For more than 113 years, youth have discovered, explored, and strengthened their outdoor skills and commitment to environmental stewardship through the Girl Scout Leadership Experience and Girl Scout camp programs.

Guided by supportive adults and peers, youth discover the wonders of nature, experience the thrill of adventure, and challenge themselves and one another to reach new heights!

Girl Scouts' national outdoor programming features a variety of fun, challenging, and experiential activities that empower campers as they develop attitudes, skills, and behaviors essential to effective leadership in the outdoors.

#### **Outdoor Competence**

Girl Scouts engage safely and responsibly in a range of outdoor activities (e.g., practicing Leave No Trace and how to be prepared in the outdoors).

#### **Outdoor Confidence**

Girl Scouts have confidence in their outdoor abilities and are willing to try new and challenging outdoor activities.

#### **Outdoor Interest**

Girl Scouts have a love of nature and an interest in the natural world.

#### **Environmental Stewardship**

Girl Scouts understand how their behaviors impact the environment and what they can do to protect the natural world.

## Camp Philosophy and Camp Life

Overnight camp provides a rich experience away from home where youth unlock their potential, discover the world, and enjoy the outdoor adventures that await them. This unique environment helps your camper develop positive self-esteem, leadership skills, and social skills - all while having the time of their life.

The overnight camp experience plays a crucial role in shaping youth into accomplished and resourceful young adults. In this outdoor setting, youth develop a strong sense of self, gain practical life skills, become resourceful problem solvers, and cultivate healthy relationships by living and working together.

#### **Who We Serve**

Girl Scouts of Utah fosters belonging and respect for all our members. The Girl Scout Movement was founded to help all girls reach their full potential and to create a safe place for girls to nurture their individual growth, character, self-sufficiency, and leadership.

Girl Scouts of Utah values these founding principles and serves all youth who identify with the girl experience. Our Girl Scout Promise drives us to provide an environment where all Girl Scouts, volunteers, and staff are confident they belong.



## **Paying for Camp**

We offer several ways to help pay for camp, including Activity Credits, tiered pricing, and activity scholarships.

Our Activity Scholarship program provides need-based support for families throughout the year so all Girl Scouts can experience the magic of camp, minicamps, and council programs. See page 6 for more information. Payments are due in full by May 20, 2026.

Registration fees help cover all the expenses associated with our camps such as property maintenance, utilities, insurance, equipment, program supplies, food, activities, and staff.



### **Early Bird Pricing**

Register for a summer overnight camp program on or before **January 31, 2026**, and save! Don't miss this opportunity to secure your spot at a reduced rate.

Early Bird pricing is eligible for all three tiers.

Early Bird pricing is available only for overnight camp sessions at Camp Cloud Rim or Trefoil Ranch in summer 2026. Troop Camping, Camporee, and minicamp programs are not eligible.



### **Activity Scholarships**

Every girl belongs at camp—and financial barriers should never stand in the way of discovering courage, confidence, and connection in the outdoors.

Apply for an activity scholarship after completing initial registration and paying the \$50 non-refundable deposit.

The primary round of scholarship requests for summer camp are accepted until April 1; applications received after this date will be awarded based on available funding. Scholarships awarded will be applied to camp balances no later than May 1.

## **Tiered Pricing**

Tiered pricing makes it possible for all campers to have the same experience, regardless of what their caregiver can afford. Tiered prices are listed with each camp session description and should be selected based on the family's budget. No financial documentation is required.

We strive to ensure household finances are not a barrier when paying for a camp experience. Activity scholarships are available for Girl Scouts of Utah members if assistance is needed to pay for Tier Three (T3).

#### Tier One (T1)

The actual cost to run camps–staffing, program supplies, food, and maintenance costs. *Available for Girl Scouts of Utah members, Girl Scout members from other councils, and non-members.* 

#### Tier Two (T2)

Partially subsidized cost for families that can pay a little more, but not the actual cost of camp. Available for: Girl Scouts of Utah members and Girl Scout members from other councils

#### Tier Three (T3)

The minimum fee all GSU members are asked to pay. Girl Scouts of Utah subsidizes the entire remainder of the cost. Available for Girl Scouts of Utah members only

## **Activity Credits**



Girl Scout programming is powered by the Girl Scout Cookie Program through Activity Credits. Cookie sellers receive Activity Credits to help pay for summer camps, day camps, program activities, Girl Scout membership fees, and items in the Girl Scout Shop.

Each summer camp session indicates the number of packages of cookies needed to sell to attend that program using Activity Credits. Girl Scouts can work with a supportive adult to use these quantities to help set their cookie-selling goals.

Pick your favorite camp session(s) and reserve your spot with a \$50 non-refundable deposit, then use Activity Credits to pay the remaining balance. During checkout, you'll have the option to let council hang on to your 2026 Activity Credits—no need to submit anything later once you've earned them during the Cookie Program!



#### **Redeem Activity Credits for Camp**

To apply Activity Credits to a camp balance, simply bring in or mail the physical credits to any Girl Scout office with a payment form (see page 43 or scan the QR code below). You will receive email confirmation once the payment has been applied.

Because these credits are treated like cash, GSU must receive the original certificates to process your payment.

## American Camp Association



#### **Accreditation**

Girl Scouts of Utah's Camp Cloud Rim and Trefoil Ranch are accredited by the American Camp Association (ACA). Our camps are also regulated through the state of Utah and local multiplicities and adhere to Safety Activity Checkpoints, Girl Scouts of the USA's national safety standards.

What does all of this mean? It means that we comply with over 300 industry standards in health, safety, and program quality in order to maintain our accreditation. Our camps are inspected by the state of Utah and are reviewed by ACA every year.

#### **Food**

Food is an important part of the camp experience. Each camp has a Kitchen Manager trained to prepare well-balanced meals that kids will enjoy.

All kitchen staff are required to complete
Food Handler Permit training and pass
certification, ensuring they follow established
safety standards for preparing, serving, and storing
food. Kitchen facilities are licensed and inspected by local county
health departments in accordance with applicable health regulations.

If your camper has any food allergies or dietary restrictions, be sure to list them in detail on the health form after registration. This allows us to plan ahead, ensuring that everyone has food that accommodates their needs while they are at camp.

## Safety



At Girl Scouts of Utah, the safety of our campers is our top priority. Safety, fun, and achievement are an essential part of camp. We encourage campers to test their limits through high adventure activities under the guidance of trained staff.

Our summer camp staff undergo thorough training needed to facilitate activities like high ropes, horseback riding, and boating. All of our GSU summer camp staff are trained in first aid and CPR so they're ready to handle minor injuries that occur.

Our overnight camps also have dedicated Health Supervisors with advanced first aid and CPR training, who operate under standing orders from an on-call physician. The Camp Director or Health Supervisor will contact you in the unlikely event that your camper gets sick or injured.



Girl Scout outdoor experiences are based on a system of progression. We encourage campers to start at their comfort level, learn new skills at their own pace, and keep building their confidence in the outdoors.

Girl Scouts of Utah has several programs designed specifically to meet your camper where they are and then build their independence and leadership skills throughout the years to come!



Not all experiences need to happen in Girl Scouts! You may have camped or traveled elsewhere with family or friends and may be able to start at a different step. Progression is a suggestion; you know your camper best!

Trefoil Ranch sits on 123 acres of ranch country tucked away in Provo Canyon. The camp features a lodge, ranch house, bunkhouse, showers, electricity, hot water, and flush toilets. Trefoil Ranch is home to our herd of 18 horses, offering unique opportunities to experience equestrian programs.

Campers stay in cabins or platform tents. Program activities include horseback riding instruction, high and low ropes courses, archery, woodworking, hatchet throwing, and hiking.

### **Horseback Riding Programs**

Our equestrian programs give campers the chance to learn new skills, challenge themselves, and grow as riders, whether they're stepping into the arena for the first or tenth time.

Campers are grouped by experience level, and each lesson is tailored so everyone feels supported and successful. Instruction includes riding skills, stable maintenance, and "ground school," where you'll learn horse behavior, tacking, and daily care.

Horseback riding is a physical sport requiring balance, coordination, and the ability to follow safety directions. Campers in horse programs hike to the stables for each session, about three-



quarters of a mile uphill from main camp. To keep both riders and horses safe, participants must follow staff instructions at all times, and riders may not exceed 250 lbs.

#### Little Bits Mini



Entering Grades 2-3

Sample life in the saddle during this mini session of overnight camp! Practice some basic horseback riding, learn about riding equipment, and participate in basic horse care at the stables. Beyond the horses, create an art project, make s'mores, and sing silly songs while on a hike-perfect for a first-time camp adventure!



#### Leader-in-Training (LIT)



Entering Grades 9-10

The Leader-in-Training program (LIT) is a building block for Girl Scouts of Utah's Leadership Programs.

LIT is a prerequisite to the Counselor-in-Training, Wrangler-in-Training, and Junior Counselor/Wrangler programs. This 10-day camp includes traditional camp programming opportunities, youth development, and a camp service project.

You'll attend workshops covering the Camp Program Quality Assessment tool, youth developmental stages, belonging, rainy day backup plans, and games without equipment. The second week of camp will focus on helping equestrian staff lead the younger campers through their horse programming at the stables, with support from the equestrian staff.

## Overnight Registration Information

Registration for summer overnight camp opens on January 15, at 12:00 p.m. Programs remain open until two Mondays prior to the start of the program or until filled, whichever comes first.

### **UltraCamp**

All overnight camp registrations, forms, and healthcare are housed in UltraCamp – Girl Scouts of Utah's Outdoor Program registration system. This is a separate system from your myGS account.

Families are encouraged to set up their UltraCamp accounts <u>before</u> registering for camp.

- Visit gsutah.org/camp, click "UltraCamp Account" to be connected to UltraCamp.
- Note: Don't use your myGS account OR www.ultracamp.com as it is for administrative login only.

### **Camp Forms**

Camp forms, including requesting a buddy, special diets, health information, and so forth, will appear on your family's main UltraCamp Account page after registration. All camp forms are due May 20, 2026. If you register after this date, you will be prompted to fill out forms after you register for the session.

## **Camp Buddy**

Your camper may request one buddy online; however, the system does not automatically place them together – that is up to you. If your camper wants to go to camp with a buddy, make sure to register for the same session, including age range. You will list your camper's buddy's name when you complete their camp forms post-registration.

## **Accessibility & Accommodations**

It is our goal to provide a positive experience for all individuals who attend our camp programs. Help ensure your camper's success by contacting us prior to registration regarding your camper and their experience – including disabilities as well as mental and physical health needs. This allows us the opportunity to discuss and determine appropriate accommodations so they can be successful while at camp. The Outdoor Program Team can also help guide you toward the best programs and locations for your camper; email info@gsutah.org.

#### **Cancellations & Refunds**

The \$50 deposit is non-refundable.

The remainder of the camp fee (\$50 deposit excluded) will be refunded if:

- GSU receives an email (info@gsutah.org) notification at least three weeks prior to the start date of the camp program.
- Camper leaves the camp program due to illness or injury and GSU receives an email (info@gsutah.org) request for a refund within two weeks after camper returns home. Refunds will be pro-rated on a per-diem basis.
- GSU cancels the camp program and alternative programs were offered, but you choose to not select an alternative program.

Cancellations within three weeks of the start date of the camp program:

- If a camper is unable to attend camp due to illness, injury, family emergency, etc. GSU will work with families to see if the registration can be transferred to another camp program in the current summer.
- If an alternative program cannot be found for the same summer (June 1 – August 15), families will receive credit for the amount paid for the program (\$50 deposit excluded) for the following summer (terms and restrictions apply).

No refunds will be provided if a camper returns home due to homesickness, misconduct, parent/guardian request, and/or any other circumstance.

## Important Information

Girl Scouts of Utah plans quality programs with the health, safety, and well-being of campers as our priority. Sessions may be altered or canceled due to weather, fire, natural disaster, staffing challenges, or low registration numbers.

If a session is canceled due to low registration numbers, campers will be given the opportunity to select another program. No refunds will be issued if changes are made to activities due to weather, fire, or natural disaster.

The Camp Director may determine whether a camper is competent to participate in any activity, and, if necessary, transfer the camper to another program. When necessary, campers will participate in alternate activities.

Campers are expected to follow the Girl Scout Promise and Law. If a camper is unable to follow camp guidelines, damages property, or becomes a danger to themselves or others, the Camp Director will work with the camper and may elect to send them home.

- **Option 2** Pay \$50 non-refundable, non-transferable deposit by credit card or electronic check for each program, due at the time of registration. *Balances are due on or before May 20, 2026*.

#### **Paying Your Balance**

- Pay balances (partial or in-full) by credit card or electronic check through your family's UltraCamp account.
- Pay balances (partial or in-full) with Activity Credits by submitting them along with a payment form (see page 43) through mail or in-person to a Girl Scouts of Utah office location.

## Registrations on or after May 20, 2026

- Pay in full by credit card or electronic check at the time of registration.
- Activity Credits can be applied retroactively if received within 10 days of the registration. Mail a copy of the payment form (see page 43) along with the physical Activity Credits to:
