The Prophet so called his daughter Zainab to Madinah in exchange for her captured husband, Abu Al-Aas ibn Rabi'.

The Prophet himself performed the 'Aqiqah (sacrifice of an animal on the occasion of a child's birth) for his grandchildren.



On one occasion, the Prophet prolonged his prostration during prayer because his grandson was playing on his back.

When a companion asked about making up the fasting days of his deceased sister, the Prophet semphasized the importance of fulfilling such obligations.



The Prophet seemphasized to his companions the importance of being good to their families and taking care of all family members.

The Prophet mentioned that the best dirham you spend, and for which you receive the most reward, is the one you spend on your family. (Muslim:995)




The Prophet staught that kindness to parents is essential, even if they are polytheists.
