


G'day! I'm a common ringtail possum.




I'm smaller than common brushtail possums and have a long tail with a white tip.




My tail is like an extra hand. It helps me hold on to branches and leaves.



When the sun is up, I like to snuggle in my cozy nest. It's called a drey, and it's made of sticks and leaves.




I only come out at night, when it's dark and quiet. Today, the rain woke me.
