Your go-to guide

Wondering how to plan out your wedding ceremony to ensure everything's in place for a successful day? **Jennifer McLaren** gets the lowdown from the experts...



Start with the basics It's personal

When a couple first gets in touch with the person they are choosing to be their celebrant, they will try to get to know them a little. Simon Houston of Fuze Ceremonies says, "The most helpful thing I feel I can do is ask the couple: 'How do you want your wedding to feel: fun and relaxed? Romantic and intimate? Lots of laughs or full of meaning?'

"Once they know the answer to that, I can help shape every part of the ceremony around them. That way they immediately feel it's personal and it lets them know I am there for them from the very start, right through the process – not just an officiant but someone who can help them to shape the whole experience."

Choose the vibe

Paul Browett, The Scottish Celebrant, adds, "I like to get to know my couples and to know the vibe and the tone – what they want to achieve from their day. I would say the majority of my couples are looking for something fun, something relaxed, something personal. For me, that's really important – to try and get that tone that they want to achieve.

"A lot of people think the ceremony's the boring bit before the party, whereas I want to blow guests' socks off. I want to make it where the fun begins."

Your choice

Humanist Craig Flowers of Independent Humanist Ceremonies advises, "Don't feel overly pressured by anyone else, this is your wedding and we'll do it your way. It doesn't have to be all the bells and whistles. If you want something simple, then that's fine. However we have loads of options and it's best to explore them all."

Lindsey Mason Ross of Humanist Society Scotland adds, "The first thing I like to do is to provide some reassurance. I remind couples they've chosen a great team – and I'm part of it now! On the day, your suppliers (me included) will work together seamlessly so you can relax and enjoy every moment."





Walk this way

When it comes to making an entrance, there are traditions couples tend to follow – but these are by no means set in stone.

Craig explains, "Traditionally, it happens in order of importance or seniority. Flowergirls or pageboys, followed by bridesmaids, maid of honour, then bride and chaperone. Thankfully, we no longer live in a world where a bride is property to be handed over – some couples enter together, a bride can wait for a groom if they wish and there are, of course, same sex weddings. There is no right or wrong! It's all very much up to the couple."

When it comes to the entrance, Simon adds, "There is no right or wrong and there is no official rule with this one – but there are very much traditional options most couples tend to want to go with."

Once guests are seated, Simon will announce the groom who will wait at the front with his best man or best person and the groomsmen/groomspeople, or the ushers. Once everyone is seated and the music begins, the bridesmaids will walk in.

Simon goes on, "They will often be followed by, or – depending on the age of the children – accompany the flower children or pageboys. Then finally the bride will walk in, accompanied by the person who is giving them away, often the father of the bride.

"That's the classic and most traditional way, but it can change. I have officiated at weddings where both partners walk in together and also where the bride walks in alone, unescorted.

"There's no 'should' here — you can absolutely do the traditional thing, but you can also make your entrance reflect you."

Special moment

Katie MacDonald of Humanist Society Scotland says, "Other than writing their own vows, the 'big entrance' moment is something I find couples do worry about. There's a lot of tradition around weddings - you might picture the groom waiting at the top of the aisle with a best man, awaiting the bridesmaids, then the bride, accompanied by her dad. Absolutely lovely if that's a tradition or 'moment' that's important to you. But families can be complicated, not everyone wants to be 'given away'. Traditional can feel patriarchal and heteronormative to some. The honest answer is there are no rules. But we do need to get you in the room somehow...

"Recently I had a bride walk the full aisle length of Glasgow University Chapel alone – absolutely stunning. At another wedding, a couple who shared a long relationship wanted to share that moment and take the steps together. Everyone standing and cheering for them walking in was magic. My advice would be do what feels right for you. Smile. And pick a good tune!" ≫



Ceremony rituals

There are so many rituals and symbolic gestures to consider incorporating into your ceremony. Craig and Simon enjoy traditional elements like handfasting and drinking from the quaich. Paul also favours this and rather than whisky, he will encourage the couple to choose a drink that means something personal to them.

Lizzie Edgerton of Humanist Society Scotland personally loves the oathing stone. "Not because it's showy, or elaborate, or sentimental (it's not), but because it manages to be something simple and quietly meaningful, with just the right amount of novelty to stop things getting too soppy," she explains.

Historically, couples placed their hands over a stone as they said their vows, grounding their promises, rooting them in something solid and real. After the ceremony they can take their stone home, leave it near where they got married or – if they're close to a body of water – throw it in.



Important paperwork

It's crucial couples follow the timelines and legalities involved in getting married.

The all-important M10 forms need to be submitted 29 days before the wedding – and ideally a lot earlier. You can return them from up to 12 weeks before the ceremony.

"If the legalities aren't observed it isn't a legal wedding!" warns Craig. Paul continues, "It's quite important that couples must do it themselves. In Scotland, you have to willingly enter into marriage and you have to show that you want to get married. So you must fill in the M10 paperwork yourself – and that's a form each. It's important that the same person does not fill in both of the forms.

"They submit these to the registry office closest to where they're getting married along with supporting documents to prove they are who they say they are."



Get it right

Claire Watt of Humanist Society Scotland explains, "Understanding the legal process and timeline is essential for every newly engaged couple. One of the most important aspects of wedding planning is obtaining your Marriage Schedule – without it, your celebrant cannot legally marry you."

She goes on to say that to ensure everything goes smoothly couples should know exactly what information the registrar requires and what documentation needs to be submitted. The window to submit your forms is relatively short, and although the process isn't particularly difficult, it can easily be overlooked among the many tasks on your wedding to-do list.

Simon agrees, adding, "Especially when I ask the couple if they know where their birth certificates are and they look blankly at each other! To me, it is really important to help couples avoid last-minute panic around legal paperwork.

"A lot of newly-engaged couples don't realise that the legal part of the wedding is totally separate from the fun side of it and the party planning. And because it's Scotland – where humanist weddings are legally binding – it's essential they get it right. I guide them every step of the way and remind them that missing deadlines can delay or even prevent legal marriage."

Marriage schedule

On the week of the wedding the couple has to collect the marriage schedule that will be signed on the day. This must be signed by the couple themselves (in their pre-marital names – not any new names!) Two witnesses must also be present on the day. They need to be over the age of 16, and also signatories must be sober! The person officiating the ceremony also signs.

If you are having a civil marriage ceremony, the registrar conducting the ceremony will bring the marriage schedule with them for you to sign. For religious or humanist ceremonies, the couple must ensure they have it.

Paul explains, "You've got three days to hand it back into the registry office where you collected it from. That's when they'll process the documents, and once it's all logged in the database, they send the couple out a marriage certificate in the post."

The ceremony

Simon explains that the legal part of the wedding ceremony in Scotland is the Declaration – or legal vows. These can be flexible in their wording, but the couple must each say one, clear legal statement to each other. "They need to cover something like: 'I accept you as my lawfully wedded husband/wife/spouse/partner in marriage.'
Once those legal words have been said, I'll formally declare them married."

Handy checklist

Claire Watt of Humanist Society Scotland shares her top five tips for stress-free legal planning...

