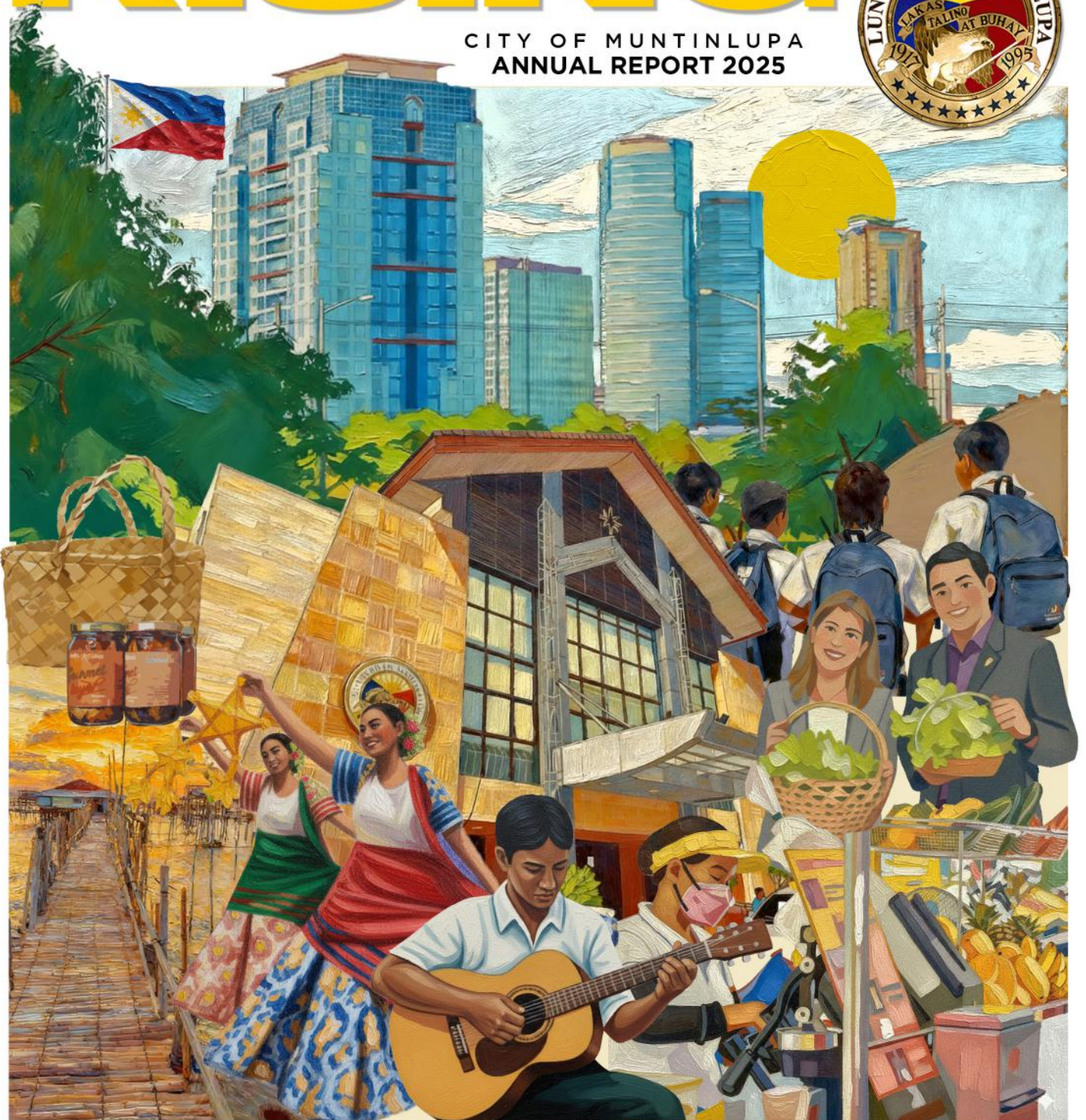
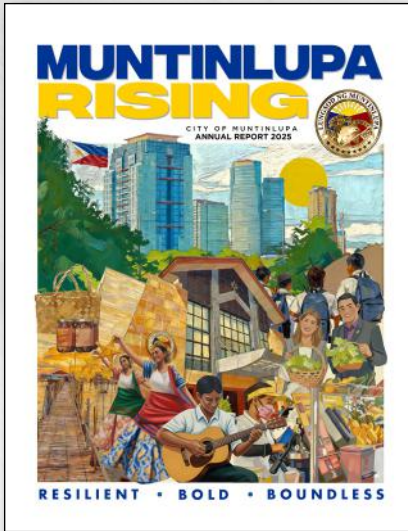



