1st Modewarre Scouts Grampians Adventure

Scouts from 1st Modewarre & 1st Grovedale left town aboard the Bank Bus on the first Sunday of the school holidays. We stopped for lunch in the picturesque Ararat gardens, arriving at our destination, Cooinda Burrong Scout camp near Zumsteins, at 3pm. The camp is set in acres of bush, so we were far away from everywhere, and, surprisingly, all by ourselves.

We quickly set up our eating shelter and kitchen, then sleeping tents – a mixture of larger canvas tents and single hike tents. The experienced Scouts knew what to do, and instructed the younger Scouts. Once bedding was set up, everyone was ready to explore their surroundings before tea. The evening was spent playing card games, soccer and being social.

The next morning, after a good breakfast, we packed our lunches and snacks, and headed off to hike from Sundial carpark, via the Sundial lookout, to the Pinnacle and then down through Silent Street, the Grand Canyon and Venus Baths into Halls Gap. The going was a little damp and slippery underfoot, but the rain held off. Lunch was eaten in a large, low cave just past the Bridal Veil Falls. The rock formations and scenery were dramatic. With it being school holidays, there was a lot of foot traffic in

both directions. We met the bus again at 3pm in Halls Gap and headed back up the very steep, winding road to camp.

Tuesday morning was spent at the Halls Gap Zoo. Everyone had their favourite animals. The Red Panda was enjoying an animal experience meeting, so was the centre of everyone's attention as it was very visible. The roaming deer are very gentle but also very friendly when looking for food. We lunched in Hall's Gap, with the Scouts buying their lunch after working out the most economical way to do so. Apparently the Fish 'n' Chip shop ran out of chips once the Scouts had been through! Then it was back up that long road to camp again. We stopped off at McKenzie Falls on the way, descending the 100s of steps down to the Falls, and then having to climb back up them again after some time exploring the area at the base. At least it stretched out tight leg muscles from our hike! The evening was spent around the camp fire, with a ripper of a fire.

Wednesday saw us firstly exploring Zumsteins Historical area. It was amazing to believe that, in the 1930s, Walter Zumstein dug a public sized swimming pool out with shovel, pick and wheelbarrow, recycling that dirt into the base of the tennis court and 3 rammed earth cottages. From Zumsteins we hiked 5km to nearby Fish Falls and back. We were then driven out to Hollow Mountain, where we climbed way, way up to the hollow part. The view from there is fantastic. The Scouts enjoyed exploring where the hollows went. With the weather forecast to change, we descended at 2pm, arriving back to camp for a late lunch. This evening's campfire was even better than the night before.

Our last day was Thursday, our travel home day. Up early, the Scouts quickly packed up personal belongings, had breakfast and pulled down sleeping tents. A team effort packed away the kitchen and eating shelter and their components. We had everything packed into our 2 trailers and drove out the gate at 9:15am. Once again, we lunched at Ararat – toasted sandwiches on our bbq – arriving back at Modewarre by 3pm.

The Modewarre trailer was quickly unpacked thanks to Scouts and parents, and the Bank Bus left for another adventure. Our thanks go to our Community Bank for the use of the Bus, to Ken for driving us so safely everywhere and to Scouting for being the avenue for another great adventure!



There are 79 local councils in Victoria.

Voters elect councillors to represent them in the local council for their area.

Councillors make decisions about local issues, such as:

- rubbish collection
- parks and sporting grounds
- libraries
- building permits.

Surf Coast Shire has 3 Wards - Torquay, Otway Range, Winchelsea - and each will elect 3 councillors.

Voting

Voting in this election is by post only.

Ballot packs will be posted to all enrolled voters from Monday 7 October.

Your ballot pack will contain:

- a ballot paper
- candidate statements
- a ballot paper envelope (for your vote to go in)
- a reply-paid envelope (for your ballot paper envelope to go in)
- a leaflet with instructions in other languages.

Each item in your ballot pack will have a barcode on it. These barcodes represent a council (and ward, where applicable). We use these when putting your ballot pack together to make sure it has the right contents.

Your ballot paper envelope includes your unique voter details. We separate any identifying information from the ballot paper envelopes before they are opened, ensuring postal voting is secret and secure.

