Too often, frustrations are aired publicly or shared with others rather than being handled in a biblical manner. A message from our Elementary Principal,

In Matthew 18:15, Jesus lovingly reminds us of the importance of addressing conflicts privately and respectfully. Keeping issues between us allows for open communication and the possibility of resolution without escalating the conflict or hurt feelings. Ultimately, respecting others in this manner reflects a deep respect for ourselves and the relationships we value and cherish. A message from our Junior High Principal, JARED FUQUA

Having difficult conversations is a learned skill. Students must learn early to confront issues head on one-on-one with those who have sinned against them. I have witnessed this with team captains who passionately argue with one another about how they are lacking in holding their teammates accountable. Instead of creating a toxic locker room environment by politicking, they hash it out with one another for the benefit of the team. Gossip is a common issue that is observed in junior high, and sadly, amongst adults. The vicious gossip cycle goes something like this: 1. Students have disagreements with one another, sometimes heated, and struggle to cope with someone not agreeing with them. 2. The tendency can be to find an echo chamber or an empathetic ear who will hear their side and totally agree with them. 3. The result? The members of the echo chamber or the empathetic ear, speak openly about the issue, creating anger and angst among those involved. While gossiping helps the student feel validated and right, it is damaging, poisonous, and contrary to the Kingdom of God.

I pray that we as admin, teacher, students, and parents heed the words of Jesus. If we did as He commanded, how pure, blessed, and God-honoring would our hallways, classrooms, locker rooms, carline, and group chats be?




A message from our Fine Arts Director, MARIANNE MORRISON

A message from our Director of Student Support, MIKE AMMONS

In today's society, there is increasing difficulty in addressing and resolving conflict. For instance, when a restaurant serves an incorrect order, many people choose to simply accept the mistake rather than address it with the staff. Similarly, in our digital communications, we frequently use carefully crafted, passive phrases in emails or text messages, which can obscure the true nature of our concerns to avoid even marginal discomfort. As Christians, we are called to live in community, supporting, encouraging, and, when necessary, correcting one another. Hebrews 10:25 urges us not to forsake gathering together, emphasizing the importance of communal worship and mutual growth in faith. Within these communal gatherings, we worship God and grow together in our faith. Recognizing that differences or tensions will inevitably arise, it becomes essential to develop the skills to resolve such situations in healthy ways that preserve the unity and health of the community God desires.

Matthew 18:15 provides clear guidance on this matter and emphasizes several key principles:

Humility: Approaching someone who has wronged us requires humility and a charitable spirit. It challenges us to seek reconciliation actively, even when we feel we have been wronged.

Personal Interaction: Addressing conflicts in person is crucial. Relying on indirect forms of communication, such as emails, text messages, or social media, can cause us to devalue others, this digital barrier can result in an interaction that lacks sincerity or enable us to be harsh in our correction. Going in person causes us to recognize that others are image-bearers of God and reminds us to treat them with compassion and respect.

Pursuit of Reconciliation: God desires that we seek resolution to conflicts. Ignoring issues or harboring resentment can lead to division, threatening the health of relationships within families, friendships, and the broader Christian community.

In a culture that often avoids confrontation, embracing these biblical principles requires both humility and courage. By committing to resolve conflicts according to God's guidance, we trust that His ways are superior to our own, ultimately bringing glory to Him and strengthening the bonds within our community.

Dear Parent/Guardian,

Bay Area Christian School will be conducting spinal screenings after Spring Break. State law requires that schools must screen students for abnormal spinal curvature in accordance with the following schedule:

Girls will be screened two times, once at age 10 (4th grade) and again at age 12 (6th grade) Boys will be screened one time at age 13 or 14 (8th grade)

The nurse will check your child for signs of spinal problems like scoliosis. Catching a spinal problem early can make the treatment much easier. Not treating spinal problems can lead to serious health problems. The screening is simple. The nurse will look at your child's back while he or she stands and bends forward, and using a scoliometer, will measure the curvature on the student's spine. The school will send you a letter within two weeks if your child does not pass the screening. The letter will tell you how to follow up with a doctor. This screening is not a medical exam. Your child still needs to see a doctor for checkups.