- I. Download and review the MIO form and guidance notes well in advance of the deadline. This will help you understand exactly what's needed and when.
- 2. Set a reminder for three months and one week before your wedding to prepare your forms, so they're ready to be submitted.
- **3**. Gather all required identification documents ahead of time to avoid last-minute scrambles.
- **4**. Choose your witnesses and let them know in advance.
- **5**. Remember to collect your Marriage Schedule as specified by the registrar and don't forget to bring it with you to your ceremony



In tune

Music can play an important part in a marriage ceremony, creating a particular vibe. Many couples opt to have a piper, either as their guests enter the venue, or when the ceremony is over. Outfits such as a string quartet or a harpist can play before, during and after the ceremony. Dee McLaren of band Splendid Gentlemen, explains that couples should consider the mood or setting they wish to create for their ceremony – and beyond. This way, they know what kind of band or performer would suit the different aspects of the day.

Dee explains, "Music is essential to creating mood and it should complement and work with the other aesthetics of your wedding. A harpist or string quartet would be much more relaxing and add an element of class, that perhaps a singer or duo might not. But a singer or duo might add more excitement to the mood. Instrumental music is more background, to let your guests mingle, whereas anything with a singer is slightly more intrusive and demands more attention from the listener."

Make an entrance

Walking down the aisle is a big part of any ceremony, so it's a good idea to put some thought into the song or instrumental music you choose.


Traditional classical pieces such as Wagner's *Bridal Chorus* or Pachelbel's *Canon in D* remain popular, while modern tracks include Christina Perri's *A Thousand Years* or John Legend's *All of Me*.

Instrumentals

Instrumental versions of songs are also featured in many of the weddings we write about at YSW, with tracks like Elvis Presley's Can't Help Falling in Love making regular appearances.

According to Dee McLaren of band Splendid Gentlemen the music you pick always makes a statement – so try to be as personal as you can. He says, "While the first dance later is typically a romantic song, an entrance song can be something like the band the two of you first saw together. I saw a couple come in once to the Star Wars theme, which was undeniably cool. There's so much scope to express yourselves as a couple."

s co-founder of Aquarius Creative, the social media, marketing and influencer company at the heart of the BBC's *The Agency: Unfiltered*, Kirsten Coakley née Cameron is used to organising big events. And dressing the part for them too. But when it came to the star's own wedding to her husband Adam, dress shopping was on a whole other level.

Kirsten and Adam married in the picture-perfect Son Marroig in Majorca in May, with a legal ceremony at The Exchange in Glasgow beforehand. She officially tied the knot in an elegant, unembellished number with detachable lace sleeves which she admits to only ordering a few nights before. That was because she'd already found a very special number for the Majorcan wedding at Opus Couture and wanted to keep it for the main event.

And what a dress it was! "I knew I loved the brand Berta and Opus are the only stockist in Scotland so it was a no-brainer," Kirsten explains. "I originally tried on dresses for part of our show. I loved a Berta dress then but the one I eventually chose wasn't out yet. When I went back for the second time it was one of the only dresses I tried on – I loved it instantly!"

In fact, Kirsten realised months later after she had picked her beautiful lace dress with its collar detail that it was the only one she had saved on her TikTok before she started looking – "Meant to be."

Kirsten attended her Opus appointment with all her bridesmaids, her mum and mother-in-law. "They all loved the dress and there were some tears, so that confirmed it was The One," she smiles. All of the changes were overseen by Opus' business manager Susan Lightbody and Kirsten was full of praise for her. "My shopping experience was amazing from start to finish," she says. "Susan was incredible and made me feel at ease. It was like nothing was a problem! It was so nice spending time with her over the months and finalising all the details on the dress."

With her decision made, Kirsten unfollowed all other bridal boutiques so she wouldn't overthink it or be tempted by other dresses – "Even though I was completely in love with mine."

Ask the expert Rachel Scott Couture

Rachel lays out just how to get account? your dress to fit perfectly Shona wearing Westwood

aving something made entirely bespoke and designed to fit to perfection generally isn't something we're used to anymore. And without question, full-length dresses and cinching corsets definitely aren't the norm!

Ready-to-wear clothing has allowed - and encouraged - us to move entirely away from having clothes individually made for us. We're also generally choosing looser and looser clothing as a styling choice - almost anti-fit. But with that, our understanding of the process has waned, so it makes complete sense that when you choose your wedding dress and have it fitted, there will be a lot of new elements to get your head around!

Whether it's a classically-fitting structured corset ballgown or a whimsical boho number, your wedding dress will be the most thought-through, precise outfit you've ever worn. Fit and shaping are on a whole different level of importance, and you'll have to take into account aspects you may not have considered. Even the fact that it's likely going to be full-length means hem lengths (and avoiding trip hazards!) become a new fitting element you're suddenly going to have to think about. You may be a seasoned wearer of a fab summer maxi-dress, but the chances are your wedding dress will take a little more manoeuvring!

What physical fit elements should I take into account?

Make sure you test out that you can be the person you want to be on your wedding day.

Are you a wild dancer who simply must be doing cartwheels on the dancefloor? Then check if you can move your arms. On the other hand, do you even care if you can't?! Maybe the dress you've found is so entirely suited to your personality and makes you feel so amazing that you really don't care if you can't move your arms freely - and that's OK!

Fit is crucial. Design is crucial. But make sure it's *your* design and fit, not just a list of what you can and can't physically do in your wedding dress. How do you want to feel in your dress? What do you want to do?

You can be as practical or impractical as you like on this one. I think shoes always give a good comparison since it's one we can all relate to when it comes to comfort and practicality. (And also, I just love shoes!) I think we can generally agree that high heels are not designed with physical comfort in mind, right? However, anyone who knows me knows I live in stilettos, and I love my heels so will naturally feel more 'comfortable' in those,

whereas for someone else that's a complete nightmare. Don't change your personality on your wedding day! Flat shoes might be 'physically' comfortable, but if you're not feeling 'psychologically' comfortable then your guests are going to see it written across your face! But also, if you're a trainers-wearer 24/7 don't change to heels.

What about styles that are apparently harder to move in?

I bet you've heard that fishtail dresses restrict movement, right? Well, it certainly wouldn't be the first time I've seen one of my brides doing the splits on the dance floor in their fishtail wedding dress! Or stage diving. And then there's the video of one recent bride playing rounders in her fully corseted dress with highly

tailored long sleeves that you could argue restrict movement. The way she hit that ball and ran to the next base, she was managing just fine!

Road test your dress and don't overlook any niggles

Yes, the fit of your dress will change once it's in your correct measurements, but will that be enough? Trust your instincts. It's all too easy to brush aside those niggles at the early stages of dress shopping – "It'll be fine once I've lost weight," or "it'll be fine with the sculpting underwear."

If you've got a worry, don't ignore it. Say it out loud and get answers one way or another! There is always a solution – and that solution might just be a little more information and knowledge from the bridal shop. When you're trying on a shop sample it won't fit correctly. It's probably too long or maybe has panels at the back. This isn't something you're used to so it's ok to feel a little out of sorts. Take your time! Any good bridal retailer will want you to do that too.

And definitely consider these questions: Can you sit down? Does it feel too heavy? Does it not feel heavy enough? Is it feeling tight across your tummy?

Should I take my size into account when choosing my wedding dress?

No! It always makes me wince a little when I hear clients have been told they should limit their choices based on anything physical. You're not a set of measurements. You're a human being! Find a dress that makes you happy. One that clicks naturally with your personality and a dress you know you'll feel relaxed and confident in. The rest

of the technical 'measurement' stuff is the easy bit (for us anyway) that's about measuring correctly, having your dress made-to-measure and really perfecting the final fittings.

Measurements and choosing a size

Talk to the team at your bridal shop. Ask them questions and get their advice. The more we know, the better the outcome!