from the CITY ADMINISTRATOR

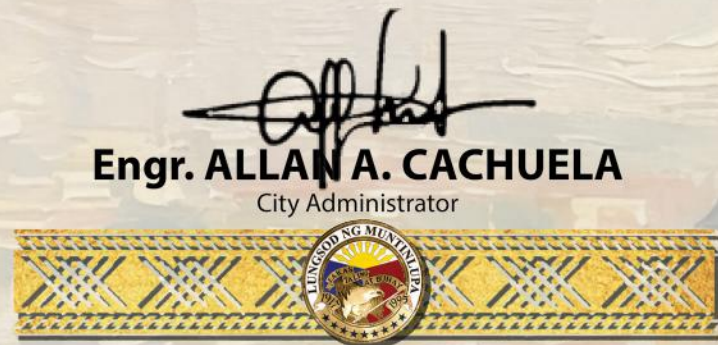

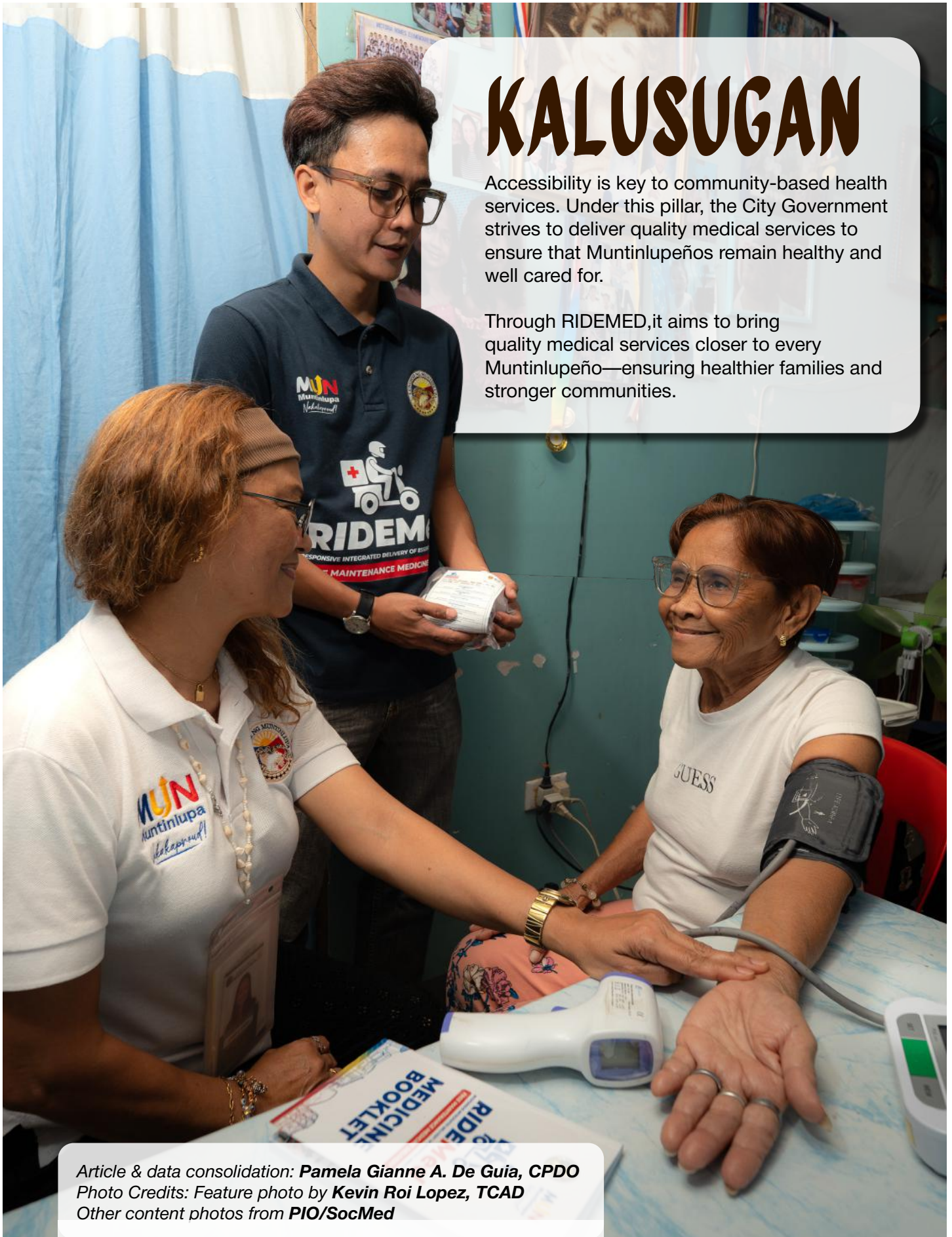

RIDEMED AT YOUR SERVICE



The City Government of Muntinlupa officially launched the **RIDEMed** program, which stands for **Responsive Integrated Delivery of Essential Medicines**. This initiative provides free monthly delivery of maintenance medicines directly