The Bachelor of Applied Science in Early Childhood Education provides an opportunity for students to become licensed teachers in Pre-Kindergarten to 3rd grade with an endorsement in Early Childhood Special Education, as they acquire a broad base of academic experiences in subject areas necessary for licensure. Coursework includes Foundations of Education, elementary math and science courses, educational assessment, psychology, special education, technology, multicultural influences, differentiated instruction, curriculum development, and literature courses. Students will have opportunities to apply their new skill sets during field experiences in Preschool and K-3 settings.
