/62 he impressed and moved to us the following season, playing 29 times, one of which was at Sunderland in our famous FA Cup replay.

FINLAY BARNES

Our new signing arrived

this summer from King's Lynn where he spent last season and featured in the play-offs.

FORWARDS

NORMAN BLEANCH

Former Southend and Bradford PA centre-forward who played for King's Lynn after he left the Football League in the early 60s. He played 42 times for the Fleet in 1965/66, scoring 11 goals.

TONY BATTERSBY

Made one appearance in our 6-0 thrashing of Morecambe in 2004 before managing to exit his contract with a supposed career-ending injury. Then turned up at Cambridge City and King's Lynn (playing 12 times for today's opponents) and managed to play on at various clubs until 2016!

KWESI APPIAH

Our returning ex-youth graduate was a Linnet as a teenager, on loan from Peterborough United back in 2009... scoring a prolific nine goals in 10 games but his spell was unfortunately cut short when the original King's Lynn club was wound up!

The Fleet kept up their good pre-season record against Gillingham with a deserved win over a strong visiting lineup that highlighted the best of Josh Wright's side's defensive and offensive capabilities.

Gillingham looked to control the game early on with Jonny Williams influential in the middle but they either fired off target or found Gio Bellagambi in their way, saving from Nelson Khumbeni and Ethan Coleman. It was the Fleet who found themselves ahead as Lennon Peake secured his second goal of this pre-season, scoring in the 23rd minute on his 23rd birthday. Cosgrave worked a ball into Peake's run and he cut inside

to fire across Turner into the far corner. The Gills found their rhythm again in the second-half forcing several good saves from Bellagambi whilst Mustapha Olagunju, who also performed very well throughout, cleared Seb Palmer-Houlden's effort off the line. The Fleet doubled the lead from the spot. Dom Samuel was adjudged to have been brought down by Shad Ogie and it was the No.14 who stepped up to convert the spot-kick himself, sending Jake Turner the wrong way. The 2-0 lead didn't last long as the Gills got one back with 10 minutes left. Joe Gbode was the man with a well-executed right-footed shot that floated into the top corner but Fleet weren't in a mood to let a second summer win under the lights slip.

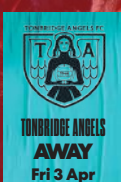

ALL THE KING'S MEN

It's a rare meeting these days between our clubs, but we used to cross paths with the Linnets on a more regular basis

ONE MEETING IN THE

last 28 years is all there's been between the Fleet and King's Lynn Town (or plain old King's Lynn FC as they once were) – that, of course, coming five years ago in Round 2 of the FA Trophy when an Ayo Obileye penalty was enough to see off the Linnets who had gone 14 matches unbeaten on their way to promotion

from the National North.

Before that, however, they were semi-regular opponents of ours, with meetings in the Fifties, Sixties, Eighties and Nineties – totalling some 19 matches between the clubs to date.

The Linnets emerged from the Eastern Counties and then Midland League during the 1950s. Their previous big

achievement was long before that, in 1900/01, when they were runners-up in the FA Amateur Cup, almost half a century before the finals were held at Wembley.

In their first season in the Southern League in 1958/59, the Fleet were the reigning champions and 2,020 people watched the clubs' first ever meeting, a 4-3 win here for us at

Stonebridge Road in November 1958. Another four goals were scored in our first visit to The Walks in the return match, this time without replay as Fleet triumphed 4-0 in front of a healthy crowd of 2,684.

That wasn't the highest attendance at a Fleet-King's Lynn match, however, which came in our next meeting in Norfolk in August 1959 as some 3,175 saw a 2-2 draw.

That share of the points was the first of five draws between the clubs over the next six meetings and well into the Sixties, the fixture continued to draw four-figure crowds with the last one (of 2,184) recorded at King's Lynn in 1963.

Four seasons of consecutive meetings ended

in 1962 with the Linnets' relegation to Division One and we followed them the season after, reuniting at the lower level for 1963/64. It was a brief reunion as King's Lynn did the double over us on their way to the runners-up spot and promotion back to the Premier Division.

Two decades were to pass before we met again, King's Lynn having suffered relegation from the Premier Division again in 1971 just as things began to look up for the Fleet.

We crossed paths once more in the Southern Premier in 1983/84 after the Linnets switched from a three-year spell in the Northern Premier League and a 1-0 win away

in 1984 ended a 25-year wait for a victory over King's Lynn. We had three more seasons of competition together, though this time around the crowds were much lower, ranging from 237 to 709.

Our relegation to the Southern Division in 1986 ended the association between the clubs

once more and King's Lynn were relegated as well to the Midland Division a year later. They spent the next 20 years in the Southern League and we met for just one more season when we were both back in the Premier Division together in 1996/97. The final league encounter between us was indeed our last ever Southern

League game and not really one to remember as we were trounced 5-1 at The Walks!

