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Teaching and Learning

Balliol students benefit from engaging with **tutors**, who are experts in their fields. Through the tutorial system, students are encouraged to think independently and develop confidence in their academic skills.

Tutorials are weekly meetings with a tutor and usually one or two other students. Most tutorials take place within College.

Students will attend lectures and may also have classes and practical work.

The college has at least 2 Tutorial Fellows even in small subjects and an unusually large number in others such as Engineering, Physics and History.

Students who achieve exceptional academic performance may be awarded prizes, scholarships and **subject prizes**.

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Using the Library


The **library** is run by a team of friendly librarians. It is open 24/7 for students to access resources and provides a variety of excellent study spaces.

Copies of core textbooks for each course are available from the library. If you need a book, you can ask the librarians to purchase a copy for you.

The librarians provide advice and training on finding resources, referencing and avoiding plagiarism.

Balliol's library and **archive** are part of the wider network of **university libraries**, and there are almost 100 libraries in Oxford to support your studies.

The library also provides squash and biscuits, board games, DVDs and origami, and hosts exhibitions, quizzes and readings.

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Social Life

Balliol students can and do enjoy an active social life. There are many regular student run activities such as BOPs (big organized parties) which take place in the **Junior Common Room** (JCR), film and tv nights, quizzes, club nights and welfare teas.

Balliol's Lindsay bar is one of the last student run bars in Oxford and it's a great place to meet friends, enjoy cheap drinks and play pool.

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Clubs and Societies

College cultural life is rich and stimulating, and there is a varied programme of poetry readings, lectures, talks, debates and concerts. There are numerous subject-specific societies and lots of opportunities to get involved in Music and Drama.

The college has a newly refurbished Music Room with piano, amps drums and its very own theatre, The Michael Pilch Studio.

Subject societies include Bacchus (Chemistry), BEERS (Engineering), BUMS (Balliol Undergraduate Mathematics Society), BURPS, (Balliol Physics Society), Cerberus (PPE Society), Dervorguilla (History Society), Skoliasts (Classics Society) and the Younger Society (Law).

College also offers the Drama Society, Balliol Literary Society, Balliol Musical Society, Sunday evening concerts, College Choir, and the A & B comedy debating Society.

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Accommodation

Balliol is able to offer undergraduates **accommodation** for every year of their course. Balliol's accommodation is found on the **Broad Street main site**, the Jowett Walk Complex and the **Master's Field site** and provides a range of options.

All first-year students live in single study bedrooms on the main Broad Street site.

There is a full kitchen and a further 6 kitchenettes in which students can prepare snacks.

International students and students who are in care can access long leases.

The College has several rooms which are specially adapted for disabled students. **Students with disabilities** or special needs should make College aware of these needs once their place is confirmed.

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Food

Students eat in our dining Hall; a buffet style lunch and dinner are available seven days a week during term time and breakfast is available Monday to Friday. There are also some special dining occasions such as formal Hall on Tuesdays and Society dinners.

The kitchen caters for students with halal, vegan and vegetarian diets producing high quality varied menus.

Food is heavily subsidized by the College and **pre-payments plans**, make eating in College even cheaper.

Students with special dietary requirements should make these known to the College, once their place is confirmed.

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Welfare and Wellbeing
