ABOUT OIS

Founded in August 2008, OIS is a private, coeducational day school offering education of an excellent quality to students across two campuses in Mumbai. OIS is an authorized three-programme IB school offering the IB Primary Years Programme (N-5), IB Middle Years Programme (6-10) and the IB Diploma Programme (11-12). Students who do not pursue the IB Diploma may opt to take IB Courses and be awarded a High School Diploma. Students in grades 9 and 10 are tracked in Mathematics and Foreign Languages. Given the inherent rigour of the IB Diploma Programme OIS does not provide ranking of its students or calculate a GPA. OIS is fully accredited by the Council of International Schools (CIS) and the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC), is a member of the East Asia Region Council of Schools (EARCOS), and Near East South Asia Council of Overseas Schools (NESA).








Our 2023 results demonstrate a return to the pre-COVID era trend, indicating a positive shift back to the academic performance patterns observed before the pandemic.


