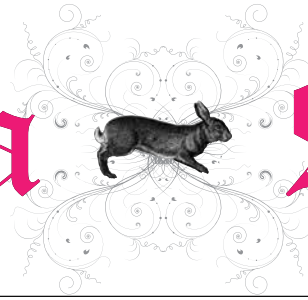

Work progressing on Winchelsea Pool redevelopment, river loop design



Winchelsea Pool redevelopment render

Redevelopment of Winchelsea Swimming Pool is continuing, with demolition of former facilities underway and expected to be complete by the end of March.

Construction of replacement 25-metre and leisure pools and a new zero-depth splash park will start as soon as demolition is complete and take several months.

The redevelopment will also include renewal of pool concourses and drainage and construction of a new amenities building at the south-east end of the site, creating a more central entry point off Barwon Terrace and better connection with adjoining Adventure Park.

The much-loved former pool had reached the end of its serviceable life after having provided summer refreshment, exercise and fun for families and visitors since 1963.

Input from community engagement and a Community Reference Group has helped inform designs for the redevelopment and decide on elements for the splash park.

Work on stage two of Winchelsea's Barwon River Loop is also progressing, with construction expected to start mid-2024.

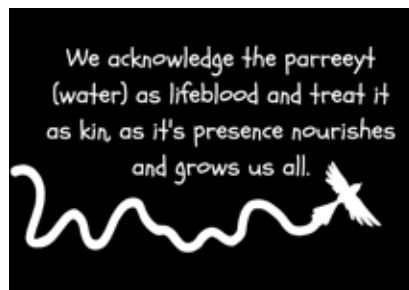
Stage two north of the Princes Highway bluestone bridge will link with the previously completed stage one to create a two-kilometre path connecting Winchelsea's four quadrants, better connecting the community with the river environment.

A pedestrian bridge will replace an existing culvert crossing near Armytage Street, and viewing platforms will be installed on both banks of the river between the two bridges.

The western bank of the Barwon River is Eastern Maar Country, and the eastern bank is Wadawurrung Country.

A Cultural Heritage Management Plan is now in place for stage two and Council is working with Eastern Maar Gulidjan artist Ebony Hickey and Wadawurrung artist Billy-Jay O'Toole who have each designed artwork to feature on steel cut panels on the viewing platforms.

Parklet Pilot to end after Easter



Surf Coast Shire is trialling a Parklet with the Beach Hotel in Jan Juc.

A Parklet Pilot has been in place since mid-January and finishes on Sunday 7 April (when daylight savings ends).

What is a parklet?

A parklet offers public seating and opportunities for street dining or green spaces. Kerbside parking adjacent to a hospitality business, is transformed into a vibrant community space.

Beach Hotel with the support of Surf Coast Shire Council is utilising three car parks during this pilot period.

What's the reason for this pilot?

The pilot will help inform if a permanent parklet program, and guidelines should be incorporated into Council's Local Law. It will also influence if more of these outdoor spaces should be considered across the shire.

Following a successful campaign to encourage interest in the establishment of Winchelsea's own Social Bridge, the group commenced the first beginners class on Tuesday 12 March 2024 at the Senior Citizens Club in Harding Street.

"Learning the history of Bridge and understanding the terminology was a good introduction to the game," said Jean Shinnars, Secretary of Winchelsea Senior Citizens Club and a new beginner to the game.

"Finding out about the early days of Bridge was fascinating but I am still trying to get my head around the Finesse an important concept in play. There is much to learn but I am finding the beginners class an excellent format - I am hooked," continues Jean.

The Beginners Class is structured to take you from knowing nothing to being a novice player in eight weeks – step by step with practice hands and notes to help.

"Bridge is never boring - every hand is different. It's a fun and friendly way to keep the grey matter active now that I am no longer working, said Veronica Levay a novice player with the Colac Bridge Club. Veronica wanted to get back to basics to improve her game.

"I really appreciated the opportunity to come to Winchelsea and meet other interested players. I hope that eventually we may be able to enjoy a two town competition as interest grows to not only foster some friendly rivalry but to meet new friends," continues Veronica.

Winchelsea is taking up Bridge with students enjoying the mental stimulation they get from every hand of Bridge. They are playing not only for the enjoyment but to keep the brain active - use it or lose it!

"Bridge offers me a good social life and creates opportunities to meet new friends," said Elaine Atkinson, Coordinator of the Beginners Class. Since moving to Winchelsea in July last

Victoria's top apprentices compete at Worldskills Competition

Victorians will make up more than a third of the 33 young apprentices, trainees, and students representing Australia showcasing their vocational skills at the WorldSkills 47th International Competition in France this September.

Minister for Skills and TAFE Gayle Tierney extended her congratulations to all the students selected for Team Australia – named the Skillaroos – who will join 1,500 participants from 75 countries competing in Lyon.

The competition gives thousands of apprentices and trainees the chance to demonstrate their talent across more than 59 disciplines. Over four days, they complete practical tasks set by industry experts to assess their knowledge, competence and employability skills against a set of strict criteria.

