View from the Bridge:

Could we soon see detailed route planning for marine navigation?

Have you wondered how we got so reliant on our electronic navigation systems?

Take automobiles, for example. Our commander, D/Lt/C Charles R. "Bo" Ibach Jr. SN-ACN, still uses a Garmin in his car. I prefer Google Maps. Both of our systems display road routes automatically. Visual and verbal instructions from our electronics guide us to our destinations. These are now our primary navigation devices for our automobiles.

Many of us will use the units for trip planning or just to see how long it will take to get to our destination. Even for short trips where we are familiar with the route, we often use our GPS. Hop in the car, turn the key and tell Google Maps where you want to go. Extensive planning is usually not required even for longer trips.

Piloting an airplane or a watercraft is much more complicated. Compass, chart and navigation tools (plus the knowledge to use them) may be inferior compared to modern navigation equipment.

Pilots in aircraft and skippers on boats both need to know where they are and how to get to where they are going. We would not want to

wander into a restricted area by mistake. (This has happened to our members: Does anybody remember being visited by patrol boats in the restricted areas of Charleston Harbor or at the Military Ocean Terminal Sunny Point along the Cape Fear River? Does anybody remember big guns pointed at his boat?) With an automobile, a fence with a sign that says "keep out" may be enough to keep you out of restricted areas.

I did not know until recently that some modern vessel navigation devices will generate a route just as Garmin or Google Maps provide a land route with instructions. Usually, marine routes need to be

entered manually, with a starting point, an end point and depth restrictions. There are modern navigation programs or apps that will generate a safe route for your vessel following a marked channel or taking you around shoal areas or land areas. With certain speed parameters provided, a time on route or estimated time of arrival is automatically calculated.

On two recent trips to the coast — one during our Rendezvous at Southport/Oak Island and another to Shackleford Banks/Cape Lookout — I had a chance to experiment with my electronic navigation devices. One was a Garmin GPS Chart Plotter/Fishfinder and the other was a tablet using the Aqua Map app.

Many use Garmin GPSs as their primary navigation device. Since Garmin's electronic charts are not updated in a timely manner, Garmin's official stance is that their units should be used as an aid to navigation, not as the primary navigation device. (This helps limit their liability also.) Aqua Map uses information from NOAA that is updated in a much more timely manner.

Both units showed me <u>negative</u> characteristics during their operation on these trips as I will explain. As many of you know, I have been accused of getting my passengers wet. It is not my fault. On the recent trip, wind conditions at Shackleford Banks were 15 to 25 with gusts to 35. I put the curtains up to keep the wind and spray off my passengers. It was an unusual day: blue sky with the ocean calm near shore. The inlet and sounds had a mean chop due to the strong wind.

Water from the wind made chop splashed on my boat and found its way past my canopy and curtains, dripping on my Garmin GPS and the tablet running the Aqua Map app. Both devices have touchscreen controls. Wouldn't you know it? Dripping water on a touchscreen acts just like a finger. Each time I looked at the navigation devices, it looked like kids had been playing with them. Resetting the instruments was necessary to make them provide useful information again. Maybe a lock screen setting or cover would help these instrument function in wet conditions.

I have encouraged those who are hesitant but are interested in boating at the coast to participate in our annual coastal trips. The shallow waters and marker system plus navigation information can be confusing to anybody, but our coastal boating has so much to offer. The benefits include abundant wildlife, coastal history, fishing opportunities and socializing with good friends. Hands-on experience and courses available within the America's Boating Club-Charlotte can help make your adventures on the water safe and enjoyable.
