

In the pulsating world of electronic music, few names resonate with the same depth and intensity as Wehbba.

A master craftsman behind the decks and in the studio, **Wehbba** has carved a unique path from his early days in São Paulo, Brazil, to becoming one of the most respected names on the global techno circuit.

Born Rodolfo Wehba, his story is one of passion, precision, and an unrelenting commitment to his craft. Starting his career in dentistry—a far cry from the smoky dancefloors of underground clubs—Wehbba found his true calling in music. He took the plunge, trading dental drills for drum machines, and the world has been grateful ever since.


Wehbba's sound is a symphony of contrasts: hypnotic yet driving, complex yet accessible, raw yet refined. His music speaks to the soul of the dancefloor, blending intricate grooves with powerful basslines that command attention. Releases on labels like Drumcode, Bedrock, Systematic, and Tronic have solidified his place among the legends, with standout tracks like "Eclipse" earning praise from heavyweights such as Carl Cox and Adam Beyer.





What sets Wehbba apart is not just his music, but his philosophy. He is a relentless explorer, pushing the boundaries of sound design, shunning shortcuts, and building every element of his tracks from the ground up. His dedication to originality shines through in his work—a refusal to follow trends and a determination to lead instead.

Offstage, Wehbba is a thinker and a teacher, sharing his insights into production, sound design, and the art of crafting a DJ set.



His humility, paired with a fierce commitment to his art, makes him not only a celebrated artist but an inspiration to the next generation of DJs and producers.







Today, we're here to talk about his latest project,

"Studio Dump," a bold new album that breaks away from traditional production norms. Instead of over-polishing, Wehbba has embraced spontaneity — releasing raw, unfiltered tracks that capture the essence of his creative process.

In this interview, we'll dive into the inspiration behind "Studio Dump," explore his creative methods, and learn about the gear that helped shape this unique body of work.

"Studio Dump" seems to capture the raw, unfiltered side of your creative process.

Can you share the moment that sparked the concept for this album and how it aligns with the 'photo dump' trend on social media?



I think that social media is a thing that now permeates our day to day very prominently

but also kind of subconsciously, and it has changed the landscape of electronic music culture in such a way, especially since the pandemic, but actually creating a project that is based on those very tools from social media and how people consume culture in them. Ever since I've created HIFN, it's been my goal to dive deeper into my artistic vision, beyond just making and performing music, and exploring different sides of art and culture in general.

So with the STUDIO DUMP 05.25 I wanted to embrace the ephemeral quality of online presence in different realms, from the music making to how I would distribute the album and how I would share any content during the release period.

From a technical
standpoint, can you walk
us through your studio setup for
"Studio Dump"? Which synths,
drum machines, and plugins
played a key role in shaping the
album's sound?

I've used most of my tools while developing these tracks, but also a while lot of things were done "in the box", and I tried to pull it all off without a post-production phase, so there wasn't any mixing or mastering sessions for the whole album, it was all done in the moment, while creating the tracks, in their own projects.

If there were any tools that were used in most tracks, I'd have to quote mostly plugins, Xfer Serum, Kilohearts Phase Plant, Sonic Academy Kick 3, Softube Model 82 and Sonic Charge Microtonic.

The tracks in "Studio
Dump" are designed to
serve specific moments in a DJ or
live set. How do you decide
which sonic ideas are meant to
disrupt, reset, or drive the energy
of a set? Is it a deliberate process
or purely instinctual?

It's purely instinctual, and after 20+ years of DJing you kind of develop your own way

of creating those moments in your own sets, and if you're a producer as well you can create what you feel that is lacking in your music library to be able to achieve that.

Even so, I've also tried to create a collection of tracks that made sense when played in a sequence, so if even though STUDIO DUMP 05.25 wasn't created based on a single storyline, it does give you the feeling you'd get while listening to a DJ set.







I'm constantly researching and learning, trying to develop new techniques

based on whatever new technologies appear, trying to optimize my workflow to be able to fully realize my ideas with more fidelity and wasting less time and energy on things that aren't helping the creative process.

I've had to learn to embrace plugins and working in the box so that I can work while I'm on the road, otherwise my output would be a lot less frequent, and since I've started HIFN I wanted to express myself a lot more than I could the past few years, so I could't depend on being in my studio all of the time, I had to be more flexible, and slowly but surely I'm getting there.

In "Studio Dump," you lean away from the traditional polished album structure. Do you think this reflects a broader shift in how electronic music is consumed in the digital era? Do you see this approach becoming a new norm for artists?



I can't really tell, but I feel that it's what's already happening. And that's why

instead of shifting away from this and just be angry about it, I've decided to embrace it fully and experience in my own skin what that's like, learning from each step and seeing how it can benefit my own artistic expression and get as much growth out of this experience as possible.