The 12 Victorians in the event this year make up the largest Victorian contingent of Skillaroos since 1995 – when the

competition was last hosted in Lyon. These are the top apprentices and trainees in their fields – which include traditional skills like carpentry, heavy vehicle mechanics and plumbing, and new skills in areas like cloud computing, additive manufacturing and mechatronics.

Before heading to France, the Skillaroos will have a final training exercise at the 2024 Global Skills Challenge in Victoria in May, hosted at various TAFE campuses that will simulate the conditions of the international competition.

Since 2014, the Labor Government has invested more than \$4 billion to repair the broken TAFE system brought to its knees by the former Liberal Government and introduced Free TAFE in 2019 – helping more than 157,500 students gain the skills for the jobs they want, while saving \$436 million in fees.

Expanding newborn screening for Victorian babies

Victorian newborns will now be screened for two additional rare but serious health conditions, helping identify babies at risk and making sure they get the lifesaving treatment they need sooner.

The Newborn Bloodspot Screening Program will now test for spinal muscular atrophy and severe combined immunodeficiency. Commonly referred to as the heel prick test, the addition of SCID and SMA will see the program test babies for 29 uncommon conditions.

Weakening the immune system, SCID affects the body's ability to fight infections due to compromised white blood cells, but early diagnosis and stem cell treatment before three-and-a-half months can be lifesaving. Identifying newborns with SCID will enable access to new gene therapy trial delivered by the Murdoch Children's Research Institute.

SMA is a serious disease-causing progressive muscle wastage and weakness that is life threatening without treatment. While there is currently no cure, early intervention and new treatments are improving outcomes.

The program is offered to the parents of all newborns within their first 72 hours of life, at no cost. In 2023, more than 73,000 Victorian newborns were screened.

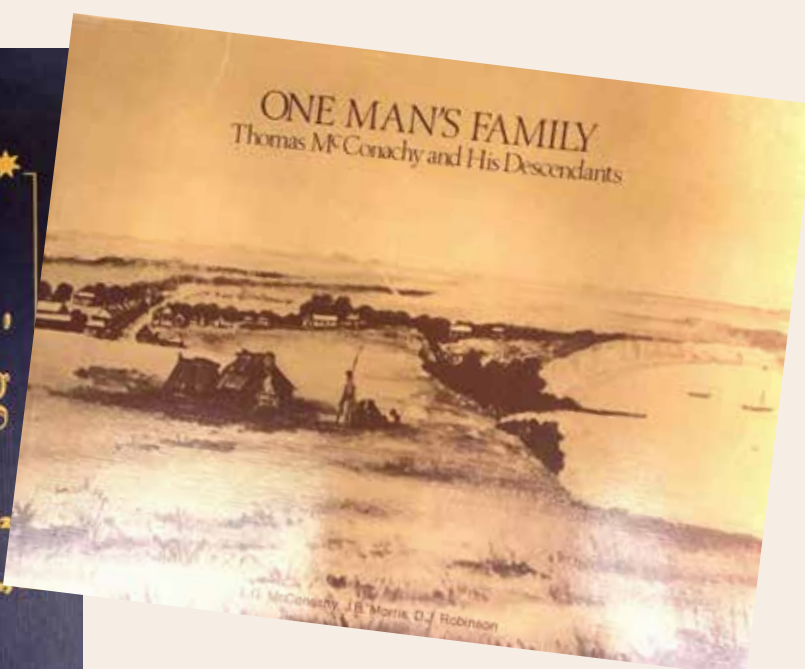

Letter to the Editor

I was perturbed by the opinion piece in the last week's Winchelsea Star headed "An alternative Climate report" claiming renewable energy projects would overtake 70% of agricultural land in Victoria!

While there was no references to prove this claim there are benefits to farmers in helping the urgent move to cheaper renewable energy to ease climate change.

Brett Hall of Farmers for Climate Action said farmers making good money from renewables projects weren't hard to find. "Income during drought is vital when you're trying to run a family farm and renewable energy delivers that. Typical payments being offered to farmers by wind companies are now more than \$40,000 per turbine per year, and many farms host dozens of turbines whilst still farming sheep or cattle. Solar companies are now offering farmers around \$1500 per hectare per year rent."

Horsham grain farmer Susan Findlay Tickner has five wind turbines on her family farm as well as five and a half kilometres of transmission (14 transmission towers).

"The wind brings us stable income, locked in regardless of whether we have a huge harvest or a poor one," Mrs Findlay Tickner said.

"We've been farming under transmission for 50 years without issue. We run harvesters under them and farm around them just like we farm around trees. Some people claim you can't fight fires near turbines but I have photos of aerial bombers extinguishing a fire between ours."

Wellington NSW fine wool farmer Tony Inder's sheep graze under solar panels at a solar farm.

