

APAC INCIDENT DATA FOR FEBRUARY 2024









Two trucks transporting a combined 64 tonnes of aluminum, valued at approximately \$180,900, disappeared during their journey from Renukoot to Mumbai, India. According to a report, both trucks diverted their route to Gujarat after reaching Nashik. Authorities have failed to establish contact with the drivers, noting their last known location as Ahmedabad in Gujarat, India, tracked via GPS.








Uniting Against Cargo Crime with TAPA APAC Intelligence System (TIS): Insights from the Webinar



TIS Webinar Replay

Supply chains are constantly under threat of losses by an array of incidents, ranging from pilferage and theft to the proliferation of counterfeit goods and other illicit activities. These threats pose significant risks to the integrity and efficiency of supply chain operations, jeopardizing not only the timely delivery of goods but also the reputation and financial stability of businesses across industries.

To help industry stakeholders and members stay ahead of criminal activity, TAPA APAC hosted the 'TAPA APAC Intelligence System (TIS) Webinar: Combatting Cargo Crime' on February 28th, 2024, offering a session for members to understand and utilize TIS to effectively combat cargo crime. With esteemed speakers and a robust agenda, the webinar engaged over 100 supply chain professionals and presented invaluable insights into leveraging data intelligence, mitigating risks, and fostering collaboration within the supply chain security ecosystem using TIS.

Host and moderator, Mr. Madu Lokan, Executive Director of TAPA APAC, sat the stage for the webinar by introducing the TIS platform and its mission. TIS is a tool which enhances the security and resilience of members' supply chain by providing insights of recorded cargo crime incidents globally, as well as information on facilities and operators which meet the TAPA Standards Certifications. TIS enables members to use the latest cargo crime intelligence and its route planning feature to avoid incident 'hotspots', suggesting resilient routes to take to protect their goods in transit.

To bolster the continuous development and refinement of TIS, TAPA APAC has established a dedicated TIS working group consisting of our member volunteers who are keen to drive greater resilience and are expert at their own fields. The working group serves as a catalyst for incident reporting and building partnerships with Law Enforcement Agencies (LEAs), ensuring its relevance and effectiveness in combating cargo crime. Led by Mr. Jason Le Busque, Global Head of Security of Toll Holdings, and Mr. Brett Marshall, Vice President Quality & HSSE of Zuellig Pharma, the working group currently has 22 member volunteers and supported by TAPA APAC TIS Expert, Mr. Kris Jason Arino.


Jason shared the key statistics provided by TIS – 2,539 total APAC cargo crime incidents with 815 TAPA Facility Security Requirements (FSR) and 128 Trucking Security Requirements (TSR) sites registered in APAC. With a global perspective on security challenges, Jason presented insights into operational strategies for leveraging TIS intelligence effectively. "TIS provides data for us to see what is going on in the region; helps us to gain insights about crime trends to support risk mitigation strategy; and supports collaboration between stakeholders like LEAs to further strengthen the supply chain", Jason mentioned.



Kris took attendees through a demonstration of TIS functionalities, showcasing key data insights and capabilities, including difference in features between member and public version of TIS, AI route recommendation avoiding crime, and anonymous incident reporting.

Attendees gain firsthand experience of TIS's potential in bolstering supply chain security efforts. He also shared the ongoing and upcoming TIS developments such as inclusion of TAPA Guarding Security Requirements (GSR) certified sites, USD currency display option and the APAC region filters for 'Cargo Crime Monitor' function.

Brett delved into the implementation of TIS within the pharmaceutical supply chain, shedding light on the unique challenges posed by cargo crime, counterfeit, illicit trade and product diversion. 'The TIS working group serves as a dual purpose in our ongoing commitment to security – being a structured platform for continuous reporting and documentation of incidents, and also dedicated to enhance the monitoring and surveillance of the supply chain industry by collaborating with LEA", Brett highlighted. He encouraged to leverage on TIS' threat intelligence to stay ahead of evolving risks that enables organisations to proactively adjust security measures and effectively mitigate potential threats to their supply chain.

Mr. Tony Lugg, Chairman of TAPA APAC, explained the purpose of TIS and TAPA Standards, "If we can get together to create a system and putting the processes in place, we can design out smuggling and choke the supply chain. What we need is data and intelligence. TIS is that intelligence platform that allows us to drive decisions, and influence the authorities in terms of addressing the issue of cargo crime." He urged members to join the working group to learn and contribute. TAPA APAC members are welcome to join the TIS working group for incident reporting, LEA collaboration and initiatives to enhance supply chain resilience.

The webinar concluded with an engaging Q&A session with questions regarding TIS utilization, benefits of TAPA certification, and effective collaboration strategies. By harnessing the power of TIS intelligence, collaboration, and innovation, stakeholders can unite in the fight against criminal activity, safeguarding global supply chains and fostering a resilient ecosystem for all.

China relies on 17.3 million truckers as the vital part of its local transportation infrastructure to keep the economy growing, accounting for 75% of total freight, according to the Ministry of Transport in China. In conjunction with China's Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) and the New Silk Road project, the Chinese government has also rolled out policies that emphasize the need to ensure supply chain stability. For criminal actors, these new and emerging routes will present opportunities for more thefts and exploitation with easier access to source regions and consumer markets.

With APAC countries investing their land infrastructure and network, trucking resilience is no longer an issue within the company or between facilities. Upstream and downstream road freight risks can affect business performance and reputation. 

Insights from TAPA APAC LinkedIn Polls: Supply Chain Outlook Opportunities & Challenges

Resilience and security of supply chains are of paramount importance, especially in the Asia Pacific region where trade volumes are soaring, and logistical complexities abound from risks of disruptions, geopolitical tensions, and regulatory complexities. Recently, Transported Asset Protection Association Asia Pacific (TAPA APAC) conducted two polls on its LinkedIn page and group, shedding light on the sentiments and concerns of supply chain leaders in the region.

The results underscored a mix of optimism, caution, and apprehension, with cargo crime and theft, supply chain disruptions and Business Continuity Planning (BCP) emerging as primary areas of concern. These polls provide valuable insights into the pressing issues facing APAC supply chains and underscore the importance of adopting TAPA Standards to mitigate risks and unlock opportunities for growth.

Mixed Opinions: Varying Dynamics

The first poll, conducted on 6th February, solicited opinions on the overall outlook on the supply chain for 2024. The poll results revealed a spectrum of opinions among APAC supply chain leaders — 36% are optimistic about growth, 29% are cautiously optimistic, 32% feel that there will be challenges ahead, and the

remaining 4% are neutral. This reflects a balanced perspective amidst the varying dynamics shaping the APAC supply chain landscape.

Delving Deeper: Challenges or Opportunities

Building upon these insights, TAPA APAC launched the second poll on 21st February, delving deeper into specific areas of concern within the supply chain landscape. Among the respondents, supply chain disruptions and Business Continuity Planning (BCP) emerged as a top concern by 41% of the votes.

Following closely, cargo crime and theft garnered significant attention of 37%, reflecting the pervasive threat posed by organized crime networks targeting supply chain assets. This reveals the need for robust strategies to mitigate the impact of unforeseen events on business operations. These poll results highlight the multifaceted challenges facing APAC supply chains and the imperative for proactive measures to enhance resilience and security.

Forging Ahead: TAPA Standards for Resilience and Security

Against the backdrop of these poll findings, the adoption of TAPA Standards is a strategic imperative for APAC supply chain stakeholders seeking to enhance resilience and security. TAPA Standards provide a comprehensive framework encompassing industry best practices and strategies for security across the end-to-end supply chain, tailored to address the unique challenges faced by organizations operating in the region.
