Manager's Corner

Annually, the Board of Supervisors adopts an overall budget and establishes the municipal real estate tax millage. On December 12, 2024, the 2025 overall budget was adopted which included the balanced General Fund budget of \$21,521,589. The 2025 approved budget maintained the municipal real estate tax rate at 1.5 mills which equates to 0.0015% of assessed value. You may recall that the Board of Supervisors cut the municipal tax rate by 12% in 2024.





Real estate taxes billed on/before Aug. 31 must be paid by Dec. 31, 2025 to avoid delinquency.

Sewer Payment Options

Springettsbury Township provides multiple options for residents and property owners to make sewer bill payments, including by mail, in person, over the phone, ACH direct withdraw or online credit card/electronic check payment. The Township encourages all residents to make payment early to ensure it is received by the due date. Payments are posted on the date payment is received, not by the postmark date. Failure to receive sewer bills is not considered a reason for non-payment and does not extend the due date.



PARKS RULES

It is expected that all users of Township facilities will conduct themselves and their activities in such a way as will not obstruct or interfere with the use and enjoyment of the facilities by others. Respect for, courtesy to, and cooperation with other users will be the norm, and any failure to demonstrate these qualities may result in denial of use of the facilities.

Springettsbury Township Parks will be subject to the following rules and regulations:

- Springettsbury Township Park will open at 7 a.m. and close at 11 p.m. All other parks will operate from dawn to dusk. There shall be no trespassing on park property during closed hours.
- 2. Smoking shall be prohibited at all times on any park property.
- The Township Manager, the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors, the Chief of Police or the Director of Parks and Recreation may close the park(s) if hazardous conditions exist that endanger life or property. There shall be no trespassing on park property during such times.
- 4. There shall be no littering.
- 5. Vandalism and negligent or deliberate destruction or removal of natural or physical property is prohibited. Possession or use of a mineral or metal detector, magnetometer, side scan sonar, other metal detecting device or sub-bottom profiler is prohibited. All natural, cultural, and archaeological resources are protected and may not be removed or disturbed.
- 6. Open fires or hot charcoals shall only be permitted in Township park grills. Grills are not to be left unattended and shall be thoroughly extinguished upon departure.
- 7. Picnic tables are not to be removed from the picnic shelters.
- 8. The solicitation, selling, or the distribution of any items or services unrelated to Township sponsored activities is prohibited.
- 9. Posting of signs of any kind is prohibited.
- 10. Alcoholic beverages and controlled substances are strictly prohibited.
- 11. Use of explosives or explosive devices, fireworks, sparklers, hot air-balloons, rockets, remote control air planes or vehicles, air guns, bows, slingshots or any similar items for non-Park and Recreation sponsored events is prohibited. It shall be lawful for any person to discharge a firearm within the Township, except if discharged in violation of all local, state and federal laws, rules and regulations, including but not limited to

- the Air Rifles Law, Game Commission Rules and Regulations and the Game Law.
- 12. Injury or killing of wild or domestic animals is prohibited.
- 13. All dogs must be currently licensed and vaccinated. Dogs shall not be permitted on any playground, sports fields or in the amphitheater area. Dogs must be leashed at all times and the leash must not be longer than six feet (6'). Limit two (2) dogs per adult. Waste must be collected immediately. Dog owners are responsible for injuries inflicted by their dog to others. Aggressive dogs are not permitted.
- 14. No hitting of golf balls.
- Use of any amplification devices and microphones is prohibited unless activity is sponsored by the Township.
- Motorized vehicles except those expressly authorized are prohibited except in designated parking areas.
- 17. Facilities and equipment can only be used for the purpose intended
- Use of electrical outlets is restricted to Township only equipment or Townshipsponsored events.
- Skateboarding, In-line skating and bicycling are prohibited in all picnic shelters, on the tennis courts and Amphitheater area including the stage, terrace seating area and designated access points.
- It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in any abusive, loud, vulgar or otherwise disorderly conduct.
- Parking areas are for park users only. All vehicles shall be parked within the designated spaces provided.
- Tents, canopies or any other like structure are prohibited unless used for a Township sponsored event.
- 23. Smoking shall be prohibited at all times on any park property.

Dog Control and Tethering

Many of us consider our dogs a part of the family and are respectful of our neighbors when it comes to our furry friend's behavior. Some folks, however, need a friendly reminder about the laws on dog control. Here are a few excerpts from the Township's Code of Ordinances that you may find helpful (*Chapter 105, Articles I and II, §105-1 through 11*).

Dog Control

- It shall be unlawful for the owner of any dog or dogs to allow or permit such dog or dogs to run at large in the Township. <u>Definition of Running At Large</u> Being upon any public highway, street, alley, park or any other public land or upon property of another person other than the owner and not being accompanied by or under the control of the owner or any other person having custody of said dog.
- A Township-appointed Animal Control Officer, along with police officers shall have concurrent responsibility for the enforcement of the Township's dog ordinance and the Pennsylvania State Dog Law.
- Violations and Penalties Violators may be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$1,000 plus costs and in default of payment of said fine and costs, to a term of imprisonment not to exceed 90 days.



