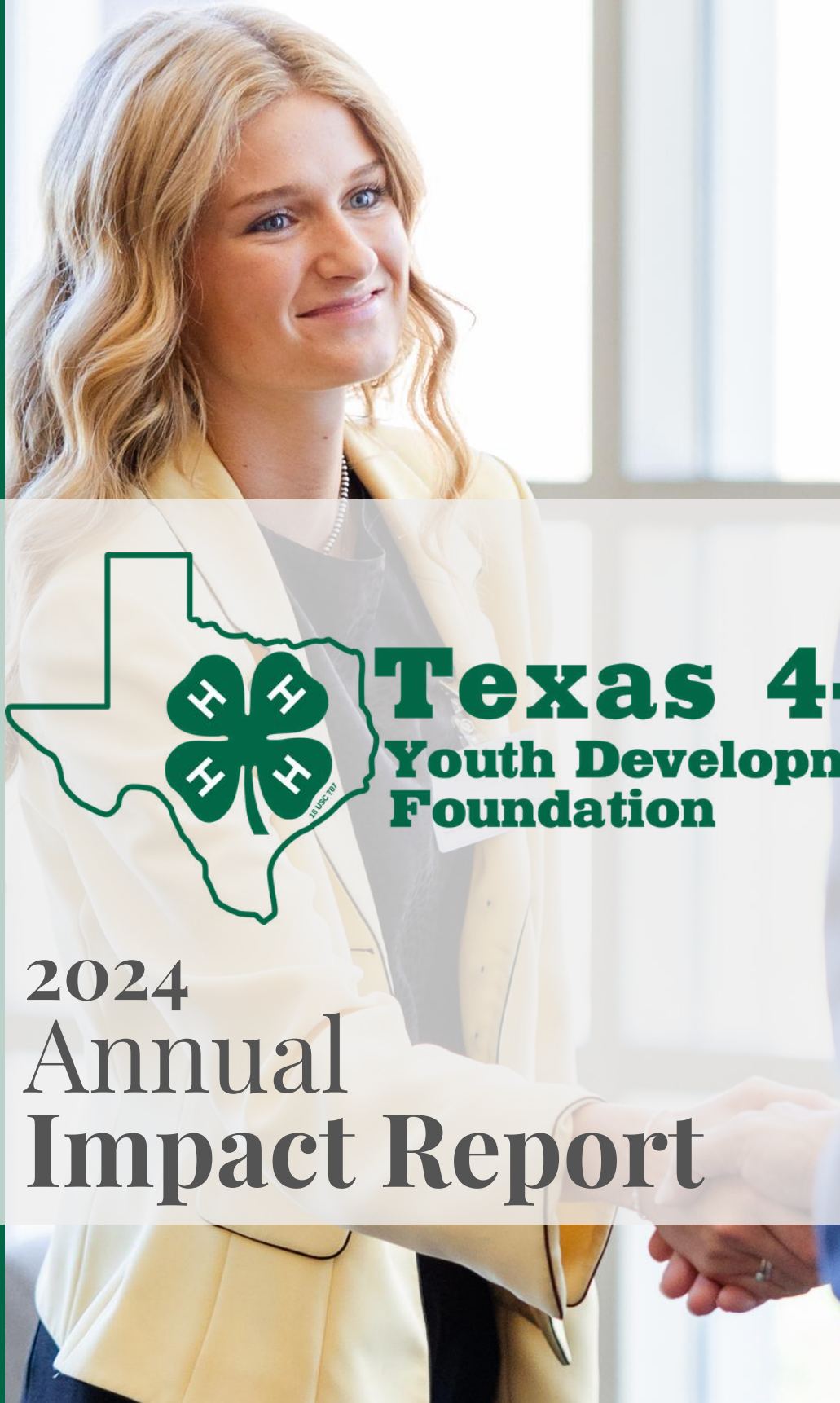

Vision and Mission



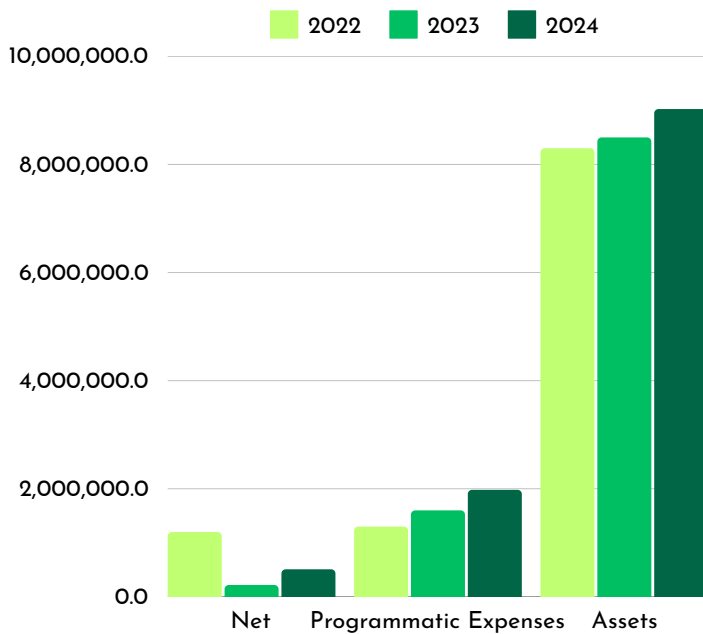

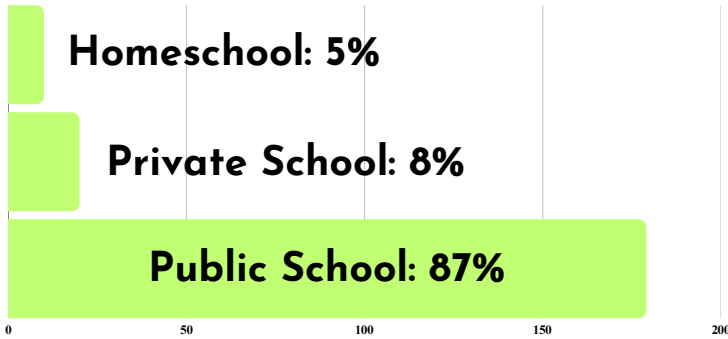

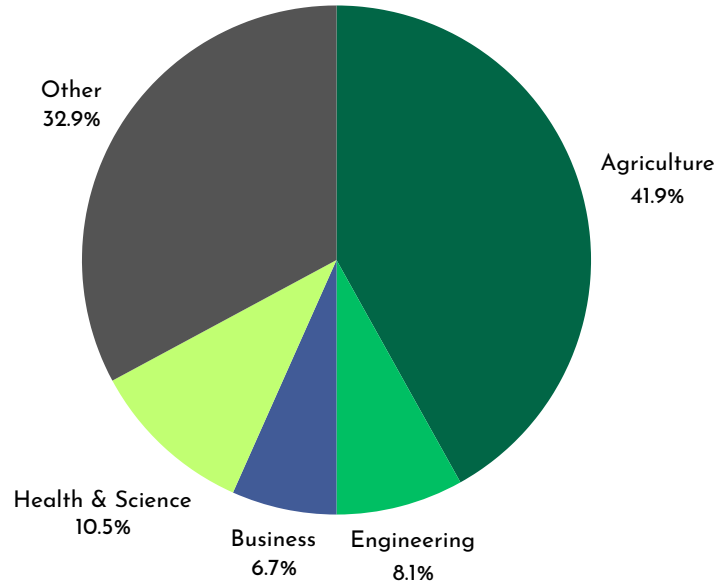

Foundation Development Districts

The Texas 4-H Foundation Board is divided into 6 regional Foundation Development Districts. These FDDs raise money in their region for the 4-H programs there.

North Region FDD hosted their second annual “Clays for Clovers” shoot and raised over \$20,000 that will be used to support Districts 1 & 2 4-H through programming grants and scholarships.

Southeast Region FDD hosted the “4-H on the Fairway” golf tournament that brought in over \$80,000 that will be used to support Districts 9 & 11.