Taking measurements is a technical skill and accuracy is everything – particularly if you've chosen a fully made-to-measure dress. You'll be amazed at the in-depth range of measurements we take, and they're not only to get a record of your body shape, but also posture, angles and asymmetry.

If you've gone for a standard size dress option, then we always consider what final alterations and fitting might be needed. Make sure you're happy that you'll still achieve a super neat fit without compromise. Body length, bust cup size and proportions in particular are measurements that really can't be, or are much harder to adjust once your dress is made.

What if I lose weight?

Tell us as soon as you can! When you're ordering your dress, let your bridal shop know if you're planning a drastic shape change. Check if it's possible to order a smaller size or delay taking measurements until a date closer to your wedding.

At Rachel Scott Couture we can confirm orders with our designers without committing to measurements until much further down the line. It's a huge advantage for us and ensures we can offer plenty of flexibility and the ultimate fit accuracy.

That certainly isn't an option with a lot of bridal shops and designers though, so check before assuming. Equally though, it may be an option to order a different size compared to your current measurements. Talk it through and, of course, be sensible with it!

Don't forget the final fittings and trust the process

Your dress is always going to need some level of tailoring once it arrives, such as tweaks to hem length, sleeves, straps and bodice. These final fittings sculpt your dress to suit you.

If you've chosen a standard size, your boutique will have matched you to the closest size based on your measurements and final fittings will be to tailor that into your bespoke shape.

Made-to-measure – our preferred approach at Rachel Scott Couture – is when your dress is made entirely from scratch exactly to your measurements. But even then, final fittings will still apply.

It's important to bear in mind that your measurements are not static. You do things like bend, twist and breathe (maybe less in a full corset!) and your ribcage can expand by more than a dress size with each inhale! The fabric your dress is made from can also affect fit. Is there a stretch to it? Is the corset fully boned or is it panelling and elastic construction? If there is no built-in structure the fit needs to be shaped around your bra or sculpting underwear.

This is why final fittings are so crucial. The process can seem daunting and definitely new, but don't rush it! To you, what might seem like an impossible adjustment could be incredibly simple to an expert seamstress. Although equally, what might seem like an easy hem, could be massively complicated! At the risk of sounding like a broken record – fit is everything so take the time to get it right!

She prepped with Glow Recipe Watermelon Glow PHA + BHA toner, followed by Plum Plump hyaluronic cream before applying Charlotte Tilbury Hollywood Flawless Filter sparingly to the high points of the face for a natural glow. She then used Face Atelier Ultra Foundation Pro to provide a skinlike finish before adding subtle warmth with the Rodial Bronze Glowlighter. "It became a hero product of the day. It layered seamlessly over foundation, creating a bronzed, sun-kissed glow that didn't move, fade or go patchy – even after a long shoot in warm conditions and 16 dress changes."

Minimal powder and Face Atelier Ultra Matte Spray helped control shine, while soft eyes contrasted with a bold lip to complete the look.

Mane attraction

Rachel Winton from AMMazing Team created two styles for the shoot, starting with soft, romantic waves with a centre parting and volume at the crown. "It's perfect for those who love Hollywood curls but want something more relaxed," she says. Maria Nila Shaping Heat Spray and the GHD Curve tong achieved the look.

She then styled a loose, low wrap-around ponytail, slicked back from the centre with unstructured volume at the crown. "The Maria Nila Texture Spray added body to the hair to avoid a sleek finish, keeping the style cool and casual," adds Rachel.

Blooming marvellous

"Taking inspiration from the sweeping flower beds at Teasses, I gathered the flowers in a scooped-up wildflower style," says florist Helen Hardman from **The Greenshed Flower Studio**. From timeline to alterations, our bridal boutique experts share the secrets to finding The One with **Claire Muir**

Q: When should I start shopping and what do I need to do before the first appointment?

Mette, Freja Designer Dressmaking: We don't need a year but, in my opinion, starting a year from your wedding date is perfect. This means the temperature is the same as it will be on the big day, your skin tone is the same, and the light and the flowers in season are the same. It can be hard to plan a Christmas wedding in June because we feel differently in different seasons. Before going to an appointment, think how you want your wedding to feel. Sophisticated city sleek? Romantic cottage core? It's great to have a starting point. Consider the dresses and clothes you feel good in. Do you love a high neckline? Or always cover your arms? Perhaps your partner always compliments one specific body part, and you may want to enhance that. A Pinterest board helps me to see what kind of person you are and if you're not sure where to start, pin lots and lots! After a while you'll start to eliminate certain styles, features or colours and refine those that stand out for you.

Q: We've opted for a 'shotgun' wedding. How can I find the perfect gown in record time?

Rachel, Rachel Scott Couture: Don't panic and definitely don't compromise! Your wedding dress has to be entirely perfect, no matter your timescale. So, don't let anyone scare you into thinking you just have to 'make do.' We work really closely with our designers and every piece is made in their own studios. So, we can adjust timelines



to make sure you get the perfect dress, whether you have months, weeks or just days! Never be afraid to ask about sample sale options too. We always have sample dresses to take away the same day.

Q: I love statement dresses but can you dance or even sit in a supertight or massive-skirted dress?!

Megan, Kudos Bridal Dunfermline:
Definitely! But bear in mind that something heavily corseted isn't going to feel as comfortable as something with less structure. Often, boning can be flexible so it will move with you to a certain extent and allow you to sit. If it's super-tight through the hips, make sure you've tested sitting down during alterations! When it comes to big skirts and trains, most gowns can be bustled to take care of any issues.



Q: How much impact do accessories have on the overall outfit?
Kavelle, Kavelle Couture: The

finishing touches should never be an afterthought. Things like veils, jewellery, shoes and hair accessories complete a look and help you feel like yourself on the day. But it's hard to visualise these things separately so I encourage brides to try them on with the dress. When you see the full look come together, it just clicks and that's always special. I have a real soft spot for hairpieces, tiaras and combs because they're such a key part of the overall style. We take a lot of care in creating them every piece is made to suit the bride. Whether it's a delicate floral comb for a relaxed outdoor wedding, a bold statement piece for a city celebration or something soft and timeless with pearls or crystals, It has to feel like something that reflects her personality.

Q: Do I store my dress at home? And how do I get it to the venue?

Mirka, Mirka Bridal Couture: Most brides pick up their dress one or two months before the wedding, after all the final alterations. This gives time for

last minute adjustments while keeping the dress safe and ready. At home, keep it on a padded hanger (to support the weight), in a cool and dry place (no direct sunlight, heat or humidity) and in a breathable garment bag to prevent moisture build-up. And don't try it on too often - you don't want accidental stains! For a very delicate or heavily beaded gown, lay it flat in a box lined with acid-free tissue paper. When travelling with your dress, pack it carefully to keep it safe and wrinklefree. The garment bag will keep away dust, dirt and damage but if you need to fold your dress, place layers of acid-free tissue paper between folds to prevent creasing. Flying? Most airlines let you hang it in a closet in the cabin or fold it gently and place it in the overhead bin. If it has to go in checked luggage, use a sturdy box designed for wedding dresses, packed with plenty of padding and tissue paper. Finally, no matter how far you've travelled, steam it at your venue. Bring a travel steamer or arrange for a professional service.

Q: I've never been to a bridal boutique before! What's the etiquette?

Susan, Opus Couture: We always recommend one appointment per day to avoid overwhelm. This allows you to focus, try on dresses without rushing and make thoughtful decisions. Spacing boutiques out over different days provides clarity and prevents decision fatigue. Getting married is something you'll remember forever so treat your bridal appointment(s) the same way. Bring those who are your personal cheerleaders; the ones who know you, love you and want to share in this magical chapter of your life. It's not about having a crowd; it's about having the right people.