We of course switched to the Isthmian and then earned promotion to the Conference while King's Lynn were wound up in 2009 with debts of £77,000. They reformed as King's Lynn Town a year later,

having to climb back up through the United Counties League and Northern and Southern Premier to finally gain National North status in 2019. They won the division in their first season which coincided with our last meeting in the FA Trophy and the Linnets swapped places with us in the National League just as lockdown descended. They lead the head-to-head record (see below) between the clubs by seven wins to five.

King's Lynn lasted two seasons in the top division before relegation back to the North and given their geographical location, it's unlikely we'll meet at National South level any time soon. Although there won't be many complaints from supporters of either club if we met again next season... in the National League!

Then the best player in the world – Umea's Brazilian star Marta

SWEDE SMELL OF SUCCESS

With the Women's Euros final approaching, we recall the spectacular rise and fall of Umea IK

Northland is a hard place. One of three administrative zones of Sweden, it is, unsurprisingly, in the north. Frozen, bitter winds swirl snow storms around the towns and in short, it's not the kind of place where you would expect a football team to find a playable pitch, let alone glory at the highest level. In its biggest town, Umea, ice hockey is the sport of the masses, and football has only had a fleeting relationship with the Allsvenskan, the

Swedish top flight. But, not too long ago, there was a team in that town that dominated Europe.

Umea IK were founded in 1985 and immediately joined the women's fourth tier. Manager Roland Arnqvist had a simple mission. He wanted his team, from this frozen backwater, to find success on the biggest stage. With the support of the ownership, they set about making this happen. In only their second season,

Umea won the league, and with it promotion to the third tier. By 1991, in the mostly amateur arena of women's football, Umea were 'professional' in so far as players were paid 35 krona per game, not exactly a life changing amount, but enough to increase the frequency of training, and begin attracting more talent. Initially, however, the club relied on the talents of Umea natives.

By 1995, they were in the

top flight. Arnqvist had by this time moved upstairs, overseeing playing style and recruitment from the directors box. Frida Ostberg, Malin Mostrom, and goalscoring sensation Hanna Ljunberg grew up in the town they then electrified. By the turn of the century they were pulling in crowds of nearly 10,000 people. Only five men's teams, including Malmo, IFK Gothenburg and AIK, could call on a bigger attendance, and none of them are in Northland. To the delight of their fans, the year 2000 also saw their first league title.

When Sweden lost the Women's World Cup final against Germany in 2003, five of the eleven on the pitch were from Umea. But with great success comes greater expectation, and recruitment got more expansive and more expensive. Ma Xiaxiou signed from China in a move that marked a shift in strategy. Umea natives were fine, but if you really wanted to make a stir you needed a little international starlight. She was joined by Swiss superstar Ramona Bachmann. Umea lost the Women's Cup final - the precursor to the Women's Champions

League - to Frankfurt in 2002, but defeated Danish opponents Fortuna Hjorring the following year. After that victory, having conquered all before them, they went one further, and signed the best player in the world, the Brazilian Marta.

Umea would win seven league titles between 2000 and 2008. In 2006, they didn't lose a single game, winning the league by 21 points. Having won a second Women's Cup in 2004, they reached the final in 2007 and 2008. But here, at the very zenith of their existence, the rot set in for a spectacular collapse.

Arnqvist left the club before that second Women's Cup defeat, leaving them without direction after 25 years. They won the league, but the following season Marta moved on to Los Angeles. Bachmann followed soon after, to Atlanta, and it started a haemorrhaging of international stars. With players leaving, the side weakening, and attendances falling, the direction was obvious. By 2011, the club restructured to avoid bankruptcy, and slipped to

mid-table. But 2016 would be a disaster.

Umea started the season poorly, with injuries to key players, and in the summer, news broke that the club needed 1.8 million krona to survive. The cost of flying so close to the sun had been immense, and having struggled for nearly a decade, time was up. The coaching staff were unceremoniously sacked, finding out their fate on the local news rather than from the board. Eight players wrote an open letter in support of their coaches, expressing their lack of desire to play for anyone else. Umea went nearly a month without any manager at all, all the while losing games.

A relegation decider against Kristianstad had a touch of northern irony about it. Delayed because of the snow, both team's players had to clear the pitch themselves. In the sticky mud of Umea, Kristianstad fought out a draw. Twelve years after becoming European Champions, Umea IK were relegated. The journey was over.

The reconstituted Umea now plies its trade as a yo-yo club between the first and second flight, never troubling the elite of the game. But, for a brief moment in a new millennium, they were the brightest of sparks.