Grant Program



Bandera County used their grant to take 23 youth on a career exploration trip as part of their CORE Academy program. CORE stands for Career Opportunities Reflecting Excellence. The tour consisted of the following businesses & professions: Texas Game Warden Training Center, Schreiber Foods, Barefoot Campus Outfitter, Capital Hatters, 3M Brownwood, Mueller Inc., Oncology Dietitian at Shannon Cancer Center, Apex Solar and Wind Farm, Mohair Council, & Damuth Taxidermy. Youth also toured Tarleton University and Angelo State University.



Gonzales County used their grant to help host a youth grill-off event. There was a total of 66 youth grillers. The committee also realizes rising cost of food and wanted to teach the youth how to prepare the most economical cut of beef, hamburger meat. It is vital to the sustainability of American agriculture that younger generations learn about Path to the Plate, which includes food production, harvesting, safety, and food preparation. Texas Farm Bureau was also a partner on this event.

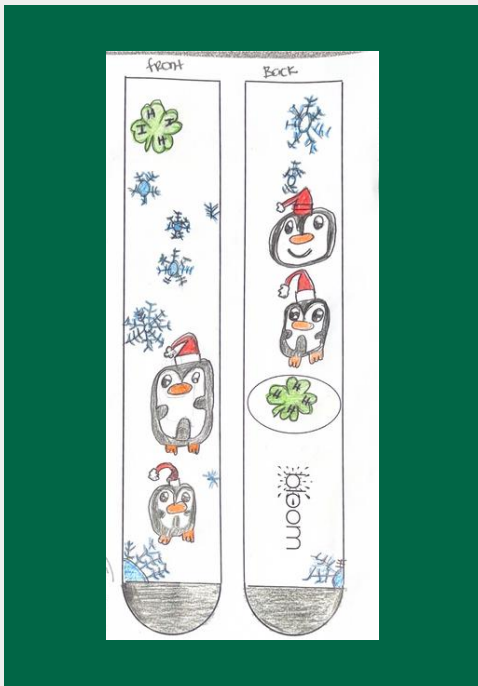

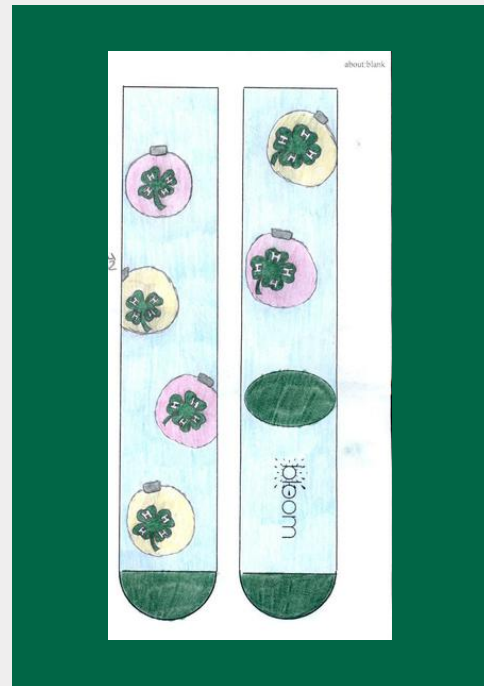


SOCK DESIGN WINNERS

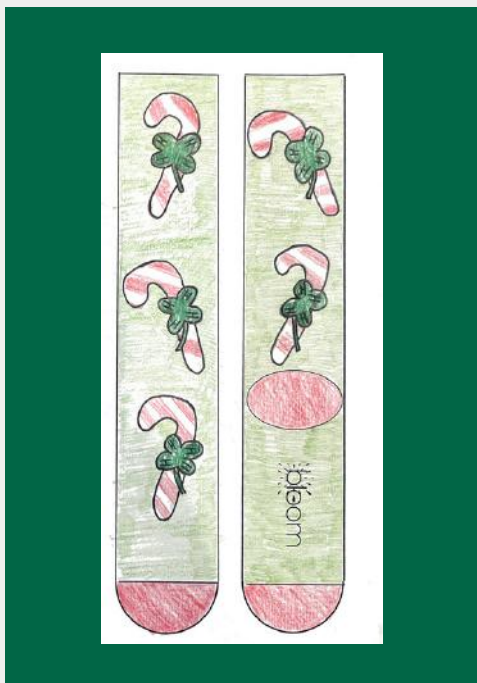