Q: I like the idea of a second dress. When should I change, and how long should I factor in for it? Carolyn, Carolyn Baxter Bridal

Couture: I'm really passionate about working with brides to create transitional looks. Many like the idea of showcasing a second look for the comfort factor but let's face it, who doesn't just love a costume change?! I enjoy creating designs that can be adapted by adding or exchanging accessories, like taking off an overskirt and/or adding a bow and sleeves. Separates are also good for combining two looks. You can change one skirt to a shorter style, or go for trousers and get the best of both worlds. When to change is a personal preference but when it's time to dance can be a good point. Grab your bridesmaids and take half an hour to refresh and take in the day so far.

Q: How do you pee in a wedding dress?

Pamela, Pamela Jayne's Bridal: There are lots of gimmicks, from popping an IKEA bag under your dress to sitting backwards on the toilet. But it depends on the person and the dress... and possibly how much prosecco you've had! Most trains can go over your lessused arm, which takes away most of the fabric and you can pee with ease. Check beforehand that your venue has assigned a dressing room with a toilet, or a disabled loo, to you. And remember you can take your bride tribe in to help you – it's a real bonding experience!





Q: Does everyone need alterations? And if I want to be a certain shape for my big day, what size should I order?

Julia, Isobel Florence Bridal: Not everyone needs alterations - but many brides get small adjustments. The most common is length, to make sure the dress is perfect for walking down the aisle and dancing the night away. You might also want a few tweaks depending on your body shape. Our advice is always to fit a dress to your body rather than fitting your body to a dress, and we encourage buying in your current size or one up. Although losing weight is something lots of brides want to do (and they want a dress in their goal size) it's far more important that the gown is comfortable on the day. Remember, most dresses can be taken in a few sizes but letting out to create a larger size can be more difficult - and more expensive.

SAYING YES to the DRESS

Katie Bletcher discovers how the Opus Couture team finds dream dresses for all their brides



very reaction you've had in it is everything we know is right." So says Susan Lightbody, the business manager at Opus Couture. I'm sitting in the boutique on one of the hottest days of the summer, looking on as bride-to-be Kenya twirls in the stunning gown in question, amid the excited squeals of the four of her six bridesmaids who were able to come along. She's back in dress number two of the seven she's tried, after it became apparent the last five were all being compared to this one. "I don't want her to take this off," says one of her girls, and you can tell by the huge smile on Kenya's face that this is The One!

This is her first appointment trying on dresses for her wedding at The Corinthian, and another booking elsewhere is quickly cancelled. All that remains is for Susan to measure her so they can order the right dress and snap an "I said yes to the Opus dress" pic, thus beginning the process towards walking down the aisle in the perfect dress. I say begin, but as Susan explains, the journey starts before the bride-to-be sets foot in the West Kilbride boutique.

I'm spending the day at Opus Couture, seeing exactly what goes into helping their brides look and feel incredible. Right from when brides begin their search, they can follow Opus Couture on their social channels and join the private Couture Chat. When I visit in July, Opus is preparing to launch a new service where, once a bride books their initial appointment, they will also book a pre-appointment call with Sarah from the team. This gives them the opportunity to discuss any likes and dislikes, whether or not they want to discuss budget in front of friends or family during the appointment, or any other confidential matters. Then, 48 hours before the appointment, they will receive a little questionnaire to help home in on the vision.

"We also like to see pictures, so when they come in, we'll

start with a consultation and say, 'Show us your pin board,' so we have an idea of the overall vibe," explains Susan. "We pull the dresses we think will work and then it's quite collaborative, with us asking how they feel, what they like."

During this appointment, the team also ensures they show options of shapes and styles that perhaps the bride hasn't considered. "Sometimes you need to compare and contrast," says Susan. "And then sometimes your inner bride has her own voice, and it's important we look at how you want to look, not what you think you should look like."

She ought to know. Susan's been working at Opus Couture for 18 years after studying garment technology at Clyde College, followed by fashion at Edinburgh School of Art. She always leaned towards more theatrical garments. so bridal was a perfect next step. "You see the detail and the beadwork, the lace, the cuts, the shapes," she says. "And each year it develops."

Top of their game
Watching Susan carry out the initial consultation with Kenya, it's clear she knows the boutique's rails inside out. And with 150 to 200 gowns to choose from in-store, and that many again in the outlet, she needs to. Of course, none of these dresses are here by chance, but have been painstakingly selected by the team.

Buying normally takes place at Barcelona Bridal Week or in New York, where new collections are shown. From watching the designers' models sashay down the runway, they decide which gowns to buy in for the new season. However, it's not a case of just buying the bestsellers or the fanciest, Susan says. "We're buying them for the women we are dressing. All of the women who come through our door are different, and we need to be prepared to dress them all." The team analyse what they have on their rails before they go buying, to see what they need for each separate style, while also listening to what their brides are asking for.

With their decisions made, it's back to the boutique and a waiting period of up to six months for the new collections to arrive. In that time, Trunk Shows can be a real help, when they are able to bring in a certain designer's entire new collection for a weekend to show brides what's on the way.

Ensuring perfection

With the new season's offering decided, it doesn't mean brides are limited to these gowns. Thanks to their inhouse sewing room, the team at Opus Couture are able to offer customisation on so many of the dresses, and appointments with new brides come with a reminder that things can be changed or adapted. If they like the buttons of one dress but the sleeves of another, alterations can be made. Remember, this is a collaborative process.

Then once the decision is made and the order is placed, the bride-to-be will wait around six months before her own dress arrives, with fittings beginning around 12 weeks before the big day.

In between these initial appointments, fittings and alterations, the teams are kept busy quality-checking each dress that arrives, ensuring every Opus bride looks phenomenal on her wedding day. A feeling summed up by Kenya as she heads to brunch with her 'maids. "I'm so excited, it's everything I envisioned."



Thinking of donning a kilt on your big day? **Jennifer McLaren** discovers why grooms should consider colour...

artan is woven into Scotland's cultural identity, so wearing it for a special occasion such as a wedding day is a great way to honour either the groom's Scottish heritage, or the country's longstanding relationship with the colourful textile.

Originally worn by Highlanders to identify different Scottish clans, it was generally quite bold and vibrant, but now more modern tartans are also available in greys or muted tones. With so many different shades to choose from, remember that going bold can mean making a statement of your own. Hamish Robertson, director at Eight Yards tells us, "Choosing a vibrant tartan brings energy and personality to your wedding day and that's exactly what we're about. It's something a simple black or navy suit just can't match. A bold tartan makes a statement, sparks conversation, and creates lasting memories, all while honouring centuries of tradition. Tartan remains a true fashion favourite thanks to its timeless heritage and its ability to evolve. And sometimes, it's as simple as this - go bold or go home!"

Howie Nicholsby, creator and director of 21st Century Kilts says, "Having dressed thousands of grooms over my 40 years in the industry, the happiest are those who have been guided by their fiancée. Colour and shades are personal to couples. Often clan tartans have more choice available than the ones they are familiar with from the past. It is best to visit a reputable kiltmaker to be guided through the spectrum of choices – clan, family, district, Irish county, and fashion tartans, and the wide range of checked tweeds."

Gordon Nicolson of Gordon Nicolson Kiltmakers adds, "Traditional tartans have always been colourful and on your special day, you want to be the best-dressed, don't you? Strong, vibrant tartans always photograph so much better than monochrome designs, so make sure the images captured reflect how momentous the occasion was!"