"The sheep I graze under the solar farm produce better wool, I think because there's more even nutrition given the panels create shade in summer and provide a wind break in winter. My sheep are part of a study investigating this. Farming helps renewables and renewables help farming."

My final quote is from António Guterres, secretary-general of the United Nations "Climate change is moving faster than we are, but we don't give up because we know that climate action is the only path."

Barwon Water and the National Trust preserve the past by stepping into the future

Barwon Water and the National Trust of Australia (Vic) are preserving the past by stepping into the future, with recycled water infrastructure installed and commissioned to irrigate farmland surrounding Barwon Park Mansion.

Barwon Water General Manager Planning, Delivery and

Environment Seamus Butcher said an underground recycled water pipeline has been installed to connect the Winchelsea Water Reclamation Plant to Barwon Park. The new, 1.8-kilometre pipeline now supplies Barwon Park with recycled water to irrigate farmland. Construction began in mid-August 2023 and has just been completed.

In addition to the permanent pipeline from the Winchelsea WRP to Barwon Park, Barwon Water supplied and installed a new pivot irrigator at the Barwon Park site. A new pump station at the Winchelsea WRP was also constructed to supply the water to the irrigator, while the power at Barwon Park was upgraded to run it.

"Partnering with the National Trust has delivered a win-win for both our organisations through the beneficial allocation of 80 million litres of recycled water for agricultural use at the Barwon Park property," Mr Butcher said.

Barwon Park farmer Ewan Peel said the 48 acres of land surrounding the Barwon Park Mansion was primarily dedicated to growing crop fodder and that the installation of the irrigation system meant the site could become even more productive and attractive to visitors.

"The proceeds from the sale of these crops will contribute to maintaining the mansion and grounds."

Mr Butcher said Barwon Water's significant investment in this project demonstrated the organisation's commitment to putting recycled water to productive reuse to preserve precious drinking water supplies and protect the environment.

"We're very appreciative of the National Trust's vision and cooperation in enabling this project to happen."

South-west farmers see how their futures could evolve

DemoDairy

Young south-west Victorian dairy farmers have seen how their farming futures could evolve during a New Zealand study tour.

The five-day WestVic Dairy - Young Dairy Network NZ Dairy Study Tour, supported by DemoDAIRY Foundation, introduced nearly 20 young farmers to five different farming systems in the Waikato and Bay of Plenty areas.

The tour focused on maximising pasture and forage utilisation for profitable milk production, adapting to changes in environmental legislation and using technology to improve efficiency – including Halter virtual fencing.

Lenise Mantell, 24, and Billy Buckingham, 27, were among those participating and both say the experience was invaluable.

Lnise, 24, who works for Reggie and Tanya Davis' Lilydale Dairy Farms near Cobden, joined the Young Dairy Network after moving from NSW to meet new people. "I've only been in the industry for three years and wanted to see a different style of farming," she said. "It was a great opportunity. It's expensive in New Zealand and I can see why they have to be on top of their game."

A third generation-farmer from Jancourt East who farms with his father and uncle, Billy wanted to see how other farms operate and what he could implement on the family farm. "Every system is different; there's no wrong or right way to do things, but we can all learn."



Billy was surprised New Zealand farmers don't feed grain through their dairies, but learnt how they had to import grain and instead turn to palm kernel for feed. "They do a lot of maize and get ridiculous growth because of the higher rainfall and soil temperature," he added.

Billy has returned home with a lot of topics to discuss, including feed pads, grass management, effluent management, virtual fencing and once-a-day milking. "The effluent side really interested me," he said. "I feel like the regulations they are facing now will be in Australia in the next 10 to 15 years. It made me think we need to get proactive and have things in place so it won't be a big shock to the system if we have to do it here."

Is gorse a threat to you?

Gorse is a significant fire hazard because it:

- Contains high levels of natural oils making it extremely flammable.
- Can outcompete other plants, creating dense stands of connected fuel which assists fire travel.
- Can conceal fences, large rocks and other impediments to a fire crew's passage.
- Is a fine fuel with leaves less than 1.5mm wide, which can float and trigger fires to assets nearby.
- Is difficult to control when ablaze, due to the high radiant heat.

Introduced from western Europe, gorse is now one of Australia's worst weeds, listed as a **Weed of National Significance (WoNS)**.

Under the *Catchment and Land Protection Act 1994*, both public and private landowners are responsible for controlling the growth and spread of gorse.

Gorse is an incredibly flammable, prickly, dense, evergreen legume which can grow up to 4m high and 3m diameter.

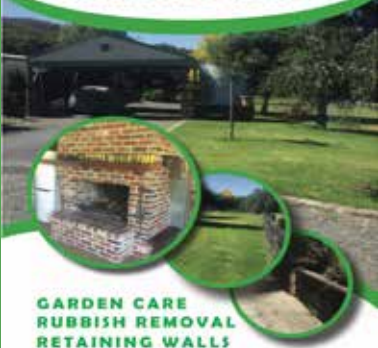