HIFN has been an important platform for you, not just as a label but as a multiart platform. How does the concept of HIFN influence your creative decisions, especially in projects like "Studio Dump"?

HIFN is not just an important platform for me, it IS me.

It's what I'm all about as an artist, it's about freedom in art, it's about being open and sharing knowledge, collaborating, learning, exploring concepts, and STUDIO DUMP is one big opportunity to do all of that in one single project.

Being able to share my findings and exchange ideas within the HIFN Community on Patreon every chance I get is extremely fulfilling for me, the listening parties leading up to the album release were really inspiring, and I like to think that stuff like this is what keeps our culture alive, beyond the business and the hedonistic aspects of it, and this is what keeps me going and keeps me inspired after all these years.

Wehbba, you're recognized as one of Brazil's leading electronic music ambassadors, with a career spanning over a decade and a journey that took you from being a dentist in São Paulo to a globally renowned DJ and producer now based in Lisbon. Looking back, how did this transformation shape your approach to music, especially in raw, unfiltered projects like 'Studio Dump'?

I don't think it was ever a transformation, I was born for art and music, and anything

else that happened beyond that in my life was just a distraction, that thankfully didn't last long.

My approach to music has always been to explore my own freedom, my own vision, and to pay tribute to the past but always looking into the future. And I like to think that my musical output and my cultural projects reflects that.


ON 13 MAY 2025,


As the music played on, guests were treated to hot/cold beverages and pizza, rounding off the event in true Proaudio style—where world-class audio meets genuine hospitality.




SOUTH Congratulations on the new car with the sound system! Are you now travelling to gigs with your own ride, and how did you manage before?

birthday. That evening, I had another event playing for Valley of Light, so it was quite an unforgettable day!


At Plett Rage, you performed ഭരണപ്പി from the iconic Red Bull van! What was that like, and how was the overall Rage experience?

For DJs who want professional features without the premium price tag of the flagship models, this unit continues to deliver.

The XDJ-1000MK2 shares a lot with the legendary CDJ-2000NXS2. It offers a familiar layout that feels right at home for DJs who have experience with Pioneer's gear, and it's intuitive enough for beginners ready to level up.

The full-size jog wheel gives you the tactile feedback you need for smooth pitch bending and scratching, while the 7-inch full-color touchscreen makes browsing tracks, setting cues, and using performance features simple and fun.

It's a clean, well-organized interface that keeps you focused on the music.



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
One of the standout features of the XDJ-1000MK2 is its support for high-resolution audio formats like FLAC and ALAC, so you can play tracks up to 48kHz/24-bit. This means your music sounds as crisp and detailed as possible, which is a big deal when you're playing for an audience that appreciates quality sound.

Performance-wise, the XDJ1000MK2 gives you a lot to work
with. It comes with 8 Hot Cues,
letting you jump to key moments in
a track on the fly. Beat Jump,
Quantize, and Slip Mode add
creative possibilities, whether
you're crafting transitions or
layering effects in real-time. It's a
system that encourages
experimentation and allows you to
develop your own style.

Integration with rekordbox is seamless. Prepare your playlists, cues, and loops on rekordbox, then plug in your USB and go. And with Pro DJ Link, you can connect up to four players or laptops via LAN, making it easy to sync tracks and share information across your setup—just like you'd see in a club environment.


IMS Ibiza Unites the Global DJ Community



Each year, the International Music Summit (IMS) in Ibiza closes with one of the most unique and visually stunning events in the global electronic music calendar — a full-scale open-air celebration held within the ancient stone walls of Dalt Vila, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. For one unforgettable night, centuries-old architecture is illuminated with LED walls, state-of-the-art sound systems, and a lineup of international talent that reads like a who's who of the DJ world.

The 2025 edition of IMS Dalt Vila continued this tradition with a lineup that spanned genres, generations, and continents. From the seasoned techno command of Paco Osuna, to the infectious Latininfused sets of HUGEL, and the soulful selections of Bradley Zero, the stage was a melting pot of musical styles.


Rising talents like **Deer Jade** and **Girls Don't Sync** brought fresh perspective, while heavyweights like **Pete Tong** and **Miss Monique** delivered electrifying sets that reminded everyone why Ibiza is the heartbeat of global dance culture.



















But it wasn't just about the artists the gear took center stage too. Performances throughout the night were powered by the latest innovations from AlphaTheta and Pioneer DJ, two names that have become synonymous with professional DJing. At the core of most sets was the industry-standard CDJ-3000, prized for its blazing-fast processor, enhanced jog wheels, and expanded touchscreen display giving DJs the precision and responsiveness needed to perform in front of a crowd that spans thousands.

