We have coordinated with Republic Services to offer additional curbside collection. You can leave your bulky or green waste items at your curb, just make sure that loose items are bundled or containerized. Place your items for pickup by 7 a.m.

**Accepted Items:** Any non-hazardous bulk items such as scrap metal, containerized brush, old fencing material or other debris (no commercial), electronic equipment including computers, TVs, DVD players and cell phones

**Not Accepted:** Tires & explosives, construction materials such as shingles and sheet rock, no more than six fence panels will be accepted unless a fence permit is shown for the address, compressed gas, pharmaceuticals or sharps

The City of Hurst contracts with Republic Services to allow Hurst residents free access to the Arlington Landfill on the second Saturday of each month beginning in February and running through November from 7 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.

**Location:** 800 Mosier Valley Rd, Arlington, Tx. 817-354-2300 (Scale house) or 817-354-2305. This access will be granted to Hurst residents to dispose of any non-hazardous materials for free.

## Accepted Items:

- Any non-hazardous bulk items such as scrap metal, loose brush, old fencing material or other debris (no commercial).
- Electronic equipment recycling including computers, TVs, DVD players and cell phones.

## Not Accepted:

- Tires & explosives
- Construction materials, such as shingles and sheetrock.
- No more than six fence panels will be accepted, unless a fence permit is shown for the address.
- Brick and rock need to be containerized.
- Compressed gas
- Pharmaceuticals or sharps

Residents must present their current driver's license or photo identification AND current Hurst water bill. Service does not include the disposal of hazardous waste or non-compactable waste.

# Flood Preparedness

With severe weather season on its way, now is the time to prepare to keep you and your family protected.

### Here are a few reminders:

- Check your area's flood maps at [fema.gov/flood-maps](http://fema.gov/flood-maps).
- It takes 30 days for a flood policy to go into effect, and homeowner's insurance doesn't cover floods! Visit [floodsmart.gov](http://floodsmart.gov) or contact your insurance agent today.
- Stock up on essentials like food, water, medical supplies, flashlights, batteries, and a NOAA Weather Radio. Learn more at [ready.gov](http://ready.gov).
- Consider upgrades like waterproof veneers or raised electrical systems. Check [fema.gov](http://fema.gov) for retrofit ideas, and contact City of Hurst Community Development to gain applicable permits before starting any work.
- Remember, only rain goes down the drain! Prevent illegal dumping with the Don't Mess with Texas Water Program and help reduce flood risks.

# Household Hazardous Waste Collection and Document Shredding

Saturday, April 11

Hurst Service Center | 2001 Precinct Line Road | 8-11 a.m.

It's important to properly dispose of hazardous waste to protect the environment and ensure our community's safety. On April 11, you can bring your hazardous waste for collection. Please bring an ID and a Hurst water bill.

**Accepted Items:** automotive fluids (10-gallon limit), batteries, cleaners & degreasers, cooking oil, lawn/garden/pool chemicals, light bulbs, and paint (limited to three five-gallon containers).

**Not Accepted:** ammunition or explosives, appliances or electronics, building materials, bulk trash and yard waste, butane or propane cylinders, medicines or sharps, and tires.

Document shredding will also be available as a way to help our community members prevent identity theft and protect personal information. Three box limit, no larger than 15" x 12" x 10", accepted due to limited space. First come, first served.

6 Stones will be on-site collecting clothing donations from Hurst residents.

Proper disposal of Household Hazardous Waste and other potential surface water pollutants is a concern to all. Should you become aware of any improper disposal of any stormwater or surface water pollutant, call the City's hotline at 817-788-7212.

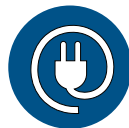

# Hurst Citizens Police Academy

## Classes begin April 2

The next Citizens Police Academy (CPA) is scheduled to begin on April 2, 2026. The Hurst Police Department sponsors the CPA to educate residents on the “Hows and Whys” of the Hurst Police Department and its operations. This is accomplished through a series of lectures and hands-on activities on Thursday evenings from 6-9 p.m. through June 4, 2026. The CPA classes are held at the Hurst Justice Center, located at 825 Thousand Oaks.