These documents contain images of barcodes which cannot be read by a screen reader. If you are blind or have low vision, call 131 832 for assistance.

How to vote

Follow the instructions in your ballot pack to complete your vote. Make sure you post it or drop it off at the election office before 6 pm on Friday 25 October.

Local mail collection times differ. Check the collection time on your post box to make sure your vote is in the mail on time.

Register your burn with CFA

Many are now starting to clear land and burn off preparing for fire season. We do love that people are getting ready but we also want to express that you also need to be fully prepared to burn. never leave it unattended and make sure you have ample water. our brigades across Victoria are already seeing an increase in out of control burns.

When can I burn off?

Burning off is only permitted in the Surf Coast Shire outside the Fire Danger Period (FDP). During the FDP, burning in the open air is totally prohibited without a written permit from the Municipal Fire Prevention Officer. In the Surf Coast Shire generally, a permit to burn will only be issued for agricultural purposes.

In the township areas of the Surf Coast Shire, burning off of dried vegetation is permitted only on WEDNESDAY and SATURDAY between 10am and 3pm outside the Fire Danger Period. All burn offs on private property must be conducted in accordance with our Burn Off Guidelines.

Register your burn-off

All burn-offs should be registered with ESTA on 1800 668 511. Please provide the following information about your burn-off when registering: Location

- Date and expected start and finish times
- Estimated size
- What you intend to burn

Unregistered burn-offs can cause brigades to be called out unnecessarily.


Why am I writing this article? Well the answer is very simple. We are an aging membership, not so old in enthusiasm, but it is



Federal Electorate of Wannon boundary changes

Judy Cameron

In 2023 the Australian Electoral Commission (AEC) instigated a review of the number of members of the House of Representatives to which each state and territory will be entitled at the next federal general election. Victoria's entitlement decreased from 39 to 38 members and abolished the Division of Higgins. This meant a redrawing of boundaries in the remaining electorates and that the number of electors enrolled in each electoral division be between 105,205 and 128,583.

Winchelsea remains in Wannon, named after the Wannon River. The name 'Wannon' is believed to have been obtained by Major Mitchell from the local Jardwadjali people.

Wannon has been extended to include parts of Golden Plains Shire (Hesse and parts of Inverleigh and Wingeel) and Surf Coast Shire (eg: Barrabool, Gherang, Gnarwarre, Modewarre, Moriac, Mount Moriac, Paraparap and Wurdiboluc and parts of Buckley and Freshwater Creek.)

Sadly the AEC have not yet updated their site with a current map or voter numbers. Before the redistribution the area of Wannon was 33,595 sq. kms.



Eight days of free public transport for seniors

Victorian State Government

The Government is supporting older Victorians to explore everything Seniors Festival has to offer, with eight days of free public transport for Seniors Card holders.

Running from 6 to 13 October and delivered in partnership with Public Transport Victoria and V/Line, free travel applies to all forms of public transport including trams, trains, buses and coach services in metro, regional and rural areas.

Cardholders need to carry their Seniors Card while travelling, and touch on and off with their myki as usual – but myki cards won't be charged.

Permanent e-scooter rules across the State

Victorian State Government

E-scooters can now operate permanently in councils where agreements are in place with share hire operators with the Allan Labor Government's two-year trial.

Minister for Public and Active Transport Gabrielle Williams today announced a new advertising campaign in partnership with TAC to promote safe riding and reinforce the tough new penalties that come into effect today.

Fines are increasing for riding without a helmet to \$395, riding on a footpath to \$296 and carrying a passenger to \$247. E-scooter passengers will also face a new fine of at least \$247, and this sum will increase to \$642 if they are also not wearing a helmet.

Riders caught riding under the influence of drugs or alcohol are subject to the same rules as motorists and will also have their vehicle license automatically suspended and have an interlock fitted to their vehicle for at least six months.

The main road rules will remain unchanged, with riders needing to be at least 16 years old, not travel at more than 20 kilometres per hour and only ride on roads with a maximum speed limit of 60 kilometres per hour or less.

Share hire e-scooters are only legal in council areas that have an agreement with an operator – while private scooters can still be used across Victoria.