These units were often paired with the flagship **DJM-A9** mixer, delivering next-level effects, superior sound quality, and intuitive control layouts that allow for spontaneous creativity on stage. Some artists also made use of the RMX-1000 effects processor for live remixing, and the DJS-1000 performance sampler — a favourite among artists who blend live production with traditional mixing. Combined with AlphaTheta's contribution to more intuitive and wireless solutions, the performance setups at Dalt Vila were nothing short of cutting-edge, reflecting the evolution of DJ gear as both art and instrument.



What sets IMS Dalt Vila apart is not just the location or the lineup — it's the **spirit of connection**. This isn't just a festival finale. It's a summit of ideas, a playground for collaboration, and a celebration of how far DJ culture has come.

Gear reps, artists, producers, agents, and fans gather here, not just to dance, but to talk tech, share stories, and shape the future of electronic music together.

The moment the sun sets behind the fortress and the first beat drops, something magical happens. The walls of Dalt Vila, which have stood for over 500 years, begin to vibrate with the energy of today's sound — a blend of history and hedonism, tradition and innovation.

Sound You've got a real love for old school music. Where does that come from, and how do you bring that vibe into your sets?



I love old school music, I was born into a family that has a great love for music. My late

grandfather used to listen to Elvis, Carpenters, UB40, Manhattans, The Commodores, and Phil Collins a lot while I was still very little. My mom & dad on the other hand would listen to Whitney Houston, Mariah Carey, Luther Vandros, Usher, SWV, Robin S, etc.

So I had the pleasure of being surrounded with all these great songs and that's where my love for old school developed. I usually transition from new school to old school that keeps my sets versatile but relevant.

We saw you perform at the Cape Town Festive Lights
Festival with Carletheia — how was that experience, and what's it like sharing the stage with a vocalist?



Performing at the Festival of Lights with Carletheia was an absolutely awesome

experience. It was such a pleasure working and co-labing with her. I also thoroughly enjoyed the choreography we worked on together and performed on stage.

I also got to entertain the crown with my scratching. So all round a wonderful, memorable experience. It was so lovely sharing the stage with a vocalist, you each get to shine in your own way (she with her beautiful vocals and me with my mixing & scratching) but together we were dynamite.

My biggest dream is to travel internationally to DJ for a crowd outside of South Africa. What

you can expect from DJ Sophia this year is definitely more gigs in and around Cape Town, and hopefully getting my SOFIRE merch ready.























On June 16, 1976, a pivotal I moment in SOUTH AFRICAN history

unfolded as thousands of black students in Soweto protested against the apartheid government's policy mandating Afrikaans as the medium of instruction in schools.

South Africa mourns the loss of **Darren Scott**, a revered radio and television personality, who passed away on May 27, 2025, after a prolonged battle with melanoma, an aggressive form of skin cancer.

His passing marks the end of a remarkable four-decade career that left an indelible mark on the nation's broadcasting landscape.

Darren Scott's broadcasting journey began in the early 1980s at Capital Radio. His passion and charisma quickly propelled him to prominent roles at major stations including 5FM, East Coast Radio, Jacaranda FM, and Hot 102.7FM. Notably, his "Just Plain Breakfast" show became a staple for many South Africans, blending humor, music, and heartfelt commentary. Beyond radio, Scott also made significant contributions to television, particularly through his work with SuperSport.



In 2024, Scott was honored with induction into the Radio Awards Hall of Fame, a testament to his enduring influence and dedication to the medium he loved. Hot 102.7FM paid tribute, stating, "Darren was many things: a gifted communicator, a music lover, a sports encyclopaedia, a deeply spiritual soul and a loyal friend. But above all, he was radio."

Scott's fight with melanoma began in 1986 and spanned nearly four decades. Despite multiple surgeries and treatments, he remained resilient, often returning to the airwaves even during periods of illness. In recent years, the financial burden of treatment led him to return to South Africa from the United States to continue working and fund his medical expenses. His ex-wife, Sarah-Kate Accetta, launched a BackaBuddy campaign that garnered significant support, reflecting the nation's deep affection for him.

The news of Scott's passing elicited a wave of tributes from fans, colleagues, and fellow broadcasters. One listener poignantly remarked, "Another voice of my childhood has gone silent. RIP Darren Scott. Alongside legends Jeremy Mansfield, Mark Pilgrim, and Kevin Savage — you were the soundtrack to our youth."

In May 2025, a benefit concert was organized in his honor, featuring performances by renowned artists such as Ard Matthews, Jesse Clegg, Louise Carver, and Kurt Darren. The event underscored the profound impact Scott had on the entertainment industry and the lives of countless South Africans.

Darren Scott is survived by his sons, Mark and Matthew, who were central to his life and motivation throughout his health struggles.

His legacy as a broadcaster, mentor, and friend will continue to inspire future generations.

As we bid farewell to this broadcasting giant, we celebrate a life dedicated to connecting with audiences, sharing stories, and bringing joy to countless listeners and viewers. Darren Scott's voice may have been silenced, but his spirit and contributions will resonate forever in the hearts of South Africans.