to the homes of eligible senior citizens who are aged 80 and above and bedridden residents aged 60 and older, and ensured they receive consistent healthcare without the burden of travel.

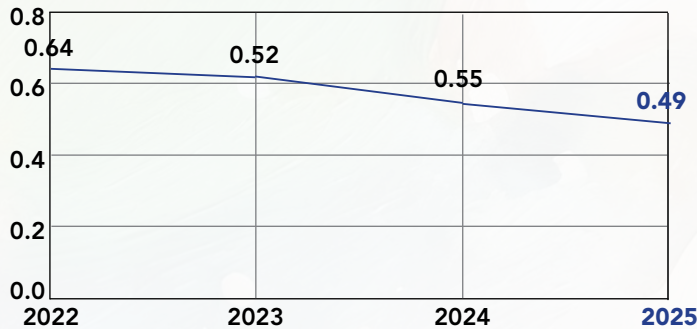

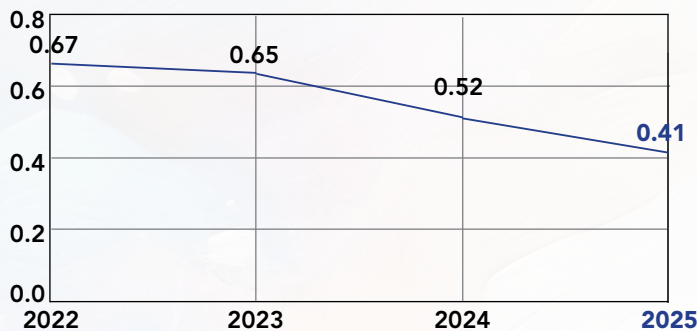

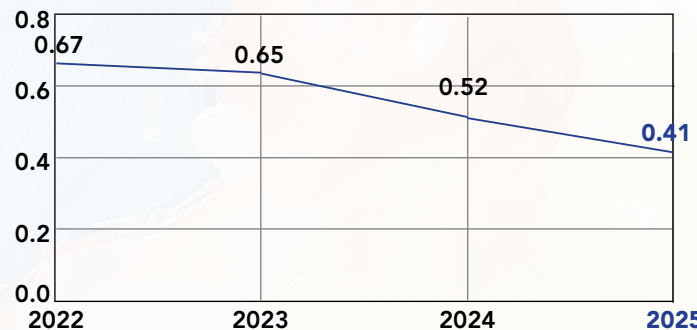
- **Underweight and Severely Underweight (UW - SUW)**



