## Scholarship

[Waukee.org/PlayItForward](http://Waukee.org/PlayItForward)

We want everyone to be able to enjoy our programs. If you need assistance to cover part of the program costs for your kids, our Play It Forward program may be able to help. Kids who qualify can receive 50% off the cost of up to two Waukee Parks & Recreation programs for the calendar year.

### Who is eligible?

The program is open to Waukee residents 18 years old or younger who qualify for free or reduced lunch at school or an equivalent financial assistance program.

### Which programs can I use it for?

You can choose one spring or summer program and one fall or winter program or use both scholarships in the same season. Some programs are not eligible, so review the list online before you submit an application.

### How can I apply?

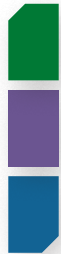

## Parks & Recreation Policies

---

### What is your cancelation policy?

Programs, activities, special events and festivals which are canceled, postponed or changed in location will be announced as soon as possible. Please check Facebook or [Waukee.org](https://Waukee.org) for updates. Waukee Parks & Recreation reserves the right to cancel a program or an activity that does not meet the minimum number of participants necessary to offer the program.

### What is your program refund policy?

**Programs/Classes/Camps:** A \$5 non-refundable processing fee will be deducted from the refund when an enrollee withdraws from a program at least one week prior to the first day of the program. Within one week of the program start date, a refund will not be issued.

**Leagues:** A \$5 non-refundable processing fee will be deducted from the refund when an enrollee withdraws prior to rosters being made. After rosters are formed, no refund will be issued.

**Trips:** Cancellations for trips must be made at least three weeks prior to the trip date to receive a full refund less a \$5 non-refundable processing fee. No refund will be issued for cancellations within three weeks of the trip.

### What is your facility rental refund policy?

To receive a refund, reservations must be canceled at least 10 business days prior to the date of the reservation. A \$10 non-refundable processing fee will be deducted from the refund. No refund will be issued for cancellations made within 10 business days of the start of the reservation.

### What is your photo/video policy?

Photos and videos may be taken of participants and guests at programs, activities, leagues, trips, special events and festivals. These photos and videos may be used in promotional materials, press releases and kits, magazine articles, newsletters, [Waukee.org](https://Waukee.org) and any City social media channels.

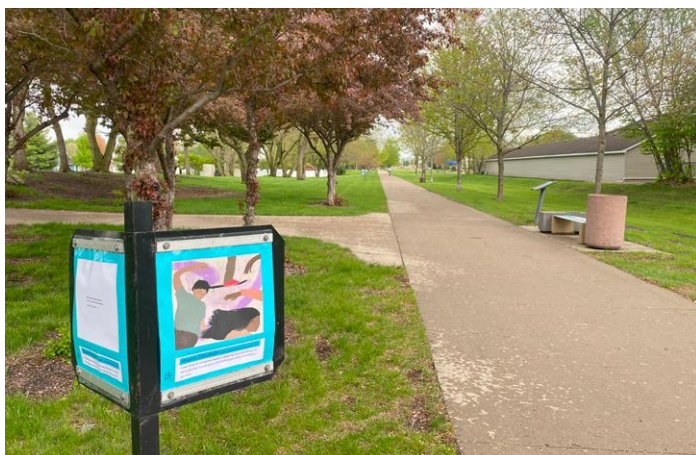

## Miracle League®

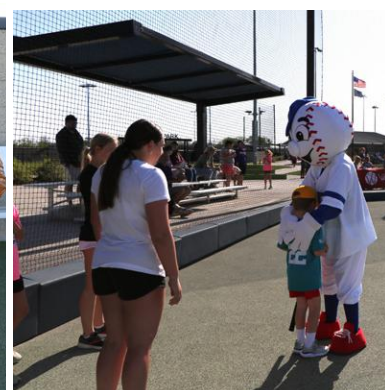
Join the Parks & Recreation Department for one or both of our Miracle League baseball seasons. Miracle League is a nationwide organization that creates opportunities for youth with disabilities to play baseball for free. Spring season has six weekly games and fall is a shortened season of four games.

The non-competitive league plays each game as follows:

- Each game consists of two innings
- Every player bats once each inning
- All players are safe on the bases
- Every player scores a run before the inning is over (last one up gets a homerun)
- All games end in a tie
- Community volunteers serve as “buddies” to assist the players throughout the game

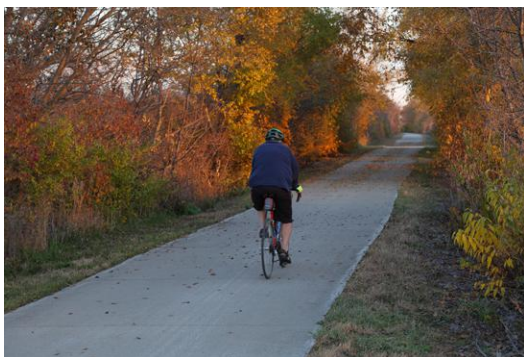


# Outdoor Recreation

## Trailside Dog Park & Trailhead

### 590 SE Brick Drive

Trailside Dog Park spans four acres just east of Alice's Road, directly south of the popular Heart of the Warrior Trail. The park has separated areas for large and small dogs and open green space as well as public restrooms, parking, drinking fountain, dog waste stations, shade structure and concrete walking paths.

Before purchasing a pass to Trailside Dog Park, Waukee residents must license their dogs with the City at PetData.com. Dog passes come with an entry code to access the park. Pass fees go toward maintenance of the park.

## Public Fishing

The City of Waukee works closely with the Iowa Department of Natural Resources (DNR) to provide accessible, quality fishing opportunities in the Waukee community. An Iowa fishing license is required at any of the public fishing ponds.

To buy a fishing license, explore maps, read Iowa fishing regulations and learn more about fishing in Iowa, visit [IowaDNR.gov/FishLocal](http://IowaDNR.gov/FishLocal). In Waukee, residents and visitors can purchase fishing licenses in person at Fleet Farm, 1300 SE Kettlestone Blvd.

Per Iowa's fishing regulations, the daily limit for bluegills is 25 and trout is 5. The daily limit for bass is three, but bass must be at least 15 inches long to keep. Releasing bass back into the water body helps maintain healthy fish populations.

Kayaks, paddle boats and motorboats are not allowed on any City of Waukee ponds.

### Northwest Waukee

- Triumph Park pond has an ADA-compliant fishing pier and is part of the DNR trout stocking program.
- Prairie Rose pond is located north of Douglas Parkway and west of north Warrior Lane.
- Public Safety pond is at the corner of Douglas Parkway and NW 20th Street next to the Public Safety building.

### Grand Prairie Parkway

- Four ponds can be accessed from the Kettlestone Greenbelt trail.
  - Kettlestone Commons Ponds are north of the Holmes Murphy building and east of Grand Prairie Parkway.
  - Tallgrass Pond is west of Grand Prairie Parkway and south of Tallgrass Lane.
  - Kettlestone Village Pond is north of Westtown Parkway and east of SE Parkview Crossing Drive.
- Waukee Towne Center Pond is south of Target
