Syllabus Breakdoun Year 1

Vocab / Study Book: Bayna Yadayk Book 1

Introductio:

essential Arabic vocabulary and dialogues.
Focuses on listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills in a gradual, unit-based structure.

Each unit includes vocabulary lists, comprehension passages, and oral practice.

Sarf (Morphology): First Steps to Understanding Sarf

Introduces the concept of Arabic root systems.
Covers the basic verb forms (I–III), conjugation for past,
present, and command.

Focus on recognition of patterns for vocabulary building.

Nahw (Grammar):

10 Lessons of Arabic Grammar + First Steps to Understanding Grammar

10 Lessons: Covers the absolute basics — nouns, verbs, particles, sentence structure, gender, number, and case endings.

First Steps: Expands on foundational nahw — introduction to i' rāb, subject-predicate structure, verb conjugation basics, and usage of common particles.

Reading: Qasas an-Nabiyyīn

Year 2

Vocab / Study Book: Bayna Yadayk Book 2

Builds on Book 1 with more advanced vocabulary and complex dialogues.
Themes: travel, health, work, education, environment, media, and Islamic values.
Stronger emphasis on speaking fluency and extendd comprehension passages

Sarf (Morphology): Matn al-Binā

Core beginner's sarf text.

Covers verb forms systematically, including triliteral and quadriliteral patterns.

Teaches students how to recognise verb conjugations

reaches students how to recognise verb conjugations across all pronouns and tenses.

Nahw (Grammar):

Classical beginner's matn in grammar.

Introduces technical terms of nahw.

Covers detailed rules of i'rāb, types of words (ism, fi'l, ḥarf), sentence types, marfū'āt, manṣūbāt, and majrūrāt.

Prepares the student for more advanced texts.

Reading: Iqra Series

Short stories and graded readers in Modern Standard Arabic.

Builds fluency in reading with comprehension questions. Moves gradually from short simple stories to longer, more descriptive texts.

Milestones By the end of Year 2 **Expanded** vocabulary and conversational ability through Bayna Yadayk Book 2. **Competence** in foundational nahw rules as structured in Ajrumiyyah, including marfūʿāt, manṣūbāt, and majrūrāt.

Mastery of basic verb forms and conjugations across all pronouns using Matn al-Binā '. **Reading** fluency developed through Qasas an-Nabiyyīn, with understanding of simple classical Arabic style.

Grammatical awareness of nouns, verbs, particles, gender, and number firmly established.

Year3

Nahw (Grammar): Qatr al-Nadā

Intermediate-level grammar text.

Provides detailed explanation of i rāb with examples
from Qur'an and classical texts.

Expands on topics from Ajrumiyyah with more depth
and precision.

Introduces conditional sentences, advanced particles, and complex grammatical constructions.

Balāghah (Rhetoric): Al-Balāghah al-Wāḍiḥah

Introduces students to Arabic rhetoric.

Covers maʿānī (sentence structures and meanings), bayān (figures of speech), and badīʿ (stylistic embellishments).

Practical exercises in recognizing and applying rhetorical devices in Arabic texts.

Sarf (Morphology): Tasrīf al-Izzī

Intermediate sarf manual.
Systematic practice in deriving verb and noun forms from roots.

Covers weak verbs, doubled verbs, hollow verbs, and hamzated verbs.

Builds mastery of the 10 major verb forms.

Reading: Selected Passages (Kaylānī, Tantāwī, others)

Exposure to refined Arabic prose and essays.
Includes literary, historical, and moral themes.
Develops advanced comprehension and stylistic appreciation.
Prepares students to engage with both classical and modern Arabic literature.

Milestones by End of Year 3

Solid grounding in intermediate nahw through Qatr al-Nadā, with ability to analyse complex sentences.

Strong sarf skills from Tasrīf al- Izzī, including irregular verb patterns and derivation of nouns and verbs.

Ability to read and appreciate refined Arabic literature through selections from Kaylānī, Tantāwī, and other authors.


