Itinerary and Highlights (subject to change)

Day 1: ARRIVE IN BOZEMAN, MT Refresh at the hotel before gathering with fellow travel companions for a special welcome dinner.

Overnight: GranTree Inn (D)

Day 2: BOZEMAN I PARADISE VALLEY I LAMAR
VALLEY, WY I GARDINER, MT Climb aboard
a specially equipped safari vehicle to explore
Paradise Valley where bison, elk and coyotes are
often seen wandering. Stay alert for wolf packs
tracking from a distance. Continue to Lamar
Valley, teeming with bison, bald eagles and
elusive wolves. Before dinner gather with the
group for a relaxing wine and cheese reception.
Overnight: Yellowstone Gateway Inn (B,L,R,D)

Day 3: GARDINER I LAMAR VALLEY, WY I COOKE CITY, MT I GARDINER, MT Today's full-day safari spans the Northern Range where wolf packs have been spotted. Learn about the packs currently roaming the park and the social dynamics and complex hierarchical behaviors within family units and between other packs. This afternoon visit an award-winning photographer at his studio for a tour of his impressive gallery. Before returning to the hotel, and if weather permits, snowshoe along one of Lamar Valley's forested ski trails.

Overnight: Yellowstone Gateway Inn (B,L,D)

Day 4: GARDINER I LAMAR VALLEY, WY I MAMMOTH HOT SPRINGS I OLD FAITHFUL Take an early morning drive to Mammoth Hot Springs. Walk through historic Fort Yellowstone or along the boardwalk above steaming hydrothermal features. Journey aboard special safari snow coaches to reach the iconic Old Faithful geyser.

Overnight: Old Faithful Snow Lodge (B,L,D)

Day 5: OLD FAITHFUL I JACKSON This morning watch Old Faithful erupt, then take a nature walk to the Castle Geyser to explore the Upper Geyser Basin. Depart the park for a scenic drive to Flagg Ranch. Mid way, transfer to safari road vehicles for the final stretch to Jackson. This evening is at leisure to explore Jackson's acclaimed town square—only a short walk from the hotel.

Overnight: The Lexington at Jackson Hole (B,L)

Day 6: JACKSON I GRAND TETON NATIONAL PARK I NATIONAL ELK REFUGE I JACKSON Safari through Grand Teton National Park to spot for wildlife. Visit the National Elk Refuge—home to an estimated 7,000 elk—for a special horse-drawn sleigh ride. Tonight gather together for a convivial farewell dinner.

Overnight: The Lexington at Jackson Hole (B,L,D)

Day 7: DEPART JACKSON After breakfast, transfer to the airport for flights home. (B)







Activity Level: This itinerary has early morning starts. The majority of the program's activities take place outdoors with extended time walking on varying terrain. It is our expectation that guests can withstand cold temperatures; walk on uneven, frozen, or snow-covered terrain; climb in and out of all-terrain vehicles; and manage stairs without assistance. (Maximum elevation: 8,391 feet at the Continental Divide)

(B = Breakfast, L = Lunch, D = Dinner, R = Reception)

- In-field lectures and presentations, including an overview of the wolf packs and family trees, a naturalist's summary of the science and research on the biological impact of the repopulation of the wolves in the Greater Yellowstone Ecosystem, and a discussion of the political history of the wolves' reintroduction
- Use of in-field gear, including high quality binoculars and spotting scopes, Yaktrax, snowshoes, and adjustable hiking poles
- Hot beverages, water, and snacks throughout touring
- · Admission and park fees throughout
- Luggage porterage
- Gratuities to Orbridge Expedition Leaders, hotel housekeeping staff, drivers, porters, and wait staff for included meals
- Airport transfers for guests arriving and departing during the suggested times