Each applicant must be at least 21 years of age, live, work, or attend a church in the City of Hurst and successfully pass a background investigation.



Applications must be turned in no later than Friday, March 20, 2026, by 5 p.m. To successfully graduate, each participant is required to attend at least eight of the 10 sessions.

# FIGHT THE BITE

## Mosquito Control Management

Controlling mosquito populations and reducing the risk for West Nile virus, Zika virus, and Chikungunya viruses must be done on several fronts – education and prevention are at the forefront of those efforts.

### Simple steps to eliminate potential mosquito breeding sites around your home

- Do not allow water to accumulate in the saucers of flowerpots, cemetery urns, or in pet dishes for more than two days.
- Get rid of tin cans, old tires, buckets, unused plastic swimming pools, or other containers that collect and hold water.
- Clean debris from rain gutters, remove standing water from flat roofs, and repair leaks around faucets and air conditioners.

- Change the water in birdbaths and wading pools at least once a week.
- Fill or drain puddles, ditches and swampy areas.
- Check for trapped water in plastic or canvas tarps used to cover boats or pools, and arrange the tarp to drain the water.

### How to reduce risk of getting West Nile Virus:

- Apply insect repellent that contains DEET, picaridin, or oil of lemon eucalyptus.
- Dress in long sleeves and long pants when outside.
- Stay indoors at dusk and dawn, when mosquitoes are most active.
- Drain standing water where mosquitoes breed; old tires, flowerpots, and clogged rain gutters.

## Mosquito Spraying

The City participates in the Tarrant County Mosquito Surveillance Program and will use four static testing sites each week and one roaming test site around the City each week this year. The City will only spray if two consecutive positive samples at a location are received from the Tarrant County Health Department, and it is limited to a ¼ mile radius around the positive site. We will share information on areas around Hurst that require spraying through our City website and City Nextdoor page.

Our primary defense in combating mosquitoes will

be our larvicide program. It has proven to be a more effective method for treating mosquito-prone areas than spraying, without causing any harmful effects to people. We use this to treat public areas. If you need larvicide donuts, they are available at Ace Hardware, Lowe's Home Improvement, and in the Walmart Lawn & Garden Department. All three stores are located in Hurst on Precinct Line Road. In addition to purchasing, larvicide donuts are offered free of charge in limited quantities during our Household Hazardous Waste collection events held in April and July.