Howie strongly recommends concentrating on the groom's outfit before choosing the bridesmaid dresses and flowers. He explains, "The couple should see the kilt as a lifetime investment, beyond their big day." Meanwhile, Gordon recommends discussing colourways with your partner to avoid clashes. "Marrying the tones of each party's outfits and accessories is a beautiful way to celebrate their celebration of union. Floral decoration and embellishments might highlight a particular strip in the tartan, while the attendants' dresses or ties might mirror the base colour. Have fun with it - and enjoy the process as well as the memories captured."

Huntsman tartan is one of

Hamish advises starting with a key colour from the bridal party. "Pull an accent shade from the dresses or florals, then look for a tartan that echoes or complements it. Whether it's a deep blue, burgundy, or green, it's that shared thread that ties everything together."

Hamish is also a great believer in letting the tartan do the talking! "Rather than matching everything to the kilt, use it as the anchor. Echo its tones subtly through buttonholes, linings or ties for a coordinated look that feels considered, not overdone."



Bright and beautiful

Howie has some favourite bold and bright tartans; "I love Hunting Stewart, it's historical and a 'Public Tartan," he says. "The Weathered 7 Muted Colours are my own preference. An absolute legendary tartan is the Bruce of Kinnaird from 1822, claimed to be Vivienne Westwood's favourite. It is stunning."

One of Gordon's favourites carries special meaning. He says, "We love Hunting Nicolson Muted, which is a new, refreshed version of our own clan tartan, inspired by Mrs Nicolson's favourite colours. Aquamarine blue and rich magenta are introduced to a more muted green, underpinned by black with the familiar highlights of gold and white found in Hunting Nicolson Modern, Ancient and Weathered tartan variations. The result is dramatically different, yet remains true to the established patterns commonly recognised as Nicolson Clan Tartans."

Look dapper in the muted Hunting Stewart tartan Eight Yards' favourite bold and bright tartans right now are perfect for grooms looking to make a statement. They include Glen Affric which Hamish describes as, "a tartan rooted in mystery and meaning." "Discovered preserved in a Highland peat bog and dated to the early 1500s, it's considered the oldest true tartan ever found in Scotland, predating the traditional clan system as we know it," he says.

Then there's Huntsman – "a tartan we're proud to call our own." Hamish says, "Designed by Eight Yards and woven here in Scotland, its subtle marled base, a soft green and yellow blend called Yucca, creates a beautifully muted canvas. Over that, we've layered deep rust reds, warm ochres, black and brown accents to form a tartan full of styling potential."

The team at Eight Yards has helped grooms create stunning outfits around the different threads of the design. Hamish goes on, "One of our favourites featured a peat-brown tweed jacket with yellow buttonhole stitching, a rust-red lining, and golden accent threads that pulled out the brighter elements of the tartan in a way that stood out with class and somehow subtlety." Huntsman is available in Eight Yards' rental collection but is also a popular choice for those looking to invest in something uniquely theirs.

to create a bespoke full Highland kilt outfit. He explains, "I wore the Ross Hunting Weathered tartan, which struck the perfect balance between traditional and modern. My jacket was a Ben Mhor in Harris Tweed - a beautifully cut piece with flat epaulettes, real staghorn buttons, and tartan trim details. The buttonholes had a contrasting thread, and the lining was a rich rust-orange satin that added a touch of character and warmth. Underneath. I wore a Harris tweed waistcoat, which I think added a lovely Scottish dimension to the overall look. The waistcoat elevated the outfit and gave it real depth.

"On my feet, I wore brown day brogues – smart, classic, and comfortable. The real standout accessory was my bespoke Highland cow sporran, which added a bit of fun and personality while staying firmly rooted in tradition."

James loved how the overall look merged classic and contemporary styles. His outfit "It was important to me that the outfit felt both traditional and bespoke – something rooted in heritage, but with a modern edge. The rust-orange satin lining added that pop of warmth and individuality, subtly elevating the whole look. The entire ensemble complemented the setting beautifully and felt very personal to the day."

James' advice to grooms planning their wedding day outfit is, "Be bold. Be brave. Make it your own. It's your big day too you want to shine, and your outfit should reflect you. The bride has her dress moment and this is your opportunity to stand out and shine alongside her. There are so many incredible tartans out there so step away from the norm and explore something a bit more distinctive - you might be surprised by how much it resonates with your personality. For me. I wanted to create a look that no one else would have. That was a huge part of the appeal. Pick something that speaks to you, don't be shy to stand out and you'll walk taller for it."

From content creators who will record all the key moments for your social media platforms to personalised cocktails, Champagne towers, magicians, caricaturists and oyster shuckers – there's never a dull moment to be had! We caught up with some suppliers to get the lowdown on what's hot at the moment.

Get creative

Roni Hyslop of All Wrapped Up Events Scotland wedding planners says, "We have been helping our couples get creative and incorporate their favourite drinks into their big days! We have had everything from 'His and Hers' cocktails to 'His and Hers' beer taps where guests can just help themselves to a pint when they want one."

Roni goes on to say that slushie cocktails, baby Guinnesses in prosecco glasses, Champagne towers or just pimping up your prosecco can really liven up your drinks reception. Nicky Mullen of Starca Designs helps couples create wedding newspapers, which can usually be found sitting on the chairs for guests arriving, or on tables with names attached. Content can include the couple's love story and how they met, a list of bridal party members, a timeline of the wedding day, an 'in memory' section for lost loved ones, thank you messages for guests, and fun facts about the couple, along with some puzzles or quizzes. The size can vary between one double-sided sheet to a four-page paper and Nicky can create bespoke newspaper titles for her clients.

Nicky explains, "I think due to the drop in religious ceremonies and the need for an order of service, these have been more popular. It's a fun way to let guests know more about the couple and it also fills in some time between them going off to have their photographs taken."

Animal magic

During the transition between the daytime and evening portions of the wedding, there is an array of entertainment for guests to enjoy. Many interactive catering companies offer experiences such as oyster shucking, serving fine Scottish produce to guests.

Meanwhile, animal-loving couples might opt for a visit from alpacas, with guests being allowed to pet and feed the gentle creatures. They will even come out of their pen for some special photos with the newlyweds!

At Kinclune House in Angus, special wedding packages include an *Outlander*-inspired wedding on top of Kinclune Hill, complete with Highland pony!






A winter castle wedding packed with style, fun and special Scottish touches



After the 'I do's, the newlyweds served their favourite cocktails – Aperol Spritz and Frozen Strawberry Daiquiri – and chilled out with their guests, mingling and listening to Elliot G Sax. Outside caterers provided a delicious wedding breakfast (a sit-down dinner comprised of their fave dishes) and there was a selection of "short but meaningful, funny and emotional" speeches from Kirsten, her sister, Adam, Kirsten's dad and the best man. The bride explains, "I know it's not common for a bride to speak but I wanted to give a big thanks to my amazing mum. I always think mums don't get much credit on the

wedding day! I read it from my phone and, typically, it ran out of battery so I had to speak from the heart. But I kind of loved that"

Sax player Elliot got the party started again and Tartan Entertainment hosted the rest of the evening's festivities. "Euan from Tartan Entertainment was absolutely amazing. He brought the atmosphere, good vibes and unreal songs. Everyone was dancing the full night and I think I burned about 1,000 calories," laughs Kirsten.


