51 Petanque Club Update

Summer has finally arrived and with the warm and sunny weather our Petanque players have enthusiastically taken to the terrain in June! COUNCILnews

Hello everyone in Great Ellingham. The Parish Council needs your help. The Breckland Astronomical Society will be able to use the observatory on the Rec. again soon, so it's important we all check our outside lights to ensure they are pointing downward and only coming on when needed - keeping lights on all night does nothing for security and just wastes your money - a PIR controlled switch is much more effective, as it turns on the light when someone or something moves within its zone.

Also, as you know, we have a number of major housing developments happening at the moment. Whilst the PC always gets Breckland to include a "Dark Sky Policy" clause in the planning conditions, which limits the type of external lighting they are allowed to install, they may or may not comply, which means we have to go into battle with them. Our weight of argument is much reduced if existing villagers are not complying already.

We will be carrying out a survey of night lighting in the village shortly, so please check your outside lighting and adjust it if needed.

places where the darkness of the night sky is relatively free of interference from artificial light.



Make friends, not enemies.

Your neighbours probably don't even realise their lighting is bothersome.

Stay positive and don't argue. Be tactful and understanding about your neighbour's right to light their property.

Suggest alternatives to their current fixture. Ask them to move the light, shield it, or add a motion sensor so it's activated only when needed. Offer to help get this done.

Be informative. Talking to your neighbour is an great opportunity to be an advocate for good lighting. There are many reasons to use dark sky friendly lighting.

It's useful to know the local costs of electricity and the local lighting control rules.

Don't dismiss their need to feel safe. Remember that home is a place where everyone wants to feel relaxed and safe.

Remember everyone wants the same thing: a chance to relax in his or her own environment.



Once upon a time on a cold winter's evening in February 2004 a PCC meeting was being held at Peggy Maynard's house in Church Street Great Ellingham. A discussion arose regarding the revival of St James Church during the interregnum period – what could be done to celebrate St James Weekend and to let the local people know that the church was most certainly ALIVE?

I had been to the Scarecrow weeks (the one at Old Buckenham) with my grandson Felix - however he had been guite afraid of the Scarecrows - and I thought how much nicer to have Teddies. Susie Gent had mentioned about Teddies in Towers and abseiling and as I sat at the meeting the idea formed in my head – yes, why not - Gt Ellingham, 'let's have Teddies instead of scarecrows-yes, let's have a Teddy Trail and a Teddy Bear Week!' I put it to the meeting - everyone looked at me with blanked amusement and silence. After a few seconds-which felt like an eternity, Mike May said 'What a lovely idea - 'A teddy is a sign of comfort and friendship'. Thereafter all the PCC members agreed and the next day I started making plans!

Thus the FIRST Teddy Bear celebrations happened in July 2004 but the idea was born in February 2004.

Before The Teddy celebrations started I did much research into how the Scarecrow Weeks worked. Did you know these weeks happen all over the country at the same time each year? I 'phoned all different parts of the country getting ideas. Liz Neil was my confidente and

we set about forming a plan of our own.

I went to see Paul and Joan Sheffield and they agreed to organise an Art Exhibition in the Church. We would have a preview evening and the Exhibition would last until the Sunday.

Jenny and John Roberts agreed to organise a car rally and Jenny said that she would be making a Teddy Bear who would be called Florrie.

With this in mind (and only having the promise of 1 Teddy) I contacted the press and we then put out a plea to the villagers of Great Ellingham!

I made many, many phone calls and pleas (I think people ducked when they saw me in the supermarket) because we were obviously concerned that we needed quite a few Teddies for the plan to work. After this – the villagers rose to the occasion! 105

I am so pleased that the Festival brings so much pleasure to young and old.
