GCSE and Fast Track GCSE

GCSEs are internationally recognised qualifications that assess students' understanding in a range of subjects including English, Maths and Science.

During GCSEs, students will study the core subjects of Maths, English and Science. Students will typically also study a further five subjects of their choice allowing them to pursue their passions and interests. Academic and career guidance is available to help students to select subjects appropriate for their degree and career aspirations.

During these crucial years of study, we help students to develop their independence, initiative and social skills.

A Level

A Levels are internationally respected qualifications taken in a small number of subjects that provide the opportunity for in-depth study. They offer flexibility, allowing students to specialize in subjects that align with their academic interests and future aspirations.


Students typically take three subjects at A Level, but some do take four. International students take English as an additional subject with the opportunity to take the IELTS test.

With small class sizes, students receive individual care and attention, allowing them to excel in their chosen subjects.

Alongside A Levels, the Extended Project Qualification is a popular choice for students who want to undertake a university-type approach to independent research on a topic of their choosing.

EPQ (Extended Project Qualification)

The EPQ is a high regarded independent research project that allows students to explore a topic of their choice in depth. It develops valuable skills such as critical thinking, research and source analysis and project management.

Year 12 students commence EPQ in January and usually conclude the programme in December of Year 13.

Many universities offer places at a lower-than-typical grade profile for a student who has been awarded a high grade in their EPQ.

It is perfect for students to showcase their initiative and research skills and is very popular with our students who are motivated self-learners.

University Foundation Programme

Designed specifically for high achieving international students, the University Foundation Programme (UFP) acts as a bridge from students' high school education in their own country to university in the UK.

A great choice for students with an exceptionally strong academic foundation, at Bosworth we offer UFP starting each September.

Overview

The UFP recognises the specific academic challenges that international students face and uses assessment strategies that offer the best opportunities to demonstrate a student's academic level and potential. Students choose three academic subjects with exams at the end of the qualification. In addition, all students attend academic English classes designed to develop their English skills for university.

Final UFP grades are determined by exams as well as a significant amount of coursework which simulates the structure of most UK university courses.

Choosing the right subject combination is important as universities look for students that have good grades. We work intensively with each student to choose the best combination to help achieve their university and career aspirations.

Preparation Programmes

Pre GCSE

This programme develops the academic and English skills needed to progress to GCSE or Pre- A Level.

Students will study a range of subjects encouraging them to explore their academic potential and discover their interests. They will be prepared for the Key English Test (KET) or B2 First (FCE) test.

Pre A Level

The course is designed for international students whose level of English is not ready for them to progress immediately on to A Levels.

Students will study the Key English Test (KET) or B2 First (FCE) and IGCSE Mathematics. Students will be able to choose three additional subjects from the following options: Biology or Economics, Chemistry or Business and Physics or Geography.

High School Term

This programme is designed for international students who wish to join Bosworth for one or two terms rather than the whole year.

Students will integrate into one of our full-time programmes and the choice of programme will depend on the student's age, level of English and academic history.


Boarding