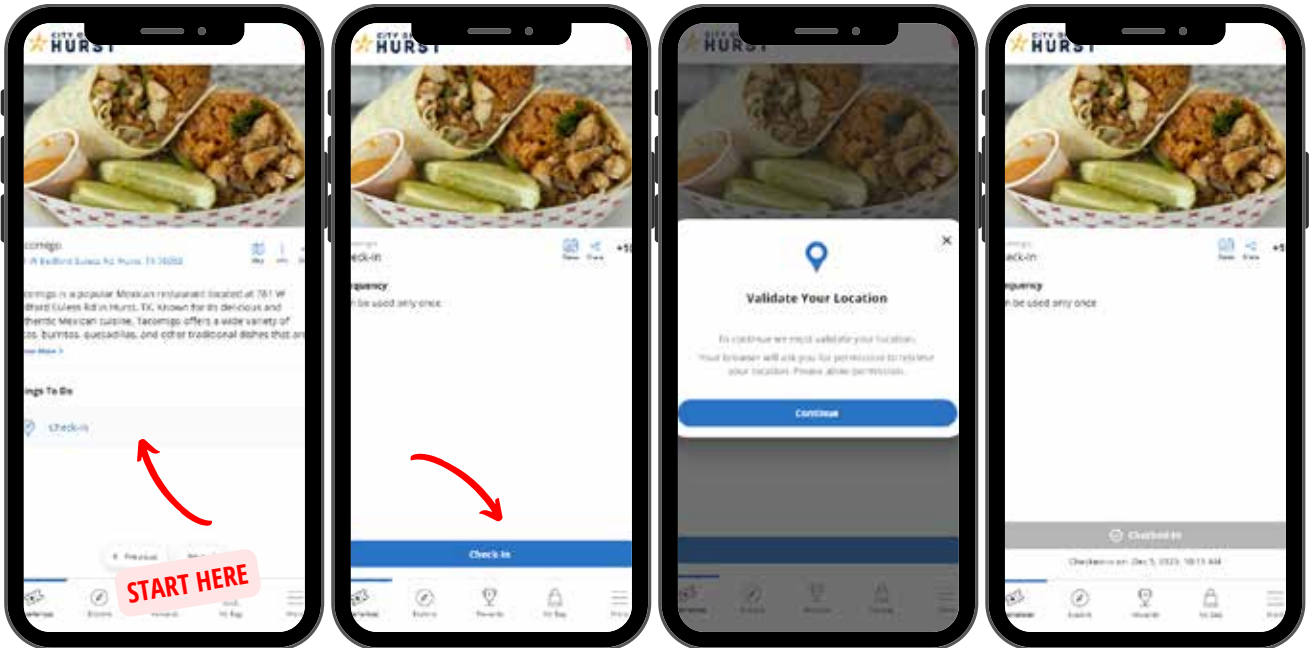

## DIY Rainwater Harvesting Workshop

Capture rainwater this spring to use on your landscape later! Join our workshop to learn how, then build your own rain barrel to take home for only \$25.

Rainwater harvesting is great for North Texas because you can keep some of the rain we get during the spring and fall to use during our hot and dry summers. Even a small roof area can produce a usable amount of water during an average rainfall. From huge cisterns to small DIY barrels, capturing rainwater can be done by anyone. Attend this workshop to learn the ins and outs of rainwater harvesting and purchase a discounted barrel to take home!

### Learn about:

- How much water your roof will produce in a year
- Where to put your rain barrel to capture the most water
- How to install a barrel

- How to hook up and use your new water source
- How to build your own 50-gallon rain barrel with just a few supplies from the hardware store

Registration and pre-payment are required for attendance. More than one person from your household can attend the workshop with the purchase of one barrel/ticket, but only one per household, please. This workshop is in-person and includes a class about rainwater harvesting basics and a demonstration on how to build a barrel. After the class portion, you will get to build your own rain barrel to take home. This is an educational opportunity, and class attendance is required to get a barrel.

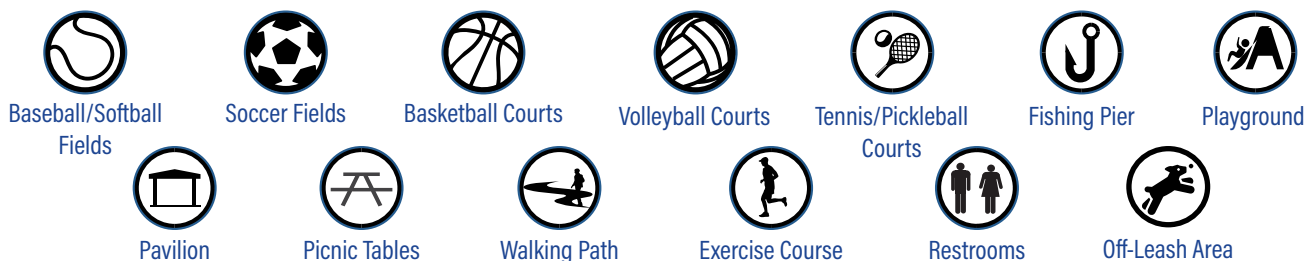