Looking back, her wedding highlight is simple: "Everyone you love being in the same place, all having the best time. It was a day I wish I could relive again and again."



they had their second date. It may have
been raining but it was perfect, and he even
managed to propose against a backdrop
of seals, one of marine biologist Roma's
favourite animals.

The couple's bespoke wedding rings by Aberdeen jeweller Megan Falconer further deepened their connection to this special place. "Our bands were textured by one of Megan's hand-made hammers that uses rock from the same coastline," Roma explains.

After a month of basking in the newly-engaged glow, Roma and Rory got down to planning and from the outset they knew it wasn't going to be a "standard wedding package by anyone's book". A fusion of both their cultures was essential, and amazing music was one of their top priorities. Roma first spied Scottish-Indian band Unison Anthems on Instagram and she loved their high-energy mix of bagpipes and Indian dhol drums. "I thought it was an amazing way to fuse two musical cultures together," she says. The couple made a provisional booking



before hitting upon the perfect venue, Culdees Castle Estate. "It was a new developing wedding venue, which gave us the opportunity to do something a little more unique," recalls Roma. They fell in love with the ancient trees, the castle backdrop and the woodland setting. "The on-site chickens, goats and peacocks also gave it extra appeal!"

Culdees owners Tracey and Rob were eager to help them realise their vision, building a mandap structure for the Hindu ceremony and allowing an open flame as part of that ceremony.

Woodland vibe

Roma and Rory opted for a colourful wild, woodlandinspired aesthetic. Florist Kirsty of Fern Floristry understood their brief for a foam-free design of big and bold blooms combined with softness perfectly, balancing strong colours with pastels and lots of different textures, shapes and greenery. "The florals and greenery on the day were just stunning, so abundant and beyond anything that we could have imagined," says Roma.

The couple followed their Hindu ceremony with a humanist one, held in front of the mandap, using the florals to frame this ceremony before it was deconstructed. Kirsty then repurposed all the flowers for the wedding breakfast, including an incredible arrangement around their sweetheart table. "It was as if Rory and I were sitting in our own garden, looking out at all of our guests," smiles Roma. "It was just beautiful."

Kirsty even returned the next morning to create posies for guests from all the flowers, meaning they could be enjoyed for as long as possible!

Roma also worked closely with their stationer Martina from Pleasant Pheasant who adapted her existing Culdees artwork into a bespoke stationery suite.

Dressed to impress

Roma is originally from South London - one of the best areas to shop for Indian outfits - and went home to search for her wedding clothes with her mum. For her ceremony outfit she initially tried slightly less traditional, mixed-colour lehengas before surprising herself and falling for a more traditional red outfit.

Then for the evening, she customised a botanical sequined lehenga by adding butterfly sleeves, green details and a lemon-yellow underskirt for a dreamy woodland feel.

A sense of peace

Despite planning their big day in just a year, Roma and Rory found time to relax with a couple of their closest friends in the castle's hot tubs the night before the wedding. Roma had loved her Mehndi ceremony earlier in the week, undergoing seven hours of henna art, and Rory thankfully staved off bad luck, finding his name hidden in the intricate design before the wedding!

On the morning of the wedding Rory recalls being hit by a momentary wave of emotion, quickly replaced by excitement. Roma was unexpectedly nervous too, until >>>

the doors opened and she saw Rory, who had surprised their guests by wearing a traditional Indian sherwani. Then she felt peaceful walking down the aisle to an instrumental piece from one of her favourite British-Indian rom-coms.

Their Hindu ceremony included meaningful customs such as a knot-tying which was mirrored later in a handfasting as part of the humanism one. And during the humanist proceedings Roma surprised her mother-in-law by wearing a tartan sash she had gifted her.

Rory made a quick outfit change into Highlandwear before they walked into their humanist ceremony together to *I Love the Rain the Most*, enjoying the irony as it poured throughout, stopping briefly as they were pronounced husband and wife. In fact, rain seems to have followed them through every significant step of their relationship, from their second date, to moving into their home in the midst of Storm Babet!

They wrote their own personal vows for this part and their humanist celebrant included drinking from the quaich, made even more personal as Rory's parents had gifted Roma's parents the quaich when they first met.

Time to celebrate

Following their ceremonies, guests were treated to delicious Indian canapés that catered to all dietary requirements – crucial for Rory, who is coeliac. "With my condition I'm often quite anxious when I go out to eat, so I wanted to make sure on one of the most important days of our lives I didn't have to worry," he explains.

Luckily their amazing chef, Praveen Kumar from Tabla restaurant in Perth, had everything covered. They first discovered him at a farm shop and Roma remembers thinking, "This tastes like something I would eat at home." They served




a buffet-style wedding breakfast, followed by samosas and pakoras as a late-night snack and everyone was raving about the food. "We were sending people away with handfuls of samosas because they had eaten so much during the buffet." The couple's cake designer also came up trumps, creating a delicious glutenfree wedding cake which didn't compromise on flavour or quality. "It was amazing!"

The atmosphere was electric, and the guests certainly worked up an appetite, dancing the night away to Unison Anthems' fusion of Western and Punjabi beats before the DJ introduced the non-Scots to a spot of ceilidh dancing. Roma's American cousins told her "This is a dream!"

From their sweetheart table to out-of-order speeches and surprise moments, Roma and Rory's wedding was deeply personal and heartfelt. Rory recalls sitting at dinner, looking out at all their guests laughing and chatting. "Alongside marrying Roma, this is what people talk about when they say these are the parts of the day you'll never forget – all your loved ones together in one place, and having the best time," he says.

And now they're married Roma says that there is a feeling of peace. "It feels right that we're married. We've lived together for several years already so this was the natural next step for us - we couldn't be happier."

This couple's all-white theme made for a stunning country house hotel wedding emi and Ryan met on New Year's Eve 2017 in a local bar. "We didn't know one another but seemed to have mutual friends. This is how we began speaking and it all unfolded from there," says Demi.

Demi's sister Chelsey was maid of honour and Ryan's sister Steff was bridesmaid, with both wearing black satin dresses chosen from different shops. Meanwhile, Ryan wore a Celtic brown tartan kilt with a tan jacket to match his brown shoes. The groomsmen all wore the same – as well as a mini version for their two-and-a-half-year-old son, George! The men's wedding party consisted of Euan – Ryan's best friend and best man – groomsmen Steve, Ryan's brother-in-law and his best friend Liam as well as Demi's Dad, Stuart, and Ryan's dad, David.

Demi and Ryan stayed at Balbirnie the night before with their family members and wedding party, enjoying a meal in the library downstairs along with some drinks. Demi woke up feeling quite nervous, but once she had a little breakfast, she felt much better. She says the morning was "incredibly chilled". "We had music on, prosecco, face masks. 

ebecca and Owen first met at school in St Andrews where they shared a class together, then later worked together at Pret A Manger in the town, where Rebecca is now a manager.

After four years together, Owen

They booked Earls Hall Castle first followed by suppliers like photographer, band, celebrant, hair and make-up. "We both fell in love with the venue. The gardens of the castle sold it for us as the flowers had beautiful blooms and the topiary garden was magnificent." They settled on a rustic theme and decided on sage green and blush pink for the colour scheme. Meanwhile, DIY was a big feature with Rebecca's dad, Brian, making a rustic crisp wall and kind family friends painting and personalising a secondhand children's sweetie cart. "We did all of the table decorations ourselves and made our table plan using a frame we bought online. We filled it with photos from our engagement shoot and the seating plan," Rebecca explains.