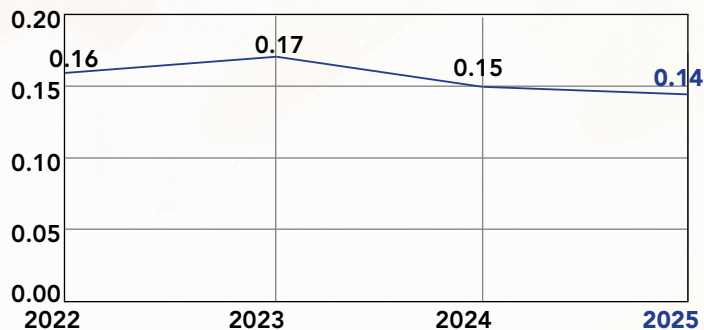
- **Stunted and Severely Stunted (ST-SST)**

The highlight of the event was Mrs. Trina Biazon, who led a hands-on demonstration and personally distributed dual-ready kits—packed with essential items for both mother and baby—ensuring they were fully prepared for the journey of childbirth.

Through creativity and advocacy, participants used digital platforms to express messages of awareness, resilience, and youth leadership.

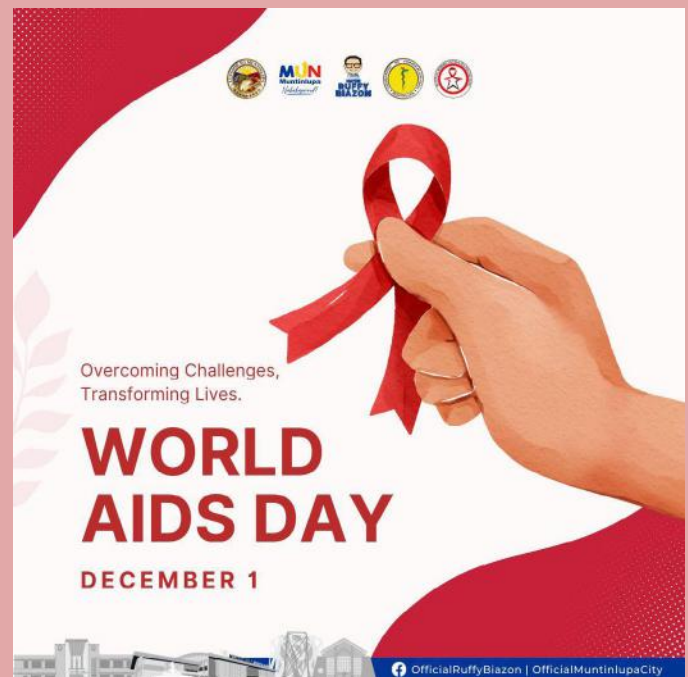

MACAO INTERNATIONAL ENVIRONMENTAL CO-OPERATION FORUM & EXHIBIT (MIECF)

The City Government of Muntinlupa participated in the 2025 Macao International Environmental Co-operation Forum & Exhibit (MIECF), held from March 27 to 29, 2025, in Macao, China. Muntinlupa City was represented by Engr. Carl Bequillo from the City Planning and Development Office and Mr. Elijah Santos from the Environmental Protection and Natural Resources Office.



With the theme “Innovation and Green Development Solutions to Build Beautiful Cities,” the 2025 MIECF featured international forums, project promotion meetings, and green-themed activities. These engagements focused on key areas such as urban transformation, green transportation, green buildings, waste management, energy efficiency, and renewable energy.

AIR QUALITY MANAGEMENT

Rapid urbanization drives economic growth but often takes a toll on the environment. Increased economic activity

contributes to declining air quality, largely due to industrial pollutions and vehicle emissions. In response, the City Government of Muntinlupa ensures good air quality by expanding green spaces and strictly enforcing anti-smoke belching regulations.

