For you to be to be eligible for an apprenticeship, the following needs to apply:







Employed and working a minimum of 16 hours per week

Has lived in the UK for a minimum of 3 years





Does not hold an equivalent qualification in the same area

## **Personal Tutor**

Your Personal Tutor will be your main point of contact throughout your programme. A sector expert, they will guide and equip you with the knowledge, skills and behaviours you need to successfully complete your End Point Assessment (EPA) and achieve your apprenticeship.



## **Functional Skills**

If you don't already have valid Maths or English qualifications, you will need to achieve Level 2 Functional Skills in order to complete your apprenticeship. Our knowledgeable Functional Skills Tutors will be on hand to support you through this alongside your main programme.

Your EPA consists of questions, observations and interviews to assess the level of knowledge you've achieved from your apprenticeship.




## **Final Results**

## Commitment

#### **Your commitment**

To succeed within the apprenticeship Paragon Skills expects the below:

- Complete all enrolment tasks
- Attend sign-up meeting with your Personal Tutor
- Complete a piece of learning every 4 weeks
- Complete work within the agreed timescales
- Attend all progress reviews and monthly meetings
- To provide at least 48 hours notice to postpone or cancel meeting
- Complete Functional Skills, Maths and English if you do not have an equivalent qualification
- Commit to the entire apprenticeship and achieve the qualification

## Manager's commitment to you

Managers should be there to support learners throughout the programme and will be asked to;

- Attend and contribute to your enrolment appointment, Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) discussion
- Read and sign the quality compliance document
- Discuss the support you will require
- Plan and agree dedicated learning time between the learner and Personal Tutor
- Attend the progress reviews with you and your Personal Tutor every 12 weeks
- Check-in with you on a fortnightly basis



If you don't already have valid Maths or English qualifications, a knowledgeable Functional Skills Tutor will support you through completing Functional Skills alongside your programme.




#### Cognassist

Near the start of your apprenticeship you will complete a cognitive assessment. This gives us important information that will enable us to support you on your apprenticeship in the best possible way.



#### eQuoo

If you are aged under 35, you'll have access to eQuoo - our mental health app. eQuoo allows you to expand your emotional intelligence skills, be more resilient and become a better communicator.



## Protected apprenticeship time

Protected apprenticeship time is a statutory requirement for an apprenticeship. It's learning that you'll complete during your normal working hours, for the purpose of knowledge, skills and behaviours.

## Must be activities that are outside of your normal working role

# How much protected apprenticeship time is needed?

If your contracted working hours are between 16-30 hours per week = 20% of your working hours must be spent on dedicated learning time per week.

If your contracted working hours are 30+ per week = a minimum of 6 working hours must be spent on dedicated learning time per week.


