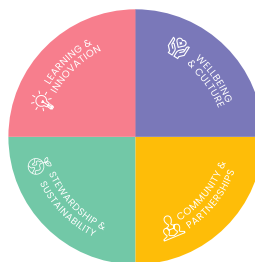

To be a vibrant learning community where Christ is honoured, everyone is valued, character is nurtured and positive relationships thrive.



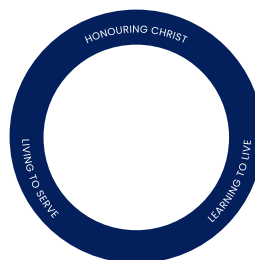