Family friend Ruth and her children, Lily and Abbey, gave the couple the perfect gift by making all of their cakes. For favours, they created Golden Snitches out of Ferrero Rocher sweets for *Harry Potter* fan Owen and gave each guest a National Lottery scratchcard. Meanwhile, all of the bouquets and buttonholes were crafted from artificial flowers.

Wow factor

Rebecca visited Madison Rose Bridal in Kirkcaldy with her mum, Catherine, mother-in-law and her two sisters. "I tried on around six or seven dresses and got a better idea of what I wanted, but failed to find The One the first time I visited."

After attending a second appointment, Rebecca finally chose '9908' by Allure Bridals: "I thought I wanted a lace fitted dress that was not off the shoulder, however I fell in love with an A-line style dress with a satin skirt. The dress had detailing in the bodice to give it the wow factor – and it was off the shoulder!"

Rebecca's mum bought her a floor-length veil with little pearls throughout and she wore a simple pair of heels (later swapping them for white fluffy slippers that said 'bride' over them because who doesn't want to wear slippers on their wedding day?). Chelsea, a long-term best friend, Eve, who is Owen's brother's fiancée, and her two nieces Taylor and Lily. "I wanted them all to be comfortable on the day so I let them pick their own bridesmaid dresses that they felt their best in as long as they fitted with the colour scheme of blush pink and sage green."

Owen had his brother Ryan as his best man, with cousin Liam and two good friends, Ryan and Kyle, taking on the groomsmen duties. He and his groomsmen wore kilts in Hunting Stewart tartan, along with a grey jacket and grey waistcoat with traditional black kilt shoes. They hired the kilts from Slaters in Dundee.

The night before, Rebecca, Chelsea and Eve slept at Eve's house. "We had a couple of glasses of wine before getting a good night's sleep. Chelsea also gave me a 'letters to the bride' book and there were plenty of tears reading this. It was such a lovely, thoughtful gift.

"Neither Owen or I felt nervous the morning of the wedding. We were both just excited to see each other I think! I slept like a baby, again the most chilledout bride ever!"

Owen was driven to the venue in his dad's black vintage Ford Mustang. Meanwhile, Rebecca and her dad arrived in the red Volkswagen Beetle of a family friend

Incredible feeling

The bride admits to a "tiny wobble" as she was about to walk down the aisle with her

dad but managed to pull herself together. "I surprised Owen with the song *Married Life* from the film *Up* and there were a few tears from us both when it started playing. It was a magical moment and I couldn't take my eyes off Owen."

The couple chose a personal ceremony as neither are religious. "Our celebrant Steven spoke about our journey, how we met, how Owen proposed and added the perfect amount of humour to the ceremony. We performed the hand fasting tradition by tying the tartan from Owen's kilt and my favourite tartan (Black Watch) together."

"Everything from walking down the aisle to having our first kiss as husband and wife was magical. We were surrounded by our loved ones knowing that they were there for us and we felt so much love. Mingling afterwards and getting to speak to everyone was amazing as they were so happy for us and it was just an incredible feeling."

Afterwards there was a drinks reception for their 53 day guests followed by the wedding breakfast, before an additional 130 guests arrived for the evening festivities in the marquee.





Picture PERFECT

Photography is an important part of your wedding day – and a big investment, too. **Jennifer McLaren** speaks to the experts to find out what you can expect before, during and after the big event ...



hen first setting out
to find your wedding
photographer, it's time
to do a bit of research
– and a whole lot of
looking! David Grant Simpson of David Grant
Simpson Photography suggests taking a
good look through their website and asking
yourself; do the couples look natural and
are their personalities coming across in the
pictures?

"It's important to find someone that you'd be happy to spend the day with as you will have a lot of time with your photographer on the day."

Allan Forrester of Biggar Picture Photography is a firm believer in making sure you get to meet your suppliers before booking – particularly those that you will spend a lot of time with. "Do your research online, socials and speak with your venue or friends for those important recommendations," he advises.

Hayley Fraser of Hayley Fraser
Photography says it can be a tough choice
with so many talented photographers out
there. "Look at everyone's portfolio and
decide what style you like best, then narrow
it down once you have found a style you
like. We focus on candid documentary
photography that captures your personality."

Make it formal

While securing a booking can vary from photographer to photographer, the process generally remains similar. Allan explains, "After meeting and agreeing we are a good fit, I charge a small deposit at the time of booking along with some paperwork to make sure I have all the correct details and, of course, the booking agreement gets signed by all parties to make it all formal. Make sure you read the Ts&Cs as every supplier looks for different things to be in place, from a meal being supplied to how far they will travel."

Hayley says, "Once you have decided to go ahead we send the invoice for the deposit and the contract. Everyone will have a different way of working, but we ask for the final balance to be paid on the first of the month before your wedding date."

David adds, "I like to arrange a Zoom call after receiving an enquiry so that we can chat over their plans, get to know the couple and to give them an opportunity to see if I would be the right fit for their day. If they'd like to book, I send over an online contract to be signed and an invoice for a £250 deposit. The balance is due four weeks prior to the wedding."

At ease

Pre-wedding photoshoots are becoming more popular and Allan incorporates them into all of his packages as standard. "They really help set everything up for the wedding day," he explains. "From getting to know you both a little better so the craic is on point, to finding out how comfortable you are in front of the camera, the prewedding shoot is such a powerful tool."

Hayley explains, "It can be really helpful, especially if you're feeling anxious about the photos. It's also a nice way to get to know your photographer a bit more and can put you at ease. It's also super-fun and you can use your images to create all sorts of fun things for your wedding day like newspapers or save the dates."

While David says he doesn't always do them with to-be-weds, they can be useful: "If the couple are a little anxious about the photoshoot on the wedding day, it's a good opportunity for them to get to know how I work and to get to know me. The good thing about this is that our rapport is already established and it makes things a little smoother on the big day."

Group shots
Once you have your photographer locked in, it's good to think about your must-have group shots. Hayley says, "We send you a form to complete with your group shot list included. We always give a little guidance for this. Don't worry about all the other key moments as photographers have that covered - but a group shot list is usually handy and can make the process more efficient on the day."

"I always ask for a list of group shots and ask the couple to try and keep it to ten different combinations," adds David. "Try to keep it to immediate family and bridal party... the more groups you have, the longer it takes. I also suggest that we could do group shots with friends etc after dinner when everyone is a bit more 'loose' and up for having some fun."

Allan adds that it means you're unlikely to forget anyone. "This would be so easy to do if you were having to think of the different combinations on the spot," he says. "We certainly don't want your auntie not talking to you because you forgot her!"

And when it's time for the couple to leave their guests for their photoshoot, our photographers try to ensure they aren't away for too long.

David says, "I personally want to ensure that the couple have as much time with



their guests as possible. The timings would all depend on the venue and the locations that we wish to visit - but I don't like to take them away for any longer than 30 minutes."

"This is a big variable," Allan says. "I am a firm believer in trying to give you a good amount of time with your guests on the wedding day whilst still making sure we capture the important shots."

Hayley adds, "Every photographer is different but we try not to steal you away too long so that you can still have time to enjoy the day with your guests. It can also depend on location and travel but we usually take 30-40 minutes for the couple's shoot and then go back out at sunset for 10 minutes if the light is good."

Memorable moments

Remember your photographer will be working hard on the day to capture all your memorable moments. While many don't stipulate they require a meal in their contracts, it's important that they stay fed and watered so that their energy levels remain high. Consider asking if they need to have a meal at your venue, or check that there's somewhere close by where they can grab a bite while the wedding breakfast is underway.

