FHF Founder and Executive Director, Seanicaa Edwards Herron, Honored at Inaugural 2025 James Beard Foundation® Impact Awards

n the world of agriculture, where many voices have been silenced or overlooked, one woman is making a powerful difference. Earlier this month, our visionary founder and executive director, Seanicaa Edwards Herron, was honored as a recipient of the inaugural James Beard Foundation® Impact Award. The award ceremony was held in Chicago, Illinois, at The Dalcy during the 35th anniversary of the James Beard Awards®.

This esteemed accolade, which recognized individuals whose leadership is reshaping the food system to be more equitable, sustainable, and economically viable, comes as a pivotal moment for Seanicaa, and the acknowledgement underscores the significance of her work at Freedmen Heirs Foundation. "I'm deeply honored to receive this award, which recognizes not only my personal journey but also the broader mission of Freedmen Heirs Foundation," said Edwards Herron



The celebration, presented by Capital One, served as a powerful reminder of how food connects us all. As leaders in the culinary world gathered to honor excellence, Seanicaa's presence emphasized the need for change. "If you hold power, use It. If you hold privilege, share it. If you hold capital, invest it, Don't just celebrate equity, fund it. Don't just recognize Black farmers, buy from them. Don't just talk about justice. Contract it, legislate it, and invest in it", she boldly stated.

With the Impact Awards celebrating trailblazers across the food system, Seanicaa joins an elite



Nate Bradford

Carrying a Legacy of Resilience and Regeneration in Ranching

n the heart of central Oklahoma, a remarkable story unfolds at G-Line Ranch, led by Nate Bradford, a fourth-generation rancher who's transforming the ranching landscape through his mission-driven approach. Nate's journey began as a young boy, working alongside his father and grandfather, who instilled in him a deep sense of pride and purpose. Today, he honors their legacy by redefining what it means to steward land, livestock, and community.

Founded in 2003, G-Line Ranch spans Creek and Okfuskee counties and reflects a rich and resilient heritage. Nate's vision for the ranch goes beyond cattle farming. It's about sustainable agriculture that preserves the land for future generations. With a passion for quality and responsibility, Nate ensures that every piece of beef produced is a testimony to his commitment to ethical practices and high standards. In a bold move in 2020, Nate embraced innovation by expanding into wild game processing and launching an online platform for beef sales, welcoming a new era for his ranch within a historically underrepresented space.

Pride in Landownership and His Commitment to Sustainability

Nate's journey as an agribusiness owner hasn't been easy. As an African American landowner, he speaks passionately about the pride he takes in his work, overcoming significant racial and financial barriers in an industry that has historically been inequitable. "Being a landowner as an African American gives me a sense of pride..." he reflects. Despite the barriers faced,



Nate has worked hard to ensure his journey leaves behind a legacy for his children and future generations.

Additionally, Nate ensures that G-Line Ranch sets itself apart through its commitment to regenerative practices. He utilizes rotational grazing, solar-powered water wells, and participates in carbon farming to ensure long-term sustainability for both his livestock and the land. His operation also emphasizes high-quality genetics to deliver premium beef products. But innovation alone doesn't define his success, it's the deep roots and relentless drive behind the work that make Nate's journey stand out.

Resilience Through Self-Funding and Community Involvement

Nate and his family's perseverance is evident as they've faced issues with loan servicing and obtaining capital for their operation. This has led them to continuously reinvest income from

their full-time jobs back into the ranch. This selffunded resilience has allowed them to keep growing despite the systemic obstacles encountered.

Nate also extends his commitment to community through his nonprofit, Bradford, Williams, Bradford, Inc., which has been a pillar of support for the local agricultural community since 2010. He believes in uplifting those around him, sharing his knowledge and resources to inspire the next generation of farmers.

He advises aspiring agripreneurs to "Find a mentor and build a plan. Discover what you're passionate about in agriculture and grow from there." Nate's influential reach doesn't stop there. His dedication to mentorship and education extends beyond his ranch through social media platforms, where he regularly shares insights and resources.

Nate's journey is a testament to the power of perseverance, heritage, and vision. As he continues to build a legacy for his children and

uplift others along the way, his story serves as both inspiration and a blueprint for aspiring farmers, ranchers, and anyone chasing their dreams against the odds.

USDA World Agricultural Supply and Demand Estimates (WASDE) Report

The World Agricultural Supply and Demand Estimates (WASDE) report is prepared and released by the World Agricultural Outlook Board (WAOB). This report is released monthly and provides annual forecasts for supply and use of U.S. and world wheat, rice,

coarse grains, oilseeds, and cotton. The report also covers U.S. supply and use of sugar, livestock & meat, poultry, eggs, milk, and dairy products; as well as Mexico's supply and use of sugar. Read June's report by clicking the link below.

USDA National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS) Crop Production Report

This monthly report contains crop production data for the U.S., including acreage, area harvested, and yield. The report also contains a monthly weather summary, a monthly agricultural summary, and an analysis of precipitation and the degree of departure from the normal precipitation map for the month.


