In these photos, the nursery children are fully engaged in sensory play, exploring sand, water, and mud through hands-on activities. They are tipping, filling, and pouring using a variety of containers, developing their fine motor skills and early scientific understanding. The children are investigating different textures and observing cause-and-effect such as how water moves rubber ducks through a tube. This play encourages curiosity, problem-solving, and collaboration. As they work together, the children share their ideas and have meaningful conversations about what they are creating, demonstrating early language and social development.

At nursery, we love to finish the week with a special Friday Treat, and our first week's activity had the children making their own Top Hat Buns! This engaging task combined fun and learning as children poured melted chocolate, added marshmallows, and topped their creations with Smarties - an ideal way to strengthen fine motor skills. 

Year 4 have been busy learning about 2D shapes and have been expoloring various ways in which we use 2D shapes on a daily basis.






Miss Whiteway held the first Roots of **Empathy lesson** with Year 5M. The children are very excited about the programme.





#### **Children and Smartphones**

The five schools in the Moira and Magheralin area have grouped together to start a discussion on children's use of smartphones. We believe this is a very important topic, particularly given recent items in the news on the potential dangers children can face online despite the best efforts of parents to keep them safe.

We are keen to understand parents' views on the use of smartphones and will be circulating a short parent survey across the five schools in the coming weeks. This is to help determine what information and support we can provide, with a view to potentially holding an information session for parents.

In the meantime we wanted to share an initiative and some media on the topic that has been highlighted to the schools by some parents. Please note that some of the media linked below does contain some difficult and sensitive themes.



Smartphone Free Childhood is a grassroots movement of parents who believe childhood is too short to be spent on a smartphone. The aim is to bring parents together, empower parents to wait to give their children a smartphone and demonstrate that parents are demanding change. https://smartphonefreechildhood.co.uk/



Assignment - Ireland's first smartphone free town. Swiped - the School that Banned Smartphones - Two-part documentary series that see Emma and Matt Willis explore the use of smartphones by children and the dangers they can face. #### Moira and Magheralin Schools' Smartphone Survey

In early 2025, 449 parents across the 5 schools in the Moira and Magheralin area responded to a survey on smartphones.

- 9 in 10 parents said they would delay the introduction of smartphones if other parents in the area were doing the same.
- Nearly 8 in 10 parents said they felt pressured into giving their child a smartphone at a younger age than they were comfortable with.

In memory of his life, the family and friends of Carl Henderson are planning a sponsored walk up Errigal on Sunday 26th of October, starting at 11.30 at Errigal Car Park to raise funds to place a defibrillator around the mid point of the mountain.