The Anti-Smoke Belching Unit (ASBU) of the City Government of Muntinlupa consistently enforces regulations against smoke-belching vehicles to protect public health and preserve air quality in the City. In support of these efforts, the ASBU provides free emission testing for public utility vehicles to promote environmental awareness and encourage vehicle owners and operators to properly maintain their units in compliance with established emission standards.

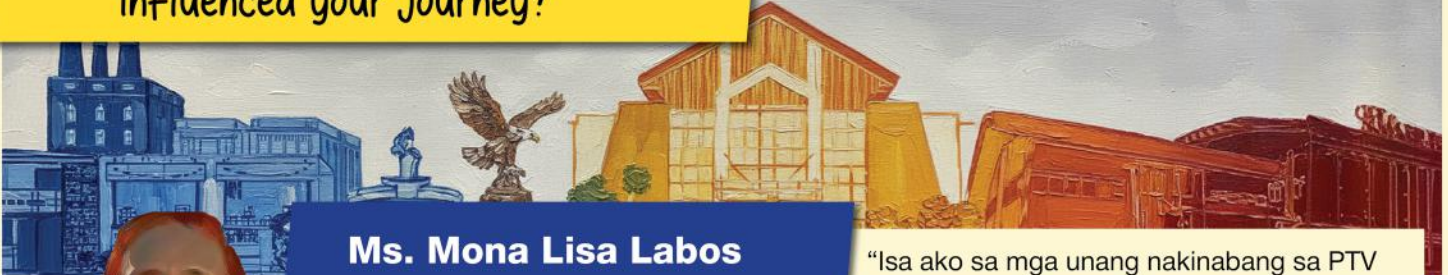

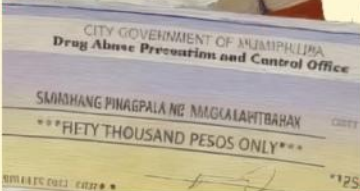

These initiatives are complemented by sustained efforts to enhance the city's disaster resilience and preparedness.

Under the **Kaayusan at Kapayapaan** agenda, key priority areas include improved traffic management; intensified crime prevention and control; comprehensive drug abuse prevention programs; enhanced fire safety measures; efficient jail management; strategic manpower deployment to deter criminal activities; and a robust disaster risk reduction and management system.