Tethering of Dogs

It shall be a violation for any person to tether a dog outside if any of the following conditions apply:

- The tether is not attached to the dog by a non-choke-type collar of the proper size for the dog and not attached to a stationary object by swivel anchors, latches or similar devices in a manner which prevents the tether from becoming entangled around any object so as to limit the dog's freedom within the tethered area, or to prevent the dog or any of its appendages from becoming entangled by the tether.
- The dog does not have easy access to clean drinking water and adequate shade and/or shelter within the tethered area.
- The dog is tethered outdoors and unattended during any period in which a severe weather warning has been issued for York County by the National Weather Service. The dog is tethered outdoors and unattended for a continuous period of time greater than half an hour if the temperature during such period remains entirely either below 32 degrees Fahrenheit or above 90 degrees Fahrenheit. "Outside," shall mean any unattended dog that is outside and subject to the weather and elements which expressly includes, but not be limited to, a dog in a securely fenced-in yard, a dog in a kennel, or a dog tethered or tied-out. The dog shall be considered "outside" regardless of access to an outdoor doghouse or similar structure.

- The dog is left tethered outside between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m.
- The dog shows signs of physical distress such as shivering, shaking, excessive panting or immobility.
- · A dog is tethered that is under the age of six months.
- Enforcement; authorized agent An agent of any society or association for the prevention of cruelty to animals (SPCA), is designated as the enforcement officer to administer and enforce the provisions of the dog tethering ordinance.
- Any dog removed from premises of the owner or occupant shall be held at the York County SPCA. The dog owner may regain possession of any confiscated dog upon an adequate showing to the SPCA that the tethering violation has been brought into compliance.
- · Violations and Penalties Persons who violate any provisions of this ordinance may be sentenced to pay a fine not to exceed \$500, together will all enforcement and shelter costs in the event a dog must be confiscated, and all court costs as permitted by law. Enforcement and prosecution of any violation of this article may be conducted by the Township as provided by law, or by an SPCA agent and its counsel as provided in the Pennsylvania Animal Cruelty Law.

"Flushable" Wipes Are NOT Flushable

The Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) is encouraging all Pennsylvanians to only flush toilet paper and human waste, not disinfecting wipes or other non-flushable items that should be disposed of in the trash.

Flushing things that aren't meant to be flushed can damage your own sewer pipes as well as the sewer treatment facilities that we all depend on. Even so-called 'flushable' wipes shouldn't be put in the toilet.

Tissues, paper towels, and single-use wipes, including cleansing and diaper wipes, cannot be safely flushed, even if they are labeled as "flushable" or "biodegradable. Other non-flushable items include things like diapers, feminine hygiene products, disposable toilet brushes, disposable gloves, cotton swabs, dental floss, and kitty litter.


Flushing or dumping the wrong things down the drain can cause blockages in your own home or business as well as problems in the local sewer system. These products do not break down like toilet paper and can clog systems very quickly. Many sewer blockages occur between your house or business and the sewer main, where the property owner is responsible for correcting and paying for the repair.

Blockages can also lead to sewage overflows that can have adverse effects on the environment, especially if the overflow enters local rivers, lakes, and streams.

Flushing only toilet paper and human waste helps ensure that the toilets, plumbing, sewer systems, and septic systems will continue working properly to safely manage wastewater in Pennsylvania.

Having fully operational wastewater services is critical to protecting Pennsylvanians from public health risks. Pennsylvania's wastewater employees are local heroes on the frontline of protecting human health and the environment every single day.

Top Tips


- 1. Wear a properly fitted helmet. It is the best way to prevent head injuries and death.
- 2. Ride on the sidewalk when you can. If not, ride in the same direction as traffic as far on the right-hand side as possible.
- 3. Use hand signals and follow the rules of the road. Be predictable by making sure you ride in a straight line and don't swerve between cars.
- 4. Wear bright colors and use lights, especially when riding at night and in the morning.

- 5. Ride with your children. Stick together until you are comfortable that your kids are ready to ride on their own.

History Night features Motels & Inns of Springettsbury



Township residents and the local community are invited to join Stephen Smith of the Historic Preservation Committee at the Springettsbury History Night event on Wednesday April 9, 2025. "Motels & Inns of Springettsbury" will explore the interesting history of sixteen past and present businesses built for travelers, however also frequented by locals for their restaurants and other amenities. The event will take place in the Community Room within the Springettsbury Township Municipal Complex at 1501 Mount Zion Road, York, PA 17402, at 7:00 p.m., with doors opening at 6:30 p.m.

Most of the Motels & Inns were built in the York Valley along the main road into York. The oldest was the Ye Olde Valley Inn, in business back to the time when Colonial delegates traveled the road when Continental Congress sat in York in 1777

and 1778. Another was the York Valley Inn Motel, at Yorklyn, which was often frequented by locals for the restaurant, or for swimming lessons at their pools. A few notable Springettsbury campgrounds and rooming houses will also be explored.

History Nights are held during April, July and October. They feature a presentation on an aspect of Township history including photographs and stories of life in Springettsbury Township. The Historic Preservation Committee invites community members to share their stories.