After the big day is over, our photographers say they will try to get some preview images over to you within a few days of the wedding. Final galleries can take anything from around three to ten weeks to allow for editing and depending upon the number of photos taken - because there can be thousands!







hen only a castle

weekend, Cluny Castle is the one.

This magnificent 16th-century mansion – a family home that's been lovingly transformed into a seriously special yet relaxed venue – is completely hidden behind sweeping parkland. Driving up the long tree-lined driveway, I waited with bated breath to catch my first glimpse of those majestic turrets. And the big reveal didn't disappoint. I knew instantly Cluny would be a photographer's (and to-beweds'!) paradise.

The castle's rich heritage and impressive architecture create a dramatic backdrop that instantly impresses. We're talking stained glass windows, a private courtyard entrance and perfectly manicured lawns – but the interiors are just as special.



What's on offer?

I couldn't wait to hear more about the historic castle and quickly learned Cluny was built way back in 1604, then remodelled in the 1820s. Now, its owners welcome couples looking for privacy, luxury and grandeur – and loads of freedom to create the wedding of their dreams.

Here, you get exclusive use of the castle and grounds, plus beautiful overnight accommodation for up to 28 (rising to 30 in 2026). Whether you're planning a wee wedding or a party for up to 300, the Cluny team is all about adapting to your vision.

The 120-seater chapel, which sits within the castle itself, took my breath away. And I loved that additional guests at bigger weddings can sit elsewhere in the house (the public rooms are nothing short of incredible!) to watch remotely.

Receptions happen directly under the romantic chapel, in the parquet-floored Tenants' Hall. You'll get 94 in here for dinner and 110 for dancing, and a bar tucked in the corner so the dancefloor is never empty! This felt like a real party room – intimate yet sociable with great acoustics.

For grander guest lists, a marquee behind the pond has space for up to 400 with the castle as a stunning backdrop. An outdoor ceremony is also an option and it's worth noting nothing's really off limits here, whether that's fireworks, four-legged ring bearers or anything else your heart desires.

And there's more...

Exploring the rest of the venue was no mean feat and I was glad to have the lovely Natalie to guide me! Our home for the night was the private West Wing apartment, which has five bedrooms on the first floor and loads of rooms

to relax and party downstairs, from the welcoming open plan living/dining/kitchen to the games room and cosy snug. The self-catering set-up means you can treat the castle like home, which we definitely did, complete with an indulgent afternoon tea courtesy of Hudsons Catering!

The West Wing is usually the groom's base whilst the bride takes over the elegant castle bedrooms. Uist is a *YSW* fave – perfect for prep with its gorgeous natural light. And overlooking the grounds, you'll see guests arriving too.

What also sets Cluny apart is the sheer level of service (no matter your vision, Natalie and her team are obsessed with making sure everything runs seamlessly) and exclusivity – the venue only hosts a select number of weddings each year. Getting married here really feels like a privilege reserved for a limited few. And with a minimum two-night stay, you have the perfect excuse to draw out your celebrations. Think fun gatherings the night before and leisurely brunches the morning after.

"The wings made the dress feel complete." fter meeting while working at



Sax o'clock



During my visit I got to see the Ballroom in all its glory, with the LED dance floor and fairy lights illuminated. This is where the wedding breakfast and evening festivities are held for up to 216 guests, complete with garden views and cocktails



And trust me, the food is outstanding - though, coming from a kitchen that produced two Bake Off: The Professionals alumni, that's hardly surprising.

Let's go outside Indoors Balbirnie offers picture-

perfect photo opportunities at every turn. However, if the sun does shine on your wedding, make the most of the mansion's beautiful gardens. The lawn is surrounded by pretty, well-tended flowerbeds and would be gorgeous for an outdoors ceremony (you can make the decision to wed in or out up until noon). Then you'll love exploring all the outdoor 'rooms' that trail into the woods, having your photos taken on the swing, or adding your love lock to those of all the other couples who have married here - an enduring reminder of your incredible Balbirnie wedding.



or Nenah and James, founders and owners of Ladyburn House, their love story is completely intertwined with their beautiful country house.

"It was more than a venue for us – it was always the place we were meant to say 'I do.' That's why we created it with so much intention," smiles Nenah.

The couple first met via online dating and after calling and texting, their first inperson date was climbing Ben Vrackie near Pitlochry. It featured a soft overlay of floral vines trailing down the fabric, which felt like it mirrored the garden landscape at Ladyburn. I woke early with a mix of excitement, nerves, and emotion that had been building for days – I was completely full of feeling. There were definitely tears, happy ones, as the reality of the day sank in. It was overwhelming in the most beautiful way. We started the morning with a big group breakfast at the house, which was so lovely."

For Nenah, walking down the aisle was like "stepping into a sacred moment – but with a twist of last-minute magic." Nenah was walked down the aisle by Ralphie while their string quartet played *The Secret Wedding* from the film *Braveheart*: "It wasn't just meaningful – it was unforgettable. Seeing James waiting under the tree, surrounded by our people, with Ralphie by my side, felt like the most sacred, love-soaked moment of my life."

Their ceremony was conducted by humanist celebrant Alexis McKenzie and James surprised Nenah by inviting Scottish poet and author Donna Ashworth to read out her poem *I Choose You*.

ou know the time-honoured wedding adage; 'Something old, something new'. Arriving at Lynnhurst in Johnstone on a gloriously sunny Sunday in May the saying couldn't be more fitting. This beautiful venue combines old Victorian charm with chic and contemporary new features, giving couples the best of both worlds.

The building itself is made up of two separate Victorian mansions, connected by a modern extension that houses The Lowland restaurant and a number of bedrooms. We're visiting at the end of a wedding open day, and although wedding venue coordinator Kerry-Ann has spent the day showing to-be-weds around Lynnhurst, her enthusiasm is infectious.

We start our tour outside the top mansion which is dedicated to weddings, and with its separate entrance you'll feel like you and your loved ones are tucked away in your own private setting. A red carpet will be rolled out and you can have a piper, your dog – or even Highland cows (yes, it's been done!) to greet your guests.

Inside there are all the Victorian features you could wish for, from the mosaic floor to the stained glass. Then the cocktail bar takes on a more 20s vibe, with painted panelling, a beautiful chandelier and a mirrored bar. But the pièce de résistance has to be the gilt-framed USB TV. You're encouraged to personalise all aspects of your day here and guests will be treated to a slideshow of photos sharing your love story as they enjoy a tipple. Simply plug in your USB stick.

Just off the cocktail bar you'll find the conservatory, another great space for guests to mingle or have fun in a photo booth perhaps.

The main event

When it comes to saying 'I do' at Lynnhurst, ceremonies are held in the modern ballroom and you'll love how light and airy it feels. 

Then at noon the bride is taken to the Cashmere Suite to get into her dress, and this is where you'll get those amazing first look photos with your parents or bridal party.

While the bedroom is a thing of beauty with its elegant furnishings and gold touches, it's the bathroom that really raises the bar. We're talking sunken whirlpool bath (the staff will draw it before bedtime), walk-in rainfall shower and mirrors and marble everywhere. You can even have a complimentary end of night cocktail in the bath. I recommend the passionfruit martini.

Extra touches

One of my favourite rooms in the whole hotel, however, has to be the Powder Room. This gorgeous space sits just off the ballroom and is perfect if you need to touch up your make-up or to change your shoes or dress. The groom can even get dressed here in the morning. It's your space to use however you need.






