RENEW YOUR SPIRIT: DIVE INTO JEWISH LEARNING AT TBS!

We are thrilled that we have been able to return to a sense of normal life at Temple Beth Shalom over the last few months. Now that we have embraced being together again in person, we in the Temple leadership are focusing on some major changes that will enhance the membership experience for everyone. You'll see below that we are completely revamping our Adult Education programming.

We will be partnering with the Melton School for Adult Learning, bringing in new class topics and interesting teachers, engaging a scholar in residence, and diving deeper into Jewish topics and texts. When we look at a body of water from above, it may be beautiful and serene. But when we dive down into the water we see whole new worlds before our eyes, dynamic and colorful.

As we dive into Jewish learning this year, may we challenge ourselves to connect to our tradition on a deeper spiritual level, to learn something totally new to us, to explore the depths of who we are as Jews. While we are still in the planning phases for this year, I am so excited to share where we are so far.

TBS IS PARTNERING WITH MELTON SCHOOL FOR ADULT LEARNING

- You may have heard of Melton, as our JCC partnered with them for a number of years (Rabbi B was a teacher). What is Melton? "The Florence Melton School of Adult Jewish Learning engages adult learners in a life-enhancing study of Jewish texts and ideas that nurtures and deepens Jewish community worldwide."
- These are mostly six-week classes (although some classes are longer and a few are shorter) that we will offer in the daytime, in the evenings, and on Sunday mornings.
- Rabbi Benjy and Rabbi Lenette will teach, as well as some other teachers as well including Rabbi Leigh Ann Kopans.
- We will be licensing the Melton curriculum and program so there will be a charge per student for these classes paid directly to Melton. The TBS leadership is hoping to be able to offset those costs for our learners.
- There will be another batch of classes offered in the second half of the year!
- Our goal is to have 30 registrations from our congregation sign up for one or more of these classes.
- Before the High Holy Days, these classes will be solidified. You'll have a chance to try a Melton-style class during Yom Kippur afternoon.

"This experience provides an opportunity for parents to bring the Jewish conversation home to share with their young child. Foundations of Jewish Family Living provides you with the learning, the language, and the confidence to be a teacher to your own children"

TBS LIFELONG LEARNING ADULT EDUCATION CLASSES

- Separate from Melton, we have a number of wonderful teachers and professors in our congregation who are interested in teaching material they love. These classes will be shorter, 1-3 sessions, and will not have a fee associated with them..
- TBS Lunch & Learn will continue monthly with assorted topics from Jewish responses to topical issues, deeper dive into Jewish holidays, and more. These classes are open to anyone in our TBS community who is interested in learning!
- Lunch Bunch will continue monthly with a catered lunch and a presentation on a not-necessarily Jewish topic.

LIFELONG LEARNING CLASSES

Understanding the Holocaust

A monthly or quarterly class on different topics to help us grapple with this horrible history

Richard Prystowsky, expert Holocaust Studies professor and interviewer of survivors, will be teaching these classes.

Defense Against the Dark Arts: Magic in Jewish Tradition

Krista Dalton, Assistant Professor of Religious Studies at Kenyon will teach us about the oversized role magic has played in Judaism throughout the ages. Participants may even get to make their own incantation bowls!

Understanding Islam and the Quran

Our Rabbi Emeritus, Rabbi Howard Apothaker will teach us about Islam by comparing various texts and traditions from the Quran to Jewish texts and tradition.

SCHOLARS IN RESIDENCE

- In addition to these classes, we will be welcoming a scholar in residence to TBS this Spring, as well as a musician in residence this Winter. More details about these exciting opportunities will be available before the High Holy Days.

I hope that you read the content above with much excitement and delight. We are on the cusp of entering a new era of learning and depth at TBS, and I hope you'll consider taking this journey with us.

CANTORIAL CORNER

One of the summer highlights at Temple Beth Shalom was our Piano Dedication Shabbat Service held on June 24, 2022. If you did not get an opportunity to experience this service (or want to hear it again) you can retrieve it by going to our Facebook page. Our new Kawai piano, which was generously donated by Dr. Jonathan and Marcy Schaffir, was featured and accompanied our prayers, along with the Klezmer Band and Shabband.

In addition to these accompaniments, Orlay Alonso, Merry Pruitt, and Nate Terry played both original and composed compositions to enhance our service. The Sharyonim Choir was scheduled to be part of the service since it too is accompanied by the piano, but because of COVID complications, could not perform. Nonetheless, our wonderful Sharyonim members were in attendance for the event.

Singing is important to our Sharyonim members, and joining in song while amongst the congregation greatly enhanced the sound and spirit of our congregational singing.

Singing is an integral part of Judaism and our services. The minyan, the quorum of at least ten adults, is considered preferable to solo prayer. Although there is certainly a place for personal prayer, Judaism prizes the group for many reasons. Congregants sing along as participants in the service.

Our Sharyonim Choir plays an important part in Temple Beth Shalom's musical environment. Choral singing is one vehicle used to elevate the spirituality of those who listen and respond during a religious service while at the same time can elevate the spirituality of participating singers.

Tzvi Freeman, in his article "Music, Spirituality and Transformation: The Centrality of Song in Chabad" writes that "Song carries the soul upwards to be absorbed within the Infinite Light," calling upon the tradition of the ancient prophets who would sing and play musical instruments as they awaited the gift of prophecy.

A non-denominational look at faith-based singing, "Singing Meditation: Together in Sound and Silence" by Liz Hill and Ruthie Rosauer, notes "We've all experienced a sense of wonder and magic when a choir performs sacred music. The effect is even greater when we participate in singing together. Joined in song, our emotions are not merely stirred; they merge and dissolve with the emotions of others, deepening our human connection. Singing in community provides a tangible power that doesn't exist when we sing alone."

The Sharyonim will be participating in this year's High Holiday Services, adding their voices in both the congregation and to Choral Sacred Works.

If you love to sing, can carry a part, can attend most rehearsals, and are a fun person, we would love to have you this year.

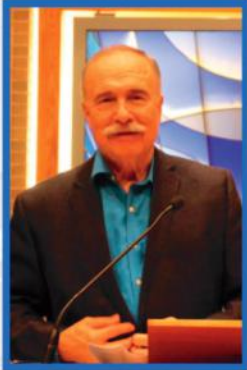
