FINDING A RHYTHM AT ESA

Whether it's a song at Coffeehouse, a sixth grade chapel performance, a drumline ensemble at a basketball game, or a musical band number, music teacher Bill Smith plays a supporting role that gives his students the confidence to perform at their best. With a career that has taken him around the country and across the world to perform, write and record, Bill has discovered that ESA is a fulfilling place to settle down.

Originally from southeastern Ohio, Bill studied music therapy at Tennessee Tech before changing course and moving to Asheville, North Carolina, where he earned a B.A. in jazz performance from Brevard College. While in North Carolina, he taught African drumming, instructed drumlines and directed percussion ensembles for middle and high school students as an adjunct teacher.

In 2005, Bill moved to Los Angeles, where he served as a middle school band director, taught music privately at the Rock School of Los Angeles, and played professionally. As a percussionist, he recorded with Peter Rowan, Alex Ebert, Edward Sharpe and the Magnetic Zeros, and others. As the drummer and one of the lead singers of Truth & Salvage Co., Bill toured with The Black Crowes, Lynyrd Skynyrd, Steve Miller Band, The Avett Brothers and The Lumineers. His band traveled to Iraq to play for U.S. troops stationed there.

Bill's music career took him to Nashville in 2012, where he played music and wrote songs for various artists. Some of his songs have been featured on the CMT website's up-and-coming artists page.

In 2014, Bill moved to Lafayette with his wife Monti – a Carencro native – and daughter Charlie. He found a home at ESA, and has spent the past two school years shaping the Cade campus music program. While he plays guitar and piano, Bill is primarily a percussionist. He uses instruments such as the drums, marimba and xylophone to engage the students quickly. In teaching rhythm, melody and harmony – the basic elements of music – Bill says learning is instantaneous with percussion instruments. He encourages students to play all of the instruments in his classroom, and continually adds to the collection. This year he is bringing in additional ukuleles as a predecessor to guitar.

6th grade chapel performance

The Cade campus music curriculum begins in middle school with short quarter-long courses in sixth and seventh grade and Music I in eighth grade. Students study the history of popular music, from the beginning of the 20th century to today. They examine modern songs for the basic elements and relate them to the music history they've studied. The students present songs to the class as options, and eventually the group chooses one to perform, usually in chapel. (View videos of some of the performances at vimeo.com/esacadiana.)

In upper school, students enroll in either beginning or advanced Music II. "I see music as an outlet to help students with academics without making it too academic itself. It feeds their passions," Bill says. At the same time, there are certain things he won't overlook – like reading music, something he has worked on with his upper school musicians. He has seen the students grow as live musicians as well, and works with them on stage presence, understanding their instruments and communicating together on stage.

With the exception of Sean Morrow, '17, who is attending Berklee School of Music, the advanced musicians will all be back on the ESA stage this fall. Bill has enjoyed seeing them take their instruments more seriously and find success beyond Cade.

At the Independent Schools Association of the Southwest music festival in Oklahoma last spring, ESA's rock band impressed the stage managers, who told Bill ESA had one of the best bands they've seen in a long time.



Drumline at ESA Summer

Thanks to the Nails family, owners of Dockside Studios, middle and upper schoolers are learning what it takes to be studio musicians as well as live performers. A highlight of the program, the Dockside sessions have immersed the students in an environment that has seen an incredible range of talented musicians. “My goal with the recording sessions is to teach them work ethic, professionalism and what goes into being a studio musician,” Bill explains. Where studio recording is familiar to Bill, some of the aspects of musical theater are not. He had experience as an instrumentalist in theatrical productions, but not in acting or directing. Yet his work with Performing Arts Chair Kat Movassaghi on the school's musical productions has deepened the music theatre experience, and Bill has managed to quickly make a mark on the program. For the first time in ESA history, a full student band performed the music for last year's musical production, *The Wedding Singer*.

Another expansion – a drumline – adds spirit and noise to basketball games and pep rallies. The group traveled to the Smoothie King Center in New Orleans to support the Falcons last year. A session of drumline camp during ESA Summer brought together some of last year's drummers with new musicians hoping to join in.

There's no doubt ESA Music is thriving under Bill's influence. At the same time, Bill sees the program as a great fit for this stage in his career. “I get to share my experiences and what I know. I get as much satisfaction from watching my kids play as I did playing myself.”



