TAKE UP YOUR CROSS

Where have My True Followers gone to? Just as Peter hid in the crowd, some have already begun to recede into the background, afraid they will be recognized and targeted by the dark side. Children, when you join the Army of God, you are on the front line, with no thoughts of retreat. There is not a clause in My Word that tells you that you can retreat when the gross darkness covers the earth.

When you pick up your cross, it is all in or nothing. When My Son Jesus of Nazareth took up His cross, He carried it to the very end. What did Paul say about his cross?

The apostle Paul wrote extensively about the cross of Jesus Christ and its significance in his letters to the early Christian communities. In his letter to Galatians 6:14-16, he wrote, "May I never boast of anything except the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by which the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world." He also wrote, "I have been crucified with Christ."

In his letter to the Romans 6:1-4 Paul wrote that "all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death." He also wrote that "our old self was crucified with him" and that "you have died to the law through the body of Christ.

Paul was not ashamed of the cross. 1 Corinthians 1:18-19 (NKJV) For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved, it is the power of God.

19 For it is written: "I will destroy the wisdom of the wise, And bring to nothing the understanding of the prudent."

Paul believed that the cross held the key to salvation and ethics. He believed that just as Christ died and rose again, his followers may "crucify the flesh" and die to a life of sin. Romans 1:16 (MSG) It's news I'm most proud to proclaim, this extraordinary Message of God's powerful plan to rescue everyone who trusts him, starting with Jews and then right on to everyone else!

In summary, Paul saw the cross as a symbol of salvation and a way for Christians to die to their old selves and live a new life in Christ.

Today I am requiring you to take up your cross and follow me!

For whoever would save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it. For what will it profit a man if he gains the whole world and forfeits his soul?"

She joyfully hugged the pastor when she emerged from the water.

Many friends and family attended the baptism and were shown in the video worshipping from hymnals.

Movieguide® reported that von Drachenberg's lifestyle transformation first began in 2020 when she sold her beauty brand and began covering her tattoos. Later that year, she and her family moved to Indiana to "escape California's 'terrible policies' and 'tyrannical government.'"


In 2022, Movieguide® reported that von Drachenberg threw out her books on witchcraft.

"Right now, it's never been clearer to me that there is a spiritual battle taking place, and I want to surround myself and my family with love and light," she said after she ditched her occult books.

In an Instagram post, she encouraged her social media followers—which includes 697,000 on YouTube, 1.6 million on Twitter, and 11 million on Facebook—to make "meaningful changes" in their lives.

THE GOOD SAMARITAN LAW

The Good Samaritan law offers legal protection to someone who attempts to help a person they believe to be injured, ill, in peril or otherwise incapacitated. The law is intended to reduce a bystander's hesitation to assist someone for fear of being sued or prosecuted for unintentional injury or wrongful death. The purpose of this law if to encourage ordinary people to help someone in distress before the ambulance or police arrive.

The key to the Good Samaritan Law is acting:

- 1. In good faith
- 2. Not for compensation or looking for a fee
- 3. Without gross negligence or misconduct

The origin of the Good Samaritan law is from a Bible parable attributed to Jesus Christ. The parable, found in Luke 10:29-37, tells the story of a traveler from Samaria giving aid to another traveler who had been beaten and robbed by bandits.

Common examples of Good Samaritan situations include someone experiencing chest pain or someone falls and hits their head on a sidewalk. It also includes if someone goes into Cardiac Arrest and you know CPR, you should immediately start CPR and use an AED if one is available. Also, if you witness an overdose and you have Narcan, you should use it to stop the effect of the opiate. This law encourages bystanders to help people using first aid without fear of their actions inadvertently contribute to further injury or death.

Once a person starts providing first aid, he should not leave the scene until a more qualified rescuer takes over. You will have valuable information to pass on to the rescuer:

*Did you see the whole incident

*How was the victim hurt

*Did the victim complain of any pain

*What first aid actions did you use (stopping the bleeding)

The law does not expect a person to put himself in harm's way in order to help another person.

Don't be afraid to help someone who needs CPR or First Aid, even if it is just calling 911. Immediate action by bystanders is critical in any emergency. Seconds are often a matter of life and death.



Humility (part 3)



Part 2 Other Stains You May Encounter - Easy Ways To Remove Them

MAKEUP /BODY RELATED

Lipstick – hair spray

Mist the stain with a hair spray then let it sit for 10 minutes and then dab it down with a wet cloth to remove any residue.

Foundation – shaving cream

The best product to remove foundation stains is to use shaving cream. Dampen the stain with cold water and apply shaving cream directly onto the stain. Rub the stain gently using your fingers or a soft toothbrush. The shaving cream should help loosen up the stain and then laundry as usual.

Lipstick stain – Nail polish remover

Apply nail polish remover to the area and scrub it with an old toothbrush, rinse it off with cold water and blot dry. You can also spray the stain with diluted dish soap and use a toothbrush to work into the stain.

Perfume stain – vinegar

Apply the stain with a solution of equal parts glycerine and water, leave it to soak for up to an hour, then wash as normal. Mix equal parts of vinegar and water and gently dab the stain so the entire area is covered. Let it on for few mins and rinse off.

Deodorant - hydrogen peroxide

Combine 1/2 cup dish soap and 1 cup hydrogen peroxide in a small bowl. Stir to combine. Apply it on the stain and sprinkle a bit of baking soda over the area. Use a brush to scrub gently on the stain, wash the cloth after an hour.

SWEAT STAIN – lemon juice

A simple and affordable solution for cleaning sweat-stains is to mix equal parts of lemoniuice and water and rub it on the affected area. For tough stains, use baking soda mixed with lemon juiceto scrub away the stain. Use a soft brush to gently lift the stain and wash in a regular cycle.
