Floating tent

With a backdrop of coconut tree plantations, bamboo clusters, and other trees and plants native to this island, your tent overlooks the Tatai River and the Cardamom Rainforest.

The river is a meter or two deep (depending on the tides), and safe to swim in. You can take a dip right from the balcony of your tent.

The 90 sgm deck includes a terrace with sunbeds and outdoor seating chairs Your tent is equipped with a queen-sized bed or Twin beds, with bedside lamps, and a comfy sofa $(0.70 \text{ m} \times 2\text{m})$

Island Double Tent - On Land

Island Family tent - On Land

We've taken some small steps towards sustainability...

- Resources such as well water and rainwater are valued, protected, and managed, while grey water from septic tanks is used in the garden.
- We upcycle and recycle on-site as much as possible and also ensure food leftovers are not wasted.
- Being off-grid we try to use as much solar power as possible while optimizing the use of the backup generators.
- Composite and renewable materials were in the building, such as wood-plastic composite (avoiding wood from deforestation) and fast-growing water hyacinth/rattan/bamboo for furniture.
- Our policy against single-use plastic is stringent. From food packaging (no plastic bags on site, no straws, plastic cups, PET water bottles, and polystyrene takeaway boxes) to room amenities (no single-use shampoo, toothbrushes...) are some examples while finding and promoting sustainable alternatives.
- Probably the most emotional and fun times of the year are the biannual cleanup of the Tatai River. 30 to 50 families (mainly youngsters) gather with boats and tools to clean about 40km of banks.
- Environmental protection we teamed up with Wildlife Alliance (direct forest protection) Kla Trey (wildlife protection), Trees4Travel (plantation management)

... and we have others in plan:

- cool our tents using a ground-source heat pump
- electrify our boats' propulsion
- build a rain-catching system
- a smokeless garbage incinerator
