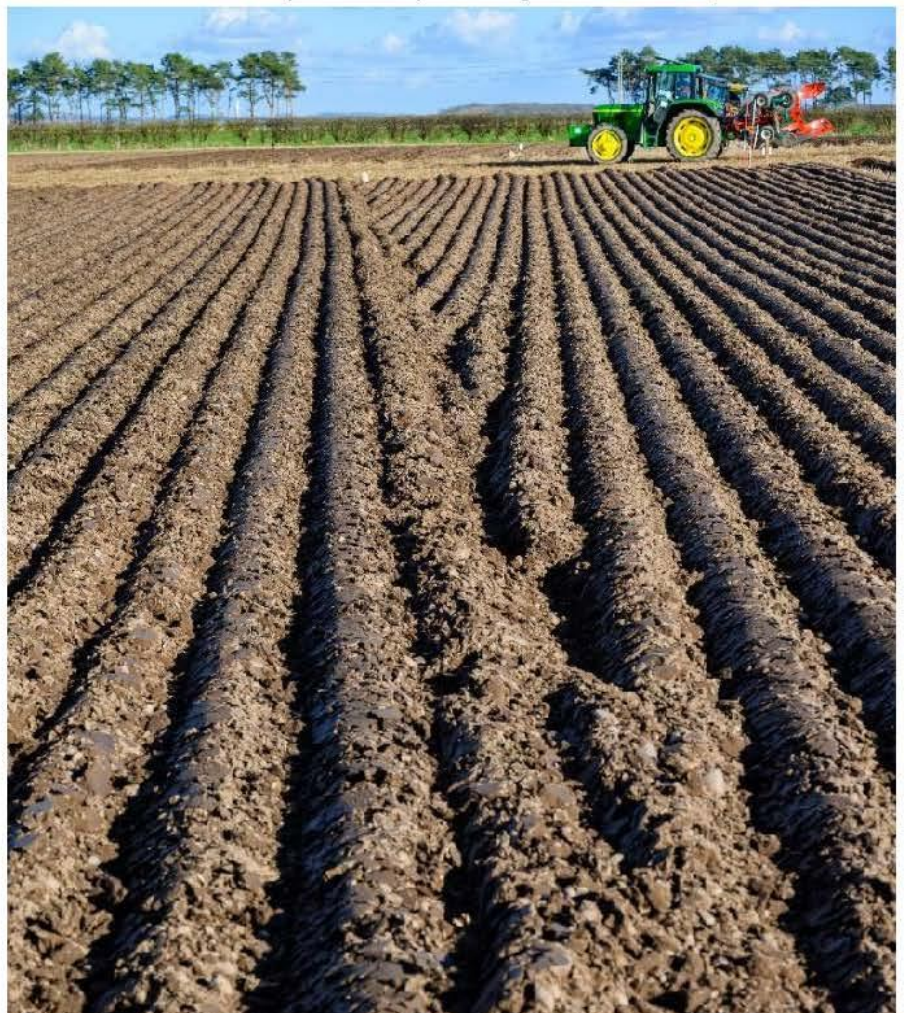

CONDITIONS TO ALL PLOUGHING COMPETITORS

1. Please enter by Monday 22nd September 2025.
2. All competitors must read or have read to them the event risk assessment upon arrival on site.
3. Competitors may have assistance to set and remove sticks only.
4. Headlands – ins and outs to be left as ploughed to Headland Mark.
5. No handtool or handwork will be allowed. No shaping of furrows, only with tractor and plough.
6. Minimum depth 8". Maximum depth 10". Vintage Minimum depth 5"
7. Work will commence at 9.00am with final judging at 2.00pm. Competitors must plough a double opening split. The opening split must be completed by 9.50am when it will be judged. Competitors must wait until the Judge or Steward gives permission to continue ploughing.
8. Competitors start and finish their plots according to the directions of the Stewards.
9. Above conditions must be adhered to, or competitors may be penalised or disqualified.
10. All Vintage competitors will be required to open at start and to wait until it has been inspected by Judge/Steward – who will then give permission to proceed.
11. All competitors and exhibitors are requested to comply with current Health & Safety Regulations.
12. All Vintage must have Third Party and Public Liability Insurance.

HEALTH & SAFETY

The NHLS carries a legal liability insurance policy. It has no insurance for personal accidents to competitors and cannot accept responsibility for such accidents.

HOWEVER – Accidents can be minimised or eliminated by safe working practices. Therefore in the interests of safety for themselves and spectators, competitors are asked to observe safe working practices, including site tidiness, at all times.

MECHANICAL HEDGE CUTTING

Sponsored by P & S Contractors

1. Competitors must have public liability insurance and ensure that all equipment is in good working order and all guards are fitted.
2. All operatives must be trained in the use of all equipment and in risk assessment
3. Upon arrival at the site, carry out a site-specific risk assessment (SSRA). Amend the SSRA as required during the day's activities.
4. Identify any poisonous wildlife, where possible use a shearing blade rather than a spinning blade for brush cutting to avoid splatter of toxic wildlife.
5. Plan your work and think ahead to make sure you will always be working safely.
6. Check your machine, engine and all equipment. Do not use equipment which is damaged.
7. Protect other people from the noise and dust. Warn others to keep away while the Hedgecutter is in use. Additional safeguards such as barriers may be required when working in the vicinity of members of the public.
8. Make sure the area is clear and safe and that no one is near to you or could distract you.
9. Carry out any maintenance to the Hedgecutter / Brushcutter with the engine switched off.
10. Make sure you carry out a regular visual inspection of the cutting blades for any imperfections. If there are any, report any damage. **DO NOT CONTINUE TO USE.**
11. Ensure that the area is cordoned off to prevent the public gaining access to the area being cut.

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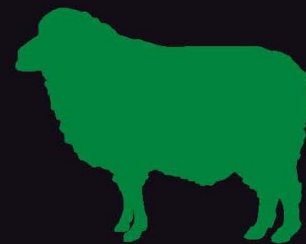
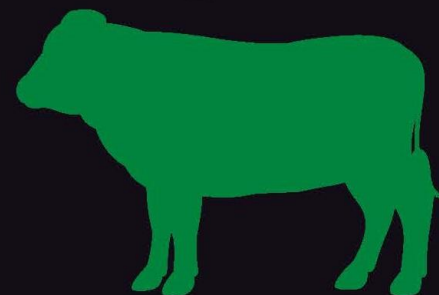
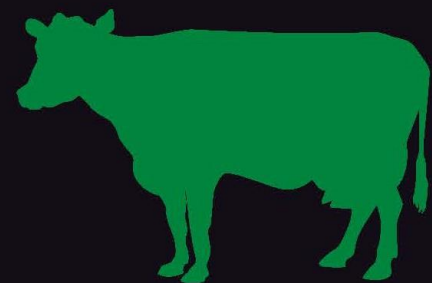