2025 Springettsbury Residential Trash & Recycling Collection Program

Services Offered

- 1-3 ea. 32-gallon trash bag or trash can per week plus recycling pick-up. Cost per quarter = \$98.40.
- 1-96 gallon toter equal to 3-32-gallon trash bags or trash cans per week plus recycling pick-up. Cost per quarter = \$98.40.
- Extra waste bags may be purchased at the Township Municipal Building or by calling Penn Waste at 717-767-4456. The fee per bag is \$5.00.

Yard waste will be collected in four (4) foot lengths once per week (beginning the first week of March and concluding the first week of December): bundled; placed in a biodegradable Kraft or other paper bag; placed in maximum 32-gallon container with a Township approved brush identification sticker. Brush stickers can be obtained at the Township Municipal Building for \$.50 each.

REMINDERS: Please do not combine yard waste and recycling materials. Do not use the 96-gallon toters provided by Penn Waste for yard waste. Yard Waste containers should be no larger than a 32-gallon container.

Acceptable Large Items

Residents should contact Penn Waste, 717-767-4456 to schedule the large item collection at least one day prior to the normal collection day.

What to do with Unacceptable Items?

- Used Oil from vehicles can often be disposed of at auto shops or agencies selling auto supplies.
- Unacceptable metal items can often be disposed of through various Metal Recyclers or Scrap Metal facilities in the area.
- Plastic Bags from all stores can be recycled at many local grocery stores.
- Truck and tractor tires can be taken to a tire distributor to be disposed of or recycled. Contact business in advance, a fee may be required.

- It is always recommended to call a facility first to see what their policies are regarding accepting materials

Recycling Acceptable Items

Place ONLY these items in your Recycling Bin

Metal: Aluminum and steel food & beverage cans Glass: Clear, brown, blue and green glass food & beverage containers

Plastic: #1, #2, and #5 ONLY

Paper & Cardboard:

- Corrugated cardboard boxes
- Newspapers
- Cartons for Juice, Milk, Soy Milk, Soup/Broth, Wine, Egg Substitutes and Cream

Remember:

- Remove all packaging materials (Styrofoam, peanuts, bubble wrap, plastic liners)
- Flatten ALL boxes, and
- Bundle all cardboard that does not fit into the recycling
- Cover loose paper with heavier items to prevent it from blowing away. If the weather forecast calls for high winds or wet weather, keep your paper recyclables until the next week. Wet paper products are difficult to process.
- Rinse thoroughly to remove all contaminants.
- Please dispose of any liquids in items before placing in recycling bins

Please have your waste, recycling and large item available for collection at curbside by 6:00 a.m. on your collection day, but no earlier than 4:00 p.m. the day prior to pick up. Empty containers must be removed within 24 hours after collection. No items may be placed at curbsides that are too heavy to be lifted into a truck by two people. Additional trash bags are NOT considered a bulk item.

DID YOU KNOW?

Continental Paper Grading (CPG) accepts magazines, junk mail, catalogs, cereal boxes, and books for paper recycling. Drop off these materials at CPG 3350 Concord Road, York

Monday - Friday from 8:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m.

Recycling Unacceptable Items

- Needles & Medical Waste DO NOT place used needles or any other medical waste with recycling! This is a serious health hazard to everyone.
- Diapers (acceptable as trash)
- Aerosol cans (acceptable as trash)
- Windows, mirrors, ceramics, drinking glasses, light bulbs or broken glass (acceptable as trash)
- Shredded paper (acceptable as trash)
- Aluminum foil (acceptable as trash)
- Food soiled or wet materials including paper, cardboard (acceptable as trash)
- Styrofoam, packing peanuts, bubble wrap (acceptable as trash)
- Plastic bags (acceptable as trash)
- Tissues and other paper products (acceptable as trash)
- Paperboard products such as toilet paper/paper towel rolls, cereal boxes, tissue boxes (acceptable as trash)
- Pool chemicals (Hazardous Waste)
- Hose (acceptable as trash)
- Rechargeable Batteries

Holiday Collection Schedule

Penn Waste observes New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day. When your collection day is on or after a holiday, collections will be delayed by one day. Example: Memorial Day falls on a Monday. Collection schedule this week is Tuesday through Saturday. Thanksgiving falls on a Thursday. Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday collections will not change. Thursday and Friday collections will move to Friday and Saturday. **EXCEPTION:** If holiday falls on a Saturday or Sunday, there is **no change** in service prior to or after the holiday.

Remember: The Covered Devices Recycling Act (Act 108) prohibits residents and businesses from placing electronics waste at the curb or in their trash. Covered devices include: desktop computers, laptops, monitors, computer peripherals (keyboard, mouse, printer and speakers), televisions and e-readers that browse the internet.

ELECTRONICS COLLECTION TIMES AND LOCATION

The York County Solid Waste Authority (YCSWA) has a FREE Residential Electronics Recycling Program open to York County residents. Collection of electronics is conducted Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. and Saturdays from 8:00 a.m. to noon at the Small Load Drop-off Facility at the York County Resource Recover Center, 2651 Blackbridge Road. 


