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Year 5 Watercolours










Year 5 have enjoyed using watercolours to create artwork related to their topic of Water.

Year 1 loved getting out in the snow to play - but they also enjoyed the opportunity to play indoors and use their imagination to create lots of different games and have fun.














Rowandale Football Team Success