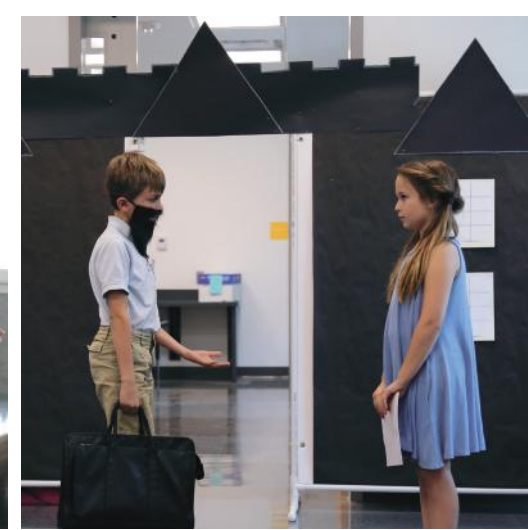
AT HOME IN THE EC

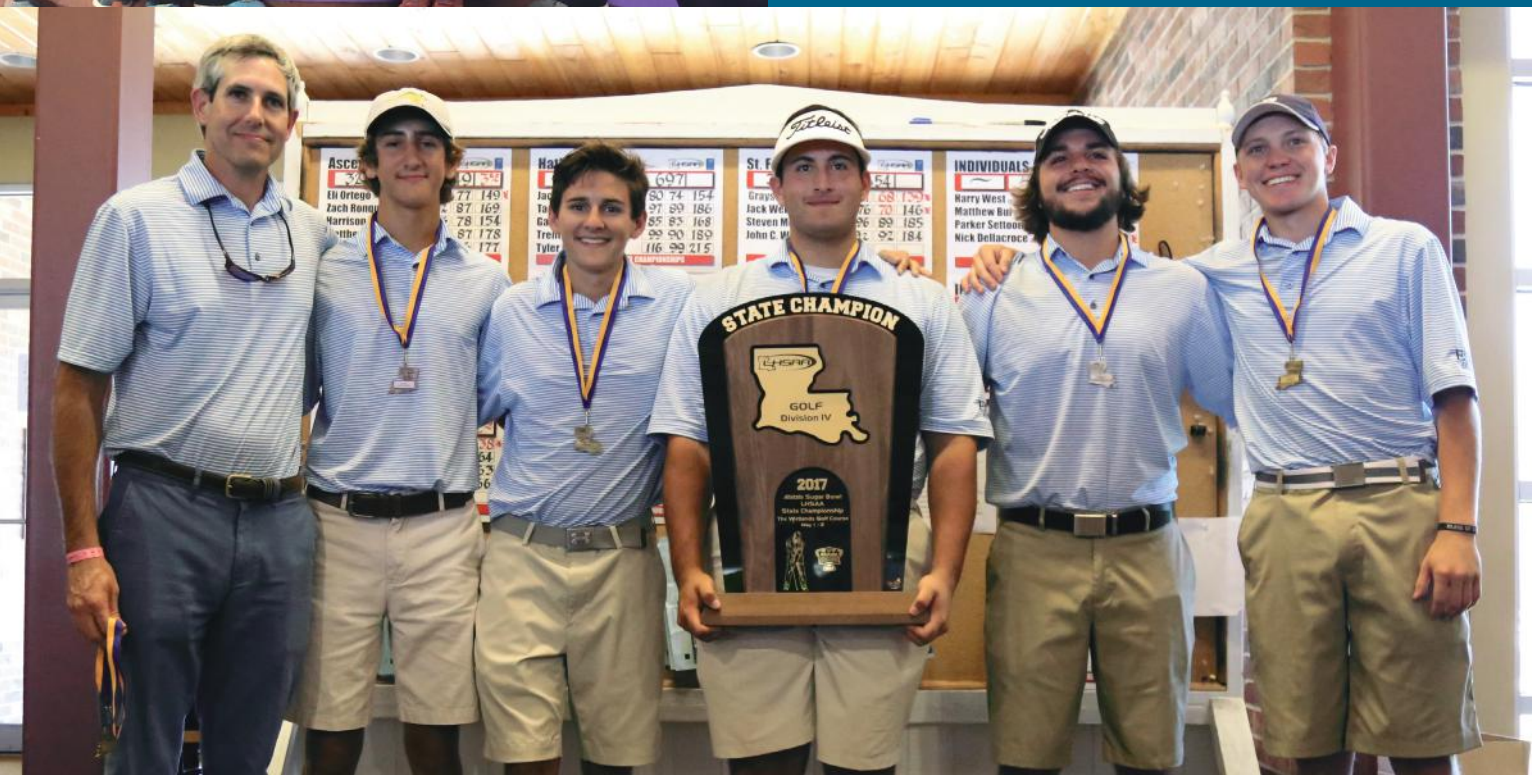


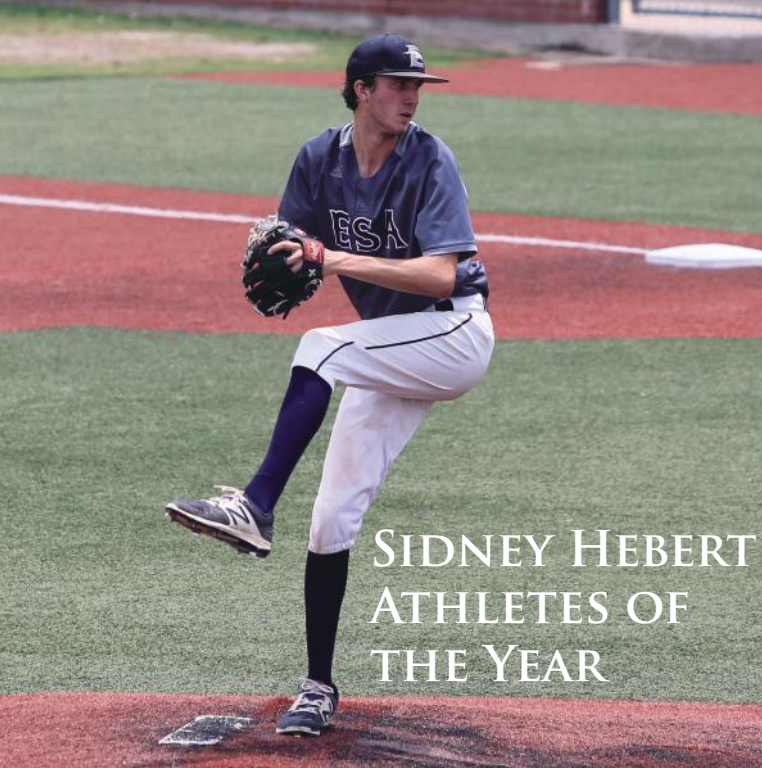


A REPEAT AND A THREE-PEAT!
