

## **Enhancing Diagnostic Accuracy Through Evidence-Based Practices in Laboratory Medicine**

When it comes to healthcare, a correct diagnosis is frequently the first step toward healing. What many of us don't realize is that the accuracy of laboratory test results is crucial in making accurate diagnoses.

Healthcare, like the aviation sector, which is known for its strict safety regulations, can considerably minimize diagnostic errors by using evidence-based methods in laboratory medicine. Evidence-Based Laboratory Medicine (EBLM) ensures that thorough research and established procedures drive every stage of the testing process, from sample collection to result interpretation.

The preanalytical phase is an often-overlooked aspect of laboratory testing. This is where simple but important steps such as collecting, labeling, storing, and transporting samples take place. These may appear to be simple tasks, yet even minor errors can have serious effects. Regardless of the advanced testing equipment, incorrect blood sample collection or mislabeling will lead to incorrect results. This situation exemplifies the principle of

#### "input quality, output quality."

No matter how advanced the technology, incorrect input will result in a wrong product. This is why accuracy from the start is essential, serving as the foundation for everything that follows.

EBLM is all about taking an organized approach and ensuring that every phase of the testing process, preanalytical, analytical, and post-analytical, is carried out with precision.

It's similar to how aviation follows strict standards to assure passenger safety at all stages of the journey. By addressing potential errors at each level, healthcare practitioners can significantly enhance laboratory results accuracy. When this data become more reliable, patient outcomes also improve.

This level of precision requires coordination. To guarantee that the diagnostic process goes smoothly and reliably, lab technologists, clinicians, and support personnel must work seamlessly together, breaking down traditional healthcare silos.

By encouraging open communication and coordination across all departments, we can break down information barriers, resulting in more accurate diagnoses and better patient outcomes.

Clinical Decision Support Systems (CDSS) can significantly increase the use of technology in healthcare by providing real-time access to guidelines based on current research, reducing human error, and allowing healthcare practitioners to make accurate decisions in less time. Merging evidence-based practices in laboratory medicine with technology is crucial for improving patient outcomes, ensuring faster, safer, and more trustworthy diagnoses in the future.



## THE ADVENT OF DIGITAL EYE STRAIN: A GROWING CONCERN IN THE DIGITAL AGE

In the modern era, technology has become an indispensable part of our daily lives. We spend a significant amount of time staring at screens, from computers and smartphones to televisions and tablets. However, this increased exposure to digital screens has led to a growing concern: digital eye strain.

Digital eye strain, also known as computer vision syndrome, is a temporary condition caused by prolonged focus on digital screens. The constant stream of digital information can lead to eye fatigue, dryness, and irritation. The symptoms of digital eye strain are numerous and can include headaches, migraine, eye fatigue, blurred vision, eye twitching, neck & shoulder pain and sensitivity to light. If left untreated, digital eye strain can lead to chronic conditions such as dry eye syndrome and increased risk of myopia (nearsightedness).

### "One of the primary causes of digital eye strain is the blue light emitted by digital devices."

Blue light, which is a high-energy visible (HEV) light with a wavelength of around 400-450 nanometers, can cause eye strain and disrupt sleep patterns. Furthermore, prolonged screen time, poor posture, incorrect viewing distances, uncorrected vision problems and inadequate lighting can also contribute to digital eye strain. To mitigate the effects of digital eye strain, several practical solutions can be employed.

Firstly, following the 20–20–20 rule can help reduce eye strain. This involves looking away from the screen every 20 minutes and focusing on something 20 feet away for 20 seconds. Additionally, adjusting display settings, positioning devices correctly, and taking regular breaks can also help alleviate digital eye strain. Moreover, using blue light filtering glasses or software, maintaining good posture, and staying hydrated can also contribute to reducing the risk of digital eye strain.

#### **Prevention Strategies & Treatments:**

- Follow the 20-20-20 rule: Every 20 minutes, look away from the screen and focus on something 20 feet away for 20 seconds.
- Blue light filtering glasses
- Adjust display settings: Brightness, contrast, and color temperature.
- **Position devices correctly:** Directly in front, at comfortable distance, and at a 90-degree angle.
- Blink regularly: To prevent dry eyes.
- Take breaks: Every 60-90 minutes.
- Exercise: Regular eye exercises
- Lubricant eye drops
- Prescription glasses
- Vision therapy
- Dry eye treatment