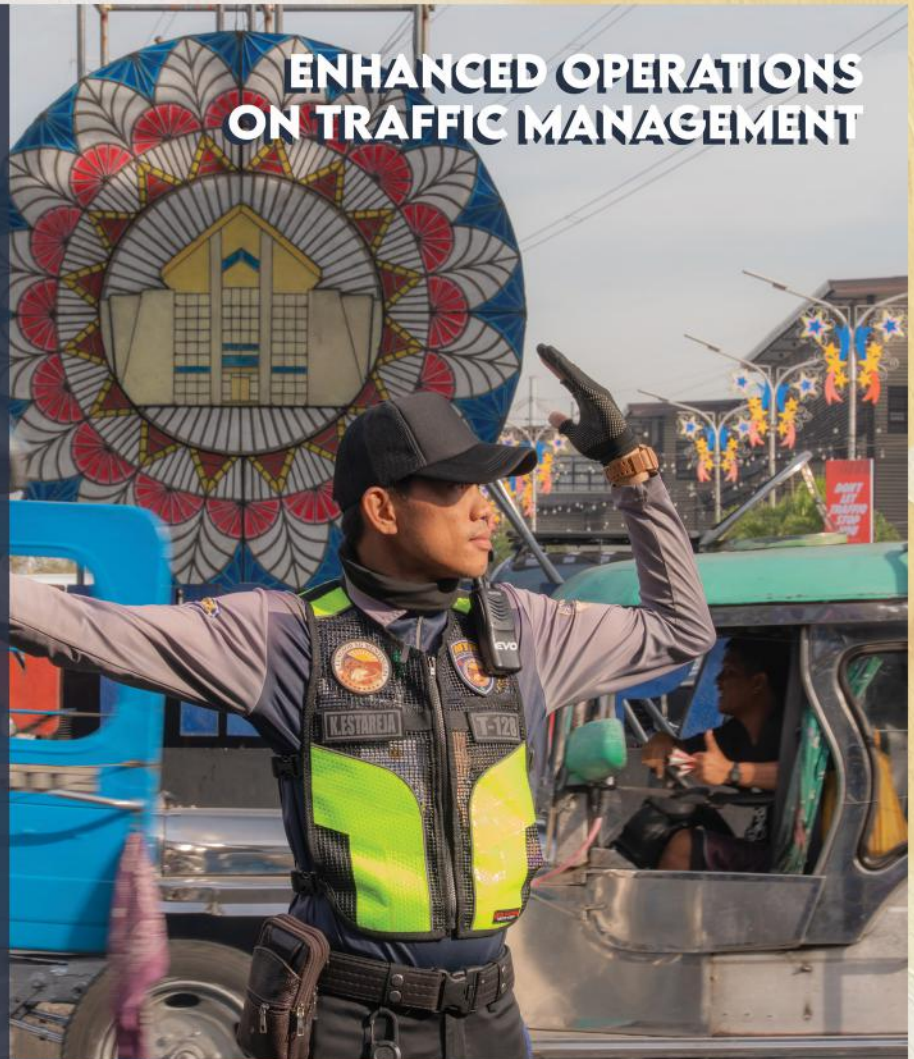

Subsequently, a caravan rollout activity took place in Brgy. Buli, the project's pilot barangay, running for thirteen days. During this period, **1,990 MUNTIZEN IDs** were issued, achieving a **75.95% accomplishment rate**. In the coming months, the caravan will visit all remaining barangays in the city and expected to serve even more residents through the operational MUNTIZEN Hub, set to open at Ayala Malls Southpark by the second quarter of 2026

STRENGTHENING PARTICIPATORY GOVERNANCE: EMPOWERING COMMUNITIES THROUGH CIVIL SOCIETY ENGAGEMENT

Participation is a cornerstone of good governance. In line with this, the City Government continues to embody the principles of transparency, accountability, and inclusivity, recognizing the vital role of Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) in driving local development. By reinforcing partnerships among CSOs and other stakeholders, it aimed to empower communities and enhance their involvement in the decision-making processes as their input helps ensure that programs and projects meet the community's needs.

Series of CSO accreditation activities were conducted in order to ensure multisectoral representation in local special bodies of the local government. 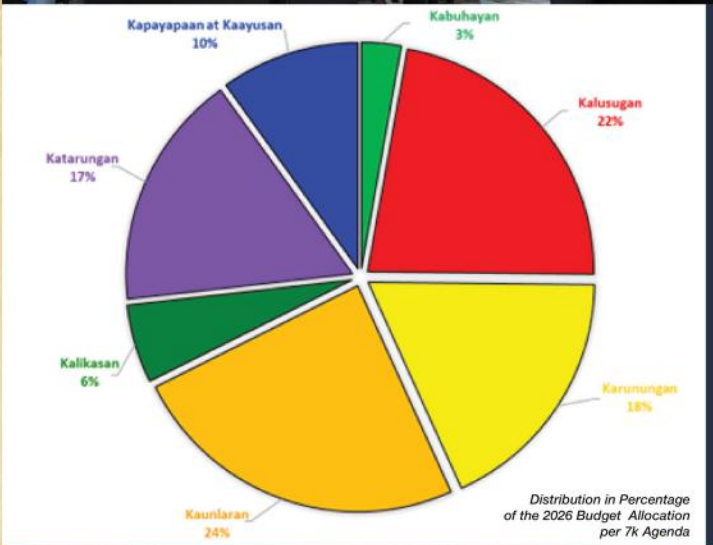
